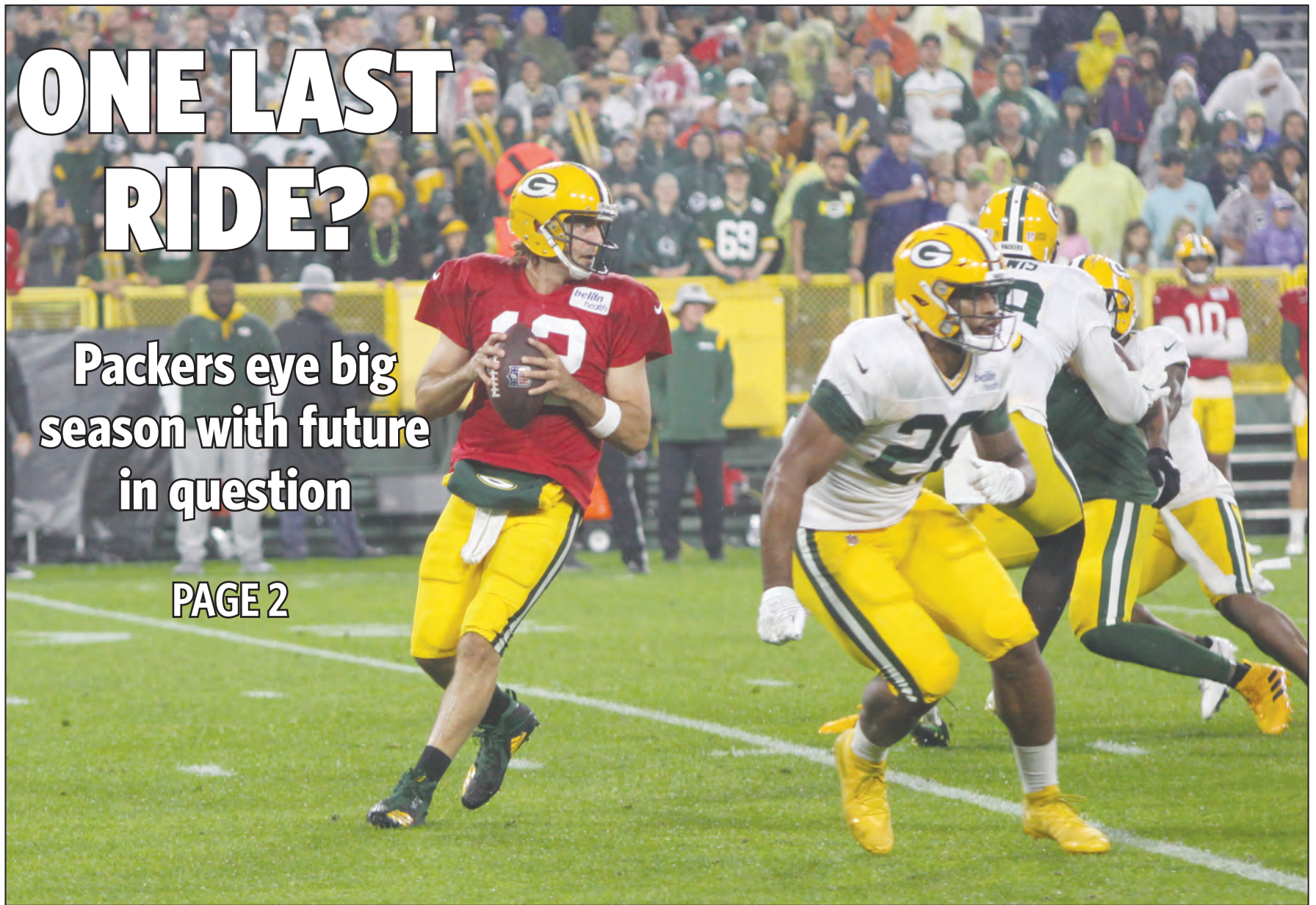

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Green Bay with Super Bowl aspirations

Team looks to avoid third straight loss in NFC title game

An offseason of rumors and speculation are in the rear-view mirror and it's finally time for the Green Bay Packers to step on the field and open the 2021 NFL season.

