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District moves to next step on SCHS expansion

Final bids expected to come back in April

SHAWANO — The full Shawano School Board received a briefing Monday on a proposed expansion of Shawano Community High School that could cost as much as \$3.3 million.

The plan is to take most, if not all, of the cost out of the district's fund balance, which was just under \$7.56 million at the end of the fiscal year in June. That amount is equal to about 24.48% of the district's expenditures for the school year, an amount well above what financial experts recommend a school district have, which is 10-15%.

Should the current price tag wind up being the final cost for the project, the fund balance would be reduced to about 13.5%, depending on whether the district taps into the fund balance for any other projects.

The school district is planning to expand athletics and arts facilities at the high school, with much of the infrastructure being almost 25 years old and in need of upgrading. On the athletics side, the promise of adequately-sized training facilities when the school was first built in 1997 came up a little short.

The district spent much of 2019 exploring the possibility of team-

ing up with the city of Shawano to build a new recreation center that both entities could use. That idea was quashed by a community survey that showed almost two-thirds of the respondents were against the idea.

Jeff Easter, the district's facilities director, told the board that many aspects remain in the planning stage, but he hopes to have sufficient feedback by the end of the week so that he can create a request for proposals to be sent out around the middle of this month. He plans to have the bids ready for the board to vote on April 20 in the hopes of breaking ground on the expansion before school ends in June, although it's likely work would still be going on come September, when the new school year begins.

"We're looking at expanding the high school in both the art area, like

the theater and music, and over on the athletic side to create a weight room and a wrestling area," Easter said.

More than 60% of the \$3.3 million project — which Easter said might be a conservative estimate — would be new construction, but the cost for the athletic facilities versus the arts facilities is split almost down the middle. Easter also wants to tap contractors who can both design and build the project in order to keep costs manageable.

While the district has the money in the fund balance to complete the work, it still plans to reach out to the high school's music and athletic boosters to see if they wish to provide some funding.

"We're looking to improve some things that are out of date, and we need some significant dollars to make that happen," Easter said.

The district has already toured some schools to look at what they've done with their performing arts centers, weight rooms and training centers, and Easter said more tours were planned for this week.

Board member Diane Hoffman recommended that once final plans are put together, they should receive the blessing of the district's buildings and grounds committee before the request for proposals goes out. The next committee meeting is tentatively scheduled for March 18, which would fit in with Easter's timeline.

Shawano, in top 3, to find out if it won in April

SHAWANO — The skills of four Shawano Community High School students are being praised at home after they made it into the top three in a state SkillsUSA Teamworks contest in their first year competing in the specific contest.

According to SkillsUSA adviser

Greg Brown, SCHS won't know for sure which place it has finished until late April, when the state SkillsUSA conference and a number of other competitions takes place. If the foursome gets first place, they will continue on to the National SkillsUSA convention this summer in Kentucky.

In the February competition, teams of four students had three days to build a construction project. The project for this contest was a bathroom.

The students have to show proficiency with reading detailed blueprints and special instructions that were presented at an orientation.

SCHS students Spencer Engelhardt, Austin Dillenburg, Wylee Springborn and Keenan Raddant worked to combine carpentry, electri-

cal, plumbing and masonry skills to complete the project. They were also judged on adhering to building codes, job site safety and more.

"We had 13 hours to build a little mockup of a bathroom, 4-by-8 (feet) with the framing, plumbing, electrical and siding," Dillenburg said, noting that there was only a 20-by-20-foot space in which to work. "We just had to know what everyone was doing and work around each other."

Brown noted that the competition took place at a home show in Milwaukee, so besides concentrating on their own work and dealing with building inspectors, the students also had to contend with onlookers eager to see what they were working on.

"It was good to see these guys come together and develop a game plan the night before and analyze the plans and figure out who was going to do what, when and how," Brown said. "You never know what you're to get for a buildout."

Besides having standard building skills, the students had to show they could problem-solve in case they got themselves into a corner, Brown added.

This is the fifth year that SkillsUSA has offered the Teamworks contest in Wisconsin, but it is the first time SCHS has competed. There were about a dozen teams competing this year.

Woman arrested with record amount of meth

SHAWANO — A Green Bay woman arrested last week was in possession of the largest amount of methamphetamine ever seized from a single person in Shawano County.

District Attorney Greg Parker called the 62.2 grams of meth a "bell ringer" during the woman's initial appearance in Shawano-Menominee County Circuit Court on Feb. 26.

