Alshehry sailing on a piece of history

USS Constitution undefeated in battle, today serves as promoter of maritime history

Petty Officer First Class Munerah Alshehry, a native of Shawano, is one of nearly 80 sailors who celebrated America's 246 years of independence while serving aboard the U.S.S. Constitution.

Alshehry, a 2012 Shawano Community High School graduate, joined the U.S. Navy seven years ago. Today Alshehry serves as an electrician's mate.

"I went to college for a little bit but then decided to join the Navy," said Alshehry. "I've been using the Navy for educational benefits, and I will finally graduate in December 2023."

Skills and values similar to those found in Shawano are important to succeed in the military.

"Moving to a small hometown from Saudi Arabia taught me how to start new, which helped me adapt to the Navy lifestyle," said Alshehry. "I grew up different, but in the Navy, we're all so different and that's what makes us so strong."

The U.S.S. Constitution is the U.S. Navy's oldest commissioned warship, and the crew is hand-picked to promote naval history and maritime heritage while raising awareness of the importance of a sustained naval presence.

The ship earned the nickname Old Ironsides during the War of 1812 after British cannonballs were seen bouncing off the ship's wooden hull. The U.S.S. Constitution was undefeated in battle and captured or destroyed 33 enemy vessels.

With 90% of global commerce traveling by sea and access to the internet relying on the security of undersea fiber optic cables, Navy officials continue to emphasize that the prosperity of the United States is directly linked to trained sailors and a strong Navy.

"Our mission remains timeless — to provide our fellow citizens with nothing less than the very best Navy: fully combat ready at all times, focused on warfighting excellence, and committed to superior leadership at every single level," said Adm. Mike Gilday, chief of naval operations. "This is our calling, and I cannot imagine a calling more worthy."

As a member of the Navy, Alshehry is part of a world-class organization focused on maintaining maritime dominance, strengthening partnerships, increasing competitive warfighting capabilities and sustaining combat-ready forces in support of the National Defense Strategy.

"The Navy is important to national defense, because we deter aggression and our presence really does make a difference," said Alshehry. "I saw that first hand on my last ship when we did a deployment to the Middle East and South America."

As Alshehry and other sailors continue to train and perform missions, they take pride in serving their country in the United States Navy.

"I've learned so much about leadership in the Navy and how much one person can make a difference in people's lives," said Alshehry. "I am proud of the time and effort I have put in and my accomplishments make me proud to put on this uniform."

Alshehry is grateful to others for helping make a Navy career possible.

"I am grateful for my mom and sister," said Alshehry. "They have always been proud of me and have always been there for me. Their emails, letters and care packages while I'm on deployment make all the difference."

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The taming of the theater musical

Box in the Wood bringing 'Kiss Me, Kate' to stage for summer production

One of the classic musicals that bears the message of love — and how that can often get people in trouble — is coming to the Mielke Arts Center in mid-July.

Box in the Wood Theatre Guild is presenting "Kiss Me, Kate," where actors in a production of William Shakespeare's "Taming of the Shrew" are embroiled in romantic affairs and gambling with gangsters while finding a way to ensure the show goes on. The curtain goes up July 13 for the first show.

The opening for "Kiss Me, Kate," named for the character Katherine from "Taming of the Shrew," finds the show's director, Fred, getting into arguments both on and off the state with his ex-wife, Lilli. He is also pursuing the affections of Lois, another actress in the show, but she's attached to Bill, who has let his gambling addiction get the better of him and ends up with an IOU to some gangsters in Fred's name.

"It is a play within a play," said director Evelyn Smoot. "We have our touring theater company putting on 'Taming of the Shrew' with our leads, who have some bad blood between them because they were married, and now they are feuding. That basically spills over into the 'Taming of the Shrew' play. Some hijinks happen, some gangsters get involved with the show, but everything works out in the end."

As the gangsters are demanding their money and putting the show's performers in peril, the entanglements continue as Shakespeare's classic show, in musical form, plays out.

The musical is inspired by the arguments of two real life actors as witnessed by Broadway producer Arnold Saint-Subber, who enlisted Bella and Samuel Spewack to write the script as Cole Porter was asked to write the lyrics.

"It's got a big orchestration. It's got (Porter's) tongue-in-cheek lyrics for a lot of the songs," Smoot said. "It's a little bit more on the adult side, but it's got catchy songs that everybody has heard at one point or another."

The show became a film in 1953, and at least four television productions have been made.

Putting the show together for Box in the Wood has been a family affair

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for Smoot.

