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Green Bay has 6% chance to make playoffs

Does team start Love at all?

Believe it or not, the Green Bay Packers are still alive in the NFC playoff picture, as they enter a must-win matchup against the Los Angeles Rams in week 15.

Green Bay currently has a 6% chance to make the playoffs. While that may seem low, there are realistic opportunities for the Packers to sneak into the playoffs. It all starts with the Packers winning the rest of its games.

If that doesn't happen, none of the following scenarios has much significance.

"Every season is different, and every season is new," said Packers General Manager Brian Gutekunst, on his thoughts on the Packers' season. "Obviously we had some moving pieces heading into the season — it has just taken us a little while to gel."

With three wild card spots available, Green Bay is currently in the No. 10 seed in the NFC. Seattle and Detroit occupy the two spots ahead of the Packers.

Dallas, Washington and the New York Giants are the teams that now sit in the three available wild card spots. With the Philadelphia Eagles owning a 12-1 record and the Cowboys owning a 10-3 record, it seems likely that the Cowboys (or the Eagles, if they collapse) will take one of those spots.

That leaves two spots open. The headache comes in week 15 as the Giants and Commanders, who tied earlier this year, meet again. Whoever wins this game will need to tally just one more victory to guarantee placement ahead of the Packers, even if Green Bay were to win out.

Whoever loses this game, though, would need to lose two more games, with the Packers winning out, for the Packers to jump ahead of them.

The Seahawks are in an interesting spot in regard to Green Bay. On its schedule, Seattle still has yet to play the San Francisco 49ers, Kansas City Chiefs and New York Jets. Those are not exactly easy games.

If Seattle goes 2-2 over that stretch, they would finish 9-8, which would move the Packers ahead, due to tiebreakers.

The other team that is lurking around the playoffs is the Detroit Lions. This one is a little trickier than

Seattle, as the Lions are a division rival and have a win over Green Bay already this year.

Moving forward, the Lions have the Jets, Panthers, Bears and Packers on their schedule, which is not exactly the hardest schedule of all time.

If the Lions and Packers both win their next three games, then a week 18 matchup at Lambeau Field may have a lot more significance than fans had anticipated. If the Packers were to beat the Lions in that game, the Packers would own the tiebreaker over Detroit.

Once again, those scenarios don't matter if Green Bay does not win the rest of its games.

"I think that there has been some positive signs as of late, and we just need to continue to be more consistent," said Gutekunst, alluding to the offense's improvement as the team looks for a playoff push.

So what happens if Green Bay loses one more game? If that game is against the Rams, somehow Green Bay is still not out of the playoffs; however its chances of making the playoffs drop to below 1%. It seems unlikely that all of those scenarios go Green Bay's way, so if they do lose that Rams game, can we expect to see a little bit more of Jordan Love?

Aaron Rodgers has been playing most of the season with a broken

thumb, so it makes some sort of sense to put the veteran quarterback on injured reserve and let Love run the offense with Rodgers coaching from the sideline.

That also brings into question what the Rodgers' decision will be in the offseason. Will the 39-year old quarterback want to finish out the last season of his contract in Green Bay? Will he go to a different team? Or, will he retire?

With \$50 million sitting on the table for Rodgers, it may be too tempting to return to Green Bay next year. That once again leads to the Jordan Love situation.

"I don't really want to take my mind there, but as long as we are mathematically alive, I'd like to be out there," said Rodgers, after the week 12 loss to Philadelphia. "There are obviously a lot of other conversations that come into play once you are eliminated, and I'll be open to all of those conversations."

If Rodgers does in fact return to Green Bay, then the Packers are faced with the same dilemma as last offseason — what do we have in Love?

The Packers traded up to draft the Utah State quarterback in the first round, leading many to believe that Love was going to be groomed into Rodgers' successor. Since Love was

drafted in 2020, Rodgers has led two MVP campaigns and three straight playoff seasons.

Is a broken thumb and lackluster season from players around Rodgers enough for Rodgers to leave? Probably not, considering he is the longest tenured Packer of all time.

"That is an offseason kind of decision, but surely we want all of our guys back," said Gutekunst about Rodgers returning next year. "Like we have talked about in the past — this is something where we will sit down with him after the season, and it will be something that we do together."

That's why Love needs to play this season if the Packers lose one more game. Coaches have seen bits and pieces of Love, but not in any high-pressure or real NFL situations. He is also only signed through four years, with a team decision on the fifth year.

