Plans to sell old Wescott Town Hall proceed

Shawano School Board sets minimum bid of \$70K for building

The Shawano School Board signed off Jan. 17 on a \$70,000 minimum bid they would accept for the sale of the former Wescott Town Hall.

An appraisal for the building was done in December, according to Shawano School District Finance Director Josh Swanson, and it stated the fair market value was \$65,000. He noted the district would not have many costs associated with the sale, but he recommended that the minimum bid be higher than the fair market value to make sure the district recoups its costs.

"We're looking into whether we need title insurance," Swanson said. "We have the cost of the appraisal, some small legal fees and whatever closing costs."

There is a question of how much

land comes with the building. Swanson noted that the appraisal declared there were 2.55 acres, but the district's legal representatives claim 1.7 acres are part of the parcel that has the building.

District officials did not how much the additional costs would be, which prompted board member Mart Grams to suggest postponing the decision until the actual costs were clear.

"We're shooting in the dark here," Grams said.

Board president Michael Sleeper countered that the work to sell the building had to proceed before the board's next meeting in February.

"The assorted costs are small," Sleeper said.

In 2019, the Town of Wescott deeded the old town hall, located at N6251 Lake Drive, back to the school district. This fulfilled the obligations of an agreement reached 50 years earlier when the district gave the building,

then used as a schoolhouse, to the town. The town had voted in 2006 to keep the building for community use, like the occasional rummage sale, even though the town's main office and meetings took place at the current town hall on Old Keshena Road. It was later decided to return the building to the school district.

Initially, the district had pondered using the facility as an alternative academy for the exceptionally gifted for grades 6-12 with plans to research the idea in earnest in summer 2020. However, the coronavirus pandemic derailed efforts to research the issue further, and district officials announced in 2021 that they planned to sell the building instead. District residents agreed to those plans at the annual meeting held in September of that year.

Family ties keep Bieber from 3rd term

Sheriff plans to spend more time with wife, sons; supports chief deputy's plans to run

There's going to be a new sheriff in town as Adam Bieber has opted not to run for a third term.

Bieber recently announced that he's opting for family first in his life and bowing out as the county's top cop. He said he hasn't decided if he's going to continue in law enforcement after his term concludes at the end of 2022 or pursue a different kind of job, but he's going to focus on his family.

"This is something we've been discussing for quite some time over the last few months," Bieber said. "We knew this was coming up, and it's always a very stressful time for me and my family. We have to raise money, campaign, show up at parades, all that stuff, and then not know if you're going to win or not."

Bieber won his first term as sheriff in 2014, beating incumbent Randy Wright in both the primary and general election after Wright launched a write-in campaign, along with independent candidate Lucas Christenson. He sailed to a second term in 2018, defeating independent candidate and former sheriff's detective Keith Sorlie.

After winning his second term, Bieber had told the Leader that his track record in working with the Shawano County Board of Supervisors was what helped him to win. In a new interview on Jan. 12, Bieber said that the board and the sheriff's department are not on the same wavelength as they once were.

"It really started when I wanted to include citizens in on our deputy interviews, our corrections officer interviews and our dispatch interviews," Bieber said. "I got a lot of kickback from the county board chairman on that."

The board as a whole signed off on the proposal, but Bieber said other issues have surfaced, like the efforts to get corrections officers more pay. In 2021, the board approved giving them and other jail staff a \$3 per hour pay raise, but it's only a temporary fix, as the county used American Rescue Plan Act funds, and those expire in 2024.

"It was a battle to get that stuff, and I had to burn some bridges during that process," Bieber said. "People that I thought were reasonable, I had to battle them with words and logic."

Bieber has much to be proud of in his two terms as sheriff. He cited the construction of a new evidence storage building, something that had been a struggle to get the county board to fund, as one of them.

"We were able to get that done in under a year," Bieber said. "It's one of the best evidence storage buildings around."

Another accomplishment Bieber is proud of is getting body cameras on his deputies, and he noted that they're an invaluable tool for law enforcement. However, the company the county is using is no longer working with the existing cameras, and a new vendor needs to be sought out, an issue that Bieber and the county board are clashing on.

"I know our citizens want us to have that, so that's still a battle we're fighting with the county board," Bieber said.

Bieber is also proud that a drug court was established on his watch, saying that the program is able to transform lives.

"It's awesome that we already have three graduates, and we're working to help so many more," Bieber said.

Although paperwork for the sheriff's race can't be taken out until later

this year, there is already at least one person vying to take Bieber's place. George Lenzner, the county's chief deputy, announced on Facebook that he plans to run for his boss's seat.

"George was the first one to know, besides my wife, that I wasn't going to run," Bieber said. "I let him know because I want him to run for sheriff. I know that he's always desired to be sheriff ... and I encouraged him to run."

Bieber believes not running for a third term will help him to be more in his sons' lives. His oldest son, Will, currently is a junior at Coleman High School, while his other two sons attend Shawano schools. He plans to get his children into one school district.

"We miss our oldest son terribly. We're just missing out on a lot of time," Bieber said, noting that the family is having to decide which son to see on Friday nights for football and for other activities. "We've got to split up as a family, and we're just not willing to do that anymore."

Bieber noted that his belief that politicians should not spend their whole lives in their elected seats is also playing a factor in his decision.

"To run for a third term would ac-

tually fly in the face of what I should believe," Bieber said. "I don't want to be a career politician."

Bieber admitted he has been outspoken on some controversial issues, and his stances have sometimes been difficult for his wife and children. As an example, he cited when the Black Lives Matter movement came to Shawano in 2020 and he refused to walk with the group.

