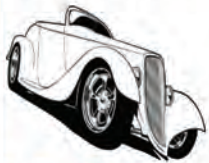

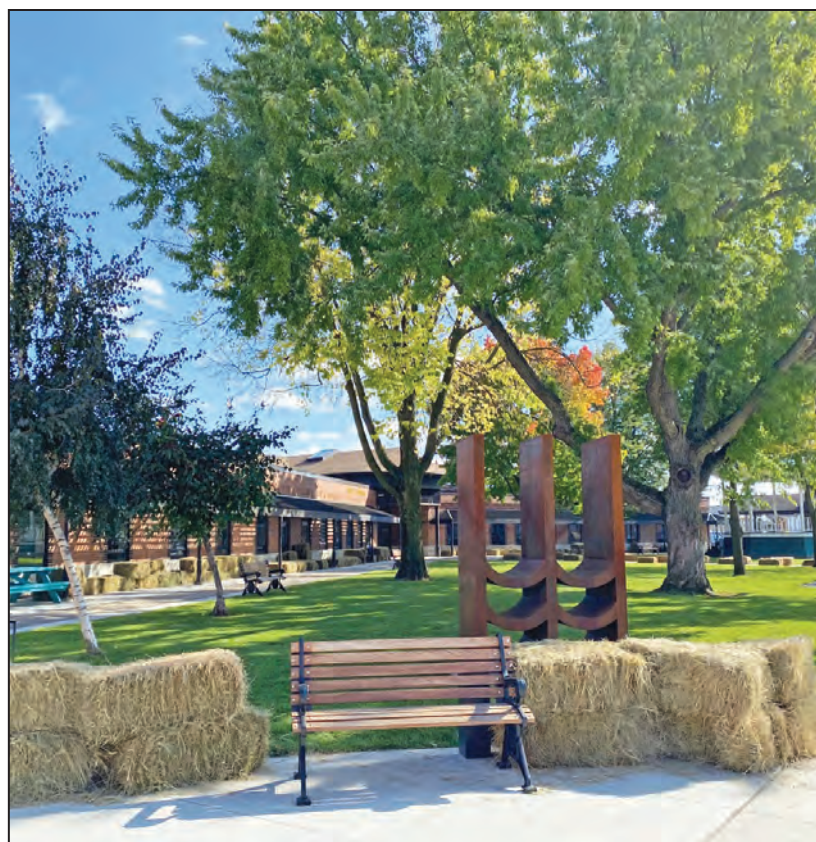

Experience nature at its best

Earn Mammoth Hike Challenge patch, certificate of accomplishment

More than 12,000 years ago, an immense flow of glacial ice sculpted a landscape of remarkable beauty across Wisconsin.

As the glacier retreated, it left behind a variety of unique landscape features. These glacial remnants are now considered among the world's finest examples of how continental glaciation sculpts the planet.

The Ice Age National Scenic Trail is a 1,000-mile footpath that highlights these landscape features as it travels through some of the state's most beautiful natural areas. The trail is entirely within Wisconsin

and is one of only 11 National Scenic Trails.

But the Ice Age Trail is more than a path through the woods. It is a place for mental and physical rejuvenation, a place to unwind after a hard day and enjoy the landscape of Wisconsin. More than 2.3 million people use the Ice Age Trail each year to hike and snowshoe, to backpack, to disconnect and reconnect.

Behind the scenes, a community of volunteers across the state work to build and maintain the trail, making it one of the country's best hiking experiences.

Here are a few facts about the Ice Age Trail.

- The trail is managed by a partnership among the National Park Service, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the Ice Age Trail Alliance.

- The Ice Age Trail is open for hiking, backpacking and snowshoeing. Many segments support cross-country skiing, too.

- The trail is not yet complete. Nearly 700 miles of it are yellow-blazed Ice Age Trail segments; about 500 miles of unmarked connecting routes link the blazed segments. The

entire route is about 1,200 miles long.

- The trail's western terminus is in Interstate State Park in St. Croix Falls, Polk County. It overlooks the St. Croix River and the state's neighbors in Minnesota.

- The trail's eastern terminus is in Potawatomi State Park in Sturgeon Bay, Door County.

