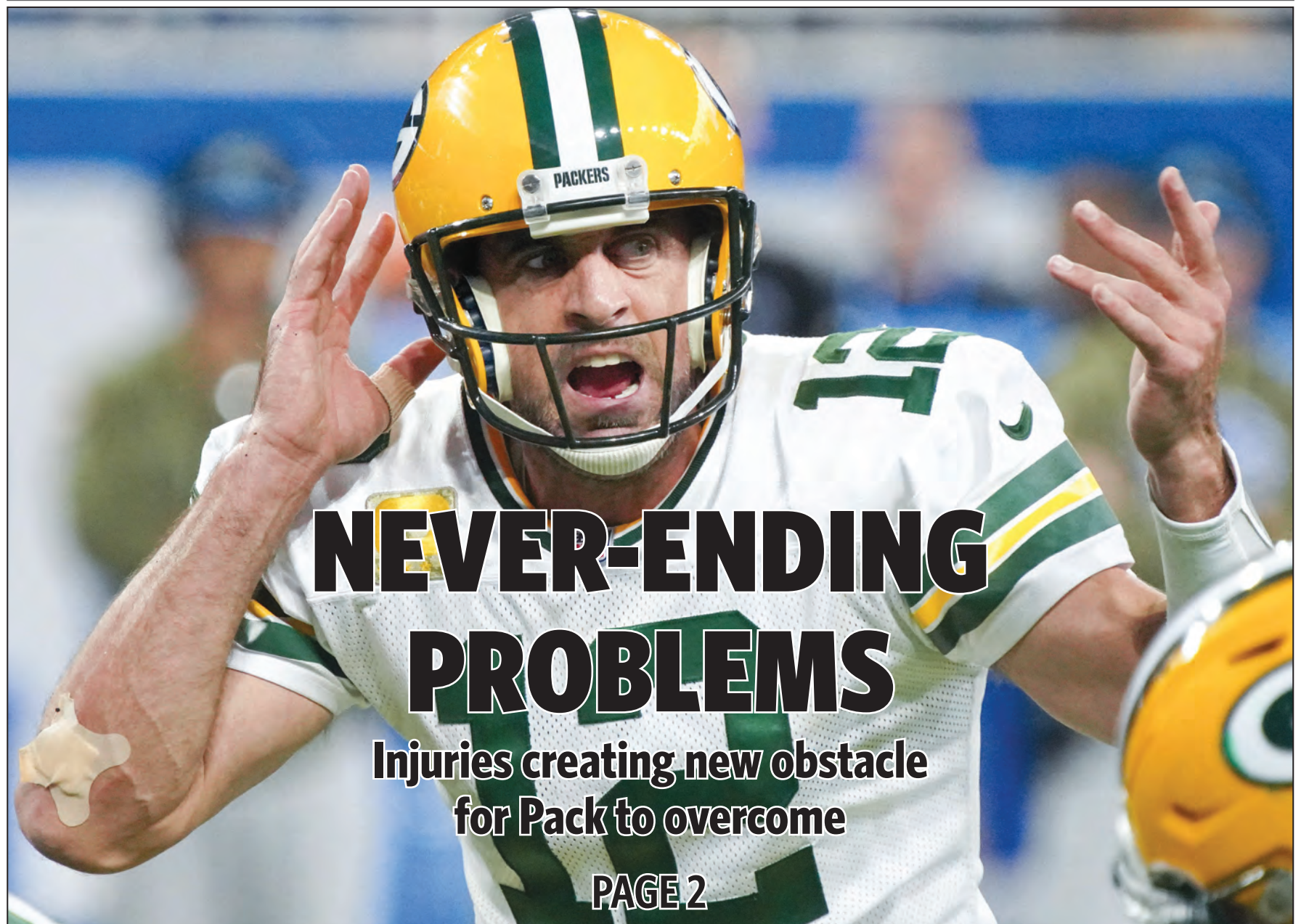

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Gary's injury provides one more setback

Several other players also banged up

The Green Bay Packers keep taking hits on and off the field as the three-time defending NFC North champions have watched their playoff chances dwindle to a remote possibility well before Thanksgiving.

Green Bay (3-6) has lost five straight games for the first time since 2008, which was Aaron Rodgers' first year as the starting quarterback. The Packers must try to escape this tailspin without some key players.

Outside linebacker Rashan Gary, who has a team-high six sacks, is expected to miss the rest of the season after injuring his right knee Sunday in a 15-9 loss at Detroit.

