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WBHS FFA Chapter recognized with award

Agriculture teacher attributes success to hard work

Through hard work and dedication to community, the Wittenberg-Birnamwood High School's FFA chapter was named Chapter of the Year on Jan. 5.

"There is an organization out there made up of high school students from all around Shawano County — the Shawano County Agriculture Ambassadors," said Matthew Christian, agriculture teacher at Witt-Birn. "They vote to decide on the best FFA chapter, and we were voted the best chapter of the year in all of Shawano County last year."

Christian said there are about 10 chapters in Shawano County. He feels his school came out on top because of the chapter's selfless volunteerism efforts throughout the year.

"We have been striving to succeed in everything that we do," Christian said. "We do a giving tree over the winter months; we focus on the household goods. We give that back. We always donate 300 or so pounds of fresh produce to the food pantry here in town. We do a farmer's appreciation day where we deliver goods to farms all over the school district."

He said that the FFA program expands far beyond the walls of the school.

"We are trying to give back to the community that has given us so much," said Christian.

Christian said this award reflects the dedication of the students within the chapter.

"The kids are always working hard and are always trying to improve," he said. "I think this recognizes the kids more than it does me. I am not out for awards; it is all about the kids for me."

Christian described how it felt for he and his students to be recognized and given this award.

"You know, it is an honor," said Christian. "This is something that you have to be proud of. The thing is that someone is recognizing you for your hard work and your improvement."

Christian, who is in his fourth year in the district, said that he has been very impressed by the growth of the FFA program during that time. "When I started here, we had about 80 to 90 FFA members," he said. "We have grown to about 200 now. With roughly 320 students here, over half of the school is involved."

Christian attributes the growth of FFA to the resources that the school district has available, including the new agriculture classroom and greenhouse.

"I think that this building has a lot to do with the growth," said Christian. "We have seven pigs in

the back, five steers. We are growing brook trout. We have aquaponics. We are fertilizing plants with a greenhouse — there are so many opportunities here that anyone can grasp on to."

He said that with his role in teaching the students, he feels grateful.

"It is pretty awesome that I can participate with this," Christian said. "I am not doing it for me; I am doing it for them. I am trying to help the students find careers that would interest them."

After winning this award, Christian said that he and his students will continue to developing new ideas and techniques for the future.

"We are always looking at what we can do to get better," he said. "We always look to our alumni for advice. Right now, we are looking to our alumni for grants that can help our program and our students. The more involved that we get, the more we can improve."

Family ties keep Bieber from 3rd term

Sheriff plans to spend more time with wife, son; supports chief deputy's plans to run

There's going to be a new sheriff in town as Adam Bieber has opted not to run for a third term.

Bieber recently announced that he's opting for family first in his life and bowing out as the county's top cop. He said he hasn't decided if he's going to continue in law enforcement after his term concludes at the end of 2022 or pursue a different kind of job, but he's going to focus on his family.

"This is something we've been discussing for quite some time over the last few months," Bieber said. "We knew this was coming up, and it's always a very stressful time for me and my family. We have to raise money, campaign, show up at parades, all that stuff, and then not know if you're going to win or not."

Bieber won his first term as sheriff in 2014, beating incumbent Randy Wright in both the primary and general election after Wright launched a write-in campaign, along with independent candidate Lucas Christenson. He sailed to a second term in 2018, defeating independent candidate and former sheriff's detective Keith Sorlie.

After winning his second term, Bieber had told the Leader that his track record in working with the Shawano County Board of Supervisors was what helped him to win. In a new interview on Jan. 12, Bieber said that the board and the sheriff's department are not on the same wavelength as they once were.

"It really started when I wanted to include citizens in on our deputy interviews, our corrections officer interviews and our dispatch interviews," Bieber said. "I got a lot of kickback from the county board chairman on that."

The board as a whole signed off on the proposal, but Bieber said other issues have surfaced, like the efforts to get corrections officers more pay. In 2021, the board approved giving them and other jail staff a \$3 per hour pay raise, but it's only a temporary fix, as the county used American Rescue Plan Act funds, and those expire in 2024.

"It was a battle to get that stuff, and I had to burn some bridges during that process," Bieber said. "People that I thought were reasonable, I had to battle them with words and logic."

Bieber has much to be proud of in

his two terms as sheriff. He cited the construction of a new evidence storage building, something that had been a struggle to get the county board to fund, as one of them.

"We were able to get that done in under a year," Bieber said. "It's one of the best evidence storage buildings around."

Another accomplishment Bieber is proud of is getting body cameras on his deputies, and he noted that they're an invaluable tool for law enforcement. However, the company the county is using is no longer working with the existing cameras, and a new vendor needs to be sought out, an issue that Bieber and the county board are clashing on.

"I know our citizens want us to have that, so that's still a battle we're fighting with the county board," Bieber said.

Bieber is also proud that a drug court was established on his watch, saying that the program is able to transform lives.

"It's awesome that we already have three graduates, and we're working to help so many more," Bieber said.

Although paperwork for the sheriff's race can't be taken out until later

this year, there is already at least one person vying to take Bieber's place. George Lenzner, the county's chief deputy, announced on Facebook that he plans to run for his boss's seat.

"George was the first one to know, besides my wife, that I wasn't going to run," Bieber said. "I let him know because I want him to run for sheriff. I know that he's always desired to be sheriff ... and I encouraged him to run."

Bieber believes not running for a third term will help him to be more in his sons' lives. His oldest son, Will, currently is a junior at Coleman High School, while his other two sons attend Shawano schools. He plans to get his children into one school district.

"We miss our oldest son terribly. We're just missing out on a lot of time," Bieber said, noting that the family is having to decide which son to see on Friday nights for football and for other activities. "We've got to split up as a family, and we're just not willing to do that anymore."

Bieber noted that his belief that politicians should not spend their whole lives in their elected seats is also playing a factor in his decision.

"To run for a third term would actually fly in the face of what I should

believe," Bieber said. "I don't want to be a career politician."

Bieber admitted he has been outspoken on some controversial issues, and his stances have sometimes been difficult for his wife and children. As an example, he cited when the Black Lives Matter movement came to Shawano in 2020 and he refused to walk with the group.

