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Just 2 races for County Board

Suring school referendum question on ballot

OCONTO — It ought to be a quiet election day around Oconto County, if the ballot lineup for the County Board is any indication.

While more than a dozen Democrats maneuver for our attention in the April 7 presidential partisan primary, only two races emerged among the 31 supervisory districts when the deadline passed for the nonpartisan spring election the same day.

Incumbent Supervisor David Behrend is challenged for reelection by Fran Wranosky in a rematch of the 2018 election in District 7, which represents parts of the towns of Chase and Morgan.

Behrend won that race by just one vote.

The only other race this year is in District 24, serving part of the town of Gillett and part of the city of Gillett, where Richard Nelson is not running for reelection.

Former city of Gillett mayor and alderperson Irene Drake submitted papers to run, as did Tracy Ondik, director of the Gillett Area Ambulance Service.

Only one other supervisor decided to call it a career on the County Board — Don Girardi in District 3, which covers part of the town of Little Suamico. Guy K. Gooding is the only candidate to file for that post.

Gooding and 28 incumbent supervisors will be unopposed on the April ballot.

Some turnover is guaranteed on the Suring School Board, where two members filed declarations of non-candidacy: Eugene School, representing the towns of Bagley, Maple Valley and Spruce, and Mark Strehlow, representing the town of How.

Only one candidate emerged for each seat: Gary Regal, for the Bagley-Maple Valley-Spruce position, and David Lally for the town of How position. Incumbent Cathy Lundgren was the sole candidate for the seat she now holds, representing the towns of Doty, Mountain and Riverview.

The board last week voted on the wording for a referendum question that will appear on the April ballot. Suring Area School District voters will be asked to approve exceeding the state-imposed revenue limits by \$900,000 a year for the next five years. The district has already been exceeding those limits by \$750,000 after receiving the voters' OK in a 2015 referendum.

The Little Suamico Town Board voted in September to place an advisory referendum on the April ballot regarding whether to allow all-terrain and utility vehicles to operate on town roads.

Great Lakes start year near record highs

Property owners told to be ready for high-water issues

DETROIT — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Detroit District, announced last week that water levels on each of the Great Lakes started 2020 higher than they started 2019, a year where many record high water levels were set across the lakes.

The Corps urged people impacted by the high water levels of 2019 to prepare for similar levels again in 2020. The most recent six-month forecast of Great Lakes water levels shows water levels continuing to be well above average over this period. Unlike last year, lakes Michigan and Huron are forecasted to reach record high levels this year.

"It is likely that water levels on lakes Michigan and Huron will set new monthly mean record high levels over the next couple of months," said John Allis, chief of the Great Lakes Hydraulics and Hydrology Office, Detroit District. "This sets the stage for coastal impacts and damages in 2020 similar to, or worse than, what was experienced last year."

The Detroit District monitors and forecasts Great Lakes' water levels and provides the data and analysis on their Website www.lre.usace.army.mil.

Several natural factors contribute to the record lake levels. Persistent wet conditions across the Great Lakes basin continue to drive high water levels. Many cities across the basin set records in 2019 for the wettest period on record. The warmer than average temperatures in December led to greater runoff due to snow

pack melting, especially on lakes Superior, Michigan and Huron, leading to more water supply. The warm air also caused less evaporation off the lakes' surface, which leads to more water in the system.

The water levels of each lake peaked during this past summer or fall and since then have been in a seasonal decline, however, significant erosion continues in many locations as water levels remain extremely high. Strong storm systems and resulting large waves have led to substantial erosion along much of the Great Lakes coastline.

Parking allowed near veterans monument

OCONTO FALLS — Visitors to the new veterans monument along North Farm Road need not fear getting a ticket for parking nearby.

The Oconto Falls City Council last month passed an exception to the “No Parking Any Time” zone along North Farm Road, which prohibits parking on the street near the high school and elementary school campuses.

Parking is now allowed on the east side of the street between the Oconto Falls School District office and the north entrance to the elementary school, except during high school football games.

