New debt forcing increase in Shawano County property taxes

Property owners will pay 30 cents more per \$1,000 under proposed 2020 budget

SHAWANO — Shawano County property owners would pay an additional 30 cents per \$1,000 of equalized value on their tax bills under the county's proposed 2020 budget.

According to County Administrative Coordinator Brent Miller, the increase is entirely due to new debt the county has taken on, including the construction of the Human Services facility, new locks and security improvements at the county jail and an upgrade to the emergency 911 dispatch system.

Some operational costs have also gone up, but, according to Miller, those higher costs were offset by other cuts during the budgeting process.

Health insurance costs are expected to increase by 12% in 2020 instead of the 5.5% previously expected.

Miller said the county is looking at some health insurance alternatives that were slated to be discussed by the administrative committee Tuesday.

The county is also proposing a 2% increase in wages,

which wasn't done in last year's budget. According to county budget documents, county wages are about 12% lower than surrounding counties.

Under state law, the county's property tax levy has to be held to either a zero percent increase or an increase equal to the increase in net new construction, which was 1.07% this year.

However, the county can also increase the levy for new debt. The county's debt service is jumping from \$620,771 in 2019 to about \$1.8 million in the recommended 2020 budget, an increase of 18.4 percent.

The county budget calls for a levy of \$17.3 million, up from \$15.8 million in 2019.

That translates to a tax rate of \$5.38 per \$1,000 of equalized value, a 9.4% increase over this year's \$5.08 cents per \$1,000.

That means the owner of a \$100,000 home would pay \$538 in property taxes compared to the \$508 paid this year.

The amount will vary between municipalities, which calculate the tax rate based on assessed values instead of equalized values.

The levy was recommended for approval Monday by the finance committee, with Supervisor Deb Noffke casting the sole no vote.

It goes to the County Board for review and a public hearing Oct. 23.

While a haunted house was something Stuewer wanted to develop, she did not think it would come to be in her first year as a new business owner.

"I always thought it would be cool to have a haunted house in Shawano, but I thought that would be something I'd start later on," she said.

Then she had some friends, who had worked on the crews for other haunted houses, inquire whether Stuewer had ever considered turning her back room into a haunted house. Just like that, the project was on.

Torborg's in Shawano provided the lumber, according to Stuewer.

Proceeds from the event will go toward expanding the haunted house in the future.

Best-selling author to speak in Shawano

SHAWANO — Shawano County Main Library will be hosting award-winning author Nickolas Butler on Nov. 12 at 7 p.m. The best-selling author will share stories of his writing experience and also answer questions from the audience.

Following the program, Butler will be available for autographs and pictures. Several of his titles will be available at the program to purchase.

Butler was born in Allentown, Pennsylvania, and raised in Eau Claire.

He was educated at the Univer-

sity of Wisconsin-Madison and the University of Iowa Writer's Workshop.

His first novel was the internationally best-selling and prize-winning "Shotgun Lovesongs," which has been optioned for film development and has been translated into 10 languages.

"Beneath the Bonfire," a collection of short stories, followed a year later. In 2017, he published "The Hearts of Men," which was short-listed for two of France's most prestigious literary prizes before its American publishing.

In 2019, his fourth book, "Little Faith," was published, and he is at work on another novel set in the mountains of the American West.

Butler is the recipient of many literary prizes and commendations and has published articles, reviews, short stories and poetry in publications such as Ploughshares, Narrative and The New York Times Book Review.

Prior to publishing "Shotgun Lovesongs," Butler worked a long list of jobs including: coffee roaster, liquor store clerk, office manager, hot-dog vendor, author escort,

meatpacker, bed-and-breakfast manager, telemarketer and Burger King maintenance man. He is married and lives with his wife and two children on 16 acres adjacent to a buffalo farm in rural Wisconsin.

Earlier this year, Shawano County Library, along with Oconto Falls Public Library and Marinette County Consolidated Libraries, received a grant from Nicolet Federated Library System to host an author visit at each of the those libraries.

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Eland man facing multiple child abuse, false imprisonment charges

State describes abuse of 8-year-old as "torture"

SHAWANO — An 8-year-old child was put through "torture" at the hands of an Eland man who is now facing multiple charges of child abuse and false imprisonment, according to a state prosecutor at a court hearing Monday.

Nathan Pogrnt, 36, has been charged with felony counts of child

abuse, recklessly causing bodily and mental harm to a child, and six counts of false imprisonment.

Shawano-Menominee County Assistant District Attorney Catharine White told the court that what Pogrnt did to the child amounted to torture.