"I don't regret that decision," Bieber said. "I'm one of those guys who believes that all lives matter and that everyone should be treated equally. All of us in law enforcement, we didn't agree with how that officer in Minnesota handled things, but that doesn't mean I agree with everything Black Lives Matters is doing, too."

Despite potentially not being in law enforcement anymore, Bieber said he believes the sheriff's department will continue to protect the communities it serves.

"I've always said that law enforcement is the greatest force for good in a community," Bieber said. "No matter what call you're on, you're generally helping people in some way, form or fashion."

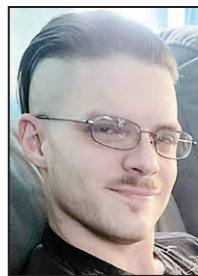

Prevea gives community COVID-19 update

Official discusses masking, isolation vs. quarantine, testing

Officials from Prevea Health gave an update on COVID-19 in Wisconsin during a Zoom meeting on Jan. 14.

Prevea President and CEO Dr. Ashok Rai covered where Wisconsin is at in regards to COVID-19, expectations for Wisconsin, isolation and quarantine guidelines, and testing.

Rai opened the meeting talking about how the omicron variant of COVID-19 has affected Wisconsin. Rai used a graphic showing Wisconsin in a dark red color, signifying a severe risk of being infected.

"There was a time where the state had a lot of green and some yellow, orange and red," said Rai. "Every single county is now in that extreme range."

He added that the positivity rate (those who are symptomatic and asymptomatic) is 30%.

"That is almost one in three people," said Rai. "If we are looking at symptomatic people, it is one in two

and one in three for asymptomatic."

Rai said the omicron variant is "omnipresent."

"It doesn't need a whole lot to infect somebody," said Rai. "In a vaccinated and boosted individual, the chance of you going into a hospital is mild and very low. In the unvaccinated or unboosted population, the chance of getting sick is higher and higher."

He said that it may not make people as sick as the delta variant.

"It still is a nasty respiratory virus," said Rai. "It still puts people on a ventilator."

Responding to a question, Rai explained when the omicron virus would start to fade away.

"When it runs out of people to infect," said Rai. "That is how infectious this variant is."

He said Wisconsin can continue to see infection spread quickly.

"We have a couple of factors that can speed up infection," said Rai. "We haven't had the level of mitigation that other states have had. As much as we would like to consider this the end game ... we can't just sit back and say this is going to happen and this is going to be the end game."

Rai talked about the different forms of testing, as well as gave recommendations for employers.

"We are going to see a lot more home antigen kits through the federal government and state government," said Rai. "They do work. If they are positive, we ask you to believe them."

Rai said that due to the way omicron replicates, if an antigen is positive, it should be believed and that person should be isolated for five days or longer.

He also said that Prevea has experienced delays getting testing kits.

"We will still continue to test, we have strategies," said Rai. "What we are asking, is that if you are symptomatic and you can't get a test in the next few days, scheduling a test four days from now will do no good. It is isolate for five days."

He said that the only people that will be tested by Prevea in urgent care and the ER are people he described as an "NIH - pure one patient."

"Those are going to be people who have had a solid organ transplant, recent chemotherapy or are undergoing chemotherapy, over the age of 75 without a vaccine and over the age of 65 with significant medical issues and not a vaccine," said Rai. "Otherwise the capacity for testing just isn't there."

Rai went on to explain the difference between isolating and quarantining.

"Isolation is when you are positive — if you know the day of your symptoms starting, that is day zero. If you don't know, the day that you test is day zero," said Rai. "After five days, if the patient is asymptomatic or their symptoms greatly improved, they would be allowed to come out of isolation with a good fitting mask."

He said that implementing this will help to get more people back out to work or do whatever they need to do.

In regards to masking, Rai said that with research, they would like to see people wearing a level one mask to start.

"Cloth masks have more of side leak," said Rai. "In health care, you can't even visit our facilities with a cloth mask, we will put a level one on you."

He said that the importance comes from the tight fitting of the mask.

"Filtration is one thing, but fit is the other," said Rai. "If you have a side leak, then that is completely unfiltered, so it doesn't matter how good the filter is. What we would recommend is putting the mask with the best filter closest to the mouth, then if you wanted to use a cloth mask, you would put it on the outside."

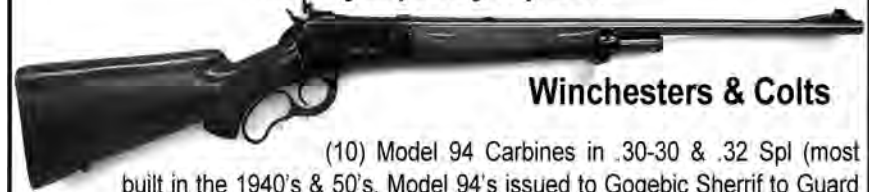

Housing development OK'd for old SMC land

15 homes going on almost 5-acre site with estimated selling values of \$250K-\$380K

The Shawano Common Council approved a deal Jan. 12 with Van's Realty and Construction to build 15 single-family homes on the old Shawano Medical Center site, ending an eight-year limbo in which the city had been trying to come up with the best use for the site.

Under the agreement, Van's has agreed to pay \$500,000 to the city once the sale is closed, and the city will reimburse up to half of that amount if the company finishes building those homes within the next 2½ years. The homes will be a minimum size of 1,400 square feet plus a three-car garage and will occupy the 4.73-acre site that used to be a hospital before ThedaCare built its new medical center on the south end of Shawano.

