Packers' defense a question mark
as 49ers come to town

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Defense trending wrong way as playoffs start

For most of the regular season, the Green Bay Packers' defense looked to have finally turned the corner. The unit was no longer a crutch for the team, and it was actually helping the team to wins.

After great performances against the Kansas City Chiefs in week nine and the Seattle Seahawks in week 10, the Packers' defense has trended in the wrong direction. And now as the postseason opens for Green Bay,

the defense is once again the likely determining factor in how deep of a postseason run the team can make.

In the team's seven games since the shutout win over Seattle, opponents have scored 28 or more points five times. In the game against the Cleveland Browns where the defense allowed 22 points, Cleveland also rushed for 219 yards. The other time Green Bay's defense allowed less than 28 points came in a lopsided 37-10 win over the Minnesota Vikings, where the Packers faced quarterback Sean Mannion instead of Kirk Cousins who lit them up for 341 pass yards and three scores earlier in the season.

Hoping to use the regular season finale against the Detroit Lions as a way to shore some things up, instead the defense was gashed for 404 yards and 37 points.

Even in the meaningless loss, coach Matt LaFleur didn't downplay the defense's poor play.

"I would just say the consistency, you know. Football in general comes down to discipline and people owning their roles," said LaFleur. "When

you aren't disciplined or you go outside the scheme, bad stuff happens, and we cannot have that. We need all 11 doing their damn job, and if they don't, stuff like that happens."

The Packers' defense was beaten for touchdowns on a pair of trick plays against Detroit. With the San Francisco 49ers coming to Lambeau Field for the Divisional Round game, the result of those trick plays should be especially concerning because of all the motion and deception that 49ers coach Kyle Shanahan incorporates into his offense.

Of course, the 49ers and Packers already met way back in the early portion of the regular season, so there's some idea of the challenges the 49ers' offense presents already.

Green Bay held San Francisco's offense to 298 total yards. Only 67 of the yards came on the ground, but that was largely due to the 49ers going behind by 17 points to start the game.

The 49ers' leading rusher in that game was Trey Sermon, who didn't

even receive a carry in the team's upset playoff win over the Dallas Cowboys. Running back Elijah Mitchell and versatile receiver Deebo Samuel combined for 168 rushing yards and two scored on 37 carries in the playoff win.

You can bet the 49ers will lean on those two guys and run all day, control the clock and keep the Packers' offense on the sidelines. It'll be up to the Packers' defense to find a way to slow down the rushing attack, or create some turnovers.

One thing that is working in the Packers' favor is its defense might be the healthiest it's been all season for the playoffs.

Outside linebacker Za'Darius Smith hasn't played since week one, but is trending toward playing this Saturday. While he is known more for his pass-rushing abilities, throwing him in to help slow the run should only boost the defense.

Then there's cornerback Jaire Alexander, who intercepted a pass

and knocked away three passes in the Pack's win over San Francisco earlier this year. He's expected back for the playoff game as well. Again, like Smith, Alexander would help out more in the passing game, but he's proved to be a sure tackler and certainly makes the defense more versatile.

There's also a chance outside linebacker Whitney Mercilus is back for the playoff run, even though he was expected to be out for the season. He's another big body the Pack can put in the box to try and slow the San Francisco passing game.

Should the Packers find a way to consistently stop the run, they'll be as ready as ever to defend the pass. Ideally, the Packers' offense would get off to a strong start and grab a multi-score lead, like it did in the team's first matchup, then the Packers' revamped defense could pin its ears back and really control the game.

Studs pass-catchers

Two All-Pro receivers will take center stage when the Green Bay Packers host the San Francisco 49ers in an NFC Divisional Round playoff game on Saturday night.

In one corner, it's Green Bay's Davante Adams, who finished second in receptions, third in receiving yards and fifth in receiving touchdowns. In the other corner, it's San Francisco's Deebo Samuel, who led the NFL in yards per reception and finished third in yards from scrimmage.

The X-factor could be the No. 2 receivers, Green Bay's Allen Lazard and San Francisco's Brandon Aiyuk.

In the first six games, Aiyuk caught nine passes for 96 yards (10.7 average) and one touchdown. In the final 11 games, he caught 47 passes for 730 yards (15.5 average) and four touchdowns.