Judge William Kussel, Jr. ordered Pogrnt held on a \$25,000 cash bond as requested by the state.

According to the criminal complaint, Pogrnt had tied the boy to a chair in an improperly-vented basement on five occasions and once confined him in a closet.

The complaint also alleges Pogrnt caused physical and mental harm to the child by strapping him to a chair in the basement for a day

and two nights without providing adequate food.

The complaint states Pogrانت also struck the child and injured him.

According to the complaint, a couple of passersby found the child walking along U.S. Highway 45 on Oct. 5 after the boy managed to escape the home and run away.

The complaint alleges Pogrانت put the boy in a hooded sweatshirt and tied him with a cord to a wooden chair that had metal bars and straps.

The boy told authorities he would have to sit in his own urine after wetting himself.

The boy's mother, who has not been charged, lives at the Eland residence with the boy and Pogrانت.

According to the complaint, she admitted the sweatshirt was used "as a straight jacket" on the child

over the past month, once or twice a week.

Pogrانت could face a maximum 76 years in prison if convicted on all counts, if sentences were imposed consecutively.

He faces a potential 12 1/2 years in prison and a \$25,000 fine for causing mental harm to a child.

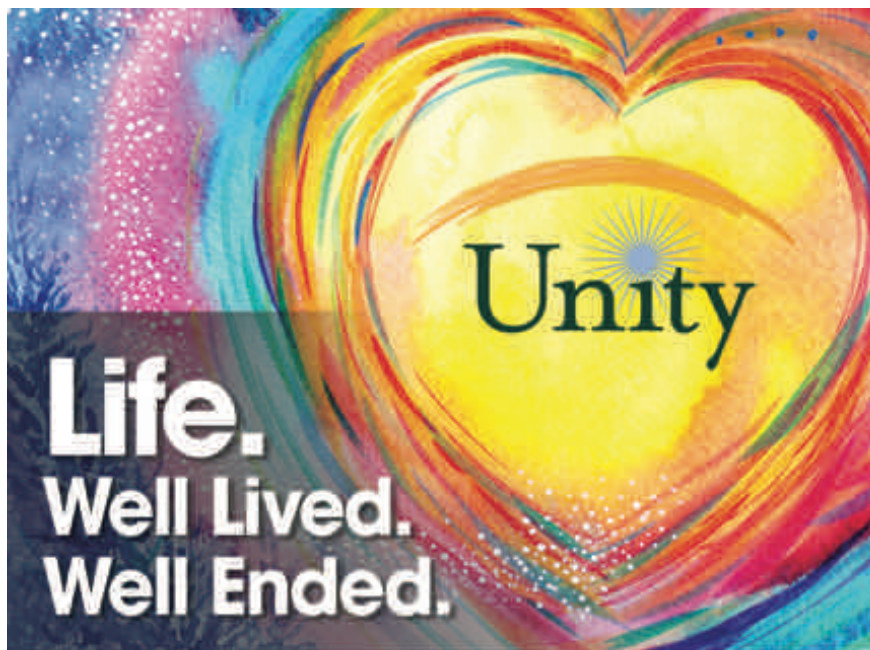
The remaining counts of physical abuse of a child-intentionally causing bodily harm, physical abuse of a child-recklessly causing bodily harm, and six years and a \$10,000 fine on each of the false imprisonment charges.

He is also charged with two counts of felony bail jumping, which carries the same possible penalty, and second or subsequent offense possession of marijuana, which carries a maximum 3 1/2 years and a \$10,000 fine.

According to court records, Pogrانت is scheduled for a jury trial starting Nov. 12 in Marathon County on felony charges of domestic abuse-related second-degree sexual assault-use of force and third-degree sexual assault.

He is due back in court for an adjourned initial appearance on the new charges Nov. 11.

ThedaCare installs medication take-back boxes

SHAWANO — To help combat the recent opioid epidemic, ThedaCare is offering a safe, convenient way to dispose of unused or expired medicine.

Since medicine should never be flushed or poured down the drain, medical officials say medicine take-back options are the safest way to dispose of such products. New medication take-back boxes have recently been installed throughout the ThedaCare system as part of its opioid awareness campaign, developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

“If a patient is prescribed an opioid, they should take and dispose of medications properly,” said Dr. Jennifer Frank, chief medical officer of the ThedaCare Clinically Integrated Network. “Unused prescription medications in homes are a concern, because they can be accidentally ingested, stolen and abused.”

