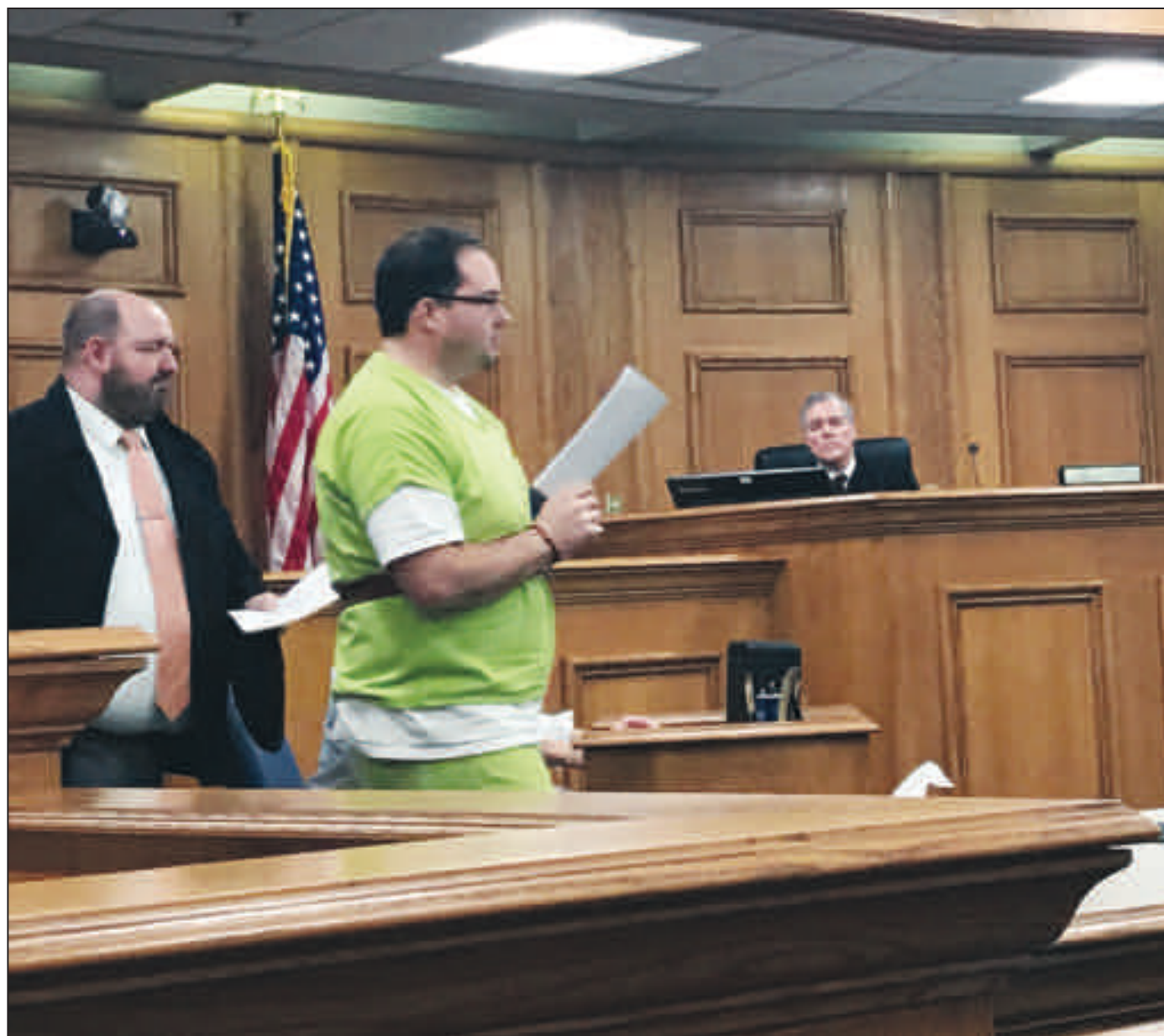

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Preliminary hearing scheduled in Beaton case

Bond set at \$10,000 cash

OCONTO — The attorney for James Beaton said during a Feb. 17 court appearance that a number of factors cast doubt on the strength of the state's case against the former Gillett mayor.