Lazard, meanwhile, scored five touchdowns in the final six games. That was one behind Adams' league-leading total.

"Feel good. Feel good," Lazard said about the state of his game. "I feel like I'm in a really good mental space; physically, as well. Just having a good intuition when it comes to playing the game, feeling it out, knowing what Aaron (Rodgers is) thinking. (Receivers) coach (Jason) Vrable and (Nathaniel) Hackett simply have done a great job throughout this entire year.

"I really just honed in on their teachings, on what they've done to prepare us. I've really been honing in on my notes, on the film and the details and the routes. I've just been working on that chemistry and connection with Aaron. It's obviously been working out very well."

Cold night at Lambeau

It's going to be a cold one at Lambeau Field for the 7:15 p.m. kickoff. While the predicted high for Saturday is 21, the projected low is 3. That will mean a kickoff temperature somewhere in the neighborhood of 12 and a wind chill perhaps dipping below zero.

With a kickoff temperature of 15 or colder, the Packers in games started by Rodgers have won four in a row. That includes a 37-10 romp over Minnesota in week 17.

"We think it's Packer weather, honestly," defensive lineman Dean Lowry said last week. "Go back to

our game against Minnesota. We played great team defense. That was probably our most complete game of the year, against Minnesota in that freezing weather.

"We're used to it. Even today, we were outside the whole practice. We just think it fits our strength of playing tough defense and having a quarterback and an offense that's experienced in this weather."

Cold doesn't guarantee anything, though. In the 2013 wild-card round, the 49ers beat the Packers 23-20 with a kickoff temperature of 5. While Rodgers has a wealth of cold-weather experience, 49ers quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo has never thrown a pass in a game with a kickoff temperature of 40 or colder.

Turning over a new leaf

Based on regular-season play, one big advantage for Green Bay is turnovers. Even with the backups turning it over three times at Detroit in the finale, the Packers finished third in the NFL at plus-13 for the season. The Packers had two giveaways in week 1, three giveaways in week 18 and just eight in between.

The 49ers, on the other hand, were minus-4 for the season – worst in the NFC playoff field and second-worst among the 14 playoff teams. However, they were plus-5 down the stretch in winning seven of their final nine regular-season games.

Teams that won the turnover

battle this season won 80% of the time. The Packers went 10-0 when collecting more takeaways than giveaways – including plus-2 in the 30-28 win at San Francisco in week three – and 0-3 when they had more turnovers. The 49ers went 4-0 when they won the turnover battle and 1-5 when they lost. Garoppolo threw 12 interceptions and fumbled eight times.

Hackett a hot name

Of the eight head coaching vacancies, Packers offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett interviewed for four of them during the playoff bye week: NFC North rivals Minnesota and Chicago along with Jacksonville and Denver.

Hackett, who helped guide the Blake Bortles-led Jaguars offense to an AFC Championship Game in 2017 and the Rodgers-led offenses to NFC title games in 2019 and 2020, has flourished alongside coach Matt LaFleur.

"This has been such a great opportunity for me," Hackett said. "Being able to come here with coach LaFleur has been unbelievable. You go through a lot of time as a coordinator creating systems. Being able to come here and learn Matt's system and being able to combine those two systems has been something huge for me as a person.

"And then at the same time watch a first-time head coach to be able to be in there with him, watch the things that he goes through, being able to have that relationship with Matt has taught me so much about his position. It's just been an amazing experience, it really has. And the culture that he's brought here, it's one of those things like, this is how it should be."

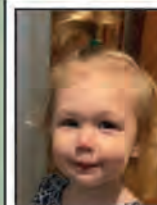

The Green Bay Packers (13-3) will host the San Francisco 49ers (11-7) at 7:15 p.m. Saturday at Lambeau Field in Green Bay. FOX will televise the game.

History

Including this year's 30-28 victory at San Francisco, the Packers lead the series 38-32-1. The teams have split eight playoff games. The 49ers knocked Aaron Rodgers and Co. out of the playoffs in 2012, 2013 and 2019.

Coaches

Green Bay – Matt LaFleur, 39-10 in regular season, 41-12 overall, third season. San Francisco — Kyle Shanahan, 39-42 in regular season and 41-43 overall, fifth season.