"I don't regret that decision," Bieber said. "I'm one of those guys who believes that all lives matter and that everyone should be treated equally. All of us in law enforcement, we didn't agree with how that officer in Minnesota handled things, but that doesn't mean I agree with everything Black Lives Matters is doing, too."

Despite potentially not being in law enforcement anymore, Bieber said he believes the sheriff's department will continue to protect the communities it serves.

"I've always said that law enforcement is the greatest force for good in a community," Bieber said. "No matter what call you're on, you're generally helping people in some way, form or fashion."

How to convince an elderly parent to stop driving

Dear Savvy Senior,

What is the best way to deal with older drivers who probably shouldn't be driving anymore? My dad, who's 86, is bound and determined to keep driving as long as he's alive.

Dear Backseat,

For many families, talking to an elderly parent about giving up the car keys can be a very difficult and sensitive topic. While there's no one way to handle this issue, here are a few suggestions that can help you evaluate your dad's driving and ease him out from behind the wheel when the time is right.

To get a clear picture of your dad's driving abilities — a good first step, if you haven't already done so — is to take a ride with him and watch for problem areas. For example: Does he have difficulty seeing, backing up or changing lanes? Does he react slowly, get confused easily or make poor driving decisions? Does he drive at inappropriate speeds, tailgate or drift

between lanes? Also, has your dad had any fender benders or tickets lately, or have you noticed any dents or scrapes on his vehicle? These, too, are red flags.

If you need some help and your dad is willing, consider hiring a driver rehabilitation specialist who's trained to evaluate elderly drivers and provide safety suggestions. This type of assessment typically costs between \$200 and \$400. To locate a professional in your area, visit AOTA.org/older-driver or ADED.net.

After your assessment, if you think it's still safe for your dad to drive, see if he would be willing to take an older driver refresher course.

These courses will show him how aging affects driving skills and offers tips and adjustments to help keep him safe. Taking a class may also earn your dad a discount on his auto

insurance. To locate a class, contact your local AAA (AAA.com) or AARP (AARPDiversafety.org, 888-227-7669). Most courses cost around \$20 to \$30 and can be taken online.

If, however, your assessment shows that your dad really does need to stop driving, you need to have a talk with him, but don't get carried away. If you begin with a dramatic outburst like "Dad, you're going to kill someone!" you're likely to trigger resistance. Start by simply expressing your concern for his safety.

For more tips on how to talk to your dad about this and evaluate his driving skills, the Hartford Financial Services Group and MIT AgeLab offers a variety of resources to assist you. Visit TheHartford.com/lifetime and click on "Publications" on the menu bar, then on the "We Need to Talk" guidebook.

If your dad refuses to quit, you have several options. One possible solution is to suggest a visit to his doctor who can give him a medical evaluation and, if warranted, "prescribe" that he stops driving.

Older people will often listen to their doctors before they will listen to their own family members.

If he still refuses, contact your local Department of Motor Vehicles to see if they can help, or call in an attorney to discuss with your dad the potential financial and legal consequences of a crash or injury. If all else fails, you may just have to take away his keys.

Once your dad stops driving, he's going to need other ways to get around, so help him create a list of names and phone numbers of family, friends and local transportation services that he can call on.

To find out what transportation services are available in your dad's area, contact Rides in Sight (RidesInSight.org, 855-607-4337) and the Eldercare Locator (800-677-1116), which will direct you to his area agency on aging for assistance.

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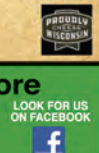
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Noriega-Avila still without public defender

Defendant asks for lower bond to allow him to work to pay for an attorney but is denied

It took years for the long arm of the law to catch up with Pedro Noriega-Avila, but it appears it may take a long while for justice to be served, as well.

It was reported Jan. 20 in Shawano-Menominee County Circuit Court that Noriega-Avila, 39, of Pulaski, is still lacking representation from the Wisconsin Public Defender's Office after more than five months in the Shawano County Jail despite meeting the qualifications to have a public defender. A preliminary hearing, originally scheduled for Aug. 13, 2021, has been pushed back multiple times while waiting for Noriega-Avila to have legal representation.

Judge William Kussel Jr. scheduled another status conference for 8:30 a.m. Feb. 17 where proceedings can continue if Noriega-Avila has an attorney by then. Kussel noted that, as of Dec. 17, the public defender's office had contacted 683 attorneys, but none of them had agreed to represent the defendant.

Noriega-Avila faces one count of first-degree child sexual assault of a child under age 13, two counts of sexual assault with someone under age 16 and two counts of incest with a child

by a stepparent. The case is from 2016, but he was a fugitive until he was caught in April 2021 by the U.S. Border Patrol trying to go to Mexico.

Noriega-Avila remains in jail on a \$500,000

cash bond. He asked Kussel, speaking through an interpreter, if the bond could be reduced so that he could get a job to afford to hire an attorney, since he was unable to get one in a timely fashion through the public defender's office.

"Since they haven't been able to get me an attorney, what I would like to do is be able to get out so that I can work and hire my own attorney," Noriega-Avila said.

Kussel denied the request after hearing from the prosecutor and the victim that there were strong objections to the request. Among the objections was the fact that Noriega-Avila had already fled the state and attempted to flee the country once.

Noriega-Avila had made a bond modification request in December, which was also denied.

"He has not stated whether any-

thing had changed in the intervening 28 days that would represent a significant change in circumstance," said Assistant District Attorney Joseph Kaupie.

Noriega-Avila faces a maximum of 40 years in prison and \$100,000 fine for each of the incest and the latter two sexual assault counts. For the child sexual assault in 2010, he faces up to 60 years in prison.

The criminal complaint states that Noriega-Avila allegedly went into his stepdaughter's room between September 2009 and June 2010 and assaulted her. It goes on to say that additional incidents occurred in 2014 and 2015. Noriega-Avila married the victim's mother on July 9, 2010.

Kaupie noted that the potential sentence, totaling 220 years if the maximum is imposed and the sentences are to be served consecutively, indicate Noriega-Avila could flee again if he were allowed out of jail on a lower bond amount.

