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# Child-care provider faces seven neglect charges

## Investigation began with a 12-week-old boy's broken arm

**OCONTO** — A Pulaski area woman faces seven felony counts of child neglect in connection with harm to children at her unlicensed home child-care service.

Hospital officials alerted authorities Feb. 14 after a 12-week-old boy was treated for a broken arm believed to have been sustained while Nicole Brewer, 36, was caring for him and other children at her home in the town of Chase.

A complaint filed in Oconto County Circuit Court on March 3 lists one count of child neglect where the consequence is great bodily harm, four counts where the consequence is bodily harm, and two counts where the consequence is emotional damage.

Brewer denied knowing what caused the boy's fractured arm and admitted she never contacted the parents when she noticed his arm was swollen, the complaint said.

Oconto County Sheriff's Department and Human Services investigators looking into the infant's injury talked with the parents of several other children involving other incidents.

A child sustained a gash to the head, which happened, Brewer told the parents, when a dog pushed him into a coffee table while she was making food in the kitchen and not watching the children.

Another child, a 15-month-old girl, was treated for a closed head injury that involved bruising on the right side of her head from chin to hairline, the complaint said.

Another parent discovered an injury after finding blood in her child's diaper.

Investigators talked to the parents of two children who are afraid of being in rooms with doors that can be locked, an apparent result of being locked in the "nap room" by Brewer

when they acted up.

Parents told investigators that on more than one occasion they saw more than the six children in the house that Brewer claimed to

be licensed to care

for at any one time, as many as 15-20 children during the summer months, according to the complaint. Although she represented herself as a licensed and certified child care provider, she apparently is neither.

During Brewer's first court appearance on March 3, Judge Jay N. Conley set bail at \$20,000 cash and ordered that she have no contact with children or with any current or former clients except for supervised contact with her own children.

She is scheduled to make her next appearance in court on Thursday.

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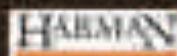


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# Hencsik happy to be coming to Gillett

## School Board approved new superintendent's contract Thursday

**GILLETT** — The community can expect to get to know its new superintendent of schools before he formally takes over July 1.

After making some final tweaks to the contract offer, the Gillett School Board voted unanimously Thursday to hire Todd Hencsik, currently serving as middle and high school principal for the Campbellsport School District in Fond du Lac County.

After signing and returning the contract, Hencsik said he has submitted to the board an "entry plan" of things he'd like to do to introduce himself to the community over coming weeks as he and retiring Superintendent Todd Carlson work on a smooth transition.

The 24-year educator said he's excited and happy to be coming to Gillett.

"I think it's a perfect fit," Hencsik said. "I felt very comfortable with the staff and principals as I met and walked the halls with them, greeting

students. I think we'll have a good working relationship with each other."

Saying he believes in transparency, Hencsik said he hopes to maintain open communication and looks forward

to the opportunity.

At the same time, it will be hard leaving the friends and colleagues he has worked with for six years in Campbellsport.

"It's tough to leave, but this is what's best for my family and me," he said.

Hencsik's wife, Lisa, is an assistant principal and athletic director at Woodworth Middle School in Fond du Lac, and they have two children, ages 6 and 8.

This will be his first superintendent position. After graduating from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh, where he was an integral part of the Titans men's basketball squad, Hencsik taught in his native Milwaukee for 12 years before moving into administration as an assistant principal at Waukesha West and high school principal posts in Rockton, Illinois, and Campbellsport.

## Oconto Falls boys win home playoff game

Panthers overcome  
first-half foul  
trouble, top Brillion

**OCONTO FALLS** — The Oconto Falls High School boys basketball team battled through foul trouble in the first half of a Division 3 regional quarterfinal playoff game March 3 before controlling the second half and pulling away for a 68-57 victory over Brillion.

The seventh-seeded Panthers were in control in the opening minutes of the contest, scoring the first six points. Senior Jarod Parsons knocked down three jumpers to provide the points, while Oconto Falls' defense stifled the 10th-seeded Lions.

The Panthers were able to extend the lead out to nine points before seniors Zach Parsons and Mitchell Manns were tagged with their second fouls in less than a minute span and with over eight minutes to play in the half.

Without two of their leaders, the Panthers saw their lead evaporate. The hosts trailed by three at halftime after being outscored 18-9 without Manns and Zach Parsons on the floor.

"We talked about keeping Mitch and Zach on the bench with two fouls as long as we could weather the storm," said Oconto Falls coach Gary Regal. "We were down by three at halftime, so I guess we weathered it. Mitch and Zach got a little rest, but we can't afford (those) guys in foul trouble."

With the senior duo back on the floor in the second half, Oconto Falls regained the rhythm it had going early in the contest.