Convenient and secure disposal options are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, for disposal of unused medications at ThedaCare Medical Center-Shawano. Additionally, there are boxes at medical centers in Appleton, Berlin, Neenah, New London, Oshkosh and Waupaca.

Those who are dropping off

medication will find signs directing to the drop box at each location. Expired, unwanted prescription and over-the-counter medications as well as medicated ointments and non-aerosol sprays are accepted. All other products — including syringes, thermometers, IV bags, diabetes test kits, inhalers and personal care products — are not accepted.

Since 2005, the rate of opioid use disorder has more than tripled, according to data provided by the Wisconsin Division of Public Health. ThedaCare is one of the few health care organizations in northeast and central Wisconsin to have permanent take-back boxes located in their hospitals.

“We want all community members, even if they are not ThedaCare patients, to have access to safe disposal options,” Frank said. “This is part of our responsibility to help find solutions to issues we are facing as a community.”

If you or someone you know is struggling with opioid addiction, help is available through the Wisconsin Addiction Recovery Helpline or ThedaCare Behavioral Health. A list of services and contact information can be found by visiting the ThedaCare opioid resource page.

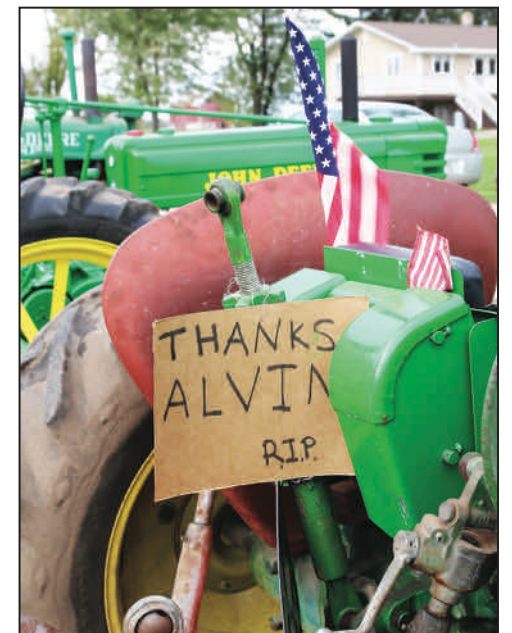

October best time to enjoy colors of wildlife area

The maples and oaks are beginning to burn with the colors of autumn as the fiery sand hills of Navarino Wildlife Area and Navarino Nature Center flame with the glory of October.

Walking along the sandy pathways over the beautiful ridges that tower over crystal blue flowages, the wind whispers through the planes overhead and the leaves of the forest oaks rustle in the October breeze. The scent of pine drifts through the air and the music of sandhill cranes and Canada geese rings out from the wetland below.

October is one of the best times of year to visit Navarino, when the col-

ors of the season are at their finest and the cool air is comforting as we walk and enjoy the sights and sounds of nature.

Patches of colorful asters are still in bloom, attracting late season butterflies, migrating monarch stragglers, as well as bumblebees to their nutritious blossom. The prairie dances with towering bluestem and Indian grasses, now painted in rich gold, red and

purple as October arrives.

The first juncos of the season have now arrived and we see them letting along the trail, their telltale flashing white tail feathers showing as they take flight just a short distance in front of us on the trail.

In the October breeze, acorns tumble from the treetops, bouncing along the pathway in front of us, while chipmunks and squirrels busily work to gather them up and store them for the coming winter.

The trail system at Navarino Nature Center and Navarino Wildlife Area is extensive and it is possible to walk for many miles enjoying the colors and beauty of the season. Trails lead over the oak and pine ridges, as well as through tamarack bogs, prairies, wetland and prime aspen, birch and maple forests.

Now in fall autumn bloom, enjoy the beauty of unusual witch hazel, a Wisconsin native shrub that grows along the trail system in many areas. The thin, wiry, yellow flowers can be seen blooming along the bare stems of these large shrubs.

Hiking along the trail, you'll also spot a number of beautiful fall fungi, now in full show as the cool weather and dampness of autumn take hold.

Each evening, the sandhill cranes return to the wetlands to roost by the thousands during the month of October, a spectacular end to an autumn day exploring the beauty of Navarino.

ing mix of full humans, half-fae, elves, faeries and brownies. They might not be a close-knit community, but they get along well as long as certain quaint barriers are maintained.

