This remarkable accomplishment highlights the expertise and dedication of our members in dairy science.

Several members also earned prestigious leadership opportunities. This past summer, Bella Theys traveled to our nation's capital to attend the Washington Leadership Conference, gaining valuable leadership skills. Hannah Yeager and Mallory Braun were accepted to participate in the Plant Systems Next Gen Conference held this March in Florida to expand their knowledge of plant science career opportunities.

In addition to academic and leadership success, our members excelled in the show ring. At the Shawano County Fair, Madisyn Weinig earned Grand Champion Rabbit, while Hannah Yeager secured Reserve Champion Rabbit, demonstrating their commitment to animal science through their Supervised Agricultural Experiences (SAEs).

Our chapter has also expanded its focus by participating in CDE teams and exploring specialized areas such as wildlife, floriculture, poultry, vet science, nursery landscape, food science and milk quality.

Our Leadership Development Events (LDEs) saw impressive participation, with members engaging in Parliamentary Procedure, Creed Speaking, Discussion Meet, Extemporaneous Speaking and Prepared Public Speaking. e didn't have all areas represented.

Looking to the future, we have ambitious goals for growth. We aim to achieve 50% active membership, reaching a total of 60 members. We are also focused on submitting six Wisconsin State FFA Degree applications and 12 proficiency applications. We also look forward to a spring trip to Milwaukee to tour various agricultural companies as well as go to a Brewers game for our active members.

