Packers win streak snapped at 4 as Lions dominate NFC North showdown

Through the rain, the Green Bay Packers out-gained the Detroit Lions in yardage, 411-261, but dropped the NFC North matchup on Nov. 3 at Lambeau Field.

Packers quarterback Jordan Love, who was dealing with a groin injury from the week prior, was able to start the game. He finished the matchup completing 23-of-39 passes for 273 yards and no touchdowns.

Running Back Josh Jacobs registered an efficient day on the ground, running for 95 yards on 13 carries. To add to the run game, Emanuel Wilson chipped in 28 yards on four carries, including a late 2-yard touchdown.

Jayden Reed led all Green Bay pass catchers with 113 yards on five catches. Christian Watson, Tucker Kraft and Romeo Doubs added another 37 yards, 34 yards and 28 yards, respectively.

On the Lions' side, quarterback Jared Goff continued his blazing hot start to the season completing 18-of-22 passes for 145 yards and one touchdown. The Lions continued to ride its two-headed rushing attack in this game as well, as David Montgomery finished the game with 73 yards on 17 carries and Jahmyr Gibbs finished with 65 yards on 11 carries, adding a touchdown.

As for the receiving game, Amon-Ra St. Brown registered 56 yards and a touchdown on seven receptions. Tight end Sam LaPorta added another 28 yards on two receptions.

In total, Green Bay almost doubled Detroit's total yardage, but mental mistakes and penalties doomed the home team. The biggest of those instances came in the middle of the second quarter, when Detroit defensive back Brian Branch was penalized 15 yards and subsequently ejected for a hit to the head of Packers receiver Bo Melton. After being ejected, Branch shouted at the refs and gestured inappropriately to the home crowd, which was followed up by another 15-yard unsportsmanlike conduct penalty.

Taking over at the Lions

32-yard line, Green Bay was charged with a false start penalty and after three plays found itself with a fourth-and-six. Kicker Brandon McManus missed the 46-yard attempt, meaning Green Bay came away with nothing on the prime opportunity.

The biggest blunder of the game for Green Bay came as when it was down 10-3 late in the second quarter, Love dropped back, and after no one was able to get open, he tried to dump it off to Jacobs on a checkdown. Lions defensive back Kirby Joseph jumped the pass, intercepted the ball and returned it 27-yards for a touchdown.

"On the interception, I was moving out of the pocket, obviously (Jacobs) was blocking with protection, I saw him get out and I was trying to dump it down to him on a checkdown," said Love. "The ball did not go where I wanted it to, and they made a good play on it."

The interception from Love marks his 10th on the season. He had 11 all of last season.

For Joseph, it marks his sixth interception of the season, which ties Packers defensive back Xavier McKinney for the most in the NFL this season.

"Every pick is going to be a little bit different," said Packers head coach Matt LaFleur, on what the difference has been for Love between the end of last year and the start of this year. "I feel like we can get better, we can learn from it and I think that we will be better moving forward."

Penalties were also a major hindrance for Green Bay in this game, as the Packers were called for 10 infractions, which resulted in 67 yards for the Lions. One of those penalties came early in the game, as the Lions were faced with a fourth-and-goal from the Packers 5-yard line. Goff caught Green Bay with a hard count and Packers defensive lineman T.J. Slaton was called with an encroachment penalty. St. Brown scored on the very next play.

"I was disappointed with the number of penalties and just self-inflicted wounds that we had," said LaFleur.

The Packers now have the sixth most penalties in the NFL called against the team, which has resulted in 480 yards for opposing teams.

Overall with the division lead on the line, Green Bay's loss pushes the Packers to a 6-3 record, as the team looks to regroup next week during its bye.

Coming out of the bye, Green Bay will look to get back on track against its old rival, the Chicago Bears.

Rehab, refresh and regroup during bye week

Packers enter Week 10 as one of the top teams in the NFC

Through nine weeks in the NFL season, the Green Bay Packers have shown they are one of the better teams in the NFC with a 6-3 record.

Even though Green Bay has come away with six wins, it feels like this team is capable of so much more. The team needs to wait though for two weeks, as the Packers' Week 10 bye may be arriving at the perfect time.

After getting beat up at home by the Detroit Lions, there seems to be some cracks in the armor for Green Bay. Coming into the game against the Lions, the Packers had a laundry list of injuries throughout practice — most notably, quarterback Jordan Love, who has missed time this season with both knee and groin injuries.

On top of Love being injured, defensive backs Evan Williams and Jaire Alexander have been banged up, as well as line-backer Quay Walker and offensive lineman Elgton Jenkins. With the bye week here, it makes sense that the Packers should have more time to refresh before entering a gauntlet of a schedule with Chicago, San Francisco, Miami and Detroit coming in the four weeks after.

"The attitude is just come back and get into the film room," said Love, on the attitude of the team heading into the bye week. "(It's) the same mindset as every week — look at the tape, figure out what we did good and figure out what we did bad. We have a lot of football ahead of us when we come back from the bye week, so just hit the ground running when we get back."

Even though the loss to the Lions exposed some weaknesses for Green Bay, the previous eight weeks, for better or worse, have shown that the Packers are one of the better teams in not only the NFC, but the NFL as a whole.