If Rodgers were to play again next year, that would mean that Love would have been a first-round draft pick that hadn't really got an opportunity to start in his first four years in the NFL. At some point, young players need to get time to develop and if Love doesn't get that this year, it could have a lasting impact on not only the Packers, but on Love's whole career.

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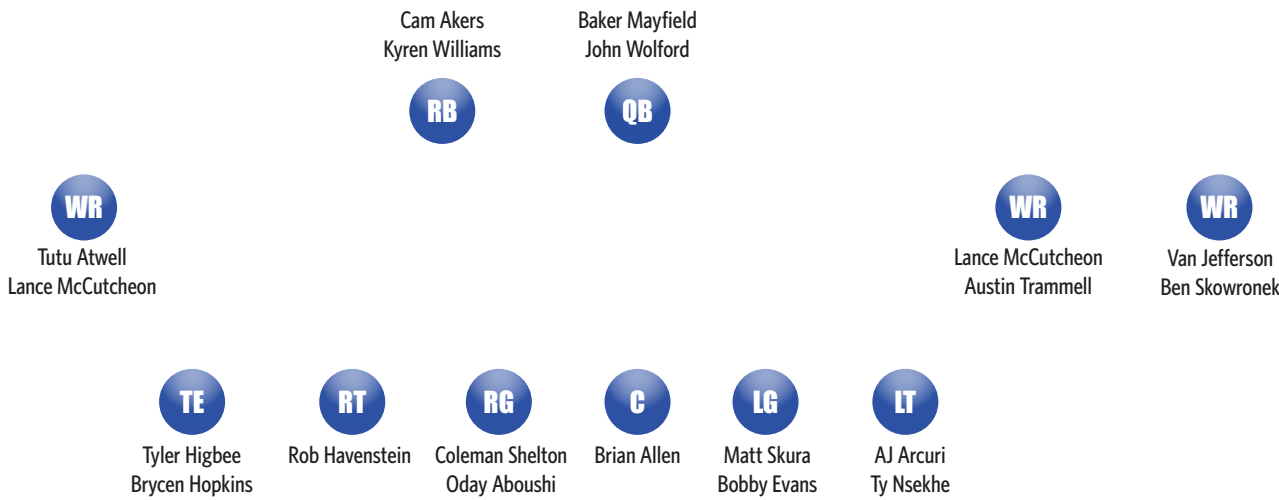

There are plenty of reasons why the Green Bay Packers won't reach this year's playoffs. First, the obvious one: They're 5-8 and in 10th place in the NFC standings with four games to go. That's too many losses and probably not enough games to catch up.

The defense is perhaps the most underachieving unit in the NFL. The special teams have been a disappointment. Aaron Rodgers has rarely played at his customary MVP level.

Can a team that needed to outscore the woeful Chicago Bears 18-0 in the fourth quarter before the bye sweep through the Los Angeles Rams (4-9), Miami Dolphins (8-5), Minnesota Vikings (10-3) and Detroit Lions (6-7)?

The defending Super Bowl-champion Rams are huge under-achievers, too, but new quarterback Baker Mayfield gave them a jolt last week.

The Dolphins are 5-1 at home and will have a two-day rest advantage.

The Vikings will have an extra day of rest. The Lions have won five of six.

Nonetheless, Green Bay's come-from-behind win at Chicago meant it still had a pulse. Losses on Sunday by the New York Giants and Seattle Seahawks, two teams ahead of the Packers in the wild card standings, gave added strength to their heartbeat.

The Dallas Cowboys (10-3) have one wild-card spot locked up but the final two spots, held by the Washington Commanders and Giants with their 7-5-1 records, are within sight.

"Obviously heading into the season, being the No. 1 seed the last two seasons leading into this season, a lot of high hopes," general manager Brian Gutekunst said last week.

"We were certainly expected to be competing for a championship, and we are still in it. If we're able to dig our way back into this thing, we still feel like we have the ability to do that."

Here are seven reasons why the Packers can make the playoffs.

Aaron Rodgers to Christian Watson

Everyone knew Green Bay's offense would be a "work in progress" following the offseason trade of

Quarterback Aaron Rodgers used that phrase throughout training camp. Thanks to the emerge of rookie receiver Christian Watson,

that progress is showing up.

Through the first nine games, Green Bay was 27th in scoring with 17.1 points per game. It failed to reach 28 points in any of those

games. It's been a different story the last four games. With Watson supplying eight touchdowns, Green Bay is sixth in scoring with 27.3 points per game. It's scored at least 28 in three of those four games.