Brittany J. Vlach, 29, was ordered held on a \$20,000 cash bond set by Judge James Habeck. She is due back in court for an adjourned initial appearance on March 16.

Vlach was pulled over by sheriff's deputies in the town of Hart-

land on Feb. 25 for speeding.

A K9 sniff of the vehicle led to deputies finding two baggies of meth, as well as drug paraphernalia and \$78 in cash.

Vlach has been charged with a felony count of possession with intent to deliver methamphetamine, which carries a maximum possible penalty of 40 years in prison and a \$100,000 fine.

She is also charged with felony counts of identity theft for allegedly initially giving deputies a fake name and bail jumping, as well as misdemeanor counts of operating after revocation, obstructing an officer and possession of drug paraphernalia.

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. *Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.*

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing.

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot by mail or in person.

Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee by mail is:
5:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 2, 2020.

Note: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified below for casting an absentee ballot in person.

Fear spreads faster than coronavirus

As masks disappear, local officials suggest better options

Prepare, don't panic.

That's the overall recommendation from Dr. Paul Pritchard, chief quality officer and vice president at Prevea Health, for dealing with the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

The disease has been declared a "public health emergency of international concern" by the World Health Organization. It creates cold or flu-like symptoms in most people, but some individuals with other health issues develop serious health problems.

Prevea, as with some other health care systems, screens patients for infectious diseases as they come into a clinic or hospital.

"About six years ago, when Ebola started, there was a lot of concern about spreading. We established a process that we use for all infectious diseases," Pritchard said.

When someone arrives at a clinic, he said, everyone gets asked if they have a cough, a fever, and have been traveling out of the country. If they meet the screening criteria, the patient is moved into a private waiting area.

"It protects everybody, the patient, the providers and the others in the waiting room," he said.

Northeast Wisconsin, though, is a low-risk area, Pritchard said. There has been only one case confirmed in Wisconsin, in the southern part of the state, he said. He recommends taking the same precautions as those recommended for preventing flu, starting with hand washing and covering a cough.

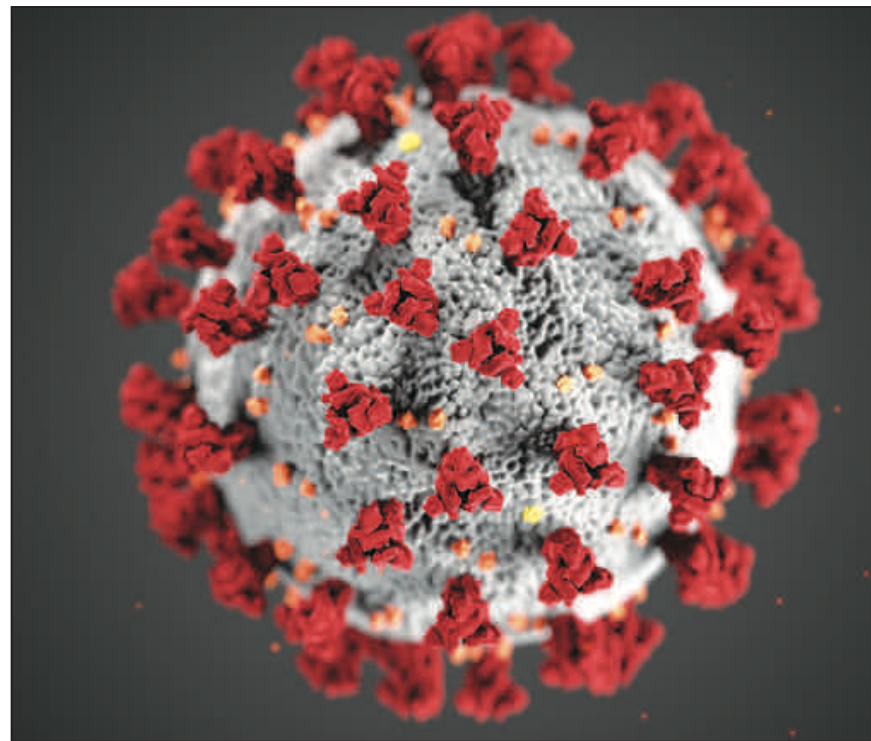
"Avoid large groups, if you're sick, stay home and avoid touching your eyes and mouth," he added.