"This is something I initially did because my mom always wanted to do that," Smoot said. "I'm having her help me with this. She's basically done

the entire set, helped with blocking and help get things started. This was on her bucket list, so I figured we'd do this one show together, and it's gone great."

Smoot has previously directed for Box in the Wood, but it's been quite a while since she helped put together a show. She directed the music for "Footloose," which was performed in July 2008.

"I've been out of town for a while, and now I'm back," Smoot said. "I'm starting in again."

The show has seen its share of challenges, according to Smoot, but everything is on pace for an excellent run.

"The cast has been super great and really stepped up. We've got a lot of new faces in this performance, more than we normally have at the Mielke," she said, noting six cast members are making their debuts in "Kiss Me, Kate."

FARM LIFE FROM A FARM WIFE

A shocking time of the growing season

"Next year, we're gonna put up an electric fence," my husband declared, not without disgust.

We were gazing at a row of what once were flourishing broccoli

florets, now nibbled right down to the stems. The deer had created havoc not only in the broccoli aisle of our personal open-air vegetable market, but as well they had less-than-

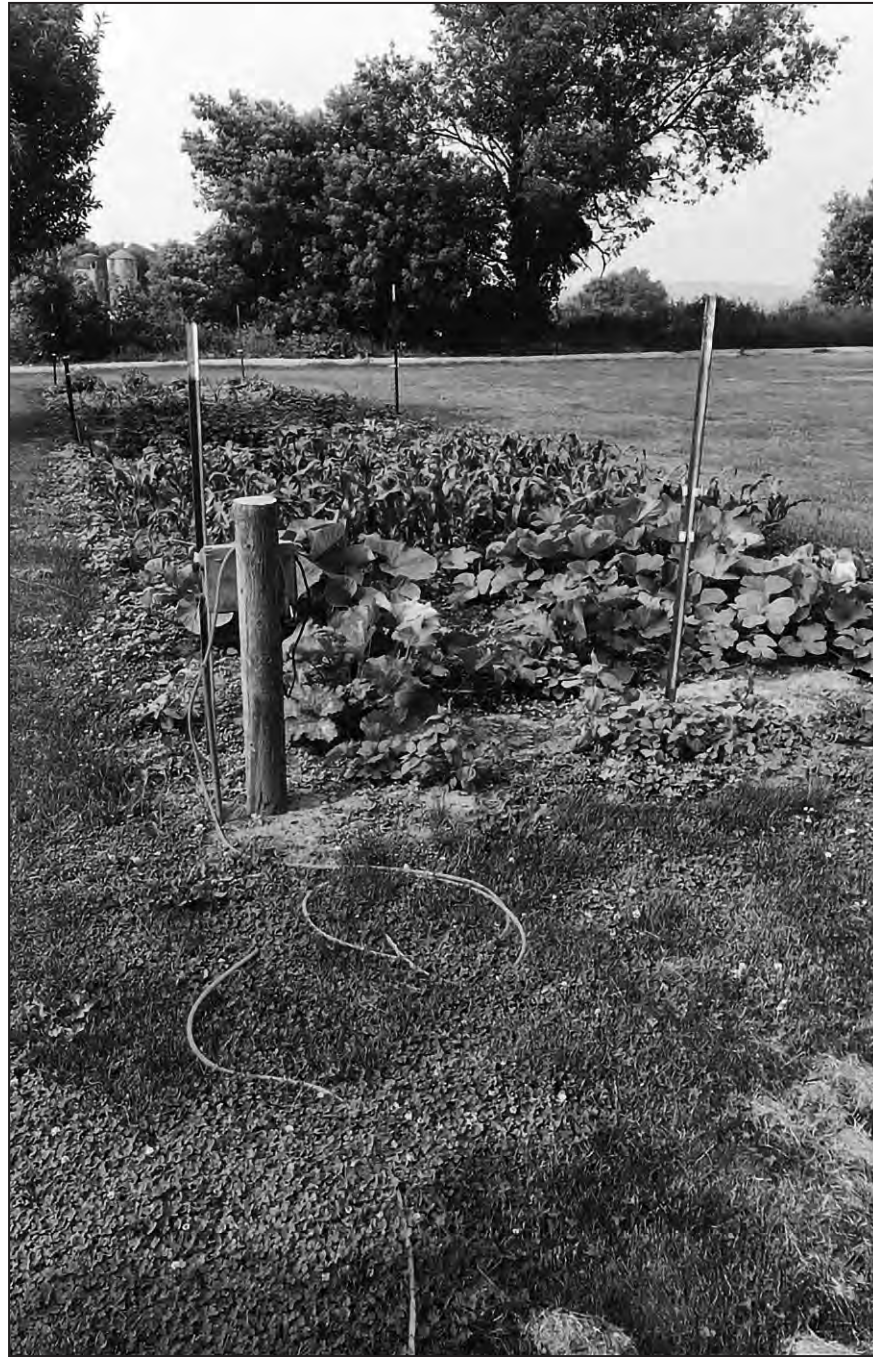
daintily trod through three rows of knee-high sweet corn.