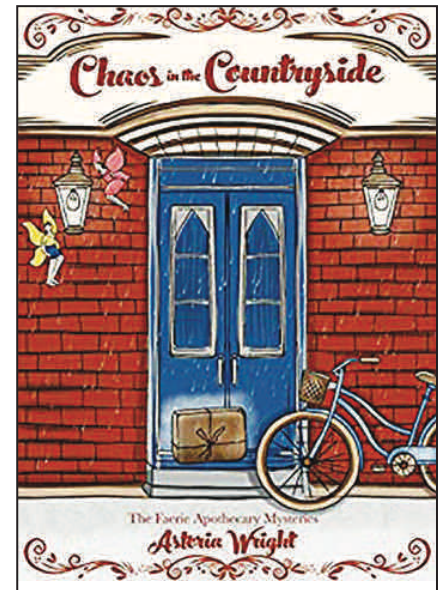

Bonduel rallies for wild win over Witt-Birn

Bears clinch playoff berth

BONDUEL — The Bonduel High School football team was playing its final Central Wisconsin Conference-Large Division game ever. The Bears made it a memorable one, rallying from a 19-point halftime deficit for a wild 21-19 victory over Wittenberg-Birnamwood on Friday.

Bonduel coach James Westrich wasn't pleased with the performance of the offense in the first half, crediting Witt-Birn's defense. "We went into halftime and adjusted some things. We did a little gut check and our kids really responded in the third quarter. They came out and played really good football and I couldn't be more proud of them."

On a cold night where a strong wind made moving the football difficult, Bonduel took advantage with the wind in its favor in the third quarter.

The Bears opened the second half at their own 41-yard line, leaning on the running game and a timely pass to put together a scoring drive.

Senior Cole Letter and juniors Max Marohl, Max Sokolski and Isaac Banker all had carries for the Bears on the drive, with Letter connecting on a pass with Banker on third down to extend the drive. After a Letter run and Witt-Birn penalty put Bonduel at the 1, Sokolski scored to make it 19-7.

Bonduel's defense then rose to the challenge, stuffing three W-B runs to force a punt. Starting from midfield, Bonduel needed just four plays to get back in the end zone.

The big play was a 25-yard pass from Letter to Banker, before a 12-yard Marohl run set up Sokolski's 11-yard touchdown run.

"We knew we played our worst half of football there at the start and then we came back and played our best half of football," said Sokolski. "We just had to stick together."

The Bears tried to kick another extra point, but after a bobbled snap,

the team had to improvise. Junior Cole Anderson found junior Carson Robaidek in the back left corner of the end zone to make it 19-15.

After forcing Witt-Birn into a third-and-long, Bonduel senior Dylan Springborn intercepted a pass and returned it to the Witt-Birn 25.

With the home crowd in a frenzy, Marohl ripped off a touchdown run on the next play to give the hosts their first lead of the contest.

"We knew we weren't playing our type of football (in the first half), that's not the team we're supposed to be. But we came out in the second half and played like the team we are," said Marohl.

Bonduel's defense kept Witt-Birn out of the end zone the rest of the game to preserve the win, which clinched a postseason berth for the team. The Bears were also playing in their final CWC-Large game, with the team, like many others, moving to a new conference in 2020.

After taking the lead, Bonduel forced Witt-Birn into a three-and-out.

The Chargers' next drive was a promising one, relying on the running attack of junior Austin Gibson, senior Logan Balliett and freshman

David Gauderman to work deep into Bonduel territory. Facing a fourth-and-11, Balliett broke free on a scramble, but came up just short of the first down marker.

Bonduel ran out the rest of the clock from there, with first-down runs from Banker and Letter sealing the comeback win.

Sokolski finished with 114 rushing yards, while Marohl had 46. Letter passed for 79 yards and Banker caught three passes for 46 yards. Banker and Sokolski finished with seven tackles each.

The Bears improved to 6-2 overall and finished 4-2 in CWC-Large play. Bonduel ends the regular season hosting Southern Door on Friday.

The Chargers are also 6-2 on the season, with a 3-2 mark in conference play. To clinch a playoff spot, Witt-Birn, which is already eligible for postseason play, must take down Manawa on Friday.

The Chargers hope to put the tough road loss to Bonduel behind them and end the year on a positive note.

"My message to the team was that we're a good football team, that we couldn't hang our heads and that one loss doesn't define our sea-

son," said Witt-Birn coach Bernard Holsey. "We had an opportunity, but couldn't take advantage of it."

Witt-Birn looked to be on its way to the playoff-clinching win Friday, especially after Gibson got the team off to a fast start, returning the opening kickoff 84 yards for a touchdown.

The Chargers kept the Bears off the scoreboard on the ensuing possession, with sophomore Kaden Schmidt intercepting a fourth-down pass in the end zone. Sophomore Ben Wesolowski also intercepted a pass in the first half.