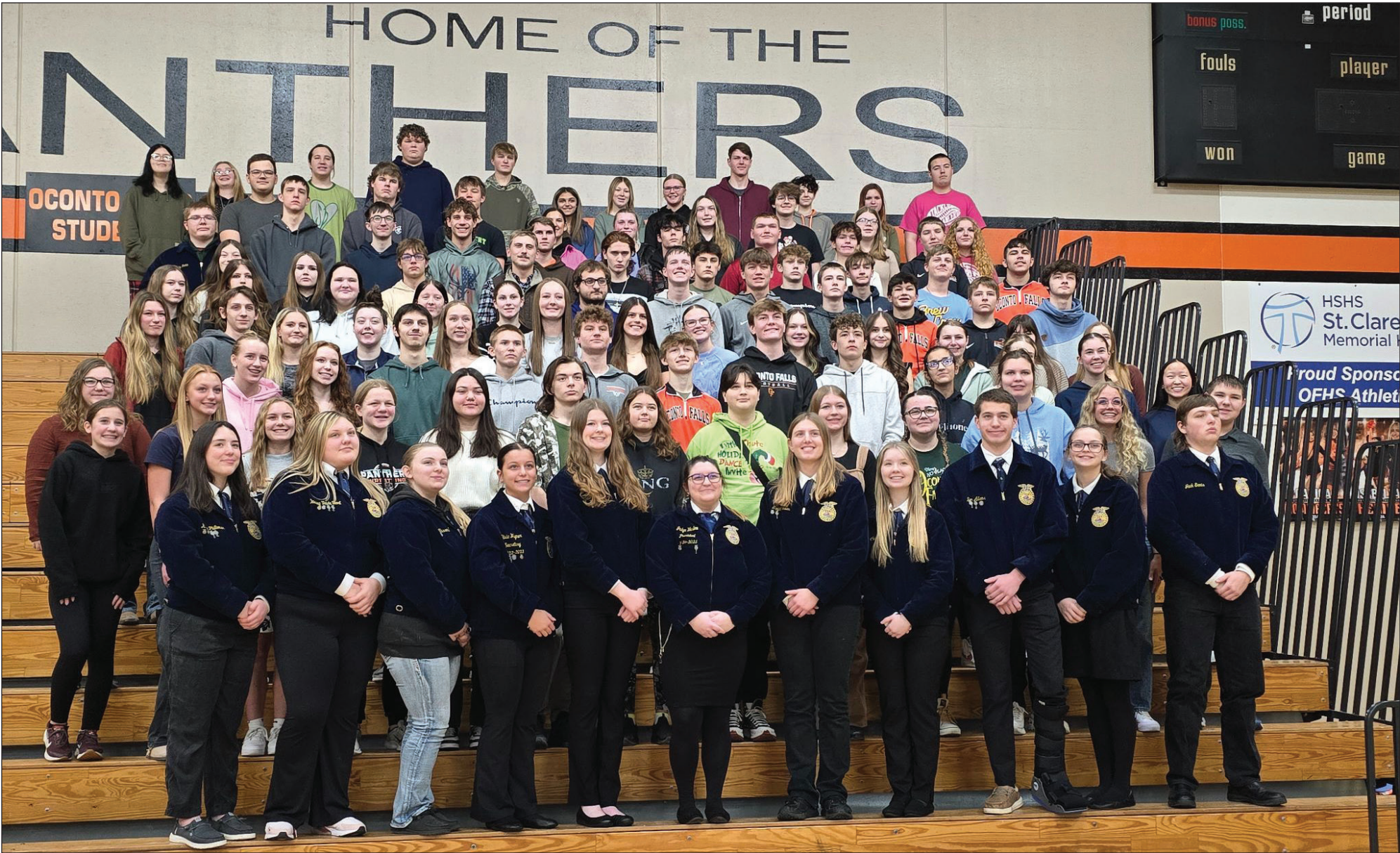

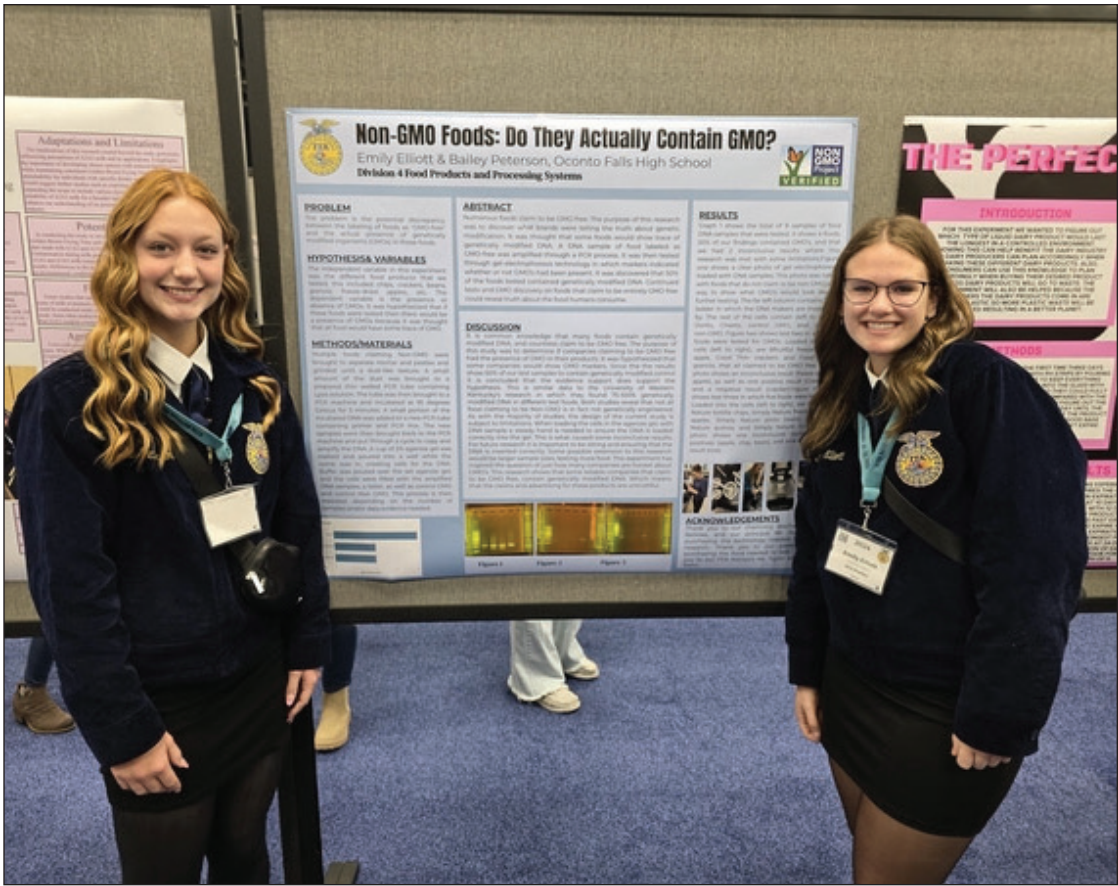

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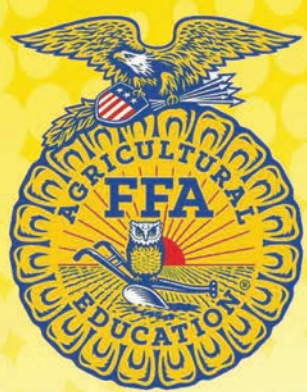
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Fairs, conventions and parade highlights of Suring FFA's year

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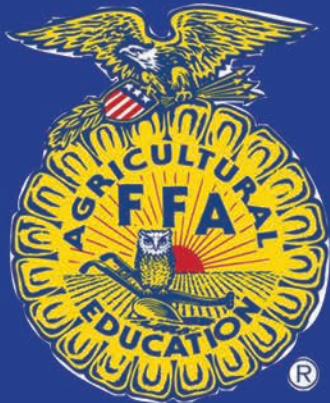
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Pulaski FFA in the middle of a busy year

The National FFA Convention in Indianapolis is the third largest convention in the country every year, behind the Republican and Democratic Party conventions.