"It's not like they don't have acres of corn all around us. They gotta walk through our garden?" I groaned. It was too much work to see it trashed.

So this year after we planted corn, potatoes, carrots, broccoli, green beans, spinach, pumpkins, tomatoes, cucumbers and onions — and presently noticed everything coming up, — my husband chose a day to fashion an electric fence. Getting our supplies organized, we needed insulators, a wooden post, a post-hole digger, seven steel posts, barbed wire, a maul and a 3-foot long steel rod. Stashing all in the back of our four-wheeler, we drove over to the garden and started in.

My husband, through the years, has made his share of electric fences. Back in the day, we had heifers roaming our woods, and after planting season came fence-making season. He'd go around checking for damage and fixing or replacing downed posts and pulling sagging barb wire taut before letting the heifers free to roam on a 40-acre pasture. It was a lot of work. He and a couple of friends had put up a sturdy fence when we had been raising Black Angus. They hadn't escaped once in all the while we had them, due to the craftsmanship of that fence.

Following his lead, this garden fence was a learning project for me. First, he dug a hole for the wooden post that would hold the electric fencer. Then we went around and as I held the steel posts, he pounded them in with a maul. After getting them placed around the garden, one on each corner and two across from each other in the middle, he clamped

an insulator on each steel post.

Next, we strung one strand of barbed wire to each steel post, fastened on the insulator, ending up at the wooden post. He then wound the barbed wire to connect to the fencer. He also attached a single smooth wire to the fencer, winding the other end of the wire around the slim steel rod which he had driven into the dirt next to the wooden post.

"Why're you doing that?" Inquiring minds want to know.

"To ground it."

I didn't want to appear dimwitted but, curious as to know just how grounding works, I asked Siri. Siri knows everything.

It took me to a website that explained: "To keep your fence working and in good condition, proper grounding is required. Your electric fence works by completing an electrical circuit whenever an animal touches the fence. The electric current originates at the energizer, travels down the fence, and goes through the animal to the ground. The soil

then transmits the current to grounding rods which are connected back to your energizer, completing the circuit, and delivering a corrective shock to the animal. (Sorry, deer.) Grounding is essential in keeping the fence functioning properly."

"A corrective shock" is a good way to put it. When we were all done and I had hauled an electric cord over, I ran it to the shed and plugged it in to the power source. Coming back to the garden, I asked my boss, "Ready?"

"Ready."

Presently we heard a steady-as-a-clock, pulsating tick, tick, tick, which was pleasant to the ear but not so much to the touch. "Is it working?" I asked incredulously because to me, it was a marvel it had all been done so efficiently.

Pushing his farmer cap to the back of his head, says he with a mischievous grin, "Why don't you try it?"

Smart aleck.

As the growing season is in full swing, I look at not only our garden and others, I note the sights around our farm and county and see the corn marching down fields in formation — along with soybean and oats that are flourishing, and second crop alfalfa is getting harvested. It never ceases to amaze me that seeds, seemingly so insignificant, can produce food in such abundance. What a providing Father we serve.

As of this writing, we are desperately in need of rain, so I'll end my column this week with a prayer for moisture.