He also recommends turning to reliable sources for information, including the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) website, www.cdc.gov or the state Department of Health Services, www.dhs.wisconsin.gov.

Pritchard said that some responses, such as wearing masks, are an understandable emotional response, but are not very effective in preventing the disease.

Masks disappearing

Masks were disappearing from shelves in some Shawano area busi-

nesses as of Monday. No masks were available at the Walgreens Pharmacy in Shawano. Dearco Glass Paint and Decorating reported that the masks normally used by painters and home decorators were out.

The Sherman-Williams store in Shawano was also sold out of masks that cover just the mouth. The assistant manager at the store said that respirators, which fit over the face and have filters, were still available for individuals who need a mask for sanding, painting and other home improvement projects.

Paint masks are not likely to be of much help, according to Pat Trinko, director of operations at Shawano Ambulance Service. He said his ambulance crews have the supplies they need, particularly the "N95" face masks, which protect against viruses.

Unlike simple face masks, these are approved by the federal government for use if a virus such as coronavirus is suspected, he said. Painting masks and other types of masks can have gaps and holes, which can make them ineffective, he said.

Masks are valuable to health care

workers, though, he said, once a patient is identified as at risk for the disease.

"It's awareness," he said, "then take measures, like donning masks that stop particle transmission. Put one on that person and one on yourself."

School plans

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction sent a notice out to schools Friday about the coronavirus and the need for schools to make contingency plans in the event there is an outbreak in any of the communities around the state, according to Newell Haffner, Gresham School District superintendent.

Haffner plans to meet with his school nurse this week to hammer out a plan in the event coronavirus arrives in the area, but for the time being, the school district is continuing to clean and sanitize all surfaces like it does with influenza and other seasonal bugs.

"We have a long-established pandemic plan in place since the time of the swine flu epidemic," said Becky Wendel, registered nurse, the

Wittenberg-Birnamwood School District nurse.

Wendel noted the CDC website has a special protocol for how schools are expected to handle a pandemic situation and that WBSD follows the standard recommended practices of having students and staff stay at home if they are sick, covering mouths when sneezing or coughing, and cleaning high-use surfaces frequently.

Public health planning

The Shawano-Menominee Counties Health Department is in the process of putting a plan together to respond to the possibility of coronavirus reaching the area, according to Health Officer Vicki Dantoin, who runs the department.

At this point, however, the department has no information to share, Dantoin said Monday.

"We're working on different preparations and things," she said.

Dantoin said there was no one else in her office who could provide further information and she could not share what kind of planning was being done.

"I don't know that I should specify quite yet, because there's a number of angles it could take," she said. "I couldn't tell you exactly what it is. It's planning stages and stuff."

Dantoin said her department was not ready to put out information to the public.

"We don't need to spread anything about that quite yet. We're working on doing public messaging at some point," she said.

Dantoin said the department is working with the tribes and other health departments. She said she might be able to provide more information in a week or two.

Shawano County Emergency Management Director James Davel said his office is currently not involved in any planning regarding the coronavirus and said it was something the health department would have more information on.

Davel also said the number of people who have contracted the coronavirus are relatively few.

"There's been more people killed by the flu than this thing," he said. "That's across the world."

Therapy dog training coming to Shawano

Volunteer handlers, pets used in hospice program

APPLETON — Tega Mae walks through the hallways of Cherry Meadows at ThedaCare's Peabody Manor with a calm demeanor, patiently waiting to put a smile on someone's face.

You'll find Tega on a leash, sporting her blue volunteer vest. Tega is a pet therapy dog.

"I knew she was special from the moment I saw her sweet face," explained Tega Mae's owner, Shirley Sitter. "She has something about her that instantly makes others feel calm."

Sitter and Tega volunteer throughout the Fox Valley visiting hospice patients as a ThedaCare At Home Hospice therapy dog team. Sitter said that she never thought of volunteering with pet therapy until she had extra time after her children left for college and Tega came into her life. The pair completed the comprehensive training and testing program through ThedaCare At Home Hospice and became an official therapy dog team.

"What I learned during the class is that Tega will give me signs," said Sitter. "She will look away and turn

her head when she is beginning to feel overstimulated. I'm her partner, and it's important that I am her advocate."

The hospice pet therapy program is made possible through the donors of the ThedaCare Family of Foundations. Funding provides training for handlers and their dogs, training resources and therapy dog vests. There are more than 40 therapy teams volunteering.

