Season's 1st major snowstorm brings power outages, flooding

Water woes exacerbated by snow and wind

OCONTO — Thousands of customers lost electricity Sunday – and some were still waiting Monday morning – as the first major snowstorm of the season brought 6-8 inches or more of wet, heavy snow to Oconto County.

The Oconto Electric Cooperative's Brookside substation failed after a tree fell on the lines, knock-

ing out power for much of Sunday afternoon. Areas listed as having hundreds of Wisconsin Public Service customers experiencing outages included Suring, Abrams, Sobieski, Oconto and Lakewood.

About 170 customers scattered across the county still had no power Monday morning.

The strong northeasterly winds added to the high-water worries that plagued the Oconto County bay shore throughout the Thanksgiving weekend.

The city of Oconto declared a snow emergency and closed Harbor Road, the Splinter Causeway at Breakwater Park and Bay Shore Road to traffic as the waters of Green Bay spilled across the roadways.

The road to the causeway had been flooded out Nov. 27, and high water also closed County Road Y north of Harbor Road for much of the day. The area was hit even harder Sunday afternoon, and city officials encouraged residents living by the bay shore to consider evacuation until the storm subsided.

The Oconto Utility Wastewater Treatment Plant was over capacity because of the unprecedented water levels, and the city asked residents to minimize the use of water as much as possible, including toilet flushing, for most of Sunday. The notice included the towns of Oconto, Pensaukee and Little River.

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County supervisor charged in road-rage incident

Parmentier allegedly pointed gun at man

OCONTO — An Oconto County Board supervisor has been charged with allegedly pointing a gun at a man during a road-rage incident.

During his initial appearance in Oconto County Circuit Court on Nov. 25, David W. Parmentier, 68, Suring, was released on a \$10,000 signature bond on a felony charge of second-degree reckless endangerment in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred June 27.

According to the criminal complaint, Parmentier yelled and gestured at a driver who passed him and a slow-moving tractor, and the other man stopped and jumped out of his truck, yelling as he approached.

During the ensuing argument, Parmentier allegedly took his pistol and removed it from its holster, the side mirror of his sport-utility vehicle

was broken off, and he said the other man tried to punch him in the face but missed.

Both Parmentier and the other man, Gregory J. Kurtz, 55, of Pound, were originally given citations for disorderly conduct. Kurtz did not contest the ticket and was fined \$389.50, while Parmentier pleaded not guilty.

Parmentier was later charged with misdemeanor counts of disorderly conduct and resisting or obstructing an officer, and the felony charge was added last week.

According to the criminal complaint, Kurtz filed an amended statement Nov. 11 that Parmentier pointed the gun at him at least once during the confrontation.

The case is being heard by Brown County Circuit Court Judge Beau Liegeois because both Oconto County judges recused themselves, since Parmentier sits on the county board's law enforcement and judiciary committee. A preliminary hearing was scheduled for Jan. 17.

St. Clare's joins partnership for child dental care

Oral Health Partnership serves underinsured and uninsured children

OCONTO FALLS — Children with complex dental needs and who are uninsured or underinsured will have greater access to care, thanks to a new collaboration between HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital in Oconto Falls and the Brown County-based Oral Health Partnership.

Oral Health Partnership, a non-profit founded in Green Bay in 2005, provides underserved children living in Brown County and surrounding counties access to preventive, restorative and emergency dental services at no cost. It offers a school-based dental care program and three clinics, and it partners with the three Green Bay hospitals to provide treatment for complex dental conditions that require an operating room.

Since Oct. 17, those services are now also being provided, one day a week, at HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital.

"Oral health is a huge challenge in Wisconsin, and it's really a nationwide challenge," said Chris Brabant, St. Clare president and CEO. "We have had a significant number of our patients who, when they need oral treatment, have to go down to St. Mary's Medical Center in Green Bay to have that surgery. Now some of those oral surgeons are coming right here to the community to operate on those patients."

About 11% of the children who have had oral surgery at St. Mary's are from Oconto and surrounding counties, Brabant said.

"Our partnership with OHP means that children who live in our rural, northern communities and in need of this type of care can now access it closer to home," he said.

This year, the partnership is on track to serve more than 10,000 children and accommodate more than 20,000 dental appointments, said Michael Schwartz, executive director at Oral Health Partnership.

"The addition of HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital to our partnership allows us to treat more children in need of hospital-based care," Schwartz said. "We are immensely grateful for their partnership, as well as the continued partnership of HSHS St. Vincent and St. Mary's."

In early 2018, the wait list for those in need of hospital-based dental care was at more than 250 children. The recent addition of HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital as an OHP partner has helped to reduce the current waiting list to approximately 50 children, Schwartz said.

As an OHP partner, HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital provides operating room space and the assistance of its surgical staff to physicians at no cost to the partnership or the patient. The nonprofit hospital also obtained a grant from Delta Dental of Wisconsin to purchase the surgical instruments for OHP physicians to perform the necessary procedures. Procedures may include the treatment of multiple cavities in young children, abscessed teeth and/or tooth extraction.

"In some cases, these complex dental conditions can be life-threatening, and that is why increasing access to this type of care is so important," Schwartz said.

HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital also provides the services of Child Life Specialists for each child who comes to the hospital to have a dental procedure. Child Life Specialists are specially trained in helping put children who may be anxious about their procedure at ease.

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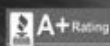

FSA can help farmers who lost commodities to storms

Program only available in certain counties

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) for Oconto and Marinette counties announced payments are now available to eligible producers who lost stored commodities due to natural disaster in 2018 or 2019.

The On-Farm Storage Loss Program (OFSLP) was authorized by the Additional Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Act of 2019.