- The Ice Age Trail is built and maintained largely by volunteers.

- Most of the blazed Ice Age Trail segments fit hikers' ideas of a traditional, off-road hiking experience. Some segments, however, lead hikers

right down the main streets of Wisconsin communities. This is by design – the Ice Age Trail is meant to connect people and communities.

– Twenty-two municipalities (with more joining each year) have chosen recognition as an Ice Age Trail Community, underscoring the trail's positive economic impact, locally. Together, the Ice Age Trail Alliance and Trail Communities promote the unique qualities that make the trail, and the community it travels through, a meaningful destination.

– The trail occasionally coincides with state bike trails – biking is allowed on these sections only. Horseback riding is not permitted. Motorized vehicles are not permitted (with the exception of just a few segments that share state multi-use trails).

– The Ice Age Trail began in the 1950s as the dream of Milwaukeean Ray Zillmer, who had a vision of a long, linear park winding through Wisconsin

along the glacier's terminal moraine.

– The trail crosses over many ownership types, including private land, city parks, state parks, county forests and national forest.

– The trail travels through 30 counties.

– One of the goals of the Ice Age Trail Alliance is to permanently protect the route of the Ice Age Trail. Every year, the group purchases land with privately donated funds and grants from government partners to get closer to achieving this goal. The state also acquires land for the trail through its Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program.

Mammoth Hike Challenge

You can do it: hike, walk, run, backpack or saunter 44 miles on the Ice Age National Scenic Trail and visit three Ice Age Trail Communities during October. Earn the 2024 Mammoth Hike Challenge patch and receive a certificate marking

the accomplishment.

Participants have the entire month of October to do it, and it's free.

Challenge yourself to:

- Explore a new-to-you segment.
- Get "lost" in the fall colors.
- Visit a portion of trail that's new since last year.
- Make a new trail friend.
- Hike at night, at sunrise or sunset.
- Scale an esker, marvel at a kame, saunter through a tunnel channel – learn all about the

trail's glacial geology and significance.

Registration for the 2024 Mammoth Hike Challenge is open now.

Sign up individually, or as a duo, family or team. (If you're hiking with others, your miles and trail community visits can be pooled together.) Then start planning how you'll get your miles in throughout October.

Free registration includes:

- Itineraries highlighting Ice Age Trail Communities, including the five new ones in



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- Invites to challenge events.
- Information about Trail Magic.

It's Scouts' honor when it comes to reporting your mileage, Trail Community visits and bonus miles. This challenge is simply a fun way to inspire you to get out and explore the trail and communities that make it so unique.

Earn your challenge patch

– Hike 44 miles, visit three Ice Age Trail Communities and submit your completion form.

– Accumulate 44 miles through hiking and bonus miles, visit three Ice Age Trail Communities and submit your completion form.

– Earn 44 bonus miles, visit three Ice Age Trail Communities and submit your completion form.

If 44 miles seems like a lot, you can still earn a patch with bonus miles. There's no limit to the number of bonus miles you can earn.

Earn bonus miles:

- Become an Ice Age Trail Alliance member and get 10 bonus miles.
- Volunteer with the Ice Age Trail Alliance for 10 bonus miles.
- Give an Alliance membership or recruit a new Ice Age Trail Alliance member and collect 10 bonus miles.

- Visit a new-to-you trail community for five bonus miles.
- Attend a Mammoth Hike Challenge event for five bonus miles.
- Hike a segment with a glacial feature to earn five bonus miles.
- Check out the Explorer Backpack at a Trail Community library for two bonus miles.
- Take Advantage of Trail Magic for two bonus miles.
- Share a photo of your trail community experience on social media and use hashtag #MammothHikeChallenge and tag @iceagetrailorg and get two bonus miles.

Wait, there's more

If you hike right, you could earn two patches this October. Many Ice Age Trail Alliance chapters have their own hiking award programs. You can earn a chapter-specific patch when you explore the trail segments within a particular region (and submit appropriate paperwork).

A certain satisfaction comes when you achieve your Mammoth Hike Challenge. But before you unpack your backpack and clean off your boots, make sure to fill out the completion form.