With Aaron Jones and A.J. Dillon, the Packers have been able to run the ball for most of the season. With the emergence of Watson, they have the big-play passing element that was lacking during their first-half-of-the-season struggles.

December dominance

Under coach Matt LaFleur, the Packers are 15-1 in regular-season games played in December and January.

Their lone loss came in last year's meaningless finale at Detroit. Past performance isn't indicative of future results, as the mandatory financial disclaimer states, but it does show the Packers have peaked at the right time and know how to handle the elements.

Starting with Monday night's game against the Rams, the Packers will finish the season with three of their last four at Lambeau

Field. Last year's playoff loss to San Francisco was a cold reminder that so-called Packers weather doesn't guarantee anything, but it should be an advantage against the warm-weather Rams and the great-indoors Vikings and Lions.

Takeaways

Joe Barry's defense ranks 21st with 23.2 points per game. It's all-around bad, checking in at No. 30 in yards per carry and No. 21 in yards per passing attempt. It just hasn't played to the preseason hype with any regularity.

However, after forcing five turnovers in the first seven games, Green Bay has produced 10 over the last six games.

Sixth-place Commanders

The Commanders (7-5-1) are 6-1-1 in their last eight games. However, they are 1-4-1 against teams with winning records, and three of their final four are against teams that are at least two games over .500. That includes a home game against the seventh-place Giants on Sunday. They are 25th in scoring, ranking 27th in yards per rush, 26th in yards per pass and 27th on third down.

Seventh-place Giants

The fading Giants face the toughest finishing schedule of any playoff contender. That stretch began with a 48-22 loss at home to the Eagles on Sunday.

They are 1-4-1 in their last six games, with the victory being at home against the dreadful Texans. The Giants are 20th in scoring and can't pass the ball a lick (28th in passing per game and 31st in sack percentage).

Remaining schedule: at Washington (7-5-1), at Minnesota (10-3), Indianapolis (4-8-1), at Philadelphia (12-1). Total: 33-17-2 (.654).

Eighth-place Seahawks

The Seahawks lost at home to Carolina on Sunday, their third loss in four games and a potentially fatal blow to their playoff chances considering they face the rampaging 49ers this week and travel to the powerhouse Chiefs next week.

While they play three of their last four at home, they're only 6-8 in Seattle the last two years. Interestingly, the NFC South doesn't have a single team with a winning record, but the Seahawks went 0-4 against that division.

Remaining schedule: San Francisco (9-4), at Kansas City (10-3), N.Y. Jets (7-6), L.A. Rams (4-9). Total: 30-22 (.577).

Ninth-place Lions

Starting with their week nine victory over Green Bay, the Lions are 5-1 in their last six games with

their only loss coming on Thanksgiving against the juggernaut Bills. They are coming off a huge win over Minnesota.

While the Lions allowed Kirk Cousins to throw for 425 yards, including 223 to Justin Jefferson, Dalvin Cook was limited to 23 yards on 15 carries. Can a young team like the Lions finish the job despite finishing with three road games, including the finale at Lambeau?

KEYS TO THE GAME

The Green Bay Packers (5-8) will host the Los Angeles Rams (4-9) at 7:15 p.m. on Monday at Lambeau Field in Green Bay. ESPN will televise the game.

History

In a series that dates to 1937, when the Packers trounced the Cleveland Rams 35-10, Green Bay holds a 48-47-2 lead. That includes wins at Lambeau Field in the 2021 regular season and 2020 playoffs.

In last year's 36-28 victory, Green Bay pulled away in the third quarter behind a 5-yard touchdown reception by A.J. Dillon and a 33-yard pick-six by Rasul Douglas.

Coaches

Green Bay — Matt LaFleur, 44-18, fourth season. Los Angeles — Sean McVay, 59-35, sixth season.

When the Packers have the ball

The Los Angeles defense was the driving force behind its win in last year's Super Bowl. Not this year.

The Rams are 16th with 22.8 points allowed per game. They are a powerhouse against the run, ranking fourth with 3.98 yards per carry, and in the red zone, with a second-ranked touchdown rate of 41.5%. However, it's 22nd in passing per play, 23rd in sack percentage and 23rd on third down. During a six-game losing streak it snapped last week, the Rams allowed 26-plus points five times.

