Another dose of mayhem and mystery with Plum

The formula stays the same but the wit and humor still delivers

I'll be the first to admit that all of Janet Evanovich's Stephanie Plum novels follow a similar plot formula, but I still get a kick out of them.

In "Turbo Twenty-Three," Stephanie Plum is still struggling to make ends meet working for her cousin, Vinnie, as a bounty hunter. With the questionable help of former 'ho Lula, she manages to get into some strange situations while chasing FTAs.

Her love life hasn't changed. Neither Morelli or Ranger are willing to make a commitment.

Stephanie really isn't ready either.

One night, Stephanie and Lula are hoping to capture hijacker Larry Virgil when things go awry. Larry spots them and steals Lula's precious Firebird. She gives chase using the Bogart Ice Cream truck he'd just stolen. After the inevitable crash, the cops open doors and out rolls a dead body covered in chocolate and nuts.

It's Arnold Zigler, head of Bogart's human resources.

Almost on cue, Ranger shows up. His Rangeman Security Co. has been hired by Harry Bogart to find out who has been sabotaging their ice cream factory.

They've experienced tainted ice cream, broken freezers and other problems, but Zigler's death has him terrified.

Bogart insists that his arch rival and cousin, Mo Morris, is behind the treachery, but Ranger has his doubts so he has Stephanie work in the factory to gather information.

She meets a decent kid working the loading dock, the very unhappy Bogart Ice Cream Clown, and inventory manager Gus, but learns nothing about the sabotage.

Next, Ranger gets her into Mo Morris's factory with the same results. The next day, Gus is found

dead in the freezer at Bogart's. This way more serious than an industry rivalry so Ranger digs deeper

into everyone associated with Bogart.

That's when a man she is sure is the Bogart Clown breaks into her apartment and nearly kills her.

As the case finally begins to come together, Ranger learns

that Bogart's problems began after Kwan Soon was hired to make things more efficient, but the operations started to fail.

When Bogart's wife takes a sudden vacation to Disney World, and Harry disappears, Ranger knows where to find him. Someone has Harry Bogart running scared.

In no time, Ranger and Stephanie board a private jet and head for Disney World. She's thrilled, but the theme park doesn't really suit Ranger's personality.

He does learn that Kwan Soon is behind the sabotage and deaths in order to force Bogart to ship drugs in his ice cream cups. Now Ranger has to find Soon and put him out of business.

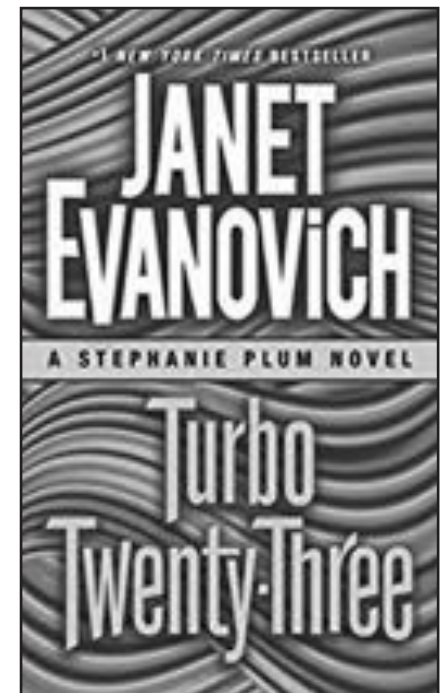
Meanwhile, Stephanie and Lula manage to bring in a few FTA's on their own, but others require a little help from Ranger or his men.

Nothing in Stephanie's life is simple or straightforward.

Ever the entrepreneur, Lula has come up with a "fool proof" idea for a reality show based on Naked and Afraid. Set in Trenton, it will star Lula and Randy Briggs. Briggs is a "little person" with a big attitude who doesn't get along with anyone, but thinks the idea could

ment at Resch Lanes.

"Kathy approached me, and I told them how it could be done," said Resch. "They pulled off a nice event. It's going to grow."

According to Resch, having tournaments like this one are fun for him because they bring in a lot of people who aren't league bowlers, and he gets the chance to meet new people.

The tournament had 16 three-person teams bowling in two shifts Saturday. Each team paid a \$30 registration fee. First- and second-place winners in each shift took home a gift basket worth \$150, and there were other prizes given to the rest of the bowlers, said Underzagst.

Mike Knab, a local bowler, explained why it was important for him and his wife, Elaine, to participate in this event.