"It's a tremendous loss," Packers coach Matt LaFleur said Nov. 7. "Not only just from obviously a production standpoint, just, man, he is a guy that just competes at the highest level. He is one of the grittiest guys that's on this team. And just the effort that he brings on a daily basis is definitely going to be missed."

LaFleur couldn't rule out the possibility that other Packers might have suffered season-ending injuries Sunday, but remained hopeful while players underwent additional tests. The biggest concern surrounded cornerback Eric Stokes, who hurt his knee and ankle.

This flurry of injuries comes as Green Bay enters perhaps the toughest stretch of its schedule, starting with a Sunday night matchup against the Dallas Cowboys in former Packers coach Mike McCarthy's return to Lambeau Field.

"I challenged everybody to dig a little bit deeper and continue to look at yourself and ask yourself what can I do better?," LaFleur said. "Because we need that, the collective effort in order for us to make that jump and come out in top. But certainly everybody's extremely frustrated."

This wasn't what Rodgers was expecting when the four-time MVP decided to return to Green Bay rather than retire or pursue a trade. Nor was it what the Packers anticipated when they signed Rodgers to a contract ex-

tension that essentially impacted their future for the possibility of winning one more Super Bowl with the future Hall of Fame quarterback, who turns 39 on Dec. 2.

Rodgers threw three interceptions — matching a career high — in the loss at Detroit as his body language frequently made his frustration obvious.

"This is a lot of life lessons for sure this year," Rodgers said. "But luckily, it's not over. There are still a lot of games left. We'll be counted out probably by many. We'll see how we respond."

What's working

The defense limited Detroit to 15 points.

The Lions had been averaging 35.8 points at Ford Field this season and hadn't been held below 27 points in any of their four previous home games.

What needs work

Green Bay couldn't crack double digits against a Lions team that was ranked last in the NFL in total defense and scoring defense.

The Packers reached Lions territory without scoring in six separate drives.

Each of Rodgers' three interceptions came after Green Bay moved inside the Detroit 25, including one on first-and-goal from the 5 and another on fourth-and-goal from the 1.

One week after the Packers rushed for a season-high 208 yards at Buffalo, A.J. Dillon and Aaron Jones were limited to a combined 59 yards on 20 carries. Rodgers was Green Bay's leading rusher with 40 yards on four attempts.

The Packers have committed 25 penalties over their past three games.

Stock up

Receiver Allen Lazard scored Green Bay's lone touchdown on a 20-yard reception. Lazard has five touchdown catches this season despite missing two games with injuries.

Tight end Josiah Deguara had a career-high five catches for 41 yards.

Stock down

Rodgers had multiple red zone interceptions in a single game for the first time. Rodgers has thrown seven interceptions this season, his highest season total since 2016.

Entering Monday, he ranked 16th

in the NFL in quarterback rating after leading the league in that category during his MVP seasons of 2020 and 2021.

Receiver Sammy Watkins had just one catch for 9 yards. Watkins has four receptions for 48 yards and no touchdowns in three games since coming off injured reserve.

Injured

Along with the injuries to Gary and Stokes, WR Romeo Doubs (ankle), Jones (ankle), WR Christian Watson, LB Krys Barnes (head) and OT David Bakhtiari (knee) left the game. Bakhtiari returned for the final series.

Watson left the Buffalo game with a concussion and was evaluated for a concussion again on Sunday. LaFleur said Monday it turned out that Watson didn't have another concussion in the Lions game.

"Matter of fact, he was dying to go back in the game, and we thought it was best to shut him down because of what transpired in Buffalo," LaFleur said. "But to his credit, he was adamant and he cleared everything. So, I know he took a nice shot in the chest, and he lost his breath for a minute."