"A complaint and warrant was issued in June 2016, and we weren't able to bring that defendant before the court because he ran," Kaupie said. "The state is extremely concerned that any modification to the bond will allow this defendant to once again flee, and we will be waiting years before he can be extradited back

to Wisconsin. There's no reason to change the bond given the very serious nature of each of the charges."

The victim also made a statement asking for the bond to remain the same.

"I don't think it's a good idea," she said. "Lowering the bond where he wants to come out and work is not a good idea because he could again run away."

Noriega-Avila rebutted that he had no intention of fleeing again and even said he would consent to wearing an electronic monitoring bracelet.

"I don't know if the court could use a bracelet or anything else that the judge would feel appropriate, but I have no intention at all of leaving or fleeing from this," Noriega-Avila said. "I only want to get this case resolved."

Kussel was unconvinced that Noriega-Avila's desire to resolve the case quickly was enough to warrant lowering the bond.

"The charges that the defendant is facing are very serious," Kussel said. "He has a great exposure if convicted. He faces 220 years of incarceration as well as large amounts of fines and costs. He has fled in the past that required actions to bring him back before the state."

Nature center fundraising for new tractor

Tractor to be used for operations, maintenance

Officials within the Navarino Nature Center are looking to purchase a new tractor to help run operations.

Navarino Nature Center director and naturalist Tim Ewing said that there is a big need for the tractor.

"We have existed for a little over 30 years and have a partnership with the DNR," said Ewing. "Over the years, we have been able to use their tractor for a number of things, including wagon rides and trail maintenance."

He said that with a surge in people attending the Senior Safaris program, trolley rides and wagon rides for the public, there has become a need for the

center to have its own tractor.

"We are at a point of time where the DNR's tractor is not available to us all of the time," said Ewing. "We have been having to rely on volunteers to use their vehicles."

The new machine would allow more frequent trail maintenance, which would be more inviting to visitors, he added.

"The DNR has 15,000 acres here," said Ewing. "It has 100 miles of trails. They typically mow all the trails only once a year. So, right around the nature center we have been trying to maintain the trails the best that we can. A tractor would help to assure us that these trails are the best that they can be."

Come winter time, he said that the tractor would be used to help remove snow, which the Shawano County Highway Department does now.

"They have been wonderful to work with," said Ewing. "There have been times when I have had to plow, because they need to get the highways plowed. We are kind of far down on the scale there."

As the nature center is looking for tractors, Ewing said that the one that they are looking at is priced at \$75,000.

"Right now with our fundraiser, we are at about \$26,000 towards the tractor," said Ewing. "We are about a third of the way here."

He added that they have also explored different grants to supplement donations.

"That is a large item, so they are harder to come by," said Ewing.

Ewing said that most of the fundraising has been through word of mouth and through programs involving trolleys.

"Right now, we are able to run

some programs like cross-country skiing, snowshoeing and torchlight events," said Ewing.

If people want to help raise funds for the tractor, they can either call the nature center at 715-758-6999, donate online through the website <https://www.navarino.org>, or send donations in the mail.

Because of its location, the nature center plays a role in many different counties, including Brown, Shawano, Outagamie and Waupaca counties.

"The way that we look at it, the nature center is kind of the gatekeeper to this wildlife area," Ewing said. "There have been a lot of people in the last two years who have found about us as they look to get outside. We are just trying to give people the assistance they need to fulfill these needs."

Judge denies McCandless lower bond amount

Menasha woman charged with attempted homicide in incident where husband was shot

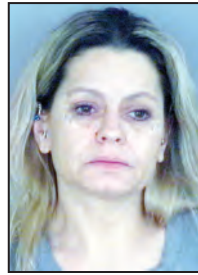

Tina L. McCandless, 48, of Menasha, was denied a request to reduce her bond from \$500,000 to \$100,000 during an adjourned initial appearance on Jan. 19 in Shawano-Menominee County Circuit Court.

McCandless has been charged with attempted first-degree homicide and first-degree recklessly endangerment in connection with a Jan. 4 incident at her husband's home on Dent Creek Road in the Town of Morris.

McCandless was without an attorney as she made the request. According to Judge William Kussel Jr., McCandless meets the requirements for a public defender, but there is a shortage of attorneys available to take on a case involving attempted homicide.

"That's not unusual," Kussel said. "There's a large need and not that many attorneys."

McCandless, appearing via Zoom from the Shawano County Jail, asked for the \$100,000 signature bond so that she could be out of jail to undergo heart surgery and recover at home. She told the court that her pacemaker was "messed up" in the scuffle with her husband, so the surgery was necessary.

Kussel said that McCandless needs to make jail staff aware of her condition, and that the request needs to come through the jail in order to make accommodations. He said he would not change the bond amount at the hearing.

According to the criminal complaint, officers were called to Mark A. McCandless' home early Jan. 4 on a report that shots had been fired and an individual was

wounded in the leg. The responding officer found the couple across from each other with a .22 caliber pistol on a living room table.

Mark McCandless said they had gone out for drinks, and then Tina McCandless left to go back to Menasha, where she was staying with family. Later he woke up to find her allegedly holding the pistol, and she told him to put his wedding ring back on. When he declined because the marriage is over, she allegedly fired off a round, according to the complaint.

The court document stated she then chased him through the house, occasionally firing the pistol, and one of the bullets struck him in the calf. At one point, he grabbed for the weapon and they struggled, and he was able to restrain her long enough to call police, according to the complaint.

The gun was registered in Mark McCandless' name, according to the complaint, and at first Tina

McCandless claimed self-defense, telling the investigator that he had the gun and it went off as they struggled, but the location of the spent casings — officers found more than a half-dozen rounds scattered around the house — appears to point to his version of events.

Online court documents show that the couple filed for divorce at the end of October, and a stipulated divorce hearing is scheduled for March 15. The complaint indicates that Tina McCandless had just found out her estranged husband had begun dating another woman.

The adjourned initial appearance was rescheduled for 1:30 p.m. on Feb. 22 in the hopes that Tina McCandless will have an attorney by then, but if one is hired before then, it's possible the hearing could be rescheduled to an earlier time, Kussel said.

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Gresham School Board adopts masking metrics

Student council president, parents urge end to masking mandates

The Gresham School Board voted 5-1 on Jan. 24 to set up a system similar to what Shawano schools are using to determine whether masks should be required in school buildings.