Beaton, 39, of Appleton, is charged with 13 counts of theft in a business setting in connection with money he allegedly misappropriated for his own use while managing Legacy Funeral Chapels, now known by its original name of Kuehl Funeral Home.

District Attorney Robert Edward Burke asked Judge Jay N. Conley to establish a \$150,000 signature bond, but Conley said he felt a cash bond was more appropriate and set bail at \$10,000 cash.

Randall Walter Petrouske II, Beaton's defense attorney, pointed out that Beaton has filed suit against the funeral home's former owners in Marinette County, suggesting that Beaton would not be a flight risk and has a vested interest in seeing the court cases through.

"There's a substantial dispute over whether Mr. Beaton was in fact an owner of this company ... and the alleged victims in this case are the defendants," Petrouske said. "I think it casts some doubt on the strength of the state's case in the sense that there's substantial dispute over the factual allegations."

Conley said the offenses involve well over \$100,000 and provide an incentive not to appear back in court without at least some cash bond being set.

"These are property offenses. They're nonviolent offenses. But as property offenses go, they're at the

top of the food chain, so to speak," he said.

A preliminary hearing of the charges was scheduled for 10 a.m. March 26 before Judge Michael T. Judge.

In the Marinette County civil case, Beaton alleges that Russell and Karen Walker breached three agreements signed when Beaton joined their funeral home business in October 2016. The court documents also allege wrongful eviction in addition to other claims related to their business relationship and the sale.

Gillett nears superintendent decision

Todd Carlson will retire this spring

GILLETT — The Gillett School Board might select its next superintendent of schools as soon as this week, the board's search consultant said Friday.

David Honish, the CESA 8 admin-

istrator who has been working with the school district, said the board interviewed six candidates Feb. 17-18 and invited two finalists back for second interviews, which were scheduled for Monday morning.

The callbacks were offered to Troy Edwards, principal of Hillcrest Primary School in Shawano, and Todd Hencsik, middle school principal in Campbellsport, Honish said.

The person chosen will succeed Todd Carlson, who is retiring at the end of this school year after six years

at the helm.

The six semi-finalists were picked from a group of 15 educators who submitted applications, Honish said.

"We're really pleased with the quality of candidates," he said. "The board has some good choices."

Staff representatives joined the board in the interviews last week, and National Honor Society students were to have a role in the follow-up interviews, Honish said.

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Machickanee draw-down planned for this fall

Board gets an update on Healthy Waters initiative

OCONTO — A one-year draw-down of the Machickanee Flowage was among the water quality projects discussed Thursday as the County Board got an update on the progress of the Oconto County Healthy Waters program.

"This is a proposal, and it's still a work in progress, but we're working for a draw-down starting in September of this year until September of next year," said Steve Dupuis of the Machickanee Advancement Association, one of four lake associations that reported on studies and projects affecting 27 of Oconto County's 375 lakes.

The draw-down will help battle invasive species and weeds.

Lowering the water flow through the Stiles dam for a year "would add compaction to the flowage, and it would also freeze out some of these invasive species we have on the flowage — not to mention some of the other plant life which is clogging up the waterways," Dupuis said.

The project is being planned in cooperation with the Oconto Electric Cooperative and Federal Energy Commission.

Two years into a program where the county helps lake associations fund studies and projects through the DNR, more than \$581,813 has been granted with more to come, said Ken Dolata, of the county Land Conservation Division. Smaller county grants and private dollars from the lake associations are also part of the mix.

"We award our funding before they apply to the DNR, so they get extra points on their application," Dolata said. "It's a statewide competition. It's getting harder and harder to get these grants because so many organizations are applying for them."

Dale Mohr of the University of Wisconsin-Extension traced the roots of the Oconto County Healthy Waters program to five or six years ago when local sportsmen, farmers, ag businesses and landowners convened to

talk about water quality.