The vote for the deal was 5-0, with Alderman Brad Keuschel abstaining because of his affiliation with the Shawano Ski Sharks. The hospital land is connected to Smalley Park, where the Ski Sharks practice and perform their water ski shows.

City Administrator Eddie Sheppard told the council that the homes are expected to sell for between \$250,000 and \$380,000. He noted that there were six different concepts presented to the city before the 15 single-family homes was accepted.

Having the \$500,000 up front will allow the city to pay for extending Fourth Street, which ends currently at Smalley Street, west and north to Third Street.

"This allows us to utilize the funds to pay for the road without having to take out any debt," Sheppard said. "You're looking at a total return for this TIF (tax increment finance) district in about 5½ years."

Prior to voting on Van's plan, the council voted to change the zoning on the property from campus development to planned development.

While folks in the neighborhood like the idea of the single-family homes, some questioned whether it was necessary to have so many homes on that piece of land. Kelly Shelberg, who lives adjacent to the old SMC property, suggested that fewer homes go on the property and having the rest of it serve as park land or green space.

"I would agree that the single-family housing is a better option for this property than the four-story apartment that was proposed several years ago, but what I don't agree with is that this needs to be jammed with 15 houses," Shelberg said. "I believe that this property, which sits next to the Wolf River, should stand as is and be used by the community. We have been blessed by beautiful parks."

Shelberg noted that, on the day of the council meeting, she saw cross-country skiers and pet owners utilize the hospital space for recreation.

"If no housing is not an option, would the council consider a compromise and lower the number of houses for a bit more community space?" she said. "Would you consider taking small steps in this process and perhaps consider a few homes before giving up the entire property and the last bit of land that Shawano, the City on the Wolf, has?"

Todd Dobberstein, president for Shawano Area Waterways Management, echoed Shelberg's sentiments, suggesting that Smalley Park needed room to breathe. He noted that the space has been utilized for 20 Ski Sharks events and 25 other activities.

"Water and tourism associated with water is the number one biggest impact that Shawano has," Dobberstein said. "Don't make a decision today that will impact the future of what we can do with that park."

Sheppard noted that the density for the old hospital land is less than nearby plots of land. Directly to the east of the hospital is 3.3 acres with 12 homes, and south of that is another 3.3 acres with 13 homes.

Not everyone in the standing-room-only council chambers felt leaving the land or at least some of it open was a good idea. Former City Administrator Brian Knapp, who lives near the hospital land, said that Shawano needs high-quality housing in order to continue to prosper. He said that if the city doesn't move on this, the homes will be built in the towns of Wescott or Richmond because people want to live in the Shawano area.

"Each of those families represents at least \$55,000 of economic development for this community every year, and that's a very conservative calculation," Knapp said. "That is something you can't replace with an event space or a park."

Shirley Hinze pointed out that affordable housing

would be better to attract people to Shawano than high-quality housing.

"If we're going to keep housing affordable for people who work in the city of Shawano, this basically puts these dwellings out of the financial reach of most citizenry," Hinze said.

Housing overall is a problem, according to John Miesbauer with Coldwell Banker, the real estate company that has been working with Van's to sell the homes it constructs. He noted that Van's built 10 homes in Shawano last year, and all of them sold before construction even began.

"What does that mean? It means there's a huge need for housing in Shawano," Miesbauer said. "Currently, there are a total of seven homes for sale in the city of Shawano. One of these homes is yet to be built."

Alderwoman Sandy Steinke noted that, in the eight years the council has been looking at ideas for what to do with the former SMC site, this was the first time there was money for the city attached to it.

"We've gone through several different proposals with giving away that land and making different TIF districts, and we're actually getting money for this land for the first time that I can remember," Steinke said.

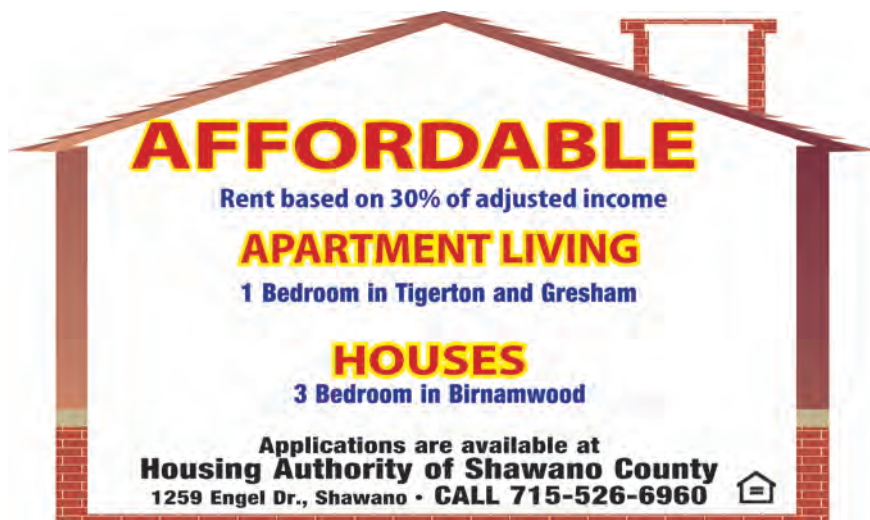

Wildcats grind out victory over Wausau

The Gresham Community School girls basketball team topped Wausau 61-36 in a nonconference matchup on Jan. 13 in Gresham.