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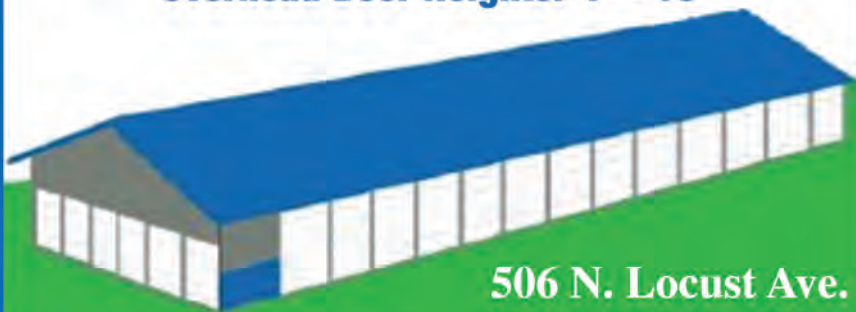

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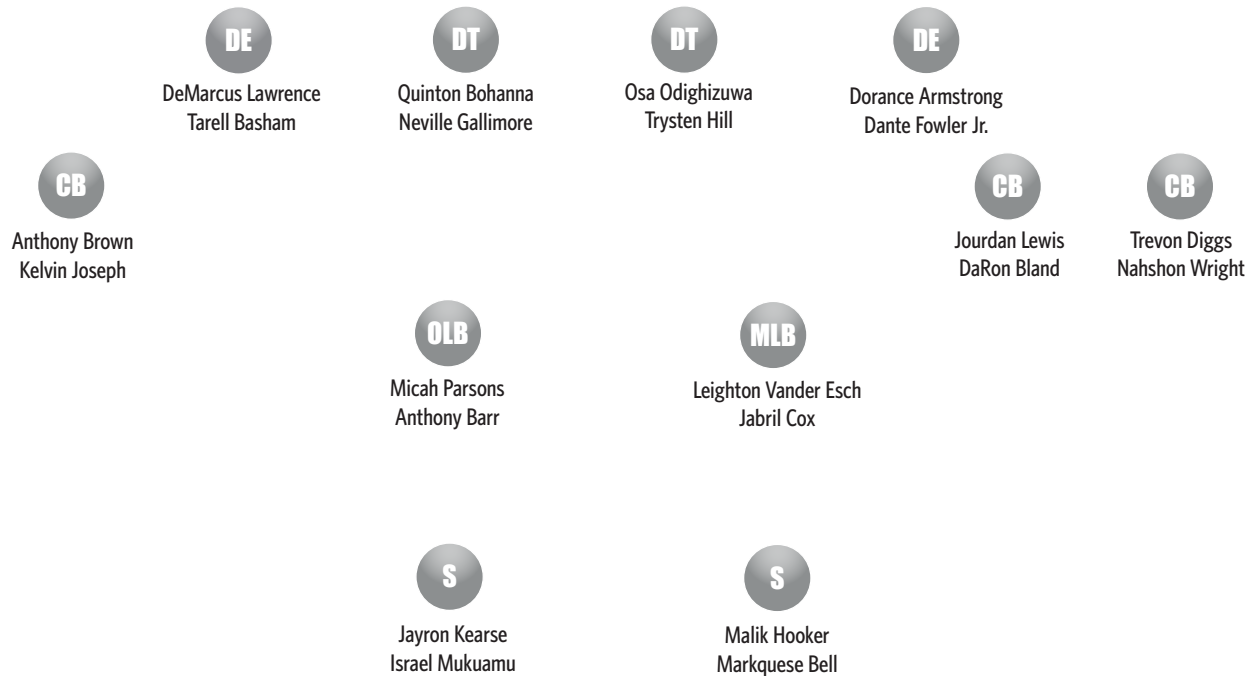
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COWBOYS DEPTH CHART

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KEYS TO THE GAME

The Green Bay Packers (3-6) will host the Dallas Cowboys (6-2) at 3:25 p.m. on Sunday at Lambeau Field in Green Bay. FOX will televise the game.

History

In a series that dates to 1960, the Packers lead 20-17 (16-13 regular season; 4-4 playoffs). The Packers have won the last three matchups — all in Dallas — including 34-24 in 2019. Aaron Jones ran for 107 yards and four touchdowns and added seven receptions for 75 yards. Dallas won the last game played at Lambeau, 30-16 in 2016. Dak Prescott threw three touchdown passes and Ezekiel Elliott rushed for 157 yards.

Coaches

Green Bay — Matt LaFleur, 42-16, fourth season. Dallas — Mike McCarthy, 149-94-2 overall, 16th season; he went 125-77-2 with the Packers from 2006 through 2018.

When the Packers have the ball

After scoring only one touchdown against a Lions defense that was on pace to give up the most points in NFL history and still ranks 32nd in points allowed, the Packers rank 27th in scoring. Now comes a much, much bigger challenge.