"We had a lot to talk about, whether it's 1,000 miles of streams or our 375 lakes," Mohr said. "It doesn't matter who you are. You could be using it for your business, or drinking it or using it to recreate. But we really wanted to have the healthiest waters in Wisconsin, so that's the rally cry."

After a 24-month study, the effort has focused on the 61 lakes with public access, which Mohr said are the most endangered by Eurasian water-milfoil and other plant species. With 27 studies in progress, the goal is to cover the remaining 34 lakes as well.

"We're trying to get everybody on the same sheet so we understand what's happening on their lakes by the end of the process," Mohr said.

Steve Heimerman, president of the Oconto County Lakes and Water Way Association, said it's not just a local issue.

"Lakes throughout Wisconsin are under assault," Heimerman said. "Aquatic invasive species are probably the worst issue, because they cost an awful lot to deal with and they create a lot of problems. We're getting way too many nutrients into our waters, algae blooms and excessive weed growth, and in many cases way over-development on our shorelines."

Control projects for any one of these issues are very expensive, so lake associations can't deal with them on their own, he said. Oconto County generally has smaller lakes — 49 of the 61 lakes are less than 200 acres — with not that many property owners.

"You really don't have a strong population of people, so you don't have the amount of property owners that can can foot the bill to pay for these things," Heimerman said.

He urged the County Board to finish the Oconto County Lakes Project, maintain the Healthy Waters cost-share program for the long-term and consider hiring a county staff professional whose sole job would be waterway health management.

"When we only have 10% of the population on a typical lake that is capable of working on the problems, much less half of them being gone for the winter, having professional help would be greatly appreciated," Heimerman said.

At the very least, lakes quality needs to be maintained to preserve Oconto County as a tourist destination, he said.

"If people can't use the lake, they're not going to visit a lake. If people can't use the lake, they're probably not going to buy a property out there," Heimerman said, citing studies that indicate residential property values go down as perceived water quality goes down.

After the presentation, several supervisors spoke in support of the water quality initiative.

"If we don't step up front and speak out and actually do something physical, we're going to lose it," Supervisor Ken Behrend said. "If all we do is talk and not do anything and ignore our water, yes, you will lose your real estate, and yes, you will lose your livelihood, and yes, the recreation people will go someplace else, and this county will lose a whole lot of money."

Members of the board's Land Conservation committee described what they saw when the panel took a tour of the lakes last fall.

"I was amazed at how bad it is," Supervisor Leonard Wahl said.

"It actually looked like you took green carpet and went over the top of the water," added Supervisor Bart Schindel.

County Board approves ATV/UTV route segments

Riders may travel county roads between trail segments

OCONTO — All-terrain vehicle riders will be able to travel legally along 15 stretches of Oconto County roadway after action taken by the County Board on Thursday.

The measures taken without discussion allow for ATV and utility vehicles to traverse as much as 2.36 miles on county roads to get from one segment of the county's ATV/UTV trail network to another.

The new ATV/UTV routes recommended by the board's Highway Committee and unanimously approved by the full County Board:

- County Road A from West River Road to Yashinski Road, 0.5 miles, and from County Road AB to North Porcupine Lake Road, 1.02 miles.
- All of County Road EE, 2.36 miles, and County Road D from the north part to the south part of Cross Road, 0.02 miles.
- County Road F at Club House Lane to Twin Pines Road, 1.14 miles, and County Road F at Club House Lane to Old 32 Road, 0.44 miles.
- County Road F on U.S. Forest

Service land to Knowles Creek Road, 0.2 miles, and from Powers Lane to Waubee Lake Drive, 0.2 miles.