Zach Parsons scored the team's first seven points to get the lead back, and the Panthers never relinquished it — despite several Brillion surges.

The teams traded buckets for the next several minutes before Oconto Falls went on a 10-2 run.

Sophomore Isaac Raddatz sparked the Panthers, getting a couple of steals on the defensive end that led to points on the offensive end for the

hosts. Raddatz hit two 3-pointers and two free throws during the stretch, with Jarod Parsons tallying the other two points.

"We needed a spark. We were kind of down in the locker room, and we needed a spark," said Raddatz. "I just tried to create for my team."

Brillion continued to fight, eventually trimming Oconto Falls' lead to three. But the Panthers went on a 6-0 run to create some breathing room with under six minutes to play.

The Panthers did a solid job of taking care of the ball and were able to drain some time off the clock before knocking down several free throws in the final two minutes to seal the victory.

"It means a lot (a home playoff win) because we haven't had a home

playoff game in a long time, and to win it in front of this crowd means everything," said Jarod Parsons.

He led the team with 20 points after hitting 10 field goals. "I felt good. I was a little bit more amped up today, and I was ready for playoffs and ready to play."

Raddatz scored 10 of his 14 points in the second half, while Zach Parsons tallied nine second-half points to finish with 13 for the game. Manns finished with 11 points, eight of which came in the final half.

"I'm really extremely pleased with the seniors. They've been leaders since day one. They came in and bought in to what we wanted to do, which was a complete change from some of the things they've done in the past," said first-year coach Regal,

of how his senior-led team turned in a solid season. "They trusted. They trusted each other and trusted the coaching staff and teammates, so that was huge."

The Panthers hit the road Friday for a regional semifinal matchup against Freedom. The second-seeded Irish defeated Oconto Falls, 63-58.

# Gillett's DeBauch tops 1,000 career points

## Junior also owns school rebounding record

**GILLETT** — Aubrey DeBauch has put together a strong high school career at Gillett High School despite just wrapping up her junior season, already reaching two milestones.

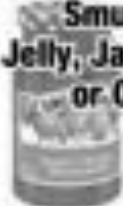

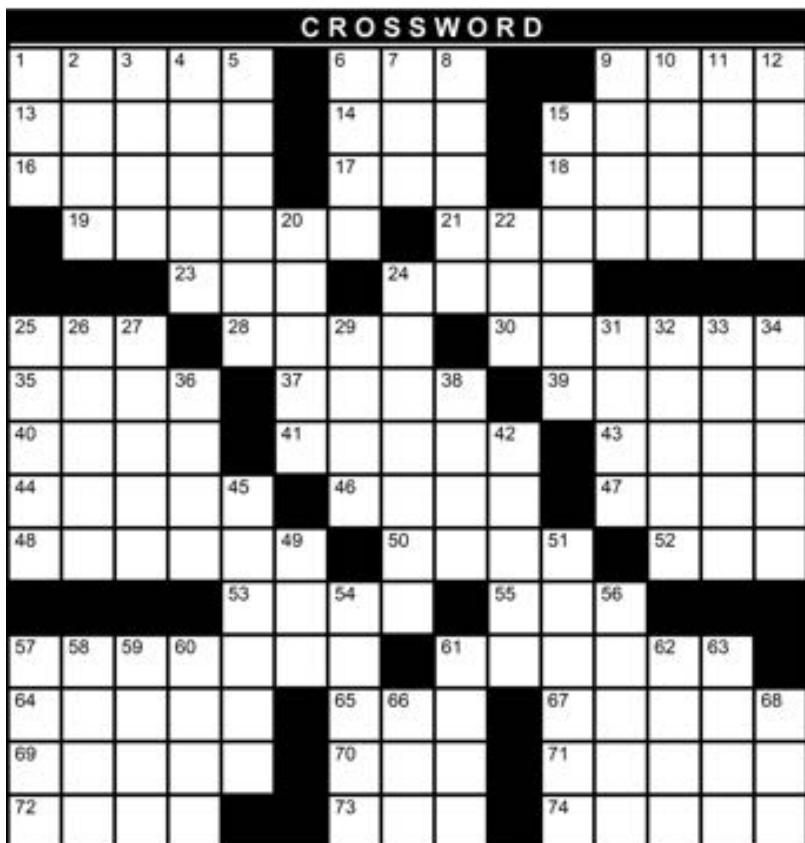

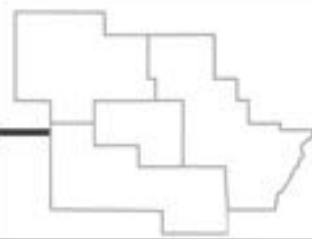