Witt-Birn wasn't able to extend its lead until late in the first half, punting on its first two offensive possessions before missing a field goal on the third.

The team's fourth drive started at the W-B 44, with runs from Balliett and Gibson moving the ball into Bonduel territory before a pass from Balliett to senior Simon Stewart got the ball down to the 24.

After a spike stopped the clock, Balliett lofted a touchdown pass to sophomore Jack Fraaza with 20 seconds left in the half.

Bonduel fumbled on the kickoff, giving Witt-Birn the ball at the host's 29 with 13 seconds to go. The next play, Balliett hit Gibson for another touchdown pass.

"In the first half, we were fortunate to get great field position and we capitalized on it," said Balliett. "We were struggling to move the ball on the ground, so we went to the air and made a couple big plays to boost our lead going into halftime."

On the team's senior night, Shawano coach Breanna Young started all five seniors — Hansen, Abi Vomastic, Katelyn Wilber, Autumn Gull and Kelsi Nick.

Green Bay East played the role of spoiler to the team's special night, going on a 14-0 run to take control of the first set. The Red Devils ended the first set on a 23-7

run and seemed to be in complete control.

But a team effort sparked by the play of Vomastic, Wilber and Hansen helped Shawano find traction in the second set.

Vomastic finished the match with 15 total kills, while Hansen had 10 kills and Wilber six. Wilber also tallied 14 assists, five digs and four aces.

"It means a lot to me because this is a major goal we wanted to accomplish this season and I'm glad we did," said senior Marissa Groshek. "We worked hard everyday and bettered ourselves at practice to get to this point. We worked on certain skills and always stayed focused."

The victory capped a 6-0 run through conference play, with several individuals chipping in along the way to help the team achieve one of its season goals.

"When I think about being conference champs, its like just one step closer to all the goals we want to accomplish," said Elizabeth Muscha. "Just to do it our senior year means so much to me. It makes it all the more special."

Coming into the match knowing a win would secure a conference title, Witt-Birn came out determined and firing on all cylinders.

The Chargers jumped out to a 9-1 lead, with junior Abi Fraaza and freshman Reese Rogowski tallying multiple kills and Muscha and junior Amara Schoepke providing strong serving.

Weyauwega-Fremont didn't make things easy, cutting the deficit to four multiple times and then down to three late in the set, but a Groshek kill, ace from senior Nicole Kielman and tip from junior McKenna Metropulos helped Witt-Birn finish off the set.

"Everyone was just like, 'It's now or never and if we want a new number up on the banner, we have to do it now.' Not give them any more chances than they deserve so we came out strong right away," said Fraaza.

The second set didn't come as easily for Witt-Birn, as Weyauwega-Fremont took an early lead before building a six-point cushion, 17-11.

Wanting to prove to everyone they deserved to be the conference champions, the Chargers stormed back. A kill from Fraaza and block from senior

Kaitlyn Clark got things going for Witt-Birn before Groshek chipped in a couple kills to whittle the deficit down.

Trailing 20-15, the Chargers went on a 7-0 run with Kielman serving to take the lead. Fraaza and Rogowski each tallied kills down the stretch, before a W-F attack error sealed the set.

Like it has all season, Witt-Birn had several players record attack kills on the night. Fraaza finished with a team-high 10 kills, while Rogowski had nine. Groshek, Clark and junior Emma Herb also had multiple attack kills on the night, with Metropulos setting them up.

"Having the hitters we have this year has been so much fun, to see the amount of effort all of them put in at practice and at games," said Metropulos, who finished with 27 assists. "We all really play as a team this year and I can honestly say they are all my best friends and playing with a team of best friends makes winning conference so much more exciting."

With the conference crown in sight, Witt-Birn surged out to a 5-0 lead in the third set, with Metropulos, Fraaza and Groshek all tallying points.

The visitors made a couple of pushes during the set, but strong serving from Muscha, Kielman and Schoepke helped the Chargers pull away for the win.

Muscha served the ball 19 times, adding three aces. Schoepke served 17 times and had two aces, while Kielman served 16 times and also had two aces.

Witt-Birn coach Becky Rew, who started coaching the team in 2017 — the last year the team won a conference title — said this year's title meant a lot to her, having helped develop the upperclassmen that lead the team.

With one of the team's goals now accomplished, the team can start focusing on another goal.

"Just make sure we are constantly improving from now until playoffs," said Rew. "We have some big hopes for the playoffs and we have to make sure we keep improving every little step along the way."

The Chargers end the regular season with a road contest against Antigo on Thursday.