Four of Green Bay's six wins have come against all four teams in the AFC South and two against the Los Angeles Rams and the Arizona Cardinals. While on the field, fans and spectators of the game are seeing Love play the way that he did last season. There

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is a lot of good (15 touch-down passes) and some bad (10 interceptions). As we saw last season, if Love can control that and not make those major mistakes, Green Bay has a chance to make another deep run to the playoffs.

What is encouraging is how well the Packers' defense has been playing this season.

Through nine games, Green Bay has given up 194 points, giving up 30 or more points just twice this season. On top of that, the defense has also forced 19 turnovers, which ranks first in the entire NFL.

Add into the equation that new kicker Brandon McManus has brought about great results, compared to his two predecessors, and it becomes clear that Green Bay certainly has the pieces to contend.

The big question remains, however: When will it all come together?

The game against the Arizona Cardinals was probably the closest the Packers have come to this, but fans of the Packers are still waiting to see a three-phased complete game against one of the top teams in the NFL.

Once again, that all starts with Love taking care of the football. Even though Green Bay leads the NFL with 19 forced turnovers, the team has turned the ball over 13 times, with 10 coming from interceptions thrown by Love.

If Love is able to recapture that magic that was seen to end the season in 2023-24, there may be just a handful of teams that can beat the Packers.

With Josh Jacobs continuing to play well in the run game, having a reliable dual threat offense should compliment a really good defense well.

"It just comes back to



focusing on the things that we aren't doing well and as we go through the week of practice, just cleaning up those details and if we do have mistakes, just not letting those things slide," said Love. "Just staying true to the details

and the fundamentals and just staying focused about the things we need to clean up. I know that we are a really good football team, and like I said, it is just too many mistakes that are self-inflicted that we haven't been able to

overcome." The Packers now have a chance to regroup with the bye week to, as Love said, watch film and figure out the good and the bad to be able to carry the weight in the second half of the season.

PACKERS BYE WEEK

Packers 0-2 against divisional opponents

Two of Green Bay's three losses this year have come against NFC North opponents, not what you want to see in a team competing for a divisional title. In addition to the 24-14 loss at the hands of the division-leading Detroit Lions on Sunday, the Packers lost 31-29 to the Minnesota Vikings at the end of September.

"It's disappointing when you have a big game like this against one of the best teams in the league," Packers coach Matt LaFleur said. "There was just too many mistakes (and) you can't overcome those against a good football team. And that's exactly what Detroit is,"

Detroit has only lost to Tampa Bay. With Sunday's win over the Packers, they are 2-0 in the NFC North. The Lions defeated Minnesota in Week 7.

"We knew it was going to be critical to get two wins in this division against two really good teams - Minnesota and then this one, Green Bay, at their place. So to be able to do that was big," Detroit head coach Dan Campbell said. "We had a number of guys step up, I thought, defensively. When we needed it most, it really showed up. We limited points. We held them in the red zone; we got off the field on third down. Just a lot of guys making critical plays."

Campbell singled out several players for their performances against Green Bay.

"Kerby's (Joseph) pick six was huge. It was a massive play right before halftime," Campbell said. "Offensively, our offensive line did an outstanding job. We were able to run it. We were pretty efficient. David Montgomery and Gibby

(Jahmyr Gibbs) got it going. I thought (Amon-Ra) St. Brown had a big game for us in the pass game. (Jared) Goff played clean football, man. He got us in the right play. He was very efficient. I just have a lot of trust in him, in what he is doing and how he is playing.

"We flipped the field. Jack Fox flipped the field. We knew that was going to be a big thing for us, just

field position. So a number of guys played well. It is a great win and that gets us to seven."

LaFleur said the Lions played a clean game and didn't put the ball in jeopardy.

"That's a good offensive line, and I think defensively, they do some things that gives a little bit of problems, and I thought they did a good job just keeping

us a little off balance," he said. "I was probably anticipating a little bit more man coverage, and they were just jumping in and out of it. So, they did a good job of keeping us a little bit off balance, I would say, offensively."

Coming out of the bye, the Packers will play the final team in their division, the Chicago Bears (4-4), which will close out the first round of divisional games.

If the Packers intend to truly compete for that divisional title, they will need to play better in the second half of the season.

The second round of divisional games includes the Packers vs. Lions in Detroit on Dec. 5 (a Thursday night game). The final two games of the regular season will be against the Vikings on Dec. 29 in Minnesota and Week 18 at home against the Bears, with the exact time and date yet to be announced.

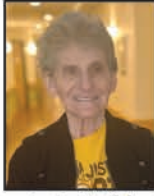

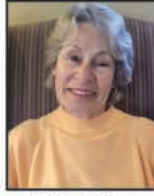

We had a lot of speakers, and we also had a military appreciation game. It always brought a lot of awareness.

And also, I was just super interested in it. When I was going into college, some of my biggest offers were from the service academies. It was a route that I almost ended up going before I committed to Iowa. So, from a young age, I've always had a massive appreciation and interest in the military. And then as I kind of grow my platform and have the ability to get here in the NFL, I've wanted to continue that.

Army, Navy, Air Force, what would you have chosen?

I was looking at the Navy just because there was a guy a couple years older than me named Jackson Perkins, who had a pipeline to the naval academy. So, I was kind of leaning that route, but, obviously, happy that I ended up going to Iowa. But I always thought it would be a super cool thing if that didn't work out.