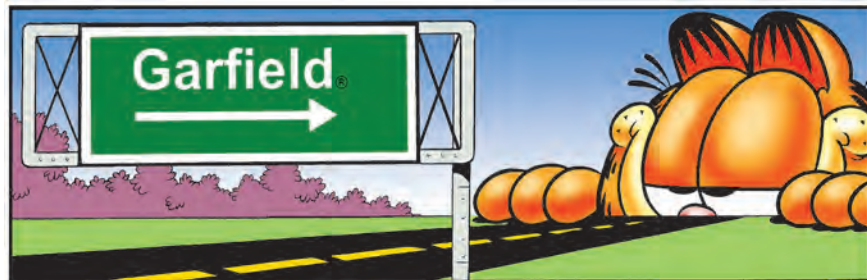
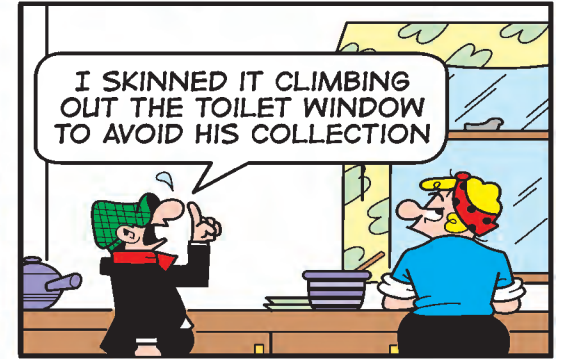
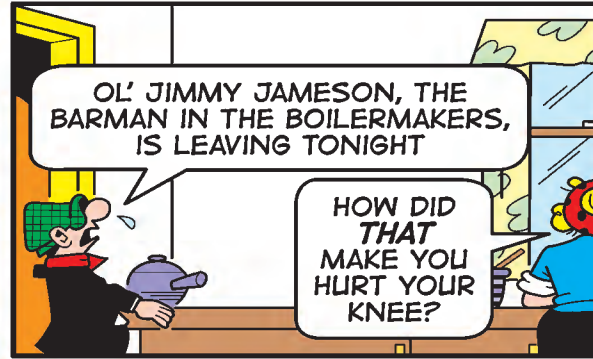
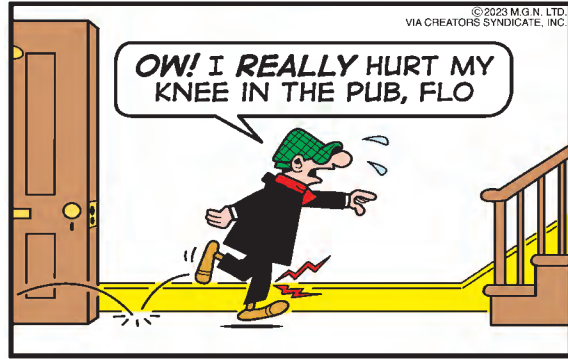
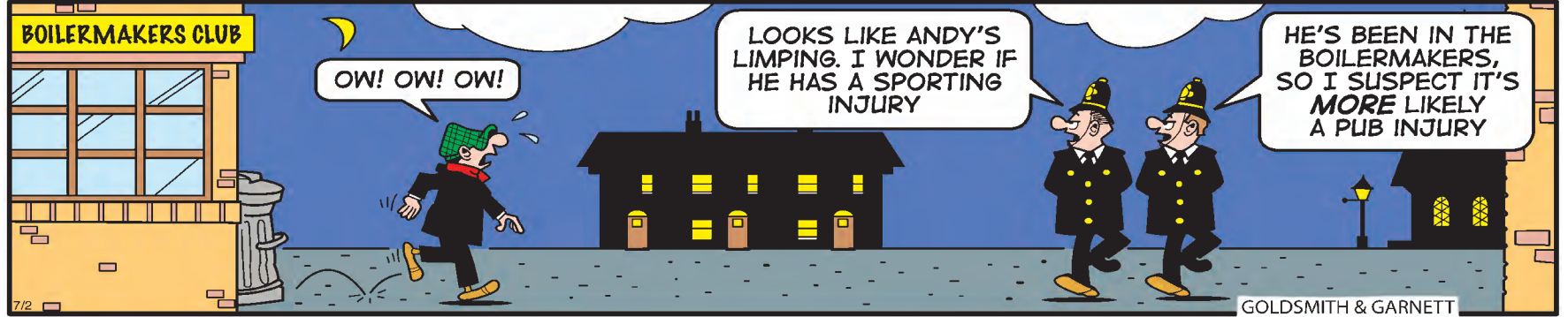

Easy annuals for summer-long beauty

While we wait for the perennials and wildflowers of July and August to come into bloom, there are many excellent easy annuals we can pop in to our gardens and containers for instant and long-lasting color.

Annuals are those flowers and plants that bloom for just one year in the garden. They are generally not winter hardy here, so we enjoy them for one growing season.

Whatever your gardening palette, there are annuals available to showcase your favorite colors and schemes. This week's focus is on some of the easiest varieties to grow.

Petunias — along with their smaller cousins, the super bells or calibrachoa — are easy to grow, wherever you plant them. One side note, be sure that you are giving them plenty of water if they are in hanging baskets that can dry out quickly in the summer wind.

Both petunias and super bells come in a wide range of color from pure white to near black. There are varieties that trail, varieties that mound and varieties that spread, some up to 4 feet wide.

The tidal wave petunias are an example of wide-spreading, mounding petunias that basically do their own thing all summer long, growing bigger and bolder by the day.

The larger petunias do need to be deadheaded in order to keep vigorous. This means plucking off spent flowers as they begin to dry. This will encourage new blooms to form throughout the long season.