The board approved setting up a threshold of positive COVID-19 cases equal to about 2% of its student and staff population, seven out of 352, where masks would become mandatory. At that point, using the Wisconsin Department of Health Services as a model, the levels would be considered critical, the highest level. High levels would be one to three people and very high levels would be four to six people, but masks would still be highly recommended and not required.

The metrics, which take effect immediately, will be welcome news to students and staff, as the number of active cases as of Jan. 21 was four, a significant drop from the numbers the school had at the beginning of the month that brought up the issue of mask mandates again for the school district.

Superintendent Newell Haffner and Kyla Heiman, the school's nurse, will review the positive cases in the district every Friday and will inform families by 6 p.m. on Sundays about whether masks will be required for that week. Masks would be mandatory whenever the building was open, so any mandate would extend to events that take place outside of the regular school schedule.

Prior to the vote, the board got a first-hand account from a student about how the mask mandate affects her and others. Ireland Jensen, president of the school's student council, said the constant back and forth on the issue over the last three years has robbed the students of a normal period of education, especially high school students like herself.

"We've had to go back and forth with virtual learning and mask mandates," Jensen said. "The only

year in high school that was normal for me was freshman year. For others, they've never had a normal high school experience."

Besides missing out on choir concerts and other high school opportunities, Jensen has had to make several dermatology appointments, she said, because her skin has suffered from wearing a mask eight hours per day for five days a week. She noted that there have been other students who reported similar problems when she surveyed them last week.

"It's not like they stop the spread," Jensen said. "We don't wear them outside of school. It should be masks recommended to give students a free choice."

Jensen also reported students experiencing headaches when they've had to wear a mask for an extended period of time, making it difficult to concentrate in classes. She also noted that the prior policy of requiring masks during school hours but not after school made no sense.

"As elected officials, you're responsible for considering all aspects and consequences of your actions," Jensen said.

The mask issue also raised the ire of parents. Chris Cerveney urged the board to listen to the arguments of board member Joe Ejnik, who has questioned the need for mask mandates in the past and was the lone vote opposing the masking metrics, instead of keeping Gresham in limbo.

"I've been coming to these meetings for about five months now, on and off," Cerveney said. "We have four people on (the board) who are left-leaning and will just stay with their left-leaning theology. If you listen to anything that the students have said tonight, it's time to move on from masking and get on with your life."

Cerveney said that COVID-19 has become endemic in the same way that influenza and the common cold have, so having masking metrics seems unnecessary. He said the cloth masks are not shown to be very effective against the omicron variant.

"I've sat here and listened to nothing but craziness," Cerveney said. "To me, it's just left-leaning lunacy. There's no common sense."

Haffner told the board that the metrics were similar to what had been implemented in the Shawano School District and at Sacred Heart Catholic School and St. James Lutheran School. He noted that other schools in the Central Wisconsin Conference have been at masking-optional statuses when Gresham has been under required masking.

Haffner added that when the numbers were high in early January, they were traced to three large families in the community.

"That was our biggest week ever," Haffner said.

Ejnik agreed with Haffner's assessment of other schools in the CWC, which includes Wittenberg-Birnamwood, Tigerton and Bowler.

"They're not having the spread, and they're not dealing with the contact tracing issues that we've been struggling with," Ejnik said. "It's a

step in the right direction, and we have a ways to go, but let's keep moving it forward."

Board member Marge Eberhard expressed concern about not having masks at the lower levels instead of waiting for the critical benchmark to be reached, but she voted in favor of the metrics.

"To me, moderately high seems dangerous. I'm wondering if we want to include that," Eberhard said, even though there were no numbers for the moderately high category for the school. "I think it needs to be addressed."

Board member Doug Huck praised the system set up by the administration, but noted that if it doesn't work out, the plan should come back to the board for tweaking.

"For the first time, we have some objective data," Huck said. "There's some objective criteria we're following that hopefully takes the personalities out of it."

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Precautions should be taken with winter activity

With the first indications of winter arriving in northeast and central Wisconsin, many people will be excited about the winter activities that will follow. To help keep the season safe and fun, there are a few considerations to keep in mind.

"When the snow sticks to the ground, people may be eager to get back to favorite activities like skiing, snowboarding or skating," said Dr. Patrick Terry, family medicine physician at ThedaCare Physicians-Oshkosh. "Make sure you're in appropriate physical condition for your activity. Warm up beforehand, and use properly fitting gear and safety equipment."

The American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons says nearly 200,000 people were treated in 2018 for winter sports-related injuries, including fractures, sprains and dislocations. Cold muscles and tendons are more vulnerable to injury, and many injuries occur when people are fatigued.

"Many of these injuries occur at the end of the day when people are just getting in one last run, for example," Terry said. "It's important to stay alert and stop for breaks when you feel yourself getting tired — and certainly don't continue your activity if you're in pain."

Kids especially may be eager to hit the nearest sledding hill as soon as the snow sticks to the ground. The National Safety Council says more than 20,000 children are treated each year for sledding injuries, often because of falls from the sled or because the sled hits a stationary

object. Skull fractures are unfortunately a common injury.

"Always supervise children who are sledding, especially those under age 10," Terry said. "Wearing

a helmet is a best practice, and no one should ride the sled head first — the feet should always be pointing downhill."

Sleds should be in good condition, without cracks or sharp edges, and using a sled with brakes and steering is the best plan. Sled hills should be spacious and free from obstacles, including having a wide space at the bottom for safe stops.

As with any outdoor activity in winter, people should dress properly for the cold when walking in winter.

"It's great to stay active even in the winter months," Terry said. "Just be prepared for winter temperatures by wearing several layers of lightweight clothing, with an outer layer that is water resistant and blocks the wind."

Footwear with rubber or neoprene soles provide the best traction on potentially slippery surfaces. Additionally, the footwear you choose should provide good ankle support as well as keep your feet warm and dry.

When you navigate icy areas, keep your center of gravity over your feet and take smaller, shuffling steps, which can help your stability.

If you're walking across roadways, remember that vehicles will take longer to stop in poor conditions.

"Be aware of your surroundings, both in terms of vehicle traffic and the conditions of the roadway or sidewalk," Terry said. "Ice is often hidden under snow and can create the potential for dangerous slips and falls."