While the Packers again have aspirations of bringing the Lombardi Trophy back to Green Bay, it's still hard not to wonder if this is the final ride with this particular core of players on the roster.

Two fan favorites — quarterback Aaron Rodgers and wide receiver Davante Adams — are at the center of the speculation.

Rodgers, of course, was at the heart of most of the offseason news after news broke on the first night of the 2021 NFL Draft that he was unhappy with the team and wanted out of Green Bay. When he finally was able to tell his side of the story, Rodgers expressed that he just wanted to be part of the team's conversations involving players and things that impacted his job as quarterback, saying he'd earned that right after 16 seasons with the team.

Adams is set to become an unrestricted free agent at the end of the season but hadn't received a new contract as of the week before the regular season opened.

One of the league's best duos didn't do much to quell the speculation, posting Instagram stories on July 23 with the same picture of Chicago Bulls legends Michael Jordan and Scottie Pippen, hinting this could be their last season together in Green Bay, or "The Last Dance," like the popular documentary that aired in 2020.

Even with all the drama surrounding the team, the goal is still simple — win the Super Bowl.

"It's Titletown. It's championship or disappointment," said Rodgers in an interview a couple weeks back.

The last two seasons have seen Green Bay fall one win short of the big game. Last year, the Packers were unable to rally late in a loss to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at Lambeau Field.

With a lower salary cap than in 2020, all NFL teams were forced to make cuts to their rosters and

restructure several contracts to make the numbers align with the cap for this season.

The Packers did what they could to bring back most of their 2020 team, re-signing players like running back Aaron Jones, wide receiver Allen Lazard, tight ends Marcedes Lewis and Robert Tonyan and cornerback Kevin King.

Players lost to free agency were mostly backups, aside from center Corey Linsley, who the team replaced by drafting Ohio State's Josh Myers in the second round of the draft.

The team opened the draft by getting some defensive help in corner-

back Eric Stokes, and then landed wide receiver Amari Rodgers in the third round.

In an effort to appease Rodgers, Packers General Manager Brian Gutekunst traded for beloved receiver Randall Cobb, so the offense should have plenty of weapons to work with.

With only three preseason games being played this year and the Packers choosing to hold out most of their starters on both sides of the ball, fans are still waiting to see what the arrival of new defensive coordinator Joe Barry can do for the unit that has had its ups and downs over the past

couple seasons.

With a lot of familiar faces on the team, and with the success the team has had under coach Matt LaFleur, fans of the green and gold are eager to get the season started so the focus can shift to football instead of all the what-if scenarios that could arise after the season.

The team was scheduled to open the season in a tough road environment facing the New Orleans Saints. Instead, the game was moved to Jacksonville after Hurricane Ida ripped through New Orleans.

The Green Bay Packers open their 2021 season this Sunday against the New Orleans Saints, hoping to start strong on their quest for a Super Bowl.

Here are some numbers that Packers players and coaches have accumulated over the years and highlight some things to watch for as the season gets underway:

26

The amount of regular season wins the Packers have combined in Matt LaFleur's two seasons as the head coach, going 13-3 both years. The win total was enough to win the Packers the NFC North and receive a bye in the playoffs both seasons, but the team lost in the NFC Championship Games in both years.

4

Years of defensive coordinator experience for Joe Barry, who is the team's new defensive coordinator. He served in the position from 2015-16 with Washington and was Detroit's coordinator from 2007-08. Barry was on the Los Angeles Rams' staff in 2020, when the team posted the NFL's best scoring defense and overall defense numbers.

48

The amount of passing touchdowns for quarterback Aaron Rodgers during the 2020 season, a career high for the one day Hall-of-Fame player. The big season helped Rodgers win the Most Valuable Player award for the third time.

12

Touchdowns for wide receiver Randall Cobb while playing for the Packers in 2014. After playing for the Dallas Cowboys and Houston Texans the past two seasons, Cobb is back in Green Bay after being traded to the team in late July. The receiver was drafted by the team in the second round of the 2011 NFL Draft.

185

Receiving yards in three preseason games for receiver Malik Taylor, who made the team's initial 53-man roster. Taylor caught 14 passes and his 185 yards were the most of any player this preseason. The receiver had five catches for 66 yards and a touchdown for the team in 2020.

for center Josh Myers, who is expected to start for the team. Myers played collegiately at Ohio State, which is where Corey Linsley — the player Myers is replacing at center — also attended college.