The Cowboys are third with 16.6 points allowed per game. They are fourth in yards allowed per play (4.77), 22nd in rushing yards allowed per play (4.66), third in passing yards allowed per play (5.47), first in sack percentage (12.6%), ninth on third down (35.7% conversions) and seventh in the red zone (50% touchdowns).

Led by defensive coordinator Dan Quinn, the Cowboys run out of a 4-3 base alignment but mostly play 3-3-5.

Each layer has a big-time playmaker with defensive end DeMarcus Lawrence, linebacker Micah Parsons and cornerback Trevon Diggs.

Up front, it's Lawrence, Osa Odighizuwa and Quinton Bohannon. Lawrence has four sacks and Dorance Armstrong has five off the bench; otherwise, it's a nondescript group.

Green Bay's hope for pulling off an upset will be the offensive line getting push against that group to power the running game.

Barr and Parsons — three first-round picks — are the linebackers. Parsons, the 12th pick of last year's draft, is one of the NFL's great players, regardless of position. He is a tremendous off-the-ball linebacker on first and second down, and a superb pass rusher on third down. In 24 career games, he's got 21 sacks, 29 tackles for losses and five forced fumbles. He's fifth in the league with eight sacks this year.

Vander Esch is second on the team with 57 tackles. Barr, the former Vikings star, is the weak link.

Diggs and Anthony Brown are the cornerbacks, Malik Hooker, Donovan Wilson and Jayron Kearse are the safeties, and DaRon Bland mans the slot.

Diggs is an interesting player. A first-round pick in 2020, he led the NFL with 11 interceptions last season and yet gave up the most receiving yards in the league, according to Pro Football Focus. This year, he's got three interceptions and is second in the NFL with 12 passes defended but is fifth in yards allowed. Brown has allowed 36 completions, second-most in the

league.

Wilson has a team-high 59 tackles. Hooker is third with 37. Both players have an interception. Wilson will miss some tackles but is an excellent blitzer.

When the Cowboys have the ball

Dallas is 12th with 22.9 points per game. It's fairly mediocre across the board, ranking 13th in yards per rush and 15th in yards per pass. In the key situations, the Cowboys are 22nd on third down (37.8%) but eighth in the red zone (63.6%).

Some of that is due to star quarterback Dak Prescott missing five games due to injury. He's played the last two weeks and posted passer ratings of 113.2 vs. Detroit and 114.5 vs. Chicago.

In 2021, he ranked among the NFL leaders in passing yards (4,449), passing touchdowns (37) and passer rating (104.2). He's an excellent runner, too, though he's scaled back on that a bit over the years.

The Cowboys have a one-two punch in the backfield with main-

stay Ezekiel Elliott and explosive Tony Pollard. Elliott continues to be the main man but Pollard is crushing him on average (6.2 yards per carry vs. 4.1).

CeeDee Lamb is Prescott's favorite target. After topping 1,100 yards last year, he's caught 42 passes for 556 yards and three touchdowns. Fellow receivers Noah Brown (25 receptions, 339 yards) and Michael Gallup (12 receptions, 135 yards in five games but 1,107 yards in 2019) and tight end Dalton Schultz (20 receptions, 203 yards) provide balance.

Dallas is renowned for its dominant offensive lines. That's not the case with this group, though. With eight-time Pro Bowler Tyron Smith on injured reserve, rookie Tyler Smith has stepped in at left tackle. He's allowed four sacks and been guilty of seven penalties.

"I think he's made a very accelerated path. Think about where we were going into the Tampa Bay game" for week one, McCarthy said. "His application, work ethic and all that, he just needs to play. Not to get on my soapbox here about offensive line training ability as far as their time and so forth, he's just a young guy that's going to keep getting better each week. Physically, he's got everything you look for. He's got the perfect temperament. He's an alpha."

Right guard Zach Martin has been a Pro Bowler in seven of his eight seasons.

The rest of the line consists of left guard Connor McGovern, former Wisconsin standout Tyler Biadasz at center and Terence Steele at right tackle.

Special teams

In Football Outsiders' rankings, Dallas is second and Green Bay is 29th.

Kicker Brett Maher is 15-of-17 on field goals, including 11-of-11 from inside 50 yards.

He's got a big-time leg, with opponents returning only two of his 42 kickoffs.

Punter Bryan Anger is among the league leaders with a 48.5-yard average and 42.4-yard net average. Opponents are averaging 8 yards per return.

Receiver KaVontae Turpin isn't going to break many tackles at 158 pounds but he's got excellent acceleration ability. He's averaging 24.2 yards per kickoff return (long of 63) and 14.7 yards per punt return (long of 52).