The key to the game will be the status of All-Pro defensive tackle Aaron Donald. He was inactive for last Thursday's victory over the Raiders due to a high-ankle sprain. He could return this week.

Donald is one of the greatest defensive linemen in NFL history. A Pro Bowler in each of his first eight seasons and an All-Pro the past seven, Donald ranks sixth among active players with 103 sacks. His streak of five consecutive seasons with 10-plus sacks is in jeopardy as he has only five in 11 games this year. Nonetheless, he leads all interior defenders in PFF's pass-rush win rate. He paces the team with 10 tackles for losses.

Greg Gaines and Marquise Copeland join Donald on the defensive line of the Rams' 3-4 alignment. Gaines has three sacks.

Leonard Floyd and Terrell Lewis are the outside linebackers. Floyd, who had a combined 20 sacks the past two seasons, has five sacks and a team-high 12 quarterback hits. With one sack,

Lewis generally rushes from the right side. That means a matchup against Green Bay's left tackle — perhaps Zach Tom with David Bakhtiari coming off

an appendectomy.

Perennial All-Pro Bobby Wagner and Ernest Jones are the inside linebackers. Wagner, the longtime

Seahawks star, has been fabulous with 111 tackles, five sacks, seven tackles for losses and four passes defended. Jones is no slouch with 93 tackles.

At cornerback, All-Pro Jalen Ramsey is joined by Troy Hill. In nickel, Hill moves to the slot and fourth-round rookie Cobie Durant enters at corner. Ramsey, with one interception and 11 passes defended, has been unusually vulnerable.

According to PFF, he's allowed a 68.7% catch rate and a league-high seven touchdowns. However, he helped limit Davante Adams to only three catches in his last game. Ramsey, the esteemed veteran, vs. the explosive Christian Watson would be a riveting matchup.

Taylor Rapp and Nick Scott are the safeties. Scott has two interceptions, five passes defended and two forced fumbles. Rapp had a career-high four interceptions last year but only one this year.

When the Rams have the ball

When the Rams won the Super Bowl last year, the key to the offense was quarterback Matthew Stafford throwing passes to unstoppable re-

ceiver Cooper Kupp. Both players are on injured reserve. Stafford is out for the season with a neck injury.

Kupp — who topped 100 yards in five of his first eight games — is eligible to come off injured reserve this week following ankle surgery, but that seems unlikely given the state of the Rams' season.

The Rams last week claimed quarterback Baker Mayfield off waivers. A few days later, he came off the bench to lead a come-from-behind victory over the Raiders by guiding a game-winning, 98-yard touchdown drive. He was 22-of-35 passing for 230 yards and one touchdown. The last time Mayfield came to Green Bay was as a member of the Browns last year. On Christmas, he handed the Packers four interceptions.

"I used to not necessarily complain about the fact that I had that many different offensive systems and having to learn that, but it came in handy when having to learn a crash course and being able to relate certain things," Mayfield said.

With Kupp and Allen Robinson on injured reserve, Van Jefferson, Ben Skowronek and Tutu Atwell are the primary receivers. Skowronek, who fills the Allen Lazard role, has 38 receptions for 373 yards and zero touchdowns. Jefferson has 13 grabs for

180 yards and three touchdowns in seven games and pint-sized but rocket-fast Atwell has 11 catches for 237 yards, including a 62-yard touchdown.

Tight end Tyler Higbee has 52 catches for 455 yards but just four receptions for 25 yards without Kupp the last three games.

Cam Akers is the leading rusher with only 376 yards on a 3.3 average. He hasn't had a run of longer than 15 yards this season, but Green Bay's run defense has been mostly horrendous.

The offensive line consists of left tackle Ty Nsekhe, left guard Matt Skura, center Brian Allen, right guard Coleman Shelton and former Wisconsin star Rob Havenstein at right tackle.

Special teams

In Football Outsiders' rankings, Los Angeles is 22nd and Green Bay is 30th.

Matt Gay is 19-of-21 on field goals, including 4-of-6 from 50-plus yards. He's got a big-time leg; opponents have returned only nine kickoffs.

Riley Dixon has excellent averages of 49.6 yards (gross) and 42.2 yards (net). He's had two blocked, should Packers coordinator Rich Bisaccia want to attack.

Receiver Brandon Powell handles both phases of returns, with averages of 20.4 yards on kickoffs and 7.1 yards on punts.