Assessment and orientation for

pet therapy providers is completed in stages. First, an initial canine and handler assessment is conducted. If the handler and dog meet ThedaCare At Home's strict criteria, they are invited to attend training. Each handler/dog team must complete ThedaCare At Home Hospice volunteer training and Canine Comfort University, which includes handler-specific training and testing for Canine Good Citizen and Alliance of Therapy Dogs.

"We enjoy meeting all of the people," said Sitter. "Some days, it's providing a warm experience for families of those in hospice care. Other days, we visit the nurse's station. You never know who you will meet, and who really needs to feel happiness that day."

Sara Wesoloski, ThedaCare man-

ager of hospice and palliative care, explained the calling to pet therapy for hospice patients is not just about dogs.

"It's mostly about a heartfelt and patient human who chooses to share his or her pet with a person and family who is experiencing the end of a life," said Wesoloski. "It creates a special bond between the pets and those families."

Most volunteers can expect about one to two visits per week, on a day that works for the family and volunteer.

"You get more out of it than you put in," said Sitter. "While we can brighten someone's day, the families do the same, even more for us. We feel very fortunate to be there, interacting with the families."

Sitter said she and Tega will continue volunteering until Tega gives her the sign that it's time to slow down. For now, Sitter doesn't see that happening anytime soon.

"It's been a great experience," said Sitter. "I am more than happy I reached out to learn about the program and all the benefits that are provided."

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Getting in on the new game

Fierek's hemp farm offers product and education

HATLEY — When you own a few acres of meadows and have a natural talent for growing plants, it's not a huge leap to get in on Wisconsin's new hemp industry.

Dave Fierek, of Hatley, made his way into the industry three years ago when Wisconsin law was changed to encourage hemp farming.

A 1997 graduate of Wittenberg-Birnamwood High School, Fierek had always been involved with FFA.

"I've always gardened," said Fierek. "That's what I've been passionate about."

As a one-man operation, he plants about two of his six acres by hand around Memorial Day, depending on the weather. To do that,

he will need to start planting from seed in his greenhouse in the next couple of weeks. He can fit about 750 plants in two acres. Fierek uses a weed barrier cloth in the field, which allows the plants to get bigger as they aren't fighting the weeds for nutrients from the soil.

Fierek said that his land hasn't been farmed for more than 30 years. The meadow state it was kept in all that time means there are no pesticides or chemical fertilizers in the soil. Although he's not certified organic, he does practice natural growing techniques and produces his own organic compost to use as fertilizer. He said hemp plants will absorb any manufactured chemicals and render the harvest useless.

According to Fierek, he gets a little bug control help from a variety of a tree frog common to the area. He didn't have to bring them in; they had already found the acreage a great place to live. On any given day, he said he's seen over 25 frogs and is grateful for their assistance.

"The ladybugs are friends of mine, too," said Fierek. "They battle the aphids and other insects."

Harvesting takes about two weeks and usually starts after Labor Day, also depending on the weather.

With a battery operated Sawzall, a power tool usually used in construction projects, he cuts down the plants and hangs them upside-down from the rafters in his shed. They take about one to two weeks to dry before he can start processing products for sale. His website, WiscoHempFarms.com, lists the products he sells.

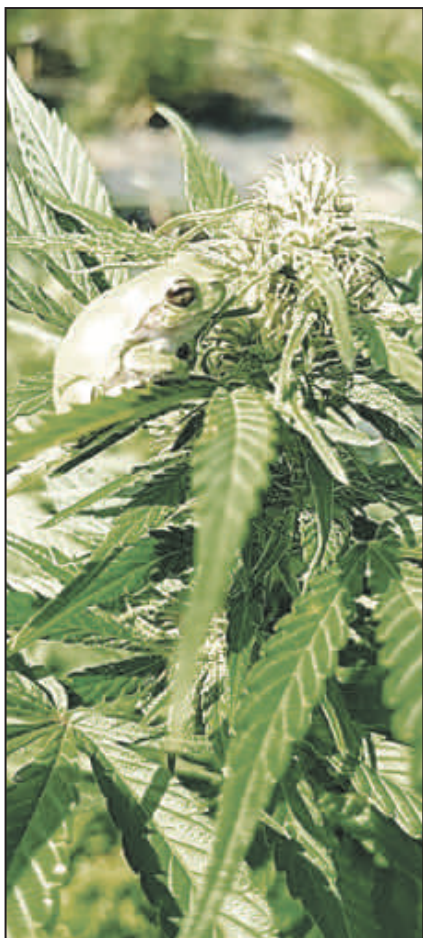
"I wanted to get in on the trend; I know it's a good medicine," said Fierek, noting that some people use CBD oils and tinctures to help treat anxiety, inflammation and pain.