Q&A WITH MIKE MCCARTHY

Mike McCarthy will coach his first game at Lambeau Field since Dec. 2, 2018, when he leads the Dallas Cowboys into Green Bay for Sunday's game against the Packers. From 2006 through his firing in 2018, he went 125-77-2, led the team to the playoffs nine times and won a Super Bowl in 2010. He's No. 2 in franchise history in wins behind only Curly Lambeau.

Q: You and your family still spend part of your offseason up here. How different do you think it will be to play a game at Lambeau Field?

A: I'm looking forward to it. As I told the team today, we're blessed to have a premier stadium, AT&T Stadium, and coming back to Lambeau Field, it's one of a kind. I just told them to embrace the opportunity but, at the end of the day, we're focusing on the team we're competing against.

I'll continue to talk about specifics and things I think are important as far as playing up there in Lambeau. We're looking forward to it. I know I'm looking forward to it.

Q: Have you thought about what it's going to be like to arrive at the stadium and walk onto the field for the first time?

A: I wouldn't say I spend a lot of time thinking about that. I think just like anything in our league, in our business, it's the people you always look forward to seeing. So, I'm definitely looking forward to seeing everybody. I expect everybody from the Green Bay media to be in my press conference afterwards. I'll be taking attendance. (Pause) That was a joke.

Q: I'm laughing.

A: I'm looking forward to that and I'm also looking forward to coming out of that locker room in that narrow tunnel, which is by design. Just all the little things. I think it's just like anything, my mind is really on making sure the team's ready for just the little intricacies leading up to the game, and we're coming up there to compete, coming up there to win.

Q: How beneficial was it for you to take a year off between jobs?

A: I think the year off was excellent. I think it's just like anything, especially getting up there in age a little bit, being in my 50s, it gives you time to reflect and do the work that you need to do to grow. It was really good for us as a family to be together more and deal with the transition.

Obviously, the pandemic was a challenge because, frankly, I think I spent more time up there than down

here in Dallas. So, I think the year off really gave me a chance to take a step back, reorganize a lot of things. I mean, 13 years is a long time.

Q: Do you ever go on Mike McCarthy Way?

A: If the kids want Sammy's Pizza, I go to Sammy's Pizza. My good friend Steve Nelson, his company's on McCarthy Way. He tells me we got a new street, new sidewalks, so he keeps me posted. So, that's a good thing, but I don't stay away from that. It's a small town. It's a unique town.

Going back to the year off, I was seeing the Titledown Orthopedics two or three times a week for rehab on some injuries and knee surgeries. Yeah, I don't shy away.

Q: What kind of reception do you expect from the fans?

A: Really don't have any expectations. I think just like anything, it's a fanbase that loves their team. I'm hopeful that we have a lot of Cowboys fans there. I was in a conversation last week about it.

I actually worked in Green Bay in 1999 when Coach (Mike) Holmgren came back to Lambeau Field for the first time (as coach of the Seahawks). I thought the crowd treated him with respect. It's a really special place that

way, and I would be all for a very positive reception.

Q: What are you most proud of?

A: I think I go back to one of the first conversations I had with Ted Thompson and Bob Harlan. A young man by the name of Terrence Murphy had an injury that the organization just didn't feel like it was in his best interest to continue playing.

Out of that conversation was, 'Hey, I don't have children, but we're going to treat these men as if they're our own children.' And that was a consistent message of how we tried to do things and obviously we had lot of success.

Q: What's your favorite memory?

A: I always enjoyed the interactions with the players, the team meetings and things like that. It's hard not to put the Super Bowl victory at the forefront of that. And I'm just talking about everything about it, just the way the team prepared and the confidence that we had before the game.

C.J. Wilson on the piano the night before the game and the guys standing around the piano signing. The welcoming to Dallas (the city) gave us, the fire engines shooting water over the top of the plane and the biggest escort I've ever seen. Just all the things

Q: How long did it take you to get over being fired?

A: I think the year off was exactly what I needed. It was not ideal to be right there in town, just being honest, but I think that time did give me the chance to be with my family so much more. It just opens their eyes to the things that we know that we all miss as coaches in this industry. But, you know, I do understand it.

You know, 13 years is a very long time to be there. But there's a reason why it lasted 13 years and why it went that long. I was never really torn about the change, because that's the way the coaching profession goes. The exit, you know, I definitely was not a fan of, and it left a dent in our family.