The win was the third in a row for Gresham, but was the team's first game since Dec. 30 after the team had to pause because of COVID-19 concerns.

Unsurprisingly, the Wildcats looked like a team that hadn't played in a couple weeks, but a surge at the end of the first half carried over into the second half, helping the hosts cruise to victory.

"It's really nice, I missed it. It's just been really hard not playing," said Gresham senior Hannah Cerveney, who led the team with 16 points. "We were missing some of our players still, but it's still good to get out on the court — we still miss them obviously but we wish they could be back with us next week, and they will."

"We struggled because we had a couple weeks off, but coming back out it was really nice," said senior Valarie Cerveney, who added 15 points. "You could obviously tell we had a couple weeks off. We had a lot of dumb turnovers and we didn't play very well, but a win is a win."

Gresham jumped out to a 9-0 lead in the first three-plus minutes of action, with Hannah Cerveney, Valarie Cerveney, sophomore Maddie Haffner and freshman Janay Pecore-Kirkland all scoring, but Wausau responded with 11 of the next 13 points to tie the contest up.

The teams battled back and forth for the next several minutes before Gresham used a 6-1 finish to the half to create a little bit of separation.

Pecore-Kirkland scored a couple of buckets on the run, while Haffner hit a pair of free throws.

Wausau scored the first basket of the first half before Gresham took control and started looking like the team it had before its shutdown.

The Wildcats answered the first bucket of the second half with a 14-0 run. The spurt started with free throws from Valarie Cerveney before Pecore-Kirkland added a bucket and Hannah Cerveney made two free throws. Haffner then added a bucket before Hannah Cerveney knocked in a 3-pointer. Junior Chloe Bohl got into the scoring action with a field goal before a free throw from Haffner capped the run.

"I think our defense got better as the game went on," said Haffner, who ended up scoring nine points. "We kind of got back into our shooting too, we weren't forcing it as much as we tried to in the first half."

Wausau was able to trim Gresham's lead to 14 before the Wildcats went on a 9-1 run to put the game away.

Hannah Cerveney tallied 11 of her 16 points in the second half to help Gresham take control. Valarie Cerveney had eight points in the half, and Bohl had six to finish with eight for the contest.

Pecore-Kirkland took advantage of her extra minutes on the court, tallying 11 points in the contest.

As the Wildcats get back into the swing of thing and try and catch up on their postponed contests, the team hopes to improve in several facets of the game.

Hannah Cerveney noted that doing more conditioning to get back in playing shape is key over the next couple of weeks. She and Haffner both said that rebounding and boxing out is an area the team wants to improve in, and that's something Valarie Cerveney believes helped the team pull away from Wausau.

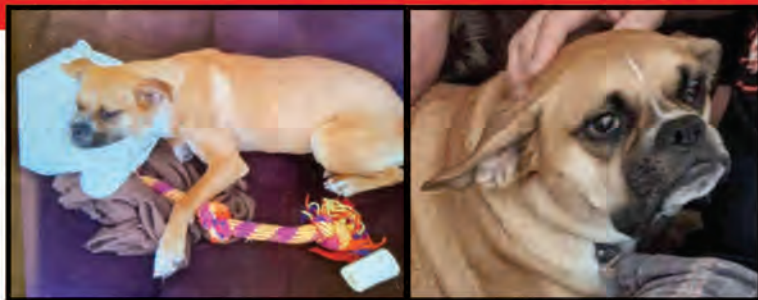

3 county board seats have competitive races

Number of school districts feature 2 or more candidates

Elections in Shawano County will be a light affair over the next few months as only a few races in the county, municipalities and school districts are competitive.

The general election takes place April 5.

There are only three seats for the Shawano County Board of Supervisors that will feature two candidates. For District 11, which encompasses Wards 2 and 3 for the Town of Angelica, incumbent Richard Ferfecki will be facing off against James Przybylski. For District 11, which covers the Town of Hartland along with Ward 1 of the Town of Angelica and Ward 2 of the Town of Washington, incumbent Deb Noffke is facing Jeremy Gretzinger. For District 16, which covers Ward 1 of the Town of Waukechon and Ward 3 of the Town of Belle Plaine, Dawn Bahr and David Heideman will vie for John Ainsworth's seat.

There are no competitive races in the city of Shawano for mayor and common council. Bruce Milavitz is unopposed and will likely serve a full term as mayor unless someone registers as a write-in candidate. Incumbents Lisa Hoffman and John Hoeffs are unopposed for Aldermanic Districts 4 and 6, respectively, while Jim Hauer is the lone candidate for District 2 after Rhonda Strebel opted not to run.

Three seats are up for grabs for the Pulaski Village Board, with incumbents Gordi Black and Bruce Brzeczowski facing off against Tom Chartrand and Stephanie Rodgers.

With the Wittenberg Village Board, three seats are up for grabs, and incumbents Renee Switalla, Barbara Buchholz and Paul Yaeger will have to defend their seats from Devin Krueger.

There are a few more competitive races for school districts, with Pulaski School District having to hold a primary election Feb. 15. The village of Pulaski will have to whittle down the three-candidate list of Jackie Huisman, Matt Rowland and

Heidi Bukowiec to two.

In the Shawano School District, three seats for the city of Shawano are up for election. Incumbents Diane Hoffman, Mart Grams and Chris Gull will compete against Jeana Winslow.

The Bonduel School District has one competitive race for the towns of Navarino and Lessor. Incumbent Dennis Bergsbaken will compete against Kimberly Strayer for that seat.