6

The number of weeks left tackle David Bakhtiari will miss, at least, as he starts the year on the physically unable to perform list and works his way back from a knee injury he suffered in practice back on Dec. 31. Elgton Jenkins is expected to move over to left tackle to replace the All-Pro lineman.

12 1/2

Sacks for outside linebacker Za'Darius Smith, which led the team in 2020. Smith has been battling a back injury during training camp and the preseason and could miss the game against the Saints.

5

Sacks in 2020 for outside linebacker Rashan Gary, who registered 2½ of those sacks in the final five regular season games before a 1½ sack game against the Rams in the team's post-season opener. Even if Smith were to play this weekend, Gary is expected to see a larger role on the defense in his third pro season.

122

Career high in tackles for linebacker De'Vondre Campbell back in 2019. Campbell is expected to start at one of the inside linebacker spots for the Packers, with Krys Barnes alongside him.

4.25

The 40-yard dash time for Packers rookie cornerback Eric Stokes. The Packers took Stokes with the 29th pick of the 2021 NFL Draft, hoping to add some speed to the defensive side

of the ball and create some more competition in the cornerback room.

2

Interceptions by cornerback Jaire Alexander against Tom Brady and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the NFC title game last season. After another big season, Alexander was named to his first-ever Pro Bowl and was a second-team All-Pro.

45.9

The average punt distance in yards for new punter Corey Bojorquez, who the team acquired from the Rams as the team cut its roster to 53 players. Bojorquez replaces J.K. Scott, who was released.

16

Field goals made and attempted for kicker Mason Crosby in 2020. The 16/16 year set a new franchise record (with a minimum of one attempt per game) for field goal percentage.

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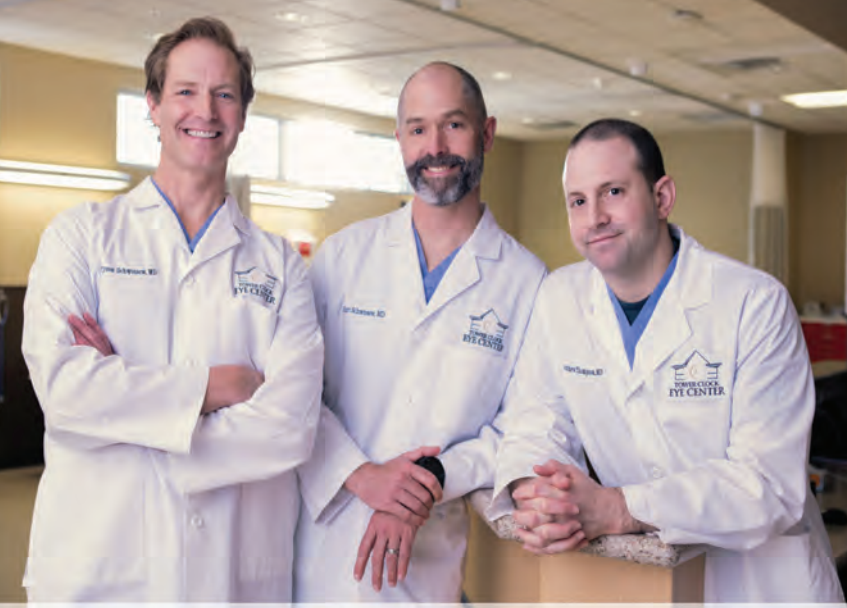

