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# Annual quilt show opens Saturday at WOWSPACE

## Exhibit expected to keep patrons 'In Stitches'

**WITTENBERG** — The annual Walls of Wittenberg quilt show is set to open Saturday and will be on display at the WOWSPACE for the next three weekends.

On Saturday, a guest lecturer will be speaking at 1 p.m. at the Wittenberg Community Center, 208 W. Vinal St. Nancy Kunst-Smith is a quilt appraiser from Stevens Point and will cover the topic of how and why quilts should be appraised.

Mary Koeppel has been in charge of the quilt show for the past three years. She belongs to the Quilting Friends of Hatley group, and many of those members are helping her. Many have entered quilts, some will help with the registration and installation, others will help with the end of the show.

"It takes a lot of work to put on this kind of show, and I'm so grateful to have help from my fellow quilters," Koeppel said, who anticipates about 30-40 entries.

Koeppel noted that in addition to the actual show, there will also be special displays including a signature quilt, a quilt made with Army fatigues and a selection of honor quilts sewn for veterans.

"I'm excited to have the specialty quilts on loan," Koeppel said. "It helps to show the variety of quilt making."

The 1905 Redwork signature quilt was created by Methodist church women from the Wittenberg and Stevens Point areas and is on loan from the Wittenberg Area Historical Society. Koeppel said that when people moved away from the area, it was a tradition to create a red and white quilt with signatures embroidered into the fabric so they would remember the friends they left behind.

Koeppel noted that although most of the women have passed, there will be many familiar family names to see.

Another quilt, by Debra Court, of Bear Creek, features the uniform shirts worn by her husband, Robert, from when he served in the Army. According to Court, her husband complained about the closet space being taken

up by his old Army uniforms, and he wanted her to get rid of them.

Court took two of his shirts — a lighter green one from his time in basic training, the darker green shirt was what he wore in Vietnam. She cut out the pockets, the collars and the cuffs and incorporated them into the rest of the quilt squares. With the help of a machine that can transfer images to fabric, Court was able to take four pictures from her husband's time in the Army and add them to the quilt.

She said that her husband wasn't keen on the idea of his shirts being used in a quilt but was surprised at the finished quilt and emotional when he saw she had added the pictures.

The Quilting Friends of Hatley make a variety of different sized quilts for local veterans, Koeppel said. A few examples of those will also be on display.

According to Koeppel, the main exhibit, though not judged, is eligible for monetary prizes. First, second and third awards will be given out based on people's choices. An addition prize

will be given as an Award of Excellence to one quilter, as determined by a committee of local quilters.

Melissa Young owned Grant's March quilt shop in Wausau. When she passed last year, her daughter, Kate, settled the estate by donating several shop items to Koeppel to use as prizes for the quilt show.

Sponsored by Walls of Wittenberg, Applewood Lane Alpacas and Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative, this is the sixth time WOW has produced a non-juried show open to all quilters.

Admission to the show and lecture is free.

# Murders hidden in the wrath of a tornado

This week, I read “The Breathmaker” by Alice Blanchard, and it was amazing. The city of Paradise, Oklahoma, boasts a population of about 22,000 but still maintains a small-town feel.

Police Chief Charlie Grover grew up there, but life hasn't been easy. At

37, he carries many painful memories plus the scars from severe burns sustained when a fire destroyed his family's home, killing his mother and little sister. Compounding his misery is

the recent death of his beloved wife, Mia. Now he's trying to be a good dad to Sophie while working the crazy hours of a cop.

Paradise is situated in the middle of “tornado alley,” but few of the residents have basements or storm shelters. It's early April when a freak twister slams into the area.

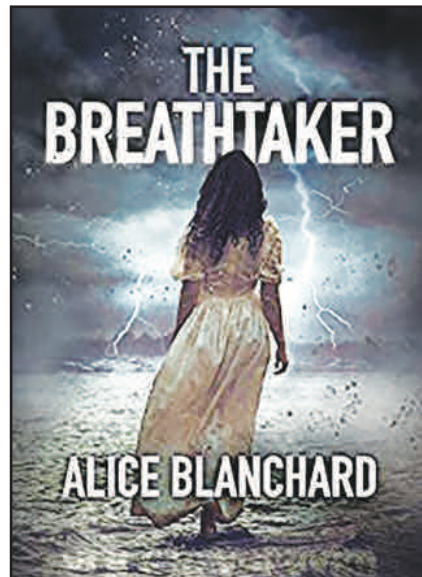
Charlie surveys a path of death and destruction when he gets a call from his assistant chief, Lester Deere. He's at the home of Dan and Jenna Peterson and reports that Dan, Jenna and Danielle are dead.