People also should protect themselves from frostbite during any winter activity by wearing hats and/or earmuffs and gloves, and taking a break from the cold whenever they're outdoors for an extended period of time.

"Older adults, infants and those with medical conditions such as diabetes are at greater risk of frostbite as their bodies may have a harder time producing heat or responding properly to the cold," Terry noted.

Signs of superficial frostbite can include, at first, cold skin and a prickling feeling. Then, there can be numbness; skin that looks red, white, bluish-white, grayish-yellow, purplish, brown or ashen, depending on the severity of the condition and usual skin color; hard or waxy-looking skin; clumsiness due to joint and muscle stiffness; and blistering after rewarming, in severe cases.

"In more progressive cases of frostbite, you might experience a feeling of warming," Terry said. "It's important to be aware of how the skin is feeling and ensure extremities are properly protected against the cold."

Each year, people suffer heart attacks while snow shoveling and

snowblowing. High levels of exertion coupled with cold temperatures and a sedentary or inactive lifestyle can put people at risk.

"Cold temperatures can increase your heart rate and your blood pressure," Terry said. "Even in healthy people, this creates a greater risk of heart attack."

People who are not normally very active especially should take precautions when shoveling, including stretching and warming up before shoveling, using a smaller shovel or shoveling smaller loads, and pushing snow rather than lifting it.

Snowblowing may seem safer, but the equipment is heavy and pushing it can cause injury or overexertion as well.

"Certainly, do not shovel or snowblow without your provider's approval if you have had any history of cardiovascular disease," Terry said. "It's far better to hire someone to clear your driveway than to end up in the emergency room, or worse."

Terry wants to encourage people to make the most of winter, while staying safe.

"The winters can be long in Wisconsin," said Terry. "That doesn't mean we must hibernate indoors for months. There are wonderful activities to take part in — skiing, snowboarding, snowshoeing or just enjoying a walk in a park or around your neighborhood. All of these are great exercises that help our bodies adapt to cold weather. If we follow safety precautions, we can enjoy the beauty that winter provides."

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Wildlife bridges not popular with DNR

Crossing structures can reduce crashes by as much as 80% in some areas of the country

Deer cause more than 16,000 car crashes in Wisconsin every year, leading to millions of dollars in damage, and even a few lives lost.

Yet the state has no wildlife crossing structures big enough for deer, which are seen as effective in other states. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources says they're not feasible.

Vehicles collide with deer somewhere in Wisconsin an average of about 45 times a day, according to records from the DNR. An average deer crash costs about \$4,800, according to American Family Insurance. That puts the estimated total bill for deer crashes in Wisconsin at more than \$75 million per year.

On top of the monetary damage, deer crashes kill an average of about eight people in Wisconsin every year, according to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation.

Some states around the country, such as Utah, Nevada and California, have embraced wildlife crossing structures to help reduce the problem. These are tunnels or bridges designed to move wildlife safely through roadways. Crossing structures can reduce crashes by as much as 80-90 percent in some areas, according to the Center for Large Landscape Conservation, a Montana group with a goal to unite American landscapes.

"The fact is that wildlife-vehicle collisions are expensive a lot of times, especially with these medium-to-larger size animals," said Daniel Olson, Wildlife Migration Initiative Coordinator at the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources. "It doesn't take avoiding very many crashes for (crossing structures) to pay for themselves, because the damage and injuries are so high for those types of events."

Just as in Wisconsin, Utah's deer population causes the majority of wildlife crashes, but the dominant species in Utah are mule deer, a migratory species. They account for about 10,000 crashes a year, according to Olson.

Utah has been constructing wildlife crossing structures since the 1970s, but the state has recently moved to build more. There are currently more than 50 in the state.

Fencing has to be installed along roadways for miles in either direction to ensure wildlife is properly funneled through the structure. Without it, animals would just shift the collision problem down the road, Olson said.

"We typically see a huge reduction in vehicle collisions when we use wildlife crossing structures, plus exclusionary fencing for the animals to cross," Olson said. "Those are a really effective combo."

In Wisconsin, the DOT has installed many wildlife crossings throughout the state for smaller animals like turtles, and deer are able to use the wildlife shelves or

walkways built under waterway bridges, said Kristin McHugh, a spokesperson for the DOT.

The DNR has decided larger wildlife crossings wouldn't be effective in "significantly" reducing deer collisions, said Scott Roepke, a Wisconsin DNR area wildlife supervisor in La Crosse.

Unlike mule deer out west, white-tailed deer in Wisconsin are not very migratory. So building costly crossing structures in the state would have minimal impact, Roepke said. While Utah is able to track migration patterns and create models to predict where mule deer will cross, Wisconsin doesn't necessarily have that opportunity.

The Wisconsin DOT does use fencing to try and funnel deer under bridges and away from high-traffic areas, according to the agency's public affairs office.

Roepke's district office in La Crosse is considering installing an elk crossing near Black River Falls and has submitted a project plan to their superiors, but no decisions have been made.

Also, the recently-passed federal infrastructure bill allocates \$350 million to states specifically for the construction of wildlife crossings.

While the impact of wildlife crossings for drivers can be beneficial, the structures can also help restore the historic migration patterns of local wildlife in some places.

When animals eventually figure out how to use a crossing structure, they use it a lot. A 2013 study in Utah showed that mule deer used crossing structures in the state a total of 31,000 times over five years.

"What that tells me is animals that were restricted now have access to a vastly bigger slice of habitat because we put that crossing in," said Matt Howard, natural resource manager at the Utah Department of Transportation. "It will help build healthier herds and populations going into the future."

Despite seeing local reductions in wildlife-vehicle crashes around crossing structures, Utah hasn't seen much change in crash trends throughout the state.

"Because (Utah) is growing so fast, the problem areas just shift — once we solve a problem in one area, a new one will pop up," Olson said.

The number of crashes in Utah compared to 10 years ago has stayed relatively stable despite a fast-growing population because of the mitigation efforts, Olson added. On top of that, these structures can take years to plan and millions of dollars to construct — an average culvert or bridge takes five years to plan and as much as \$7 million to build, Howard said.