The change was made to accommodate short-term visitors to the monument, which was built last summer on a small parcel south of the district office.

More than 400 people attended a Nov. 9 dedication ceremony for the monument, which was erected using private dollars after local veterans groups revived a fundraising campaign started by the late Marie Magnin and others around 2014.

The School Board gave final approval to the new site last spring.

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Suring man guilty of child sex assault

Sentencing scheduled for March 6

OCONTO — An Oconto County jury deliberated for slightly longer than two hours Thursday before finding a Suring man guilty of the repeated sexual assault of the same child.

Tyler J. Readman, 44, was accused of inappropriately touching a teenage girl on numerous occasions during the time she worked for him at Dairy DeLite Ice Cream Shop.

The charge of repeated sexual assault of the same child involves at least three violations of first- or second-degree sexual assault and is a Class C felony, punishable by up to 40 years in state prison, a fine of up to \$100,000 or both.

Readman was charged in connection with several incidents between May and September 2017, but the criminal complaint, filed in Oconto

County Circuit Court in July 2018, alleged that the behavior began about a year earlier when the girl started working at the shop at age 13. She told investigators she didn't report the intrusions until after she'd quit the job because she was intimidated by him.

The verdict followed about two days of testimony. The jury found Readman not guilty of a second charge, misdemeanor fourth-degree sexual assault involving another girl.

Judge Michael T. Judge scheduled sentencing for 1 p.m. March 6.

State expands availability of marriage certificates

OCONTO — Annette Behringer, Oconto County register of deeds, announces that it is now easier to obtain a copy of a marriage certificate.

Effective Jan. 2, individuals married in Wisconsin are able to go to any register of deeds office to obtain their marriage certificate. Register of Deeds offices are currently able to issue birth certificates from all Wisconsin counties. Certificates of death are available statewide for deaths occurring on or after Sept. 1, 2013. Certificates of divorce are available statewide for divorces occurring on or after Jan. 1, 2016, to present.

Behringer said that while not all vital records are eligible for statewide issuance; the state Vital Records Office continues to work with register of deeds offices to add or update specific vital records on demand – with the goal of having all eligible records available.

Individuals can contact the Register of Deeds office to receive more information about the statewide availability of records.

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their municipal clerk. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing or online at MyVote.wi.gov.

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter or you may apply for an absentee ballot online at MyVote.wi.gov. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. The winter woodland and garden are the perfect places to seek out examples of nature's pristine artwork. The closer you look, the more beauty and wonder you will discover.

From the tiniest natural wonders to the largest, nature is filled with immaculate and artistic design,

pattern and art that will take your breath away.

Winter hoarfrost is one of my favorite examples of nature at work. Feathery, crystalline structures of ice may form upon trees, shrubs, branches and just about any other surface if conditions are right on chilly winter mornings. Perfection at its finest, each crystal showcases Mother Nature's expertise at design and patterning.

In the winter forest, pay close attention to the bark of the forest trees. You can even learn to identify different trees by the artistic qualities of their fascinating bark. Of course, everyone knows white birch, as well as the shagbark hickory, but can you identify the textures and designs of the bark of black cherry, red pine, American beech or dogwoods?

The formations of ice we find along open water also showcase nature's expertise at sculpting and creation of three-dimensional works of art. Icicles and bell-shaped structures and hanging branches decorated with jewel-like ice formations and pendants are miraculous in their beauty and spectacular in their winter elegance, especially on a sunny day when they glisten like jeweled ornaments.

The winter lichens offer another example of elegant natural art. Some lichens our feathery or hairy an appearance while others form bubbly shields that sprawl over the bark and branches of trees, as well as rocks and boulders. Lichens are present in many different colors including sea-foam green, blue, many different

shades of green, even pink, yellow and gold.

In our area, we are rich in natural destinations that offer glimpses into the art of nature. One of my favorites is, of course, the Niagara escarpment that forms the backbone of eastern Wisconsin. In many areas, the

exposed limestone is painted with the colors of nature, as mosses, algae, lichens and the effects of wind and weather paint incredible design over the surface of the stone.