Others have been killed in the tornado, but something about these deaths seems off. Charlie follows his instincts and orders an autopsy. The coroner finds that they were impaled on handmade weapons. He also finds defensive wounds, but he is appalled to see that each has had a tooth pulled and replaced with an older tooth.

Who would risk his life to murder during a tornado? While the weather is quiet, Charlie works other cases and tries to keep Sophie away from local bad boy Boone Pritchett. Tornado season brings another storm and more murders.

Charlie is convinced that whoever is doing the killing knows a whole lot about predicting where tornadoes will touch down. He contacts the Wind Function Facility in Montoya and meets Rick Kripner and Willa Bellman. The pair uses the wind tunnels to test many things, including storm proofing materials.

Through them, he learns a great deal about how tornadoes are rated

and tracked. Willa and Rick are both avid storm chasers and eagerly drop everything to follow potential “high F” storms. Charlie is sure that the killer is a storm chaser. So is his estranged father, Noah.

Each time he thinks of his father, Charlie remembers his parents fighting and the many beatings that left his back scarred. He's never asked, but believes Noah set the fire that fateful night. Noah was a drunken monster, but was he a cold blooded killer?

As Charlie and his department chase down leads, they unearth the secrets and clues. Contact with nearby sheriffs turns up additional information, and he develops a picture of the killer.

When a new storm begins to form, Charlie discovers that his daughter is missing. As soon as he sees that she's not with Boone, he knows that she's with the killer and he's taking her directly into the deadly storm. For once in their lives, Noah and Charlie, work together to intercept the killer before he harms Sophie or the storm takes her.

The climax is descriptive and “breath-taking.” Blanchard has other books featuring mysteries combined with the furies of nature, and I think I'll try to find one.

### VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. **Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.**

**You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing.**

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot by mail or in person.

**Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail**

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee by mail is:  
5:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 13, 2020.

**Note:** Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

**Voting an absentee ballot in person**

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified below for casting an absentee ballot in person.

## VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their municipal clerk. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

**You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing or online at MyVote.wi.gov.**

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter or you may apply for an absentee ballot online at [myVote.wi.gov](http://myVote.wi.gov). Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot in person, by mail, by fax, by email or at [MyVote.wi.gov](http://MyVote.wi.gov).

### Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is:  
5 pm on the fifth day before the election, Thursday, February 13, 2020.

**Note:** Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

### Voting an absentee ballot in person

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

It is important your mood can be affected by the weather. Winter is one time of the year of sadness and depression that can occur in winter. In fact, many of us have seasonal episodes or even often with depression that is some degree, but if the sadness and depression goes beyond the "winter blues", that person may have Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD).

## Symptoms of Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD):

- Sad, anxious or "empty" feelings
- Feelings of hopelessness and a pessimism
- Feelings of guilt, worthlessness or helplessness
- Irritability, restlessness
- Loss of interest or pleasure in activities and socializing
- Fatigue and decreased energy
- Difficulty concentrating, remembering details and making decisions
- Difficulty sleeping or oversleeping
- Changes in weight
- Thoughts of death or suicide

Did you know that about 10% of people who live in states with long winter nights are at high risk for seasonal affective disorder? In addition, seasonal affective disorder has been during the last years of winter and winter more often in winter than ever.

Fortunately, there are ways to combat the disorder and there is good treatment to manage symptoms of SAD. Here are the following:

- Get enough sleep
- Eat healthy foods
- Exercise more often

If these remedies aren't enough, the following options may be needed. If you have health care provider:

- Light therapy. This involves a special lamp with a very bright light that simulates light from the

sun. If light therapy is going to help, it will relieve symptoms within days to two weeks.