But the year off and the opportunity to be together and do the things we did, I think in hindsight it turned out to be one of the best things that we were able to go through.

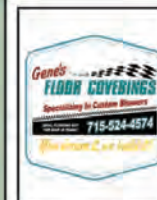

Unfamiliar territory

Together, Mike McCarthy and Aaron Rodgers brought the title back to Titledtown.

Under the tutelage of McCarthy, Rodgers went from promising prospect to future Hall of Famer. They won a Super Bowl together in 2010. A year later, Rodgers won the first of his four NFL MVPs.

After a decade of being McCarthy's starting quarterback, they'll be on opposite sidelines for the first time on Sunday when the Green Bay Packers host the Dallas Cowboys. While Green Bay's season has gone up in smoke with a five-game losing streak and 3-6 record, Dallas is 6-2 and emerging as a Super Bowl contender.

"I think it's fair to say I've had great communications with Aaron lately," McCarthy said in a conference call with Packers beat reporters on Monday. "I look forward to seeing him in-person. But my motivation is to get to 7-2."

"They're a dangerous, dangerous football team. They're very impressive with talent and particularly some of their talent on their defense. It's a lot of new faces that we haven't competed against. I'm just really focused on winning the game."

Coming off back-to-back MVP seasons, Rodgers has not been able to rescue the Packers from their funk. His three interceptions — two in the red zone and one into double coverage — were a major reason why they lost 15-9 to the woeful Detroit Lions.

McCarthy, though, knows what Rodgers is capable of doing. In 2016, the Packers were 4-6 following a four-game losing streak. Rodgers then embarked on one of the great stretches of quarterback play in NFL history as Green Bay ran the table with six consecutive wins and eventually reached the NFC title game.

"I think Aaron's been playing at an MVP level since probably '09, just the way I view it," McCarthy said. "I got a chance to watch him play a lot this weekend. His footwork and ball mechanics, it's always been off the charts. I still see him playing at a high level. Obviously, he's playing with a number of different players, but I've been very, very impressed with the video that he has."

Replacing Gary

Given how this season unfolded, the worst thing that happened on Sunday at Detroit wasn't losing to the Lions. It was losing star outside line-

backer Rashan Gary to a torn ACL.

Gary leads the team with six sacks and entered the game ranked fifth in Pro Football Focus' pass-rushing productivity, a metric that measures sacks, hits and hurries per pass-rushing snap.

A source said Gary's recovery timeline is nine to 11 months, which signals the injury is a bit more significant than just a torn ACL.

The next man up is impressive rookie Kingsley Enagbare. A fifth-round pick this year, he's been coming on strong. Enagbare had zero sacks and, according to PFF, zero quarterback pressures in the first five games. He had two sacks and six pressures the last four games. He would have had a third sack vs. Detroit if not for a questionable roughing-the-passer penalty.

"He's been getting better week in and week out," Gary said of Enagbare last week. "He's starting to understand the standard of our room and being an outside linebacker here and understanding what it means to be a Packer."

"I'm just happy that, the more reps that he gets, that he's taking full advantage. You see him getting better on the practice field, and what he does on the practice field translates to the game field. I'm just happy for his success. He's a hungry player."

Changes coming?

With it looking increasingly un-

likely that the Packers will be able to turn the season around, are changes coming?

Nothing major.

Immediately after the loss at Detroit, LaFleur said he was not considering a change at quarterback. Rodgers will start against the Cowboys, not Jordan Love.

No changes are coming on the coaching staff, either, even though a "work in progress" offense, as it was called by everyone from Rodgers to LaFleur to general manager Brian Gutekunst during training camp, has shown almost no signs of progress.

Against the worst defense in the NFL, the Packers punted only once but scored only one touchdown thanks in large part to three interceptions when in scoring position.

"We collectively have got to do a better job, starting with myself, and try to put our players in a better position," LaFleur said on Monday. "I thought on special teams, we did a pretty decent job. I thought our defense did a really good job, as well, in terms of getting some key stops, limiting a team to 15 points."

"If you hold somebody to 15 points — and this is what I told the team — we expect to win that game. Bottom line. Offensively, we were moving the ball pretty well, but this game's about points."

Youth movement

Maybe it's just an excuse, but two reasons for the passing game's weekly struggles are injuries and lack of continuity.