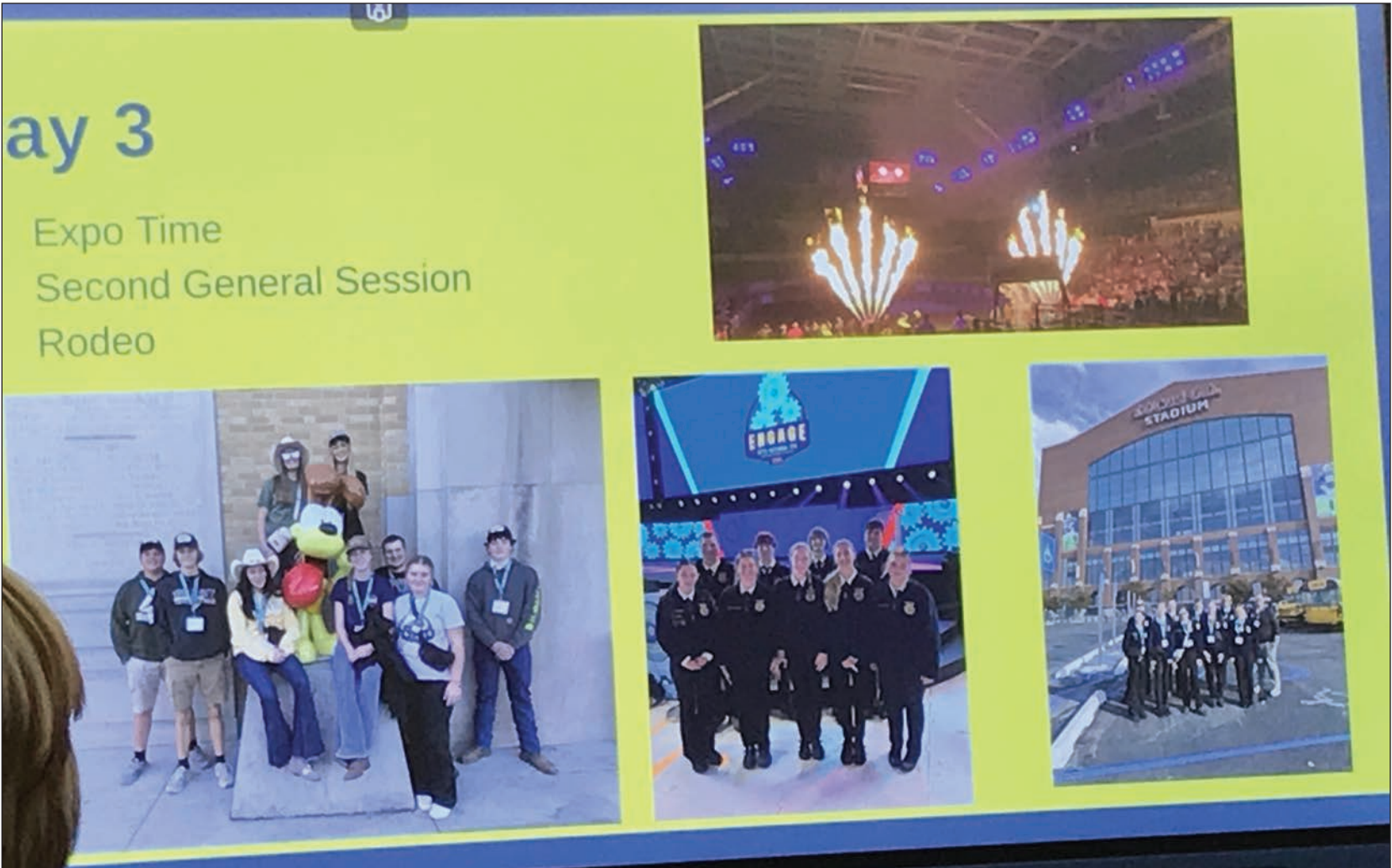
That was among the information shared Nov. 21 when members of the Gillett FFA chapter talked about their experiences with the Gillett School Board.

The 97th National FFA Convention & Expo was staged Oct. 23-26 at Lucas Oil Stadium, where the Indianapolis Colts hold their NFL games.

Attendees have the opportunity to compete, explore more than 350 careers, meet other members from across the country, shape the future of the organization, enjoy entertainment opportunities and more.

“As someone who isn’t as involved in agriculture as some of the people around me, I got to talk to a lot of higher-up people in businesses like John Deere,” said Scott Heroux, a chapter member. “I thought it was really interesting seeing all the stuff behind that.”

Adviser Jacob Timm said the convention is one of his favorite things every year.

“I always look forward to going down and kind of recharging my batteries as an adviser and an ag teacher,” Timm said. “I was able to connect with many different ag teachers from around the country, meet all the people that I

see year after year, figure out what they’re doing in their programs and how to bring it back to Gillett.” This year’s students are a great group, and they had a lot of fun and brought back great memories, Timm said.

About 71,000 students attended the convention, but the organization is expecting big things in three years, he said. “In 2028 is when the centennial is, the 100th anniversary of FFA nationally,” Timm said. “They

are gearing up for that. Lucas Oil Stadium may not be as big as we want it to be that time, but we’ll make it work one way or another.” In addition to the convention itself, chapter members made some stops

along the way to and from Indianapolis — including Natural Beauty Greenhouse in Denmark, Fair Oaks Farm in Fair Oaks, Indiana, the Indianapolis Zoo and the Albanese Candy Factory in Merrillville, Indiana.

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