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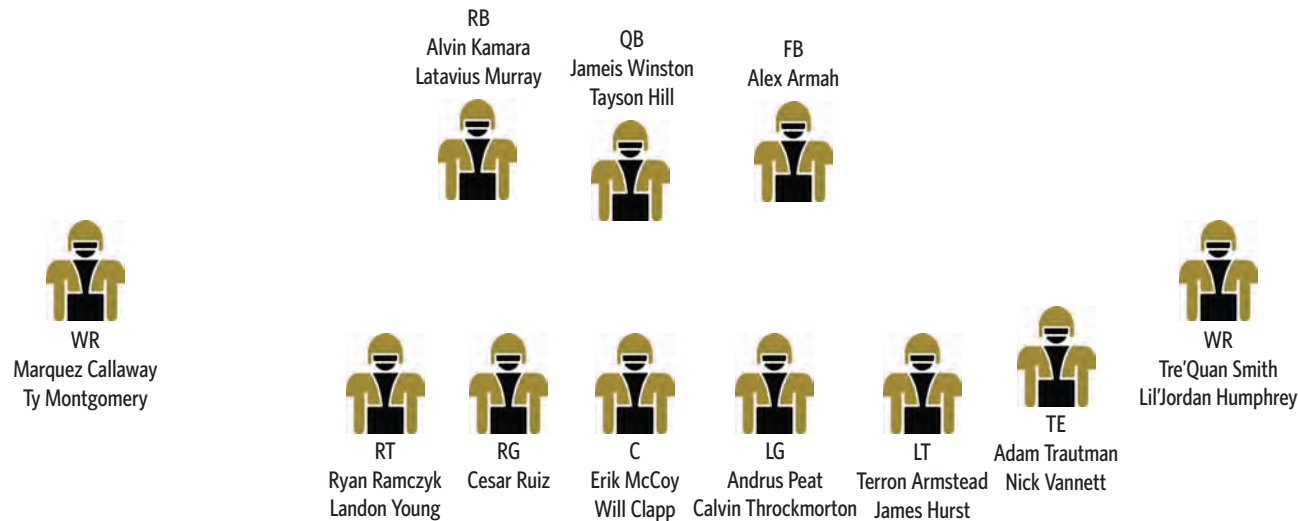
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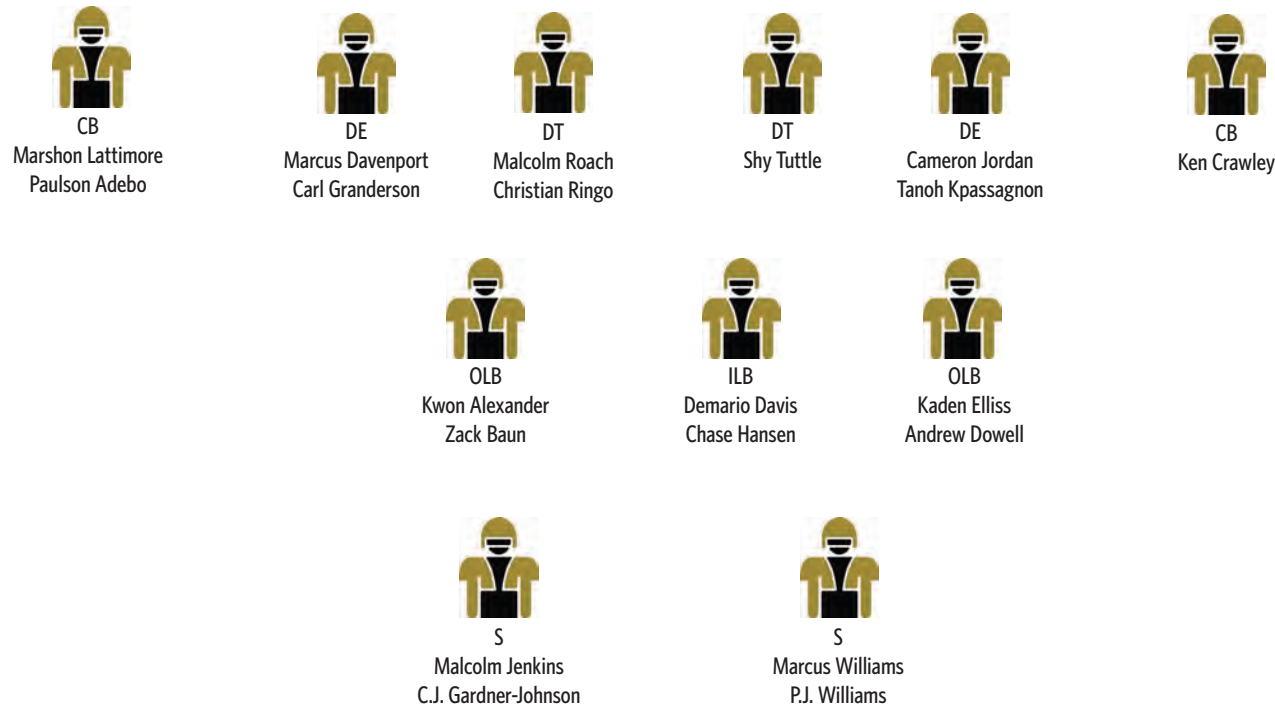