He's also working with a company in Green Bay with a licensed commercial grade kitchen to make his hemp-infused BBQ sauce, hot sauce, meat rubs and briquettes. He notes that hemp seed oil is used for food because of its high content of healthy Omega 3 and Omega 6 fatty acids. He markets those products at

the hempbque.com website.

In the off season, Fierek likes to increase awareness regarding the hemp industry. He always notes that hemp is different from marijuana and that it is not a "get rich quick" product. He encourages those who want to try growing hemp to make sure they have a buyer, or they could be sitting on a lot of inventory.

Fierek is interested in starting up a consumer-supported agriculture business. The CSA would include

hemp products, as well as vegetables from his gardens.

Banker took fourth place in the Division 3 195-pound weight class, while Sokolski took sixth in the 138 weight class.

Junior Jayson Toellner also wrestled at state for Bonduel. He finished 0-2 in the 132 weight class.

On Friday, Banker earned a dominant 18-3 technical fall win over Lancaster senior Dustin Wolf in a quarterfinal match.

Banker was taken down early in the first period, but scored the next 13 points to seize control. He ended the first period by pulling off a reversal before a three-point nearfall.

After starting in the neutral position in the second period, Banker got a takedown and another three-point nearfall to go up 10-2.

Banker then escaped from the down position in the third period before a takedown made it 13-2. Wolf escaped, but Banker responded with another takedown and three-point nearfall to end the match.

In his quarterfinal match on Friday, Moegenburg claimed a 10-2 major decision over Baldwin-Woodville senior Jordan Bonte.

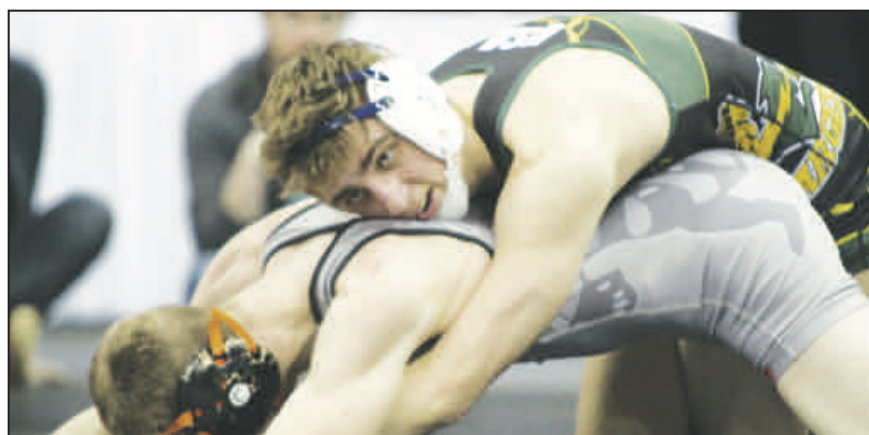

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takedown in the final period.

In the semifinals, Moegenburg dropped a 4-2 decision to Wrightstown junior Kaiden Koltz. Moegenburg was down 4-2 and in the bottom position when he suffered his hamstring injury, and he was unable to escape after that.

The injury changed Moegenburg's approach for his consolation semifinal on Saturday. The senior lost a 4-1 decision to Somerset senior Tyler Hantsbarger.

Moegenburg then battled West Salem/Bangor sophomore Evan Wolfe in the fifth-place match.

Moegenburg took control early on with a takedown, three-point nearfall and two-point nearfall in the first period.

The Witt-Birn senior suffered the

shoulder injury in the second period, but was able to fend off any scoring chances for Wolfe. In the third period, Moegenburg escaped from the down position to seal up the win.

"The whole experience this weekend was an up and down ride for sure," said Moegenburg, who took the podium with his left arm in a sling. "It didn't end the way I envisioned, but I don't have any regrets and I left it all out there."

Moegenburg ended the season with a 44-7 record.

Esker finished 2-3 at state to cap a 43-8 year on the mat.

On Thursday, Esker advanced after a 5-2 decision win over Richland Center senior Warrick Wolf.