In the Gresham School District, five will compete for three available board seats. Ethan Schmidt and Jerritt Lyons will face off against incumbents Joe Ejnik, Alpha Creapeau and Doug Huck.

The Marion School District has one competitive race for a seat representing the towns of Grant, Seneca, Pella and Herman for a one-year term. Tiffany Krueger and Jerry Ahlers are competing for the seat.

The Wittenberg-Birnamwood School District has three seats open, but only one competitive race as Greg Flak and Chuck Wendler vie for the Area 5 seat.

Northwestern Shawano County voters will be voting for three candidates for the Antigo School Board. The candidates are Michael Boldig, Mary Neufeld, Angela Schreiber, Dave Bardo, Kristen Mattmiller and Wayne Gagnon.

The Clintonville School District has three seats up for election, and the five candidates running for those seats are Glen Lundt, Elizabeth Ruskosky, Laurie Vollrath, Lori Poppe and Mark Zachow.

The Seymour School District will be seeking southeastern Shawano County votes for three of its board seats. Two seats for the city of Seymour will see competition from Steve Kane, Paul Bucheger, Lindsey Kraft and Stacy Smith. The third seat, representing the village of Black Creek, will be sought by Tom Heins and Tony Kastning.

Two towns will also be looking at referendum questions. The Town of Washington will ask if the clerk and treasurer should be appointed by the town board. The Town of Red Springs will be asking for adoption of the "We the People" advisory resolution to stop the expansion of corporate person rights.

Garden phlox, little bluestem named plants of 2022

The new year is upon us, and it's time for gardeners to celebrate the perennial plants of 2022. As chosen by a variety of gardening organizations, this year's perennial plants of the year are among my favorite garden plants.

The National Garden Bureau each year selects a perennial plant to feature as its perennial of the year. This

year, it is the Year of the Garden Phlox.

Colorful, vibrant, long-blooming and attractive to hummingbirds as well as butterflies, tall garden phlox is one of my favorite

plants — blooming from June all the way through frost.

Tall garden phlox comes in a variety of colors. From the pure white, heavenly scented David, to the rich, black cherry colors of several varieties, tall garden phlox is a beauty. There are those that bloom in purple, lavender, red, fuchsia, white or pink, as well as many patterns and forms that contain spots and swirls and pinwheels.

Tall garden phlox grows in various heights. There are those that are shorter, just a foot to 15 inches tall, while others may reach 4 to 5 feet in height.

Most of the tall garden phlox varieties are extremely fragrant, making them wonderful choices for the summer garden.

During wet summers, some varieties of tall garden phlox are susceptible to powdery mildew. If this concerns you, purchase varieties that are bred to be mildew resistant. There are a large number of tall garden phlox varieties that are resistant to powdery mildew. The plant tag should tell you this.

Enjoy the flamboyant, colorful and fragrant beauty of tall garden phlox this year and celebrate its selection as the plant of the year by the National Garden Bureau.

Another plant organization that routinely selects a perennial plant of the year is the Perennial Plant Association. Each year, a perennial is selected to be heavily marketed and featured throughout the country. The perennial plant of the year must meet certain criteria, such as being easy to grow, easy to find, as well as able to survive in a wide range of habitats and growing zones.

This year, the Perennial Plant Association has selected one of my favorite

native grasses as its perennial plant of the year. Little Bluestem is the perennial plant of the year for 2022.

Native to Wisconsin, therefore easy to grow here, little bluestem is a compact version of the giant, big bluestem

that may grow 6 to 7 feet tall. Little bluestem keeps it smaller, growing 2 to 3 feet tall and wide.

Like all native grasses, little bluestem is a perfect clumping grass. It remains showy throughout the four

seasons — from beautiful, pale silvery blue-green in summer to fiery red, orange, purple and gold during fall and winter. Its feathery seed heads adorn the dancing stems all through fall and winter, adding to its grace, beauty and elegance.

There are many hybrids of little bluestem that have hit the garden centers that come in glorious colors from smoky reds to deep purple and fiery orange.

Little bluestem is the perfect, compact grass for shorter beds and borders and even does great in containers, provided you pop it back into the ground for the snow for the winter season.

Little bluestem is an excellent companion plant for wonderful texture and flow in the garden. Plant it alongside orange milkweed, bee balm, daylilies, coreopsis, gaillardia, purple coneflowers and other medium to large perennials. It is also excellent for mass planting to create a sea of flowing green in summer and colorful reds, oranges and purples in fall.