SAINTS DEPTH CHART

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KEYS TO THE GAME

The Green Bay Packers (13-3 in 2020) travel to Jacksonville to face the New Orleans Saints (12-4) at 3:25 p.m. on Sept. 12. FOX will televise the game.

History

Packers lead 17-9, including a 37-30 win in New Orleans last season.

With Davante Adams sidelined by injury, Aaron Rodgers was 21-of-32 passing for 283 yards and three touchdowns. Allen Lazard caught six passes for 146 yards and one touchdown, and Za'Darius Smith had a pivotal sack and strip of Taysom Hill in the fourth quarter.

Coaches

Green Bay – Matt LaFleur, 26-6 entering third season. Since the NFL went to a divisional format in 1967, LaFleur and George Seifert are the only coaches in NFL history to win 11-plus games and a division title in each of his first two seasons. New Orleans – Sean Payton, 143-81 entering 15th season. His teams have won 11-plus games four consecutive seasons.

When the Packers have the ball

This will be a clash of the titans. Last season, Green Bay led the NFL in scoring. New Orleans' defense is strong, though. While the Packers piled up 37 points in an empty Superdome in week three, coordinator Dennis Allen's crew finished the season ranked fifth in points allowed (21.1 per game) and fourth in total defense (310.9 yards per game).

In fact, the Saints ranked in the top 10 of every major category with the exception of the red zone. Their defense stopped the run (fourth with 3.85 yards allowed per carry), sacked the quarterback (sixth with a sack rate of 8.08 percent) and forced turnovers (third with 26 takeaways, first with 18 interceptions).

"Dennis Allen is a guy that I've got as much respect for as anybody in this league, just looking at what he's been able to accomplish throughout the course of his career," LaFleur said. "When you watch that defense, man, those guys, they fly around, they attack the football. They're very, very physical. He gives you some challenging looks. Every week, they have a different wrinkle in that there's going to be some unscouted looks out there I know that they're going to be ready for us and we'll

LaFleur is entering his third year as the team's head coach, while Barry makes his debut as defensive coordinator of the Packers this Sunday.

do our best to make sure that we're prepared for whatever they might show us."

The Saints have a star at each level of Allen's 4-3 defense.

Up front, six-time Pro Bowl defensive end Cameron Jordan leads the charge. Over the last four seasons, he's recorded 47.5 sacks. He generally rushes against the offensive right

tackle, meaning a matchup vs. Billy Turner.

A pair of first-round picks, Marcus Davenport and rookie Payton Turner, and young veterans Carl

Granderson and Tanoh Kpassagnon provide outstanding depth on the edge. The Saints aren't as good at defensive tackle, especially with David Onyemata opening the season with a suspension.

All-Pro Demario Davis leads the linebacker corps. Over the last four seasons, he's recorded 475 tackles, 18 sacks and 24 passes defended. Oft-injured veteran Kwon Alexander and former Wisconsin star Zack Baun will flank Davis.

The secondary is much like Green Bay's, with one stud at cornerback (Marshon Lattimore) and outstanding safeties (Malcolm Jenkins, Marcus Williams and Chauncey Gardner-Johnson). The question is at the other cornerback position. The pressure will be on Ken Crawley, who has allowed 10 touchdowns while intercepting only two passes in four seasons, and rookie third-round pick Paulson Adebo.

When the Saints have the ball

In his third tour of duty as a defensive coordinator, Joe Barry has what he lacked at previous stops in Detroit and Washington: Talent. As is the case with New Orleans, Barry has a game-changer on each tier of the defense with defensive tackle

Kenny Clark, outside linebackers Za'Darius Smith, Preston Smith and Rashan Gary, cornerback Jaire Alexander, and safeties Adrian Amos and Darnell Savage.