Esker took the lead with a takedown in the first period, but was taken

down in the second period. Starting in the bottom position in the third period, Esker escaped after about 30 seconds and then secured the win with a late takedown.

In his quarterfinal match on Friday, Esker picked up a 6-0 decision win over previously undefeated Ashland junior Jared Stricker.

Esker got a takedown and two-point nearfall in the first period. He then took down Stricker after starting in the neutral position for the second period. Esker started in the bottom position and didn't surrender a single point in the third period.

In the semifinals, Esker lost a 16-5 major decision to St. John's Northwest Military Academy senior Aidan Medora. The loss sent Esker to the consolation bracket.

Esker opened Saturday against Denmark junior Ethan Schwartz, dropping a 10-2 major decision.

The Witt-Birn junior took on Amery junior Walker Ingham in the fifth-place match, losing a 7-4 decision.

"It (placing sixth) means a lot," said Esker, whose goal is to win state as a senior. "I came into state with a goal of placing and I knew if I wrestled well I could get the job done. It was a great feeling winning in the quarters to guarantee my placement."

Shawano's Tourtillott takes fifth at state

Senior ends year with 38-7 record

MADISON — Shawano Community High School senior Keith Tourtillott ended his wrestling career on the state podium after placing fifth in the Division 1 220-pound weight class at the 77th annual WIAA Individual Wrestling Championship Tournament, which ran Thursday through Saturday at the Kohl Center.

"I fought really hard for that podium spot and it really shows me how far I've come," said Tourtillott.

Tourtillott had a busy three days, wrestling in six matches.

The wrestler went 1-1 on Thursday, starting with a pin in 3 minutes, 10 seconds over Rhinelander junior Ben Sinclair.

Tourtillott got a late first-period takedown to grab a 2-0 lead. The senior then started the second period in the top position, allowing an early escape before taking down Sinclair at the 1:01 mark of the period. A few seconds later, Tourtillott secured the pin.

Tourtillott then dropped a hard-fought 3-2 decision to Oak Creek junior Ben Kawczynski in his second match of the day.

The Shawano wrestler kept his season alive with a pair of consolation victories Friday.

Tourtillott earned a 7-2 decision win over Sparta junior Madden Connelly before a 7-4 decision win against Brookfield Central junior Frederick Kyles.

In his win over Connelly, Tourtillott fell behind after allowing an early second-period escape. The Shawano wrestler took the lead with a takedown later in the period.

Tourtillott then escaped from the bottom position in the third period before a takedown made it 5-1. Connelly escaped, but Tourtillott took him down once more to finish up the match.

Tourtillott also rallied in his win over Kyles, this time erasing a 3-0

deficit. He escaped about halfway through the second period for his first point.

Tourtillott scored the first six points in the final period, starting with a penalty and escape before a takedown and two-point nearfall. Kyles escaped late, but Tourtillott was able to hang on for the win.

The Shawano senior went 1-1 on the final day of the state tournament.

Tourtillott started the day facing Ashwaubenon junior Nathan Moynihan. The senior lost a 3-1 decision in overtime.

Tourtillott bounced back in his fifth-place match against Oak Creek's Kawczynski.

Tourtillott took down Kawczynski late in the opening period to go up 2-0. Kawczynski was unable to continue wrestling after sustaining a knee injury, so Tourtillott was awarded the win and fifth place.

"It was definitely better than last year," said Tourtillott of his state experience. "I got to feel the hype of advancing from my first match. I took my first loss pretty hard, but I bounced back in the consolations and I was able to secure my spot."

"That's basically the epitome of wrestling. You win sometimes, and then you lose, and you're going to have to deal with that loss in some way. I did deal with that loss. It took me a whole night — I cried and thought about it a lot, but then I forgot about the loss, and I just bounced back."

The Shawano senior finished the season with a 38-7 record.

"He has had a great career here at Shawano," said coach Mike Homan of Tourtillott. "This is a great accomplishment considering it is only his fourth year wrestling. It was a great finish to his high school career."