"If you want to see a crossing structure up five or 10 years from now, the work starts today," he said.

Gaslighting replaced by threats in Washington

There are some people who once achieved fame, went into obscurity for a while and then made a comeback worthy of worldwide applause. Then there are some people who did the first two things, attempted the third thing and got crickets chirping as the reaction, instead.

That, in a nutshell, describes Newt Gingrich, the former U.S. House Speaker who went on Fox News' Sunday Morning Futures and predicted that the members of the Jan. 6 special committee will be put in jail if the Republicans take back the majority. Saying that they've "run amok," and behaving like the "British monarchy" as they go about "running over people's civil liberties," Gingrich predicted that the GOP will flip the tables and turn the "wolves" into "sheep."

While you've got to love the imagery Gingrich invokes, the Jan. 6 committee does not approach the same level of the McCarthyism from the 1950s, when mere associations with certain people that the "state" did not approve of got folks blacklisted. It might not accomplish much in terms of furthering this country along and evolving it into a better society, but that tends to be the hallmark of the federal government in many of its programs. So why single this one out and proclaim it as pure evil?

Once upon a time, politicians

found gaslighting to be an incredibly powerful tool at their disposal, making the voters question their own sanity by using their own twisted logic to show why their point of view is valid and anyone else's is sheer lunacy. Gingrich is now bypassing the "you're nuts" approach and just proclaiming that someone who believes a different point of view is a criminal and should be locked up.

If that method actually worked, plenty of folks in the U.S. Capitol would be behind bars. Take the late Sen. Ted Kennedy, a Democrat who drove his car into the water in 1967 and killed a passenger. He received a suspended sentence for his actions, which involved someone's death, and remained in Congress for decades to come. David Durenberger, a Republican senator denounced for unethical financial transactions, pleaded guilty to misuse of public funds in 1995 and only got probation.

It's hard to take anyone who has served the federal government seriously when he or she vows to lock up his or her own people. Some folks who served in Washington, D.C., did wind up locked away for

their criminal acts, but let's face it. The consistency of the feds locking away criminals and malcontents is Swiss cheese, at best. To jump up and proudly proclaim that the forces involved with the Jan. 6 committee will join the chain gangs in white-collar prisons is preposterous.

Also, it's hard to take Gingrich seriously as a "lawyer," so to speak, as he was in Congress when the impeachment proceedings against President Bill Clinton took place and failed to get a conviction. Granted, it proves the point that politicians make really horrible investigators and lawyers in general, and that the Jan. 6 committee is probably going to spin its wheels indefinitely. But his vague talk does not produce a shred of proof that Congress has turned into a body that says "Off with your head" and asks questions later.

Gingrich's comments are being rebuked by members of Congress, Democrat and Republican alike. Republican Rep. Liz Cheney, who sits on the Jan. 6 committee, said on Twitter that Gingrich's prediction shows "This is what it looks like when the rule of law unravels," while Rep. Elaine Luria told CNN "that is why the work we're doing is absolutely so important on the committee, is to make sure that we uphold the foundations of our democracy."

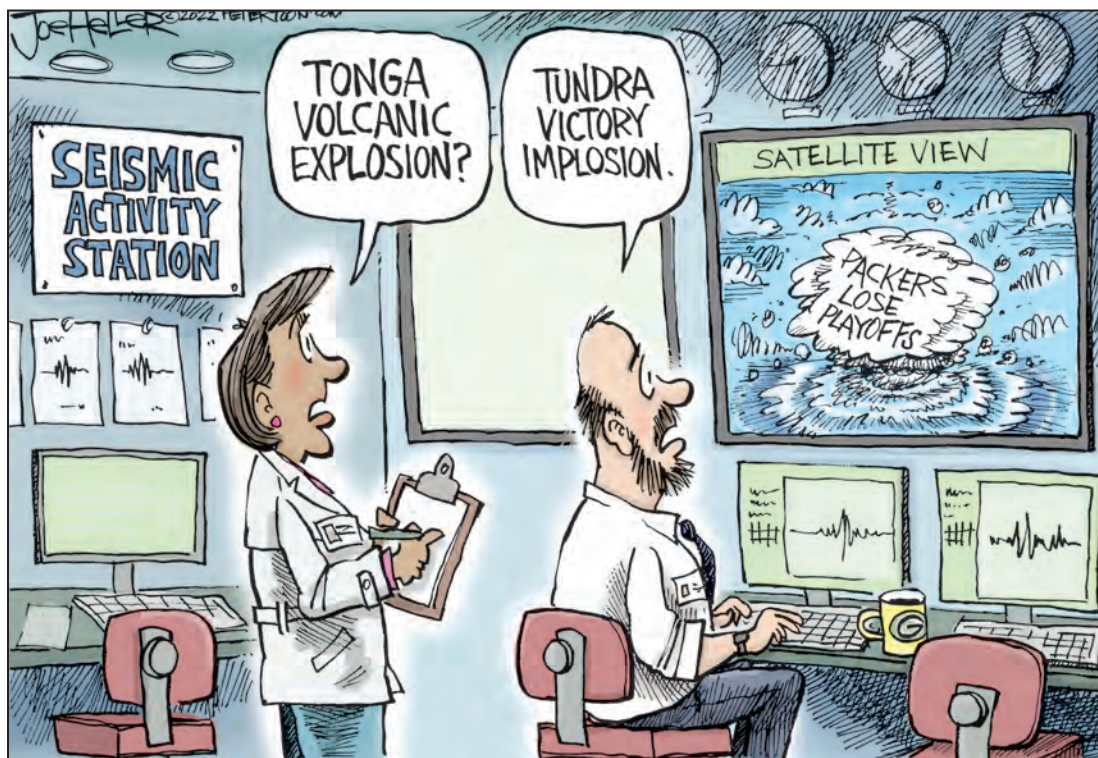
I don't have much faith in the com-

mittee producing anything in stone that will determine what caused people to lose their marbles and attack the U.S. Capitol last year, given the current political climate. Democrats are calling it an attack on our country akin to Sept. 11, 2001, and the bombing of Pearl Harbor, while Republicans are claiming that even calling it an attack is a stretch. With this type of schism in the debate, we may never learn the full truth.