There's a big change in New Orleans. That obviously is at quarterback, with Jameis Winston replacing future Hall of Famer Drew Brees. Stylistically, they could hardly be more different. Brees offset his limited arm strength with robotic efficiency. In each of his final four seasons, he completed better than 70 percent of his passes while tossing only 23 interceptions. In 2019, when Winston started for Tampa Bay, he completed 60.7 percent of his passes and threw a whopping 30 interceptions.

Payton is one of the NFL's great offensive minds, and he'll no doubt play to Winston's strengths while convincing Winston to play with patience.

Winston will play behind one of the best offensive lines in the NFL. Left tackle Terron Armstead and right tackle Ryan Ramczyk form the best tackle tandem in the NFL. They will be imposing road blocks standing between Winston and Green Bay's outside linebackers.

The best player on the field, with the possible exception of Rodg-

ers, will be running back Alvin Kamara. Last season, he rushed for 932 yards (5.0 average), caught 83 passes and scored a league-leading 21 touchdowns. In each of his four seasons, Kamara has caught at least 81 passes. The Packers didn't have anyone capable of stopping Kamara last season, when he carried only six times for 58 yards but caught 13-of-14 passes for 139 yards and two touchdowns, and they don't this season, either. Latavius Murray is an excellent No. 2 back.

Both offenses will be without cornerstones. For Green Bay, it's left tackle David Bakhtiari (knee). For New Orleans, it's receiver Michael Thomas (ankle), who led the NFL in receptions in 2018 and 2019. The projected top three receivers are preseason star Marquez Callaway, kick returner Deonte Harris and Tre'Quan Smith.

Callaway had 21 receptions as a rookie last year, Harris has 26 receptions in two seasons and Smith has 80 receptions in three seasons. That's 147 career receptions; Thomas set an NFL record with 149 receptions in 2019.

Special teams

New Packers special teams

coordinator Maurice Drayton will face a big challenge in his first game running the show.

When LaFleur was hired in 2019, Darren Rizzi was one of his targets to run the special teams. Instead, he was hired by Payton. Last season, while Green Bay finished 29th in Rick Gosselin's annual special teams rankings for SI.com's Talk of Fame Network, New Orleans finished fifth.

Harris handles both phases of returns. The 5-foot-6 dynamo has career averages of 10.3 yards on punt returns and 27.0 yards on kickoff returns. Harris gives the Saints a big edge over Green Bay's rookie returners Kylin Hill (kickoffs) and Amari Rodgers (punts).

Kicker Will Lutz, who has career marksmanship of 86.6 percent on field goals, is starting the season on injured reserve. Aldrick Rosas presumably will be promoted from the practice squad to take over. In his four seasons, he's topped 73 percent only once.

Both teams will have a new punter. Green Bay traded for Corey Bojorquez and dumped J.K. Scott. Bojorquez finished fifth in net average for Buffalo last season. For New Orleans, Blake Gillikin hasn't punted in a regular season game.

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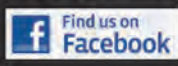

Shuffling on the line

Last season, according to ESPN.com Stats and Information, the Green Bay Packers' offensive line ranked No. 1 in the NFL in pass-block win rate and No. 1 in the NFL in run-block win rate.

That dominance was powered by two All-Pro, neither of whom will be in the lineup for the week one showdown against the New Orleans Saints. One is center Corey Linsley, who signed with the Los Angeles Chargers in free agency. The other is left tackle David Bakhtiari, who will miss at least the first six games of the season as he recovers from the ACL tear sustained on New Year's Eve.

Can the Packers' front wall, which powered Aaron Rodgers' MVP season and the No. 1 scoring

offense in the NFL, be anywhere close to as dominant without those two? Or even adequate?

Pro Bowl left guard Elgton Jenkins will fill Bakhtiari's shoes for the first half of the season. Jenkins had an excellent training camp, but Bakhtiari is a five-time All-Pro and perhaps the best offensive lineman in football. No matter how good Jenkins is, he's almost certainly not going to be as good as Bakhtiari at protecting Rodgers' blind side.