The smaller super bells do not need to be deadheaded as they are self-caring and continue to bloom profusely all summer long.

Snapdragons are another excellent and easy annual to grow for beautiful colors and long-lasting beauty, often well into fall. Continue to pinch off spent flower spikes to encourage new growth throughout the season.

Lantana and verbena are also excellent choices for the summer garden and are available in a variety of different colors. Most of these are trailing or spreading plants and do wonderfully in containers, hanging baskets, or planted directly in the ground.

There are many annuals that grow best when

started from seed sown directly in the ground in late spring or early summer. Some of these, such as sunflowers and zinnias, as well as cosmos and bachelor buttons simply need a good watering once or twice a week. As they grow, they quickly mature and bloom within several weeks.

Geraniums are an old-fashioned and traditional favorite of many gardeners and for a good reason. Their lush clusters of brilliant blooms last the full season. Snap off spent flowerheads as they begin to wither to encourage new spikes to form.

There are many geraniums that feature wonderfully patterned or variegated foliage to add even more interest to the summer garden.

Coleus are one of the most interesting and fun varieties of annual to grow. There are so many different colors and patterns and growth forms and leaf styles that one could grow an entire garden full of

coleus varieties and never be bored.

While coleus are traditionally thought of as shade plants, most of the newer varieties are sun tolerant and do great in even full sun. Check the plant tag as you buy for the plant's light preference.

Other fun and easy annuals to grow at home are 4 o'clock's, cleomes or spider flowers, begonias for sun or shade, sun patiens, which are large New Guinea impatiens made especially for sun, garden heliotrope, sweet alyssum, fuchsias for shade, as well as moss roses which love dry, hot, sandy places.

Enjoy exploring the world of colorful, easy annuals this summer, and add the rich and beautiful colors to your gardens and containers.

He was ordained a priest in 2015 and served as a parochial vicar at St. Raphael the Archangel Parish in Oshkosh before his 2017 appointment to Brussels, Lincoln and Rosiere. In 2023, he completed his studies for an advanced degree in theology, a licentiate in sacred theology. His academic research and thesis focused on mariology, the study of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

He is a long-time member of the Mariological Society of America and will serve as president of the society until May 2024. Looney has authored seven devotional books with various publishers and three self-published children's stories.

This won't be Looney's first time serving at Sacred Heart Parish in Shawano. When he was ordained

a deacon in 2014, he spent three months during the summer assisting the Rev. Luke Ferris.

"I look forward to returning to Sacred Heart Parish and seeing familiar faces," Looney said. "I also

am excited to be spending more time than just a few months serving the people."

When Looney arrived in Brussels, Lincoln and Rosiere, he immediately invested himself in the local community and culture. He hopes to do the same in Shawano.

"A faith custom where I recently served was roadside chapels," Looney said. "People built chapels on their property and anyone passing by could stop, look and pray at them. I wanted to make them more popular and accomplished that through the creation of a Facebook page and daily video tours of the chapels. That led to directing, hosting and filming a professional documentary that has aired internationally on television and competed at film festivals worldwide."

The documentary, "Faith Along the Road: The Belgian Roadside Chapels of Northeastern Wisconsin," can be found on YouTube.

"One of the things I'm looking forward to is learning about the history of Shawano — not only the parish, but the city," Looney said. "I plan to visit the Shawano Historical Society in the first month and learn more about the area from the Shawano County Visitor Center."

When asked what he hopes to bring to his time in Shawano, Looney said that he wants to be present to the parishioners and Sacred Heart School.

"While I write books and speak at parishes and conferences, those are secondary to my work as pastor of the parish I serve," Looney said.

Looney began his ministry in Shawano on July 1. Looney will host a meet and greet at Sacred Heart's Church Picnic on Aug. 13. An outdoor polka Mass begins at 10:45 a.m.

The \$500,000 awarded to CMN supports the Teacher Education Program's Meniken project. The goal of Meniken is to continue to build the capacity of CMN's Teacher Education program, improve teacher education students' cultural knowledge through experiential learning and sharing opportunities, and collaborate and engage with community partners in honoring and advancing Indigenous education.

Funding will support student internships, stipends, elder mentors and materials for monthly talking circles and teachings where students will learn and engage in learning about traditional and contemporary Indigenous topics and handicrafts.

"This is an amazing opportunity for our program to continue to provide opportunities for our students to engage and immerse themselves in Indigenous teachings from their peers, elders and community mentors through their participation in our programming that the College Fund generously supports," said Kelli Chelberg, project director for the Meniken project.