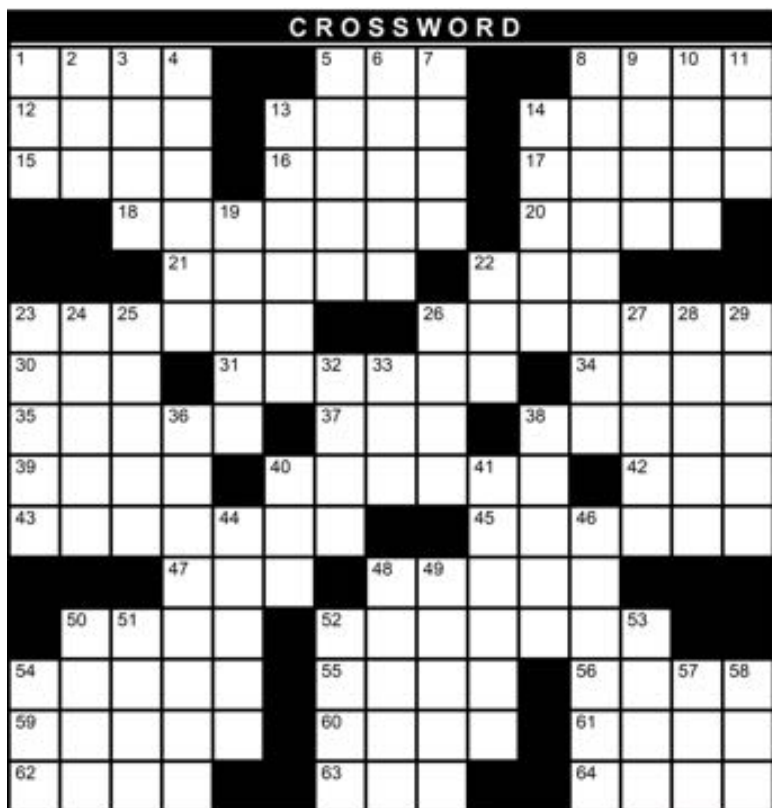

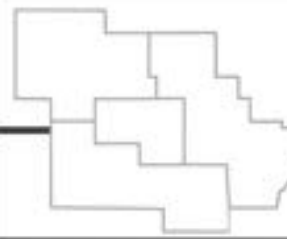

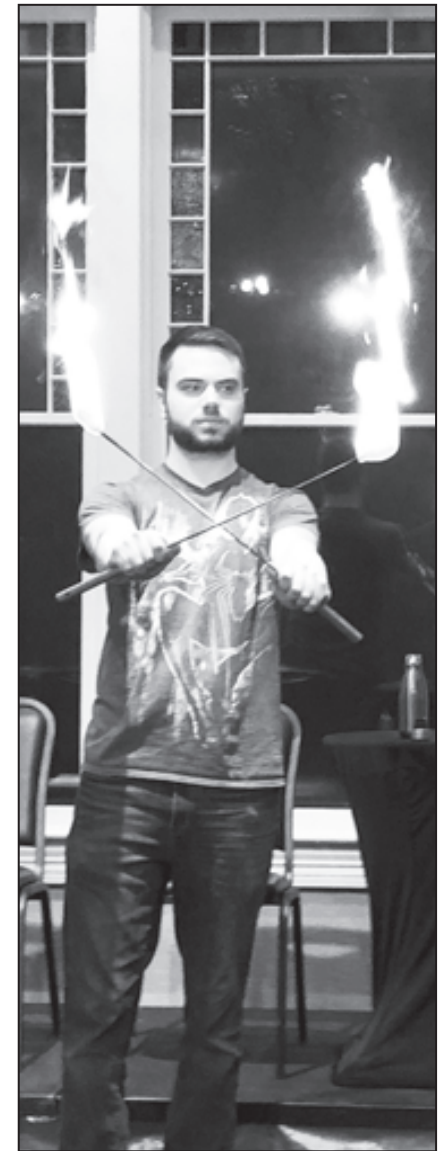
The dinner will be catered by

This year's featured speaker at the business challenge was Kathy Hansen from Body Essentials.

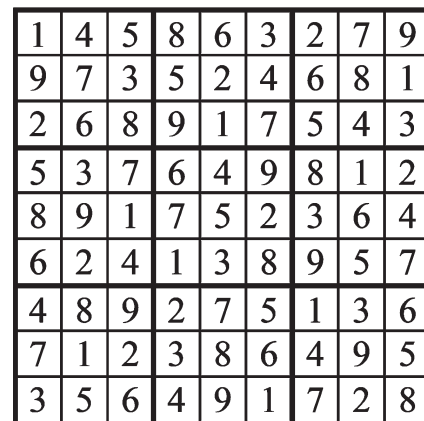
She shared her story of entrepreneurship with the students and encouraged them to be passionate about their products, have a good attitude and be willing to work hard.