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Q&A WITH INNIS GAINES

After suffering season-ending ACL injuries at TCU in 2018 and 2019, Innis Gaines went undrafted and unsigned in 2020. Because of the injury, his only NFL opportunity was a late-season try-out with the Packers, who signed him to a futures deal after the 2020 season.

After spending the 2021 season on the practice squad, Gaines might have made the roster this year if not for a hamstring injury that led to his release with an injury settlement.

The Packers signed him to the practice squad on Oct. 18 and promoted him to the 53-man roster on Nov. 29.

Q: What was that moment like when you got the call that you were being promoted?

A: It was a long time coming. I saw the Lambeau number calling me and I was like, 'Yep, it feels like it's about that time.' I felt like I had a good game, felt like I've been doing hard work on the practice team, giving my best effort. Had two good training camps — had unfortunate injuries at the end of them. So, I felt like it was about time.

Q: You were a safety in 2021 and spent a lot of this summer in the slot. Did you feel good about your

chances until the injury?

A: Yeah, I felt really good in training camp. I was doing good on special teams and getting a lot of good reps in the slot and at safety to show my versatility. So, I felt good about my chances until I had an unfortunate injury that set me back.

Q: Who was the first person you told?

A: The first person I told was my girlfriend. I called her instantly and let her know the good news.

Q: Thinking back to our Zoom call with you last year, your story is pretty incredible. What has this journey been like?

A: DoorDash ...

Q: Exactly. You delivered food for DoorDash while rehabbing the knee and now you're on an NFL roster. That's a heck of a story.

A: Man, it's crazy. I tell the story to people and they don't believe it. It's hard for me to believe sometimes, knowing the ACL tears back-to-back in college, had to sit out a year, didn't get a workout until almost the end of the year with the Packers.

That turned out to be the best workout of my life. Saved my career. It's been a hard journey. I had to keep persevering through the lows and

highs to prove that I really belonged here.

Q: What did you do after the Packers released you in August?

A: I rehabbed here at Bellin. The Packers helped me rehab here with the doctors here. I stayed and watched some Packers football until it was time for me to get my call back. Week seven was the time period of my injury settlement. They said they'd take me back if I was still available and they kept their word.

Q: So, never a doubt that you'd be back?

A: Oh, yeah. For sure. I felt like I left a good mark in training camp to where they had high hopes for me. I felt like this was my best bet. If any team wanted me, the Packers were my best bet.

Q: Have you ever ordered from DoorDash?

A: Plenty of times. I leave great tips now for the times I didn't get any tips.

Q: So, what's a good tip for rookies like me?

A: They give you a set marker, like a \$3 tip automatically. I usually raise it two or three bucks. Whatever they tell you to do, I raise it a couple more bucks because I know how hard they work. Whatever it says, I do a little

more. I don't do \$20 every time; I'm not rich yet.

Q: While you've been playing only on special teams, coach Matt LaFleur mentioned your potential on defense. What does that mean to you?

A: I'm glad he said that about me. I worked my ass off to prove that I can play defense, too. It's hard being an undrafted guy. You've got to earn the trust of everybody. I proved to myself over the past year-and-a-half that I can play slot, I can play safety.

I have a high football IQ. I can see the whole field. That helps to show the coaches that I can do everything. So, that makes me feel wonderful.

Q: When I asked him, I called you Innis. He looked at me like I had a third eye.

A: Nobody calls me Innis.

Q: Where did 'Thump' come from?

A: It originated my junior year of high school. My mentor/coach, Patrick Fischer, he gave me that name. He said, 'You need something that's going to catch on with the media, catch on to people, because it's time to get offers.' It originated with Thump-Thump but it shaved down to Thump as guys started saying it more and more.



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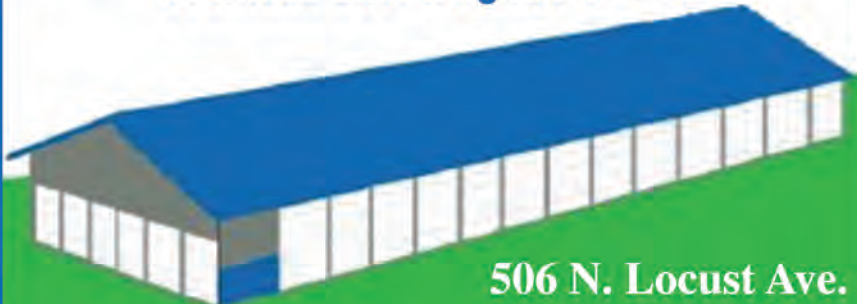
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