When the Packers have the ball

There's not a hotter offense in the playoffs than the one the Packers will roll out on Saturday night. Over the final seven regular-season games, they were second in the league in scoring. Aaron Rodgers was No. 1 in passer rating and Davante Adams was No. 1

in touchdown receptions.

They'll face a tough task against the 49ers' defense, which was superb in shutting down the Cowboys, the offense that was No. 1 in scoring the past seven games, in the Wild Card Round. In winning eight of its last 10 games, San Francisco allowed 20 points or less six times.

While the 49ers finished 12th in points allowed (21.5 per game), they were third in total defense (310 yards per game), sixth in yards allowed per play (5.11), third in sack percentage (8.8) and seventh in goal-to-go situations (63.3% touchdowns). The

Cowboys were held to 4.4 yards per play, down three yards from their fourth-ranked season average.

The front is tremendous and was the reason why the Niners upset the Cowboys. The 49ers were credited with five sacks and 14 quarterback hits while limiting the top-notch running back tandem of Ezekiel Elliott and Tony Pollard to 45 yards on 16 attempts.

The only run of 10-plus yards was Dak Prescott's game-ending scramble.

Pro Bowler Nick Bosa and Samson Ebukam are the ends, and Arik Armstead and D.J. Jones are the tackles.

Bosa was limited to 23 snaps against Dallas with a concussion but the 49ers are hopeful he'll be back. He finished fourth in the NFL with 15½ sacks and added four forced fumbles but was largely held in check by Yosh Nijman when the Packers won in week three.

The battle between Bosa and David Bakhtiari will be must-see TV. Bakhtiari returned from a torn ACL to play 27 snaps in week 18 against Detroit. He was dominant in those snaps but the Lions don't have anyone with half of Bosa's talent. Armstead is a tremendous player who contributed six sacks and Jones is a highly underrated player who finished second on the team with 10 tackles for losses.

Fred Warner (137 tackles, seven for losses), Azeez Al-Shaair (102 tackles, nine for losses) and Dre Greenlaw (21 tackles in three games) are the linebackers. Rodgers for years has raved about Warner being an elite player. He suffered an ankle injury against Dallas but expects to play.

If the Packers can protect Rodgers, there are plays to be made against a secondary that gave up 12 catches to Adams, including two big ones on the game-winning drive in week three. Emmanuel Moseley and rookie Ambry Thomas are the corners and K'Waun Williams mans the slot.

Thomas is the weak link. Jimmie Ward and Jaquiski Tarta provide steady veteran play at safety.

When the 49ers have the ball

Which Green Bay defense will show up? Will it be the one that played so well through the first two-thirds of the season and crushed Vikings running back Dalvin Cook in week 17? Or will it be the one that gave up 28-plus points in five of the final seven games?

The 49ers finished only 13th with 25.1 points per game but hit their stride down the stretch. Notably, they finished No. 1 in red-zone offense (66.7%) while Green Bay finished No. 28 in red-zone defense (66%).

The key will be San Francisco's rushing attack. Elijah Mitchell finished eighth in rushing with 963 yards despite missing six games due to injuries. He's not as explosive as Raheem Mostert, who ran circles around the Packers in the 2019 NFC Championship Game, but he's still a big-time talent.

There are two important changes since Green Bay's week three victory. One, Mitchell is healthy; he was inactive for that game. Two, receiver Deebo Samuel has become a featured runner. With Mitchell (27 carries, 96 yards, one touchdown) and Samuel (10 carries, 72 yards, one touchdown) leading the charge, the 49ers demolished the Dallas defense with 169 rushing yards.

Green Bay's run defense ran hot and cold down the stretch. The Browns rushed for 219 yards in week 16 but the Vikings managed only 27 in week 17. All the jet-motion-style runs featuring Samuel as a runner or decoy will test the discipline of outside linebackers Preston Smith and Rashan Gary and All-Pro inside linebacker De'Vondre Campbell.

The running game will set up quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo for success (or failure). He finished third in completion percentage (68.3) and ninth in passer rating (98.8). He averaged a second-ranked 8.64 yards per attempt because he benefited from a league-best 6.51 yards after the catch. He didn't play well at Dallas and has no cold-weather history.