- County Road F from the Marinette County Line to McCaslin Mountain Campground, 0.35 miles.
- County Road G at St. Bernadette Road to North Kelly Lake Road, 1.4 miles.
- County Road J from North River Road to Chicken Shack Road, 2 miles.
- County Road K West from Yatso Road to Yatso Road, 0.05 miles, and from Yatso Road North to White Lake Road, 1 mile.
- County Road S from Doran Street to County Road N, 0.25 miles, and all of County Roads N and NN.
- The County Road T road ditch from Pine Ridge Road to Pine Tree Road, 0.11 miles, and County Road T from Rapp Road to Presbyterian Road, 0.1 miles, from McCaslin Road to Townsend Dam Road, 0.07 miles, and from Rudy Road to Cassler Drive, 0.07 miles.
- County Road T from state Highway 64 to U.S. Forest Service 3028, 0.5 miles.
- County Road W at Bonita Road West to Naylor Road, 1.6 miles, and at Old Shingle Mill Road West to Mountain Lakes Road, 0.5 miles.
- County Road W from Nelligan Lake Lane East to Chapel Lane, 1.4 miles.
- County Road Y from Porter Avenue East to Chapel Lane, 0.9 miles.
- County Road Z from Ucil Lake to Marl Lake, 0.25 miles.

Man accused of pointing gun at women, child

Judge describes the charges as frightening

OCONTO — Bond was set at \$25,000 cash for a Crivitz area man charged with pointing a gun at two women and a toddler during an argument Feb. 16 in Lena.

Steven M. Schmitz, 66, was charged Feb. 17 in Oconto County Circuit Court with three counts of first-degree recklessly endangering safety in connection with the incident, which occurred as one of the women helped the other move out of

a residence in Lena.

A third woman came home from work as they were packing and accused them of stealing some of her belongings, according to the criminal complaint. At that point, Schmitz arrived and joined the argument, reportedly yelling profanities at the women.

During the altercation, Schmitz pointed a gun in each woman's face and also pointed the weapon at one woman's 2-year-old son, the complaint said.

District Attorney Edward Daniel Burke asked that bail be set at \$10,000 cash, but Judge Jay N. Conley, saying the allegations were frightening, ordered the higher bond.

Schmitz's initial court appearance was adjourned until March 12.

County Board creates flooding project account

OCONTO — With land along the shore of Green Bay threatened by flooding this spring due to record-high Great Lakes water levels, the County Board on Thursday transferred \$50,000 to create a Southern Oconto County Flooding Project Account as part of the Emergency Management Department budget.

The new account will pay for such projects as the Highway Department's filling 11,200 sandbags at a cost of \$12,000, for example, Administrative Coordinator Kevin Hamann told the board.

Some sandbagging may be needed near the courthouse, Hamann said.

"When we did have that flooding (in Oconto) over the New Year, the water got close to the courthouse here," he said. "We may have to do

some other miscellaneous things, such as reimbursing the recycling facility because we are housing the sandbags there, etc."

The money was transferred from the board's contingency fund, but Hamann hopes to recoup some of the funds by charging municipalities and sanitary districts at a slight discount for filled and unfilled sandbags.

The sandbags can be purchased from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Mondays at the recycling facility, 153 Evergreen Road, Oconto, or other times by appointment, he said. The resolution creating the special account passed on a unanimous vote.

The southern part of the county is not alone in facing possible flooding: A flood warning was issued late last week after the Oconto River reached flood stage near Gillett due to ice jams.

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Local Supreme Court numbers reflect statewide result

Kelly, Karofsky advance to April 7 ballot

Oconto County residents agreed with the rest of the state in sending Daniel Kelly and Jill Karofsky to the April ballot in the Feb. 17 spring primary election for state Supreme Court.

The unofficial local numbers are 2,305 for Kelly, the incumbent justice, and 852 for Karofsky, a Dane County judge. Marquette University professor Ed Fallone trailed with 274 votes.

The two candidates will square off for a 10-year term in the April 7 general election.

Oconto County Clerk Kim Pytleski said the election, the first using machines purchased last month, went smoothly.

"The snow slowed us down a little bit, but everything went well with all the new equipment," Pytleski said. "I heard very positive feedback."

She estimated about 11% of voters came to the polls.