"When we moved here from Pennsylvania eight years ago, we moved my father into Homme, and they took

such good care of him," said Knab. "Participating in this fundraiser is just one small way we can give back."

Schultz Farms of Bowler, Green Bay Packaging, American Family Insurance and the Wittenberg Chamber of Commerce sponsored the event. There were also 38 raffle baskets that had been donated by other people and businesses.

The Pinnacle Team of Thrivent Financial provided matching funds, up to \$2,500. Tyler Jozwiak, manager of the Thrivent office in Pulaski, said

that Thrivent prefers putting money into the communities for events like these, rather than investing in more traditional forms of advertising. The Pinnacle Team has offices in Antigo, Hatley and Pulaski.

The purpose of the Homme Home Foundation is to raise and manage money to be used to help residents with extra social programs. A new van to help transport residents to events would be a great help, according to Underzagst, who also plans on writing grants to help cover the cost.

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Kids benefit from reading to man's best friend

'Read to a Dog' program meets at Tigerton library

TIGERTON — The "Read to a Dog" program began at the Tigerton Library six months ago. It was something that Sheri Fuhrman wanted to do with her dog, Daisy, once they were certified as a pet therapy team by the Alliance of Therapy Dogs in July. Fuhrman was pleased that Tigerton librarian Caitlin Witter was interested in having them come monthly, and she worked with them to determine the best time to have the program.

It was decided to do it on the first Friday of each month, beginning at 3:30 p.m., which seems to be working out well, according to Witter. She also noted that interest in this program has grown. Reading to Daisy is getting to be more popular as time goes by, said Witter. Both the library and Fuhrman promote it on their Facebook pages.

Fuhrman explained that even her sister came one afternoon; she

lives in a larger community where this type of program is not offered. Fuhrman is enjoying the small, close-knit community of Tigerton, and she is overjoyed to be part of a literacy program that supports all kids. Having them read to a dog helps kids relax, she explained, as Daisy won't make fun of them or care if they pronounce a word incorrectly.

"That brings development," she stressed. "It just means so much to me. I've seen how many benefits it brings to the brain waves, and it's incredible. The interaction to me is incredible. I love seeing how humans and dogs interact. It's fun that I am able to see the interaction through this program."

"I had a problem with reading as a child, specifically reading comprehension," Fuhrman said. "I wanted to have Daisy and myself available to the Tigerton library, so kids could read to a dog. The research behind it shows that it has many benefits for children."

Fuhrman rescued Daisy from the Shawano Humane Society five years ago.

Becoming certified and taking part in this program might have been impossible unless Daisy had the correct disposition. Daisy and Fuhrman went to Applewood Kennels in Thornton for the basic dog training and Good Canine Citizen training.

"Daisy is such a sweet dog, calm and loving and can tell if someone is feeling down," Fuhrman explained. "I am so glad she is able to do this, that she is sociable."

Fuhrman said Daisy is the best dog she has ever had. She has to tell people that Daisy may lick, because it is required of her by the Alliance. She had not corrected Daisy on that behavior because the trainer told her not to, as that tells the dog that it is not OK to be affectionate.

One boy wondered how much it cost to read to Daisy.

"Nothing," Fuhrman answered. "Pick out a book and read to her. She will love that, and she will not correct your reading ability or judge you."

"Ten Little Kisses" was a book read by Brianna Schmidt, while Fuhrman, Daisy and Gavin Kowalski listened. Kowalski has a speech impediment and uses an iPad to communicate. With it, he could tell Fuhrman and Daisy about his farm and what animals he had, plus what he was having for supper.

Fuhrman told him she was pleased that he came and hopes he will come every time. It means the world to me, she stressed.

With his iPad, he answered: "Thank you, see you."

One boy read a Mutts cartoon book to Daisy. He said he likes dogs and has some of his own, but he also likes reading to Daisy.

"I have to be careful with Daisy when we are coming," Fuhrman said. "I can't tell her too soon that we are coming to the library, or otherwise she is just sitting by the door waiting. I bathe her the day before or the morning of, and brush her teeth. I think she gets the idea when I give her a bath, she knows she is going somewhere special."

"But when I say, 'We are going to the library. Are you ready to work?' then she is excited. When we get here, she comes and sits on this rug. This is her place, and she loves it," said Fuhrman.

She and husband Mike Fuhrman have been married for seven years. They have a 4-month-old son, Matthew, and they farm near Tigerton.