Postmaster General Louis DeJoy, GOP megadonor, is Trump's own ap-

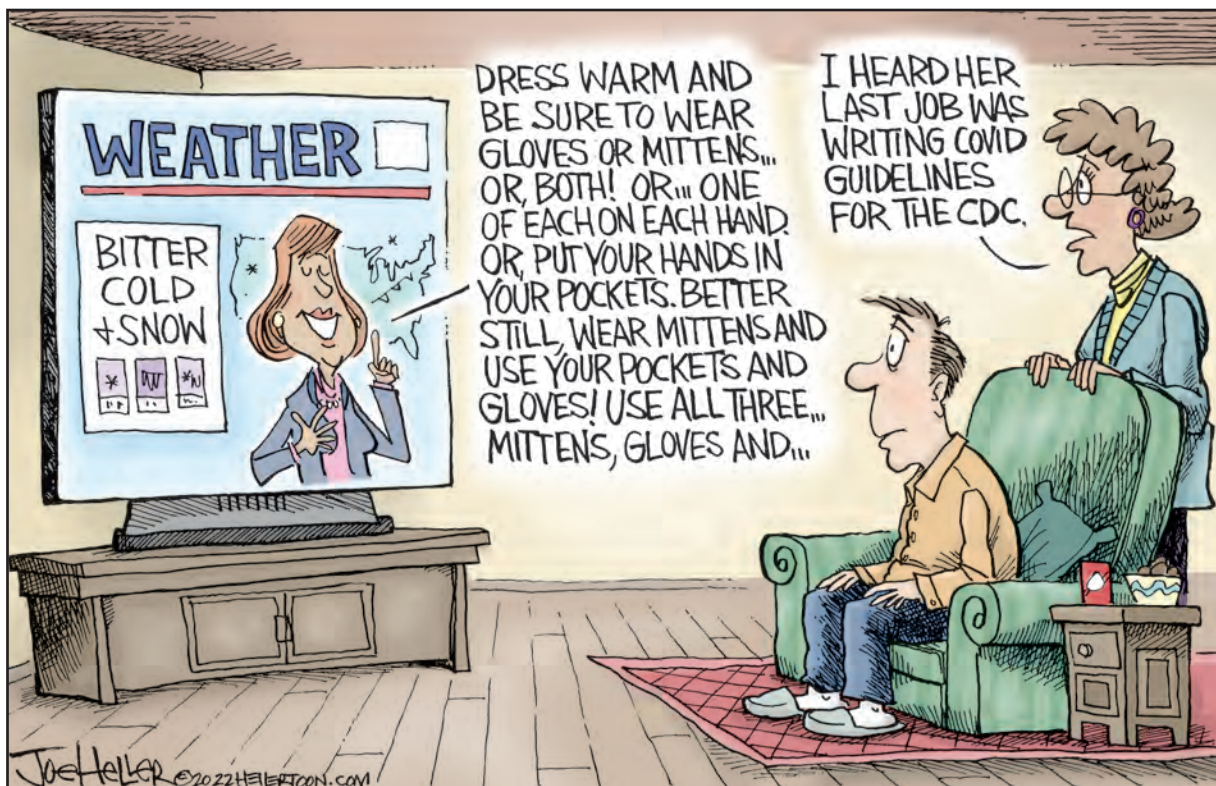

Defense trending wrong way as playoffs start

For most of the regular season, the Green Bay Packers' defense looked to have finally turned the corner. The unit was no longer a crutch for the team, and it was actually helping the team to wins.

After great performances against the Kansas City Chiefs in week nine and the Seattle Seahawks in week 10, the Packers' defense has trended in the wrong direction. And now as the postseason opens for Green Bay,

the defense is once again the likely determining factor in how deep of a postseason run the team can make.

In the team's seven games since the shutout win over Seattle, opponents have scored 28 or more points five times. In the game against the Cleveland Browns where the defense allowed 22 points, Cleveland also rushed for 219 yards. The other time Green Bay's defense allowed less than 28 points came in a lopsided 37-10 win over the Minnesota Vikings, where the Packers faced quarterback Sean Mannion instead of Kirk Cousins who lit them up for 341 pass yards and three scores earlier in the season.

Hoping to use the regular season finale against the Detroit Lions as a way to shore some things up, instead the defense was gashed for 404 yards and 37 points.

Even in the meaningless loss, coach Matt LaFleur didn't downplay the defense's poor play.

"I would just say the consistency, you know. Football in general comes down to discipline and people owning their roles," said LaFleur. "When

you aren't disciplined or you go outside the scheme, bad stuff happens, and we cannot have that. We need all 11 doing their damn job, and if they don't, stuff like that happens."

The Packers' defense was beaten for touchdowns on a pair of trick plays against Detroit. With the San Francisco 49ers coming to Lambeau Field for the Divisional Round game, the result of those trick plays should be especially concerning because of all the motion and deception that 49ers coach Kyle Shanahan incorporates into his offense.

Of course, the 49ers and Packers already met way back in the early portion of the regular season, so there's some idea of the challenges the 49ers' offense presents already.

Green Bay held San Francisco's offense to 298 total yards. Only 67 of the yards came on the ground, but that was largely due to the 49ers going behind by 17 points to start the game.

The 49ers' leading rusher in that game was Trey Sermon, who didn't

even receive a carry in the team's upset playoff win over the Dallas Cowboys. Running back Elijah Mitchell and versatile receiver Deebo Samuel combined for 168 rushing yards and two scored on 37 carries in the playoff win.

You can bet the 49ers will lean on those two guys and run all day, control the clock and keep the Packers' offense on the sidelines. It'll be up to the Packers' defense to find a way to slow down the rushing attack, or create some turnovers.

One thing that is working in the Packers' favor is its defense might be the healthiest it's been all season for the playoffs.

Outside linebacker Za'Darius Smith hasn't played since week one, but is trending toward playing this Saturday. While he is known more for his pass-rushing abilities, throwing him in to help slow the run should only boost the defense.

Then there's cornerback Jaire Alexander, who intercepted a pass

and knocked away three passes in the Pack's win over San Francisco earlier this year. He's expected back for the playoff game as well. Again, like Smith, Alexander would help out more in the passing game, but he's proved to be a sure tackler and certainly makes the defense more versatile.

There's also a chance outside linebacker Whitney Mercilus is back for the playoff run, even though he was expected to be out for the season. He's another big body the Pack can put in the box to try and slow the San Francisco passing game.