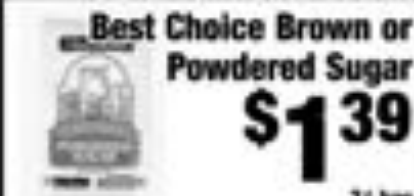

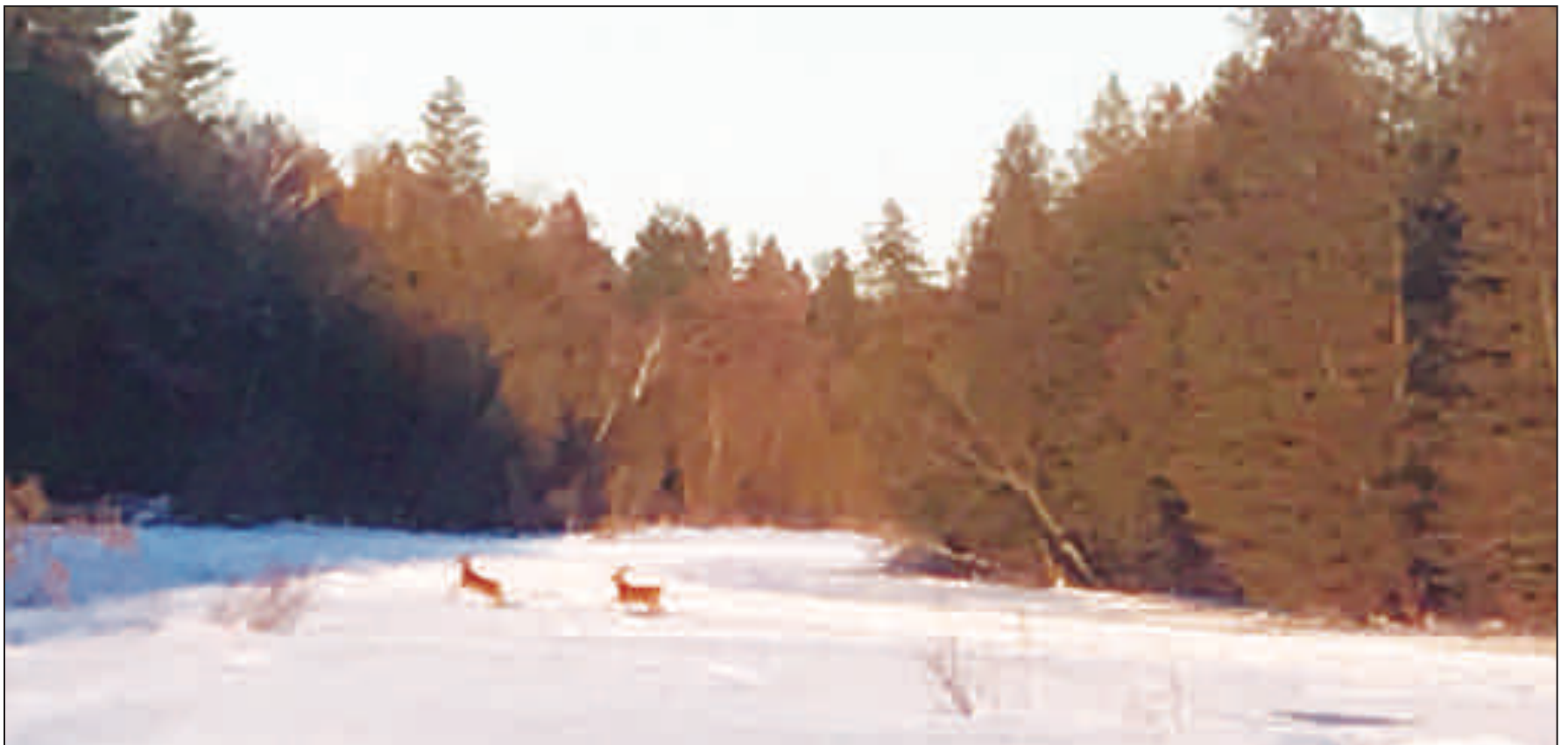

Suring student group gets mini-grant from DPI

MADISON — The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction has awarded a \$1,000 mini-grant to the Suring Junior High Student Council for its leadership role in addressing alcohol, drugs, and vaping challenges in its local schools.