However, Gingrich's threat of jail does bring America's whole freedom of speech mantra under fire. Proclaiming a belief and looking for proof that it's true is not a criminal act. On the flip side, Gingrich's attitude that the committee members should be locked up is also not a criminal act, even though his claim lacks proof to be believable.

The chant of locking up Democrats is nothing new to Republicans, as we all remember that they wanted Hillary Clinton locked up for certain emails that were part of her stint as Secretary of State, but if Gingrich was expecting Americans to hoot and holler while providing a standing ovation, he might want to step back out of the spotlight and let the current politicians make fools of themselves on their own without help from him.

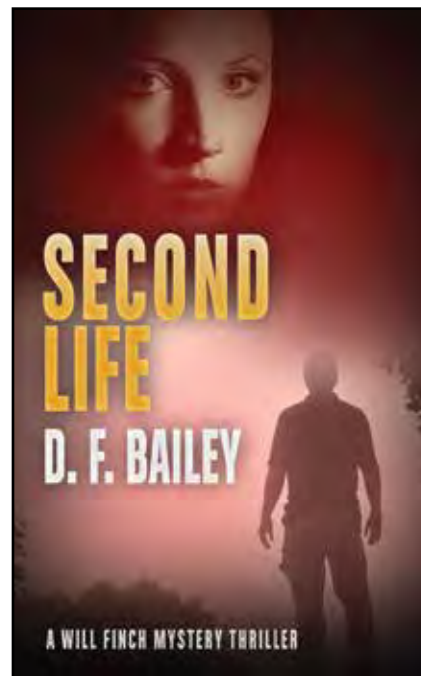

Packers' approach needs to change

The Green Bay Packers season unexpectedly came to close after blowing a late lead against the San Francisco 49ers during an NFC Divisional Round playoff game on Jan. 22 at Lambeau Field in Green Bay.

"Certainly we want him back

here," said coach Matt LaFleur of Rodgers after the season-ending loss. "I think we would be crazy not to want him back here."

"This guy does so much for our football team," LaFleur added. "Not only what you guys see on Sundays or every gameday, but what he does in that locker room, how he leads. I know what he puts into this thing, and I am extremely disappointed that we couldn't get over the hump. Not only for him but for everyone in that locker room."

While LaFleur said he wanted Rodgers back, and honestly would be pretty crazy to say otherwise, that doesn't mean the front office does, or even can based on the serious salary cap issues facing the team.

If you ask me, now would actu-

ally be the perfect time to move on from Rodgers.

That thinking starts by looking at the Packers' level of success with Rodgers leading the way. The regular season number speak for themselves, with Rodgers putting up MVP-like number every season and leading the team to many NFC North titles.

The success level of Rodgers and the team drops significantly in the playoffs though. Of course, there's all the losses in the NFC Championship Game, with the team's last win in that game coming when the team won the Super Bowl. There's been times where Rodgers has played well and the team has still lost those games, but since the Super Bowl year, Rodgers hasn't been able to lift the team up when its mat-

tered most.

That isn't necessarily a knock on Rodgers — football is a team game after all — but it's also fair to say Rodgers is asked to carry too much of the load. Could that be the reason for the average to subpar play we've seen at times from No. 12 in the playoffs?

Maybe it is, maybe it isn't, but I personally think the team expects Rodgers to cover up the team's weaknesses far too often.

Take this year for example. The Packers were awful on special teams all season. The organization didn't do much to fix the issues during the regular season and it came back to bite them in the postseason. You take away seven points from the blocked punt and add three points for the blocked field goal

and the Packers win comfortably. It wouldn't have been the flashiest of wins, but advancing is the name of the game in the playoffs.

After really coming on in the second half of the season, the Packers' offense was abysmal against San Fran. Rodgers completed 20 passes in the game, with nine receptions each for running back Aaron Jones and wide receiver Davante Adams. Of his 29 attempts, only six went to a player other than Jones or Adams.

It's almost like Rodgers didn't trust the team's other receiving options. Granted, there were some drops in there, but there was also times only Adams or Jones was open to pass the ball to. Only having a couple reliable targets can certainly affect a quarterback during a game, and can adversely affect other parts of their game as a result.

So could moving on from Rodgers actually help the Packers find more success in the postseason?

Obviously, to win a Super Bowl, you first have to reach the playoffs, and at least average quarterback play is needed for most teams to get there. The Packers have a dynamic 1-2 punch in the backfield (Jones and A.J. Dillon) and they really helped open up a lot of things for Rodgers and the pass game the past couple years.

If you look at the game-by-game breakdown for Rodgers, it's not chock full of 400-plus yards passing games. There's a lot of Packers' wins in which Rodgers threw for less than 300 yards. His unbelievable ability to take care of the ball helped the team to three 13-win seasons in a row. The next quarterback wouldn't need to throw for 400 yards and five touchdowns a game, instead being a game manager and taking care of the ball.

Another reason moving on from Rodgers could work is the improved play the team's defense showed this year.

Going into the playoffs, many people, including myself, saw the defense as a liability. Instead, with several injured starters back, the defense absolutely dominated.

With cornerbacks Jaire Alexander and Eric Stokes, defensive lineman Kenny Clark, inside linebacker Krys Barnes, outside linebacker Rashan Gary and safeties Adrian Amos and Darnell Savage, you have a strong core to build around.

What about inside linebacker De'Vondre Campbell and cornerback Rasul Douglas? That brings me to my next point.

Being in salary cap misery, mov-

ing on from Rodgers could save the team a bunch of money. That's money that could be used to bring back Campbell and Douglas, among other on the offensive side of the ball (like Adams) to surround the next quarterback with some weapons.

Trading Rodgers would also bring in some draft picks that could be used to fill out the roster and continue building the team toward a Super Bowl.

Moving on from Rodgers doesn't mean that Jordan Love needs to be the next starter either. Should the Packers not go into a total rebuild,

there's still plenty of big-time players on the roster that would make Green Bay a preferred destination for a veteran quarterback.

That next quarterback, whoever it might be, is highly unlikely to match the gaudy numbers Rodgers has put up over his career, but those also might not be needed in order for the team to get back to the Super Bowl.