Should the Packers find a way to consistently stop the run, they'll be as ready as ever to defend the pass. Ideally, the Packers' offense would get off to a strong start and grab a multi-score lead, like it did in the team's first matchup, then the Packers' revamped defense could pin its ears back and really control the game.

Studs pass-catchers

Two All-Pro receivers will take center stage when the Green Bay Packers host the San Francisco 49ers in an NFC Divisional Round playoff game on Saturday night.

In one corner, it's Green Bay's Davante Adams, who finished second in receptions, third in receiving yards and fifth in receiving touchdowns. In the other corner, it's San Francisco's Deebo Samuel, who led the NFL in yards per reception and finished third in yards from scrimmage.

The X-factor could be the No. 2 receivers, Green Bay's Allen Lazard and San Francisco's Brandon Aiyuk.

In the first six games, Aiyuk caught nine passes for 96 yards (10.7 average) and one touchdown. In the final 11 games, he caught 47 passes for 730 yards (15.5 average) and four touchdowns.

Lazard, meanwhile, scored five touchdowns in the final six games. That was one behind Adams' league-leading total.

"Feel good. Feel good," Lazard said about the state of his game. "I feel like I'm in a really good mental space; physically, as well. Just having a good intuition when it comes to playing the game, feeling it out, knowing what Aaron (Rodgers is) thinking. (Receivers) coach (Jason) Vrable and (Nathaniel) Hackett simply have done a great job throughout this entire year.

"I really just honed in on their teachings, on what they've done to prepare us. I've really been honing in on my notes, on the film and the details and the routes. I've just been working on that chemistry and connection with Aaron. It's obviously been working out very well."

Cold night at Lambeau

It's going to be a cold one at Lambeau Field for the 7:15 p.m. kickoff. While the predicted high for Saturday is 21, the projected low is 3. That will mean a kickoff temperature somewhere in the neighborhood of 12 and a wind chill perhaps dipping below zero.

With a kickoff temperature of 15 or colder, the Packers in games started by Rodgers have won four in a row. That includes a 37-10 romp over Minnesota in week 17.

"We think it's Packer weather, honestly," defensive lineman Dean Lowry said last week. "Go back to

our game against Minnesota. We played great team defense. That was probably our most complete game of the year, against Minnesota in that freezing weather.

"We're used to it. Even today, we were outside the whole practice. We just think it fits our strength of playing tough defense and having a quarterback and an offense that's experienced in this weather."

Cold doesn't guarantee anything, though. In the 2013 wild-card round, the 49ers beat the Packers 23-20 with a kickoff temperature of 5. While Rodgers has a wealth of cold-weather experience, 49ers quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo has never thrown a pass in a game with a kickoff temperature of 40 or colder.

Turning over a new leaf

Based on regular-season play, one big advantage for Green Bay is turnovers. Even with the backups turning it over three times at Detroit in the finale, the Packers finished third in the NFL at plus-13 for the season. The Packers had two giveaways in week 1, three giveaways in week 18 and just eight in between.

The 49ers, on the other hand, were minus-4 for the season – worst in the NFC playoff field and second-worst among the 14 playoff teams. However, they were plus-5 down the stretch in winning seven of their final nine regular-season games.

Teams that won the turnover

battle this season won 80% of the time. The Packers went 10-0 when collecting more takeaways than giveaways – including plus-2 in the 30-28 win at San Francisco in week three – and 0-3 when they had more turnovers. The 49ers went 4-0 when they won the turnover battle and 1-5 when they lost. Garoppolo threw 12 interceptions and fumbled eight times.

Hackett a hot name

Of the eight head coaching vacancies, Packers offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett interviewed for four of them during the playoff bye week: NFC North rivals Minnesota and Chicago along with Jacksonville and Denver.

Hackett, who helped guide the Blake Bortles-led Jaguars offense to an AFC Championship Game in 2017 and the Rodgers-led offenses to NFC title games in 2019 and 2020, has flourished alongside coach Matt LaFleur.

"This has been such a great opportunity for me," Hackett said. "Being able to come here with coach LaFleur has been unbelievable. You go through a lot of time as a coordinator creating systems. Being able to come here and learn Matt's system and being able to combine those two systems has been something huge for me as a person.

"And then at the same time watch a first-time head coach to be able to be in there with him, watch the things that he goes through, being able to have that relationship with Matt has taught me so much about his position. It's just been an amazing experience, it really has. And the culture that he's brought here, it's one of those things like, this is how it should be."

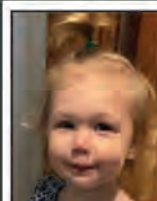

The Green Bay Packers (13-3) will host the San Francisco 49ers (11-7) at 7:15 p.m. Saturday at Lambeau Field in Green Bay. FOX will televise the game.

History

Including this year's 30-28 victory at San Francisco, the Packers lead the series 38-32-1. The teams have split eight playoff games. The 49ers knocked Aaron Rodgers and Co. out of the playoffs in 2012, 2013 and 2019.

Coaches

Green Bay – Matt LaFleur, 39-10 in regular season, 41-12 overall, third season. San Francisco — Kyle Shanahan, 39-42 in regular season and 41-43 overall, fifth season.

When the Packers have the ball

There's not a hotter offense in the playoffs than the one the Packers will roll out on Saturday night. Over the final seven regular-season games, they were second in the league in scoring. Aaron Rodgers was No. 1 in passer rating and Davante Adams was No. 1

in touchdown receptions.