Four Panthers qualify for state meet

Pankratz, Konitzer,
Stary, Whiting will
represent Oconto Falls

OCONTO FALLS — Oconto Falls High School wrestlers Graeson Pankratz, Brendan Konitzer, Aidan Stary and Clayton Whiting all qualified for the state tournament after placing in the top three of their respective weight classes Saturday at the Division 2 Oconto Falls sectional.

Pankratz and Whiting, both sophomores, placed second in the 106- and 170-pound weight classes, respectively. Stary, a junior, and Konitzer, a senior, qualified after third-place finishes at 160 and 113 pounds, respectively.

Pankratz had a busy day on the mat, wrestling five matches. He started the day with a 9-8 decision win before dropping an 8-5 decision.

With his season on the line, Pankratz claimed a 4-1 decision before solidifying his spot at state with a second-period pin. He ended the day with a 3-0 decision win to jump from third place to second.

"It's going to be very rewarding," said Pankratz, of making it to state with three teammates. "It's rewarding for the others guys also. Two of them (Konitzer and Stary) never made it to the state tournament, (and) I never really got to experience anything like this. It's going to be fun experiencing the state tournament with three other guys. It's going to be a fun weekend."

Whiting suffered his first loss of the season — a 6-5 decision — to start the day, but he rebounded nicely.

He kept his season alive with a 17-4 major decision win before locking up a state spot with a 24-9 technical fall win in the third-place match. Whiting then earned a 23-8 technical fall win to jump up to second place.

Konitzer earned a pair of 4-3 decision wins to advance to the first-place match. He was pinned in the first period of the title match and then dropped a 5-0 decision in the second-place match.

"Qualifying for state as a senior means a lot to me," said Konitzer,

whose goal is to place at state. "Knowing that my last high school matches will be wrestled at state is a great accomplishment for me."

Like Pankratz, Stary also wrestled five matches. The junior started out by winning a 9-1 major decision, but then he was pinned in the third-period

of his next match.

Stary fought off elimination with a 12-2 major decision win and then locked up a state spot with a 5-2 decision win. He was pinned in the first period of the third-place match.

"Qualifying to me means the world," said Stary, who also thanked Whiting for being his practice partner this season. "It has been a goal of mine since my brother, Noah, was in high school. I almost think he was more excited than me that I made it."

Eight other Panther wrestlers also competed in the sectional.

Oconto Falls' Tyler Budz (132) finished the day with a 1-2 record, starting with a second-period pin before back-to-back losses. Alec Halvorsen (220) went 0-2 on the day, being pinned in both matches.

Elijah Zielinski (285), Matt Loberger (195), Jacob Kaminski (182), Weston Borkovec (152), Luke Trepanier (126) and Jaden Ganter (120) all lost their only matches on the day.

Pankratz, Konitzer, Stary and Whiting will prepare for the 77th annual WIAA Individual Wrestling Championship Tournament, which runs Thursday through Saturday at the Kohl Center in Madison.

Division 2 competitors will first wrestle in preliminaries Thursday at 7 p.m.

Pankratz, who has a 26-12 record going into state, will wrestle Lodi sophomore Parker Heintz (34-12) on Thursday. The winner will advance to take on Neillsville/Greenwood/Loyal freshman Luke Dux (34-4) on Friday.

Konitzer (32-13) will take on Spencer/Columbus Catholic senior Ashton Ackman (38-4) in his first state match. The winner will advance to Friday, where Viroqua senior Josh Frye (44-4) awaits.

Stary (28-18) will wrestle Berlin senior Preston Morgan (41-3) on Thursday, with the winner advancing to face St. Croix Central sophomore Devin Wasley (42-1) on Friday.

Konitzer (113) and Whiting (182) each earned wins by pin for Oconto Falls.

Ganter (120) won by technical fall, while Pankratz (106) won a 6-4 decision in overtime. Diego Estavilla (170) won by forfeit for the Panthers.