A more balanced team that can rely on defense at times to win games, the offense at others to earn a victory or the special teams to make a play and squeak out a win might

actually make the Packers a more dangerous team come playoff time.

Maybe the regular season win total won't reach 13, but in a weak NFC North, between eight and 10 wins might get the job done each year.

It's hard to imagine the Packers without Rodgers at quarterback, but it's going to happen at some point. With some of the recent playoff letdowns and other question marks around the roster, now might be that time to move on.

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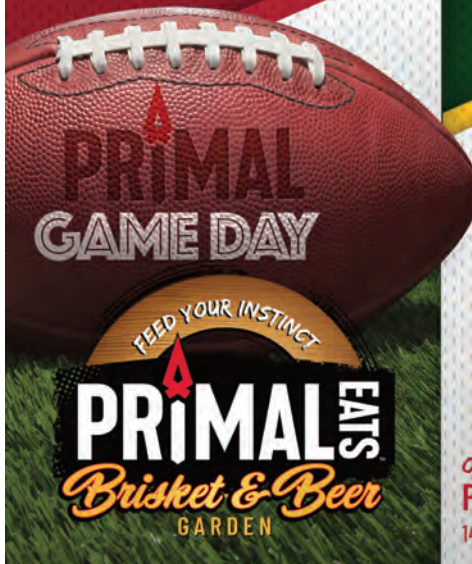
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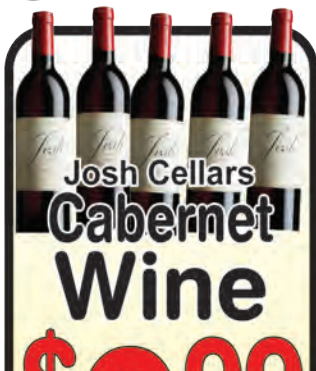


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Pack eliminated by 49ers after blowing lead

Blocked punt turns tide of game

The Green Bay Packers suffered a 13-10 loss to the San Francisco 49ers in a NFC Divisional Round playoff game after surrendering 10 points in the final five minutes of action on Jan. 22 at Lambeau Field in Green Bay.

Clinging to a 10-3 lead with under five minutes to play, all Green Bay had to do was punt the ball back to San Francisco and lean on a defense that had dominated for most of the night. Instead, the 49ers broke through the Packers' punt protection, blocked Corey Bojorquez's punt, scooped up the loose ball and returned it 6 yards for the game-tying score.

Tied up, the probable MVP Aaron Rodgers and the Packers' offense had a chance to redeem themselves after a sluggish game, but a penalty on first down pushed the ball back, and Green Bay eventually went three-and-out.

A 57-yard punt from Bojorquez made San Fran start the drive from its own 29, but gains of 12 and 14 quickly moved the 49ers into Packers' territory. On a third-and-seven play, Green Bay's defense allowed a 9-yard run, and after a couple 1-yard runs drained all but four seconds, San Fran's Robbie Gould drilled a 45-yard field goal to end the game and stun the Packers.

"Well, that's a tough pill to swallow for all of us right now," said Packers coach Matt LaFleur. "That's a really disappointed locker room. I hurt for them."

"I am a little numb for sure. Didn't

think it was going to end like this," said Rodgers.

There was plenty of blame to go around in the loss, with the special teams and offense carrying the brunt of it.

Not only did the special teams allow the punt to be blocked and turned

into points, but a field goal at the end of the first half was blocked, keeping Green Bay's lead at 7-0 heading to halftime.

A 45-yard kickoff return to open the third quarter helped the 49ers get on the scoreboard with a field goal.

Like he often does when any part

of the team struggles, LaFleur took the blame for the poor special teams' play.

"It's extremely disappointing, especially when you look at what happened tonight," said LaFleur. "Again, these are things I got to do a better job (of) and be more involved (with) to make sure that those types of things don't



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happen. That we're putting these guys in the right position, that we're coaching them the right way. Ultimately, it all falls on me."

Coming off the bye week, the Packers' offense opened the game firing on all cylinders.

The pass game helped Green Bay march right down the field on the opening drive before running back A.J. Dillon powered in from 6 yards out to give the Packers a 7-0 lead less than six minutes into the game. The drive went 69 yards in 10 plays, with 54 of the yards coming through the air.

On the second offensive drive of the game, Green Bay had picked up 33 yards in four plays and were at the San Fran 42-yard line before tight end Mercedes Lewis fumbled the ball after catching a pass. The turnover turned out to be a big play, as Green Bay's offense never really got back in rhythm.

The Packers next three drives went for a combined 26 yards and ended in three punts.

A 75-yard pass from Rodgers to running back Aaron Jones looked to jumpstart the offense right before halftime, but a sack on the next play resulted in a fumble. Green Bay fell on the loose ball, but with time dwindling and no timeouts left, had to spike the ball and attempt a field goal, which was blocked.

Green Bay's offense gained just 58 yards in the second half, with 57 of those coming on a drive that ended in a 33-yard Crosby field goal.

"I didn't have a great night tonight," said Rodgers, who completed 20 of 29 passes for 225 yards and was sacked five times. "They did a good job of kind of getting me off the spot and a better job of taking away some of the quick game that we got going the last time we played them and I just missed a couple reads."

The shortcomings on special teams and offense wasted a spectacular showing from the Packers' defense.

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Boosted by the return of outside linebackers Za'Darius Smith and Whitney Mercilus and cornerback Jaire Alexander, the Pack's defense was elite to start the game. Before gaining 68 yards on their final drive of the first half, San Fran's offense was at negative-10 yards through four series, all ending in punts.

On the drive that gained 68 yards, the Packers didn't allow points, as safety Adrian Amos intercepted a pass from Jimmy Garoppolo near the end zone.

San Fran gained 154 yards in the second half, but the Packers' defense was stingy in the red zone, forcing a short field goal and turnover on downs to end two possessions.

Smith and defensive lineman Kenny Clark each had a sack, while outside linebacker Rashan Gary finished with two sacks to lead the defense. Gary

had three tackles for loss, including the one that resulted in the turnover on downs, and had three of the team's seven quarterback hurries.

The 212 yards of total offense al-

lowed by the defense was the fewest given up since a playoff game against the Atlanta Falcons in 2011.