Following the trade of Davante Adams, the Packers don't have a go-to receiver. Allen Lazard, the team's most reliable receiver, has missed 2½ games. Cobb on Sunday will miss a fourth consecutive game.

Past-his-prime veteran Sammy Watkins missed four games and can't get on the same page. Rookie Christian Watson can't get through a game without an injury. Fellow rookie Romeo Doubs was injured on the first play against Detroit.

"There is a lot of inexperience around him," LaFleur said. "I always get a little bit confused when we talk about this, to be honest with you, because there's a lot of things that happen out there on the field that you need guys to kind of react to."

"We got a couple of looks in the game where I'm like, 'Whoa, I haven't seen some of those looks before.' So, you need guys to kind of be instinctual, and the best way to do that is to go out there and play and bank those reps. I don't really know if I've got a good answer for you other than, yes, is there going to be a lot of learning along the way."

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Rodgers throws 3 INTs as Pack falls to Lions

Green Bay unable to finish off drives

Aaron Rodgers faked a handoff, rolled right and threw off-balance left, woefully short of his target.

Rodgers' poor pass intended for left tackle David Bakhtiari on a fourth down was picked off by rookie Aidan Hutchinson. It was one of several plays the four-time NFL MVP wished he had back.

Rodgers matched a career high with three interceptions and threw an incomplete pass on fourth down from the Detroit 17 in the final minute, letting the Lions hold on for a 15-9 win over the Green Bay Packers on Nov. 6 in a matchup of slumping teams.

When Rodgers was asked why he still believes this team can turn it around, he looked down at a lectern and had a long pause before answering.

"I've been counted out many times in my life, as have many of my teammates," He said. "I hope we just dig deep and find a way. We will truly be underdogs for many games moving forward. Hopefully we can embrace that."

The Packers (3-6) have lost five straight for the first time since 2008, when Rodgers was a first-year starter.

"I would be concerned if I saw guys not competing out there," coach Matt LaFleur said.

Rodgers thought about retiring in the offseason after winning a second straight NFL MVP award, but he chose to keep playing and insisted he doesn't regret it.

"When I decided to come back, it was all in," he said.

The Lions (2-6) ended a five-game losing streak, giving them a desperately needed win after defensive backs coach Aubrey Pleasant was fired and standout tight end T.J. Hockenson was traded.

"I'm exhausted," said coach Dan Campbell, who won for the fifth time in 25 games in Detroit. "I want to go home, put my feet up and drink a beer."

Detroit tried to seal the victory late in the fourth when Campbell went for it on fourth-and-3 from the Green Bay 43. Jared Goff's pass was incomplete.

Rodgers failed to take advantage. He did convert a fourth-and-2 with a

lob to Samori Toure, who fumbled out of bounds at the Detroit 17.

Rodgers threw four straight incomplete passes to end a lousy game overall. He was 23 of 42 for 291 yards with a TD and had three interceptions for the fifth time in his career.

On the field and the sideline, Rodgers looked and sounded upset with his teammates.

"It's disappointing and frustrating, but yeah, I think that we all probably could do a little bit better job of controlling that frustration," LaFleur said.

Goff was 14 of 26 for 137 yards with touchdown passes to Shane Zylstra and James Mitchell, a pair of tight ends that took advantage of an increased role after Detroit dealt

Hockenson to Minnesota.

Rodgers threw interceptions in the end zone on his first two possessions. Kerby Joseph picked off the first one on a deflected pass and Hutchinson intercepted the next one.

"He told me he gave me a gift," Hutchinson said.

Campbell made a call on Green Bay's next possession that panned out, winning a challenge that overturned a Green Bay catch on fourth down.

Detroit took advantage, breaking a scoreless tie with Goff's 1-yard touchdown pass to Zylstra early in the second quarter. Jamaal Williams ran for a 2-point conversion after a running-into-the-kicker penalty.

Goff threw an interception early in

the third quarter and Rodgers gave it back two snaps later, getting picked off at the Lions 3 by Joseph again.

Rodgers responded with a 20-yard touchdown pass to Allen Lazard, but his 2-point conversion pass to him was broken up by Jeff Okudah, allowing the Lions to lead 8-6.

Goff gave Detroit a nine-point lead with his second touchdown pass, a 3-yard throw to rookie tight end James Mitchell.

Green Bay stalled at the Lions 7 on the ensuing drive and had to settle for Mason Crosby's 25-yard field goal that cut its deficit to six midway through the fourth quarter.