We don't need to look any further than the snow itself for an elaborate display of nature at work. A close-up

view of snowflakes through a microscope or magnifying glass reveals the hidden patterns, textures and design that create the wondrous flakes of snow that dance through the winter skies.

Nature offers a free, ever revolving gallery, ready to explore any time

of day, any day of the year. Take advantage of her beauty and generosity and discover all of her hidden works of art right before your eyes.

"The guys have been feeling pretty good ever since we played in the Elcho Tournament (Dec. 27-28). We had a nice game against Marion last weekend (a 57-49 win on Jan. 3)," said Gillett coach Russ Long. "Offensively, I think we are really starting to click, guys are starting to hit their shots."

The Tigers never trailed in the contest, with Derek Block setting the tone with a 3-pointer on the first possession of the game.

The teams battled back and forth for the first five minutes of the game before Gillett took control by ending the first half on a 31-8 run.

The Tigers got to the rim often in the first half, converting a couple second-chance opportunities along the way.

Derek Block hit all three of the team's triples in the first half and finished with 11 points. Carroll was the only Tiger that got to the free-throw line in the opening half, converting all three chances on his way to an 11-point half. Logan Block added 10 points in the opening 18 minutes.

"It's tough being young. You haven't been through everything everyone else has, like the older kids, so you don't know everything yet," said Beyer. "At the same time, it's go-

ing to make you better at some point but it can be hard to play against older kids."

"The positives are that we are getting experience against a quality team — experience is always a positive thing. The effort is always there for us," said Weidner. "We did a few good things offensively that don't really show on the scoreboard and that's something we can build on going forward."

Walters and Manns combined to hit three 3-pointers over the next few minutes to push the lead over 10

points again. That momentum helped set up the 11-0 run that finished off an extended 29-10 run.

Proceedings of Jan. 9

Bond was set at \$20,000 cash for Michael Joseph Frank Ponton, 26, Gillett, after he was charged with child abuse recklessly causing great harm, misdemeanor resisting or obstructing an officer, and two counts of disorderly conduct, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Jan. 6. His initial appearance was adjourned until Jan. 16.

Proceedings of Jan. 6

Arraignment was scheduled for Jan. 17 for Damian Lee Murphy, 18, Abrams, after Judge Michael T. Judge denied a defense motion to dismiss the charge of homicide by negligent operation of a motor vehicle in the Aug. 14 crash that killed Albert W. Reppert, 71, of Midlothian, Illinois.

Stephanie Lynn, 30, Oconto, was sentenced to 18 months in prison, followed by two years of extended supervision, for possession of methamphetamine in connection with an incident that occurred Dec. 19, 2018. A related charge of maintaining a drug trafficking place was dismissed but read into the record. Judge Michael T. Judge scheduled ruled that the sentence must be served consecutive to any other sentence she may receive in other cases. During her extended supervision, Lynn

must maintain absolute sobriety, and she must complete any assessment required by the Department of Corrections and follow through with any and all recommendations.

Kristopher Sean Reisert, 27, Lakewood, pleaded guilty to strangulation-suffocation and misdemeanor disorderly conduct, in connection with an incident that occurred Oct. 29. Misdemeanor charges of battery and criminal damage to property were dismissed in a plea agreement. Judge Jay N. Conley scheduled sentencing for Feb. 18 and ordered a presentence investigation.

A jury trial was rescheduled to April 14 for Anthony P. Pack, 30, Gillett, who is charged with strangulation-suffocation and misdemeanor battery and disorderly conduct in connection with a domestic incident that allegedly occurred Oct. 18. A final pre-trial conference was scheduled for April 6.

A Jan. 7 jury trial was rescheduled to March 10 for David J. SanRoman, 43, Oconto, who is charged with strangulation-suffocation and misdemeanor battery and disorderly conduct in connection with a domestic incident that allegedly occurred April 1. A final pre-trial conference was scheduled for March 6.