Samuel, with a league-high 18.3 yards per reception, is a stud in the run-after-catch phase and one of the premier playmakers in the league. He averaged 10 yards after the catch, fourth-best in the NFL and by far the best among receivers. He forced 20 missed tackles on 77 receptions; every Packers receiver combined tallied 24 misses on 238 receptions.

George Kittle (71 receptions, 910 yards, six touchdowns) is the best all-around tight end in the NFL, and receivers Brandon Aiyuk (56 receptions, 826 yards, five TDs) and Jauan Jennings (24 receptions, 282 yards, five TDs) emerged down the stretch.

The veteran offensive line is good but not great. All-Pro left tackle Trent Williams is a superb player, a dominant force run or pass. He's joined by Laken Tomlinson at left guard, Alex Mack at center, Dan Brunkskill at right guard and Tom Compton at right tackle. Green Bay's Kenny Clark must dominate the matchup against Brunkskill, who is the clear weak link.

Special teams

This is the phase that Packers fans have dreaded for most of the season.

The 49ers are fairly mediocre on special teams. Veteran kicker Robbie Gould was 20-of-23 on field goals and made kicks of 52 and 53 yards against Dallas.

Punter Mitch Wishnowsky finished 14th in net average. He's got all the kicks in his bag to make fielding the ball a challenge. Presumably, David Moore will handle punts. He had an excellent debut in week 17 but spent week 18 on the COVID list.

In the first meeting, Aiyuk averaged 11.5 yards per punt return and Trent Cannon had a 68-yard kickoff return. With Aiyuk having a key role on offense and Cannon on injured reserve, Travis Benjamin had an 11-yard punt return and Ja'Mycal Hasty went nowhere on two kickoff returns.



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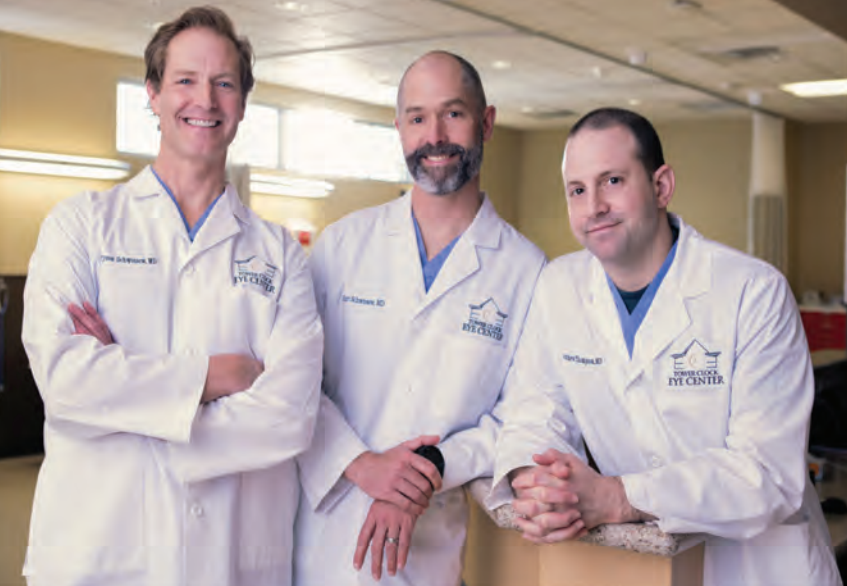
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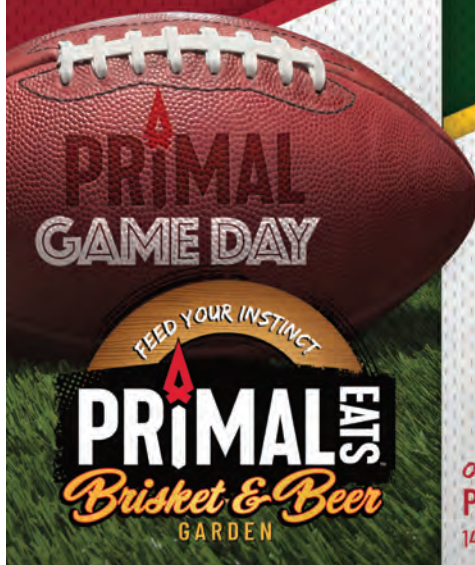
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