They'll face a tough task against the 49ers' defense, which was superb in shutting down the Cowboys, the offense that was No. 1 in scoring the past seven games, in the Wild Card Round. In winning eight of its last 10 games, San Francisco allowed 20 points or less six times.

While the 49ers finished 12th in points allowed (21.5 per game), they were third in total defense (310 yards per game), sixth in yards allowed per play (5.11), third in sack percentage (8.8) and seventh in goal-to-go situations (63.3% touchdowns). The

Cowboys were held to 4.4 yards per play, down three yards from their fourth-ranked season average.

The front is tremendous and was the reason why the Niners upset the Cowboys. The 49ers were credited with five sacks and 14 quarterback hits while limiting the top-notch running back tandem of Ezekiel Elliott and Tony Pollard to 45 yards on 16 attempts.

The only run of 10-plus yards was Dak Prescott's game-ending scramble.

Pro Bowler Nick Bosa and Samson Ebukam are the ends, and Arik Armstead and D.J. Jones are the tackles.

Bosa was limited to 23 snaps against Dallas with a concussion but the 49ers are hopeful he'll be back. He finished fourth in the NFL with 15½ sacks and added four forced fumbles but was largely held in check by Yosh Nijman when the Packers won in week three.

The battle between Bosa and David Bakhtiari will be must-see TV. Bakhtiari returned from a torn ACL to play 27 snaps in week 18 against Detroit. He was dominant in those snaps but the Lions don't have anyone with half of Bosa's talent. Armstead is a tremendous player who contributed six sacks and Jones is a highly underrated player who finished second on the team with 10 tackles for losses.

Fred Warner (137 tackles, seven for losses), Azeez Al-Shaair (102 tackles, nine for losses) and Dre Greenlaw (21 tackles in three games) are the linebackers. Rodgers for years has raved about Warner being an elite player. He suffered an ankle injury against Dallas but expects to play.

If the Packers can protect Rodgers, there are plays to be made against a secondary that gave up 12 catches to Adams, including two big ones on the game-winning drive in week three. Emmanuel Moseley and rookie Ambry Thomas are the corners and K'Waun Williams mans the slot.

Thomas is the weak link. Jimmie Ward and Jaquiski Tarrt provide steady veteran play at safety.

When the 49ers have the ball

Which Green Bay defense will show up? Will it be the one that played so well through the first two-thirds of the season and crushed Vikings running back Dalvin Cook in week 17? Or will it be the one that gave up 28-plus points in five of the final seven games?

The 49ers finished only 13th with 25.1 points per game but hit their stride down the stretch. Notably, they finished No. 1 in red-zone offense (66.7%) while Green Bay finished No. 28 in red-zone defense (66%).

The key will be San Francisco's rushing attack. Elijah Mitchell finished eighth in rushing with 963 yards despite missing six games due to injuries. He's not as explosive as Raheem Mostert, who ran circles around the Packers in the 2019 NFC Championship Game, but he's still a big-time talent.

There are two important changes since Green Bay's week three victory. One, Mitchell is healthy; he was inactive for that game. Two, receiver Deebo Samuel has become a featured runner. With Mitchell (27 carries, 96 yards, one touchdown) and Samuel (10 carries, 72 yards, one touchdown) leading the charge, the 49ers demolished the Dallas defense with 169 rushing yards.

Green Bay's run defense ran hot and cold down the stretch. The Browns rushed for 219 yards in week 16 but the Vikings managed only 27 in week 17. All the jet-motion-style runs featuring Samuel as a runner or decoy will test the discipline of outside linebackers Preston Smith and Rashan Gary and All-Pro inside linebacker De'Vondre Campbell.

The running game will set up quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo for success (or failure). He finished third in completion percentage (68.3) and ninth in passer rating (98.8). He averaged a second-ranked 8.64 yards per attempt because he benefited from a league-best 6.51 yards after the catch. He didn't play well at Dallas and has no cold-weather history.

Samuel, with a league-high 18.3 yards per reception, is a stud in the run-after-catch phase and one of the premier playmakers in the league. He averaged 10 yards after the catch, fourth-best in the NFL and by far the best among receivers. He forced 20 missed tackles on 77 receptions; every Packers receiver combined tallied 24 misses on 238 receptions.

George Kittle (71 receptions, 910 yards, six touchdowns) is the best all-around tight end in the NFL, and receivers Brandon Aiyuk (56 receptions, 826 yards, five TDs) and Jauan Jennings (24 receptions, 282 yards, five TDs) emerged down the stretch.

The veteran offensive line is good but not great. All-Pro left tackle Trent Williams is a superb player, a dominant force run or pass. He's joined by Laken Tomlinson at left guard, Alex Mack at center, Dan Brunkskill at right guard and Tom Compton at right tackle. Green Bay's Kenny Clark must dominate the matchup against Brunkskill, who is the clear weak link.

Special teams

This is the phase that Packers fans have dreaded for most of the season.

The 49ers are fairly mediocre on special teams. Veteran kicker Robbie Gould was 20-of-23 on field goals and made kicks of 52 and 53 yards against Dallas.

Punter Mitch Wishnowsky finished 14th in net average. He's got all the kicks in his bag to make fielding the ball a challenge. Presumably, David Moore will handle punts. He had an excellent debut in week 17 but spent week 18 on the COVID list.

In the first meeting, Aiyuk averaged 11.5 yards per punt return and Trent Cannon had a 68-yard kickoff return. With Aiyuk having a key role on offense and Cannon on injured reserve, Travis Benjamin had an 11-yard punt return and Ja'Mycal Hasty went nowhere on two kickoff returns.
