A DELICIOUS THANKSGIVING STUFFING

Packers win on Thanksgiving Day in back-to-back years

After a year-long wait, Green Bay Packers quarterback Jordan Love finally received a turkey leg after beating the Miami Dolphins on Thanksgiving Day, 30-17.

Love was neglected of receiving the traditional cooked bird after Green Bay's dominant victory over the Detroit Lions last Thanksgiving. In Thursday's game against the Miami Dolphins, it looked as though Love really wanted a redo on the tradition.

He did so by completing 21-of-28 passes for 274 yards and two touchdowns. For the third straight week, Love did not throw an interception, after starting the season with 10 straight games throwing one.

"It was special," said Love with a smile, talking about receiving the turkey leg. "Obviously the joke is not getting a turkey leg last year. So to be able to come in here, get the win and get the turkey leg after – it was very delicious and it is something to celebrate."

Not only was Love looking for the turkey, but his teammates were seemingly playing for him to win it as well. Tight end Tucker Kraft, who finished the game with 78 yards on six recep-

tions, said it was nice to see Love receive what he deserved after missing out on it last season.

"That was the one thing that was the most important to me was making sure that Jordan got his leg," said Kraft.

Jayden Reed was the recipient of both of Love's touchdown passes, as he finished the game with 24 yards on three receptions. Christian Watson registered 67 yards on two receptions, while Dontayvion Wicks recorded 30 yards on four receptions.

As for the run game, Josh Jacobs continued his stellar first season in Green Bay, as the former Las Vegas Raider to-

taled 43 rushing yards and one touchdown. Chris Brooks ran for 28 yards, while Emanuel Wilson added 20 yards on the ground to help round out Green Bay's three-headed rushing attack.

"We have so many weapons on this team," said Jacobs. "We are so deep at every position, and on any given play, it can be something special if we all can do the right thing. It has been fun; it has been fun playing for a team like that."

On top of Green Bay's strong offensive performance, the defense registered yet another solid showing. With Miami's explosive offense looking strong and healthy over the past few weeks, Green Bay held its opponent to just 17 points. This comes after the Dolphins scored 34 points in each of the last two games.

Forced to pass for the majority of the game, Dolphins quarterback Tua Tagovailoa completed 37-of-46 passes for 365 yards and two touchdowns. Defenders Quay Walker, King-sley Enagbare, Lukas Van Ness, Brenton Cox Jr. and Kenny Clark each recorded a sack.

KEYS TO THE GAME

Win needed to break Lions' lock on division

The calendar has turned to December, and the Green Bay Packers are coming off a strong month of November.

After starting with a loss to the Detroit Lions, the Packers won their next two games against Chicago and San Francisco.

They finished off with a win over the Miami Dolphins, leading them into what is a massive game at Ford Field against Detroit.

The last time these two teams met, the Lions won in dominant fashion.

Jordan Love threw an

interception to Kerby Joseph, which was returned to a touchdown just before halftime.

The Lions led by as many as 21 points, and the Packers were largely not competitive.

There has been no hangover from last year's loss in the NFC Championship Game. The Lions look like the most dominant team in the NFL.

They're 11-1 and have not lost since September.

The Packers are going to need to play their best game to knock them off, and have any chance at winning the NFC North.

Here are the keys to doing just that.

Packers' run defense vs. Lions' backfield

Jahmyr Gibbs and David Montgomery form one of the best thunder and lightning backfield combinations in all of football.

Gibbs is the lightning version of that and certainly lives up to the phrasing of lightning in a bottle.

Montgomery is the workhorse. His numbers may not be gaudy, but he's been a perfect fit for Detroit's physical offensive identity.

Those two, however, have been given a different nickname for their backfield. Gibbs is referred to as Sonic, while Montgomery goes by Knuckles.

It makes sense, given their identity running through these two men.

The first time these two teams faced off, Montgomery and Gibbs each scored a touchdown. Gibbs looked like he was moving at a different speed than most of

the players on the field. He is as dynamic as it gets out of the backfield.

Green Bay's run defense has been up and down for most of the year.

They did, however, slow down Christian McCaffery and a powerful 49er run game that has typically tormented them in year's past.

Whether that was a by-product of Brandon Allen starting or not is up to you to decide, but that has not mattered in years past.

Detroit is able to stay balanced. Jared Goff is efficient and able to make plays with his arm. He's not simply a game manager for this Lions offense. They do, however, run everything through their run game.

The Packers need to slow that down.

Turnovers

One of the biggest reasons Green Bay was blown out by the Lions in early November was that they

were sloppy.

That included six drops, but most importantly, a big turnover from Love.

Love has taken better care of the ball coming out of the bye week.

He did not throw an interception against Chicago, San Francisco or Miami. The Packers, perhaps not coincidentally, won all three games.

Love's interception by Joseph was returned for a touchdown and gave the Lions a commanding lead at halftime.

With the conditions, and overall health of Love's knee at the time, the Packers were all but buried at that point.

The Lions did recently overcome a game where Goff threw five interceptions. That's proof of how good the Lions are but also proof that there is a crack in that armor.

You can take the ball away from Goff and this

Lions' offense.

Green Bay has not taken the ball away as often since the calendar turned to November.

They'll need to make sure that they take care of the ball on offense, while being opportunistic on the other side of the ball.

Packers vs Lions' second half defense

Aaron Glenn and the Detroit defensive staff have done an excellent job at making adjustments at halftime to slow down their opponents.

Green Bay's offense scored 21 points against San Francisco in their first game after the bye.

They have their moments where they are incredibly effective.

They also do a good job of getting in their own way at times.

Limiting mistakes is crucial, as every point matters in these big games against divisional opponents.

Linebacker Quay Walker (7) posted two tackles for a loss for the second straight game, the first time in his career that he has posted multiple tackles for a loss in back-to-back games. Coach Matt LaFleur said Walker has been playing his best ball the last two games. “Collectively, our linebackers are playing pretty well right now, and you saw not only in the run game with Quay, but we’re bringing him on blitzes, and he’s extremely effective at setting some picks and then getting some pressure on the quarterback himself,” LaFleur said. “He’s a really talented football player and I think his best ball is in front of him.”

In 2023, Love asked Fox Sports' Erin Andrews about his turkey leg after the Packers defeated the Detroit Lions 29-22. Traditionally, the player or players of the game get a turkey leg or a hunk of turducken after winning an NFL game played on Thanksgiving. John Madden started it in 1989 when he gave the first turkey leg to defensive end Reggie White after the Philadelphia Eagles beat the Dallas Cowboys. In 1997, Madden added turducken (a chicken stuffed into a deboned duck stuffed into a deboned turkey) to the tradition. When Love asked about the turkey, he was told there was no turkey to eat because the only turkey had been torn apart earlier by announcer Greg Olsen. That was not the case. Fox is always prepared for two turkeys on Thanksgiving - one in the booth and one postgame on the field. As it turns out, the turkey they saved for after the game had a Lions logo seared into the turkey as Fox expected Detroit to win, so Fox just dumped the tradition.