"I'm very confident that he can go do this at a high level," general manager Brian Gutekunst said. "But left tackle in the National Football League is not an easy thing, and this is going to be a challenge for him."

When Bakhtiari suffered broken ribs at San Francisco at midseason last year, Jenkins moved from left guard to left tackle for 27 snaps in the second half. His main experience has come this summer, though,

as he served as the No. 1 left tackle throughout training camp. While he didn't play in the three preseason games, his daily reps against Preston Smith and Rashan Gary have gotten him as ready as possible.

"I love it," he said of the team's confidence in him. "It's a challenge to me, going out there and playing at the same standard as Bak did. I love it they had the confidence in me, and I have the confidence in myself to go out there and just keep the ball rolling and hold it down until 69 gets back."

Maybe the problem won't be at left tackle. Rather, if there is a problem, perhaps it will be the domino effect. At left tackle, Jenkins isn't as good as Bakhtiari. At left guard, presumptive starter Lucas Patrick isn't as good as Jenkins. At center, rookie Josh Myers isn't as good as Linsley. At right guard, rookie Royce Newman might

not be as good as Patrick. The only stability is at right tackle, with Billy Turner facing perennial Pro Bowler Cameron Jordan right out of the gate.

"I have not experienced two rookies, especially side-by-side like that, starting opening day," coach Matt LaFleur said. "But those guys, they've got a lot of good guys around them, and we've got a lot of confidence in their ability to go out there and perform at a high level. I've thought those guys have done an outstanding job of just kind of learning each and every day. But, ultimately, they've got to go out there and do it."

Maybe LaFleur and Rodgers will be able to navigate any stormy seas. Maybe Myers and Newman will grow quickly into reliable starters. Maybe Jenkins will be so good that he'll be viewed as the best lineman in football by season's end. But, as

LaFleur said, confidence and potential aren't the same thing as protecting Rodgers and opening holes for Aaron Jones.

"When you're blocking for a Hall of Fame quarterback like Aaron, it's always a high responsibility for all the five guys on the line," Jenkins said.

"We take pride in blocking for him and making sure he stays up, stays clean, just going there and getting the job done."

Famous Jameis

With the retirement of Drew Brees, the Saints will go into the season with Jameis Winston as the starting quarterback.

The change at quarterback likely means a big change in the Saints' offense.

Last season, Brees' average pass

traveled 6.07 yards. Of 35 qualifying quarterbacks, that ranked 34th. In 2019, when Winston was Tampa Bay's quarterback, his average pass traveled 10.36 yards. That ranked second.

Now, obviously, schematic differences play a big role in that. But Winston has a live arm, and Saints coach Sean Payton figures to use it.

"The No. 1 thing is leading your offense and moving the ball and scoring points," Payton said. "We feel like he's got the unique skill-set with his arm talent where he can get the ball down the field. He's done a really good job of working through some of the progressions. A lot of that falls on us (as a coaching staff) now."

With offensive tackles Terron Armstead and Ryan Ramczyk, the Saints should be able to protect

Winston for those deeper-developing routes.

That's especially true if Packers outside linebacker Za'Darius Smith isn't ready to go after missing all but one practice in training camp with a back injury. However, with star receiver Michael Thomas on the physically unable to perform list, do the Saints have the weapons to make it go?

No place like road

With New Orleans hit hard by Hurricane Ida, the Saints have been displaced indefinitely from their home at the Superdome. So, this game will be played in Jacksonville.

The Jaguars are on the road for week one and the Saints wanted the game played, A, in the heat and, B, at a less attractive destination for Packers fans.

Whether Packers fans will fill TIAA Bank Stadium, anyway, remains to be seen, but it will be hot.

While the Packers will practice with temperatures hovering around 70 all week, the forecast for Sunday in Jacksonville is a high of 86 with 78 percent humidity. That means a "feels like" temperature of 99.

But at least the Packers, for a second consecutive year, will avoid the Saints' deafening indoor home.

"Being at a neutral site, not being in New Orleans, they have a great fan base, they're loud, the whole nine," Jenkins said.

"Playing at a neutral site, and we'll be able to have our fans, they'll be able to have their fans probably 50-50, you never know. But being able to play at a neutral site, it's kind of an advantage for both teams."