Administered by FSA, OFSLP provides payments to eligible producers in impacted counties who suffered uncompensated losses of harvested commodities including grains, oilseeds, and hay stored in on-farm structures. For producers to receive payment, the losses must be directly related to an eligible disaster event such as snowstorms, floods, tornadoes, hurricanes and wildfires that occurred during 2018 and/or 2019.

"There are producers throughout the country who had their on-farm storage structures damaged or de-

stroyed by natural disasters during 2018 and 2019," said Oconto-Marinette County FSA Executive Director Nancy Swenty. "This disaster recovery program pays eligible producers who lost their on-farm stored commodities. We encourage producers who suffered a loss to contact our office for program information and application."

To be eligible for OFSLP, the farm storage structure must be located on the farm, not used for commercial storage, and would have, under normal circumstances, maintained the quality of the commodity. Commodities stored in warehouses are not eligible for OFSLP.

Programs payments are made for the loss of the stored commodity and not for the loss of the structure itself. Additionally, this program is only available in certain counties, including Oconto and Marinette counties.

Commodities eligible for OFSLP include: barley, canola, chickpeas (large and small), corn, cotton, crambe, dry peas, flaxseed, grain sorghum, hay (alfalfa and all-hay), lentils, mustard seed, oats, peanuts, rapeseed, rice, safflower seed, sesame seed, soybeans, sunflower seed and wheat.

FSA uses a national payment

rate per commodity, which is based on market or harvest prices. Payments will be calculated using a 75 percent factored FSA payment rate multiplied by the quantity lost while stored.

OFSLP has a payment limitation of \$125,000 per entity. Adjusted

Gross Income does not apply to OFSLP, and an acreage report is not required for this program.

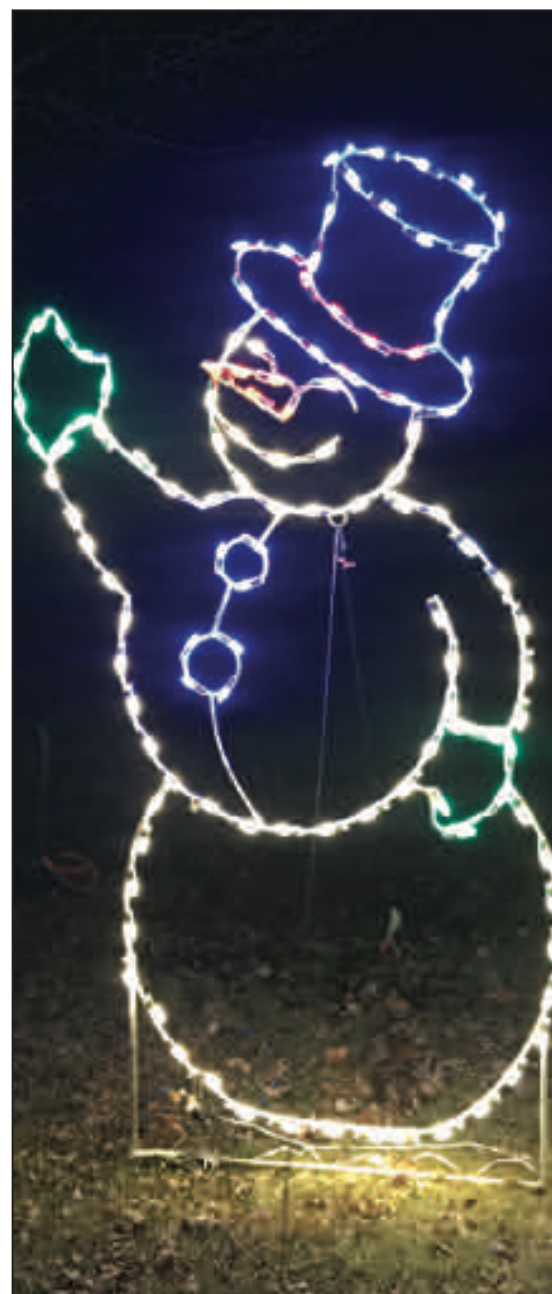

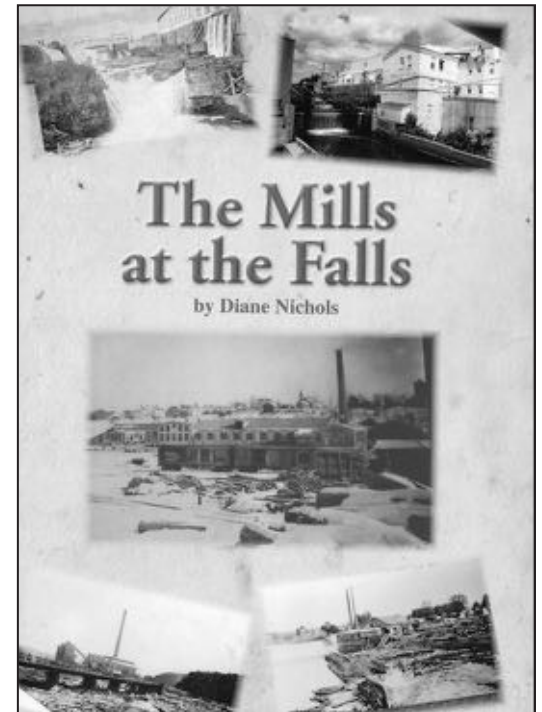

Wet fall should help conifers in winter

As we move into December, the beautiful conifers of winter take center stage in the landscape as most of our trees and landscape shrubs, with the exception of oaks and beeches, now stand bare of their leaves.

Conifers provide beauty, texture and interest all through the winter season, especially elegant when blanketed in tufts of fresh, white snow.

Conifers need plenty of moisture going into the winter season. Thankfully, we had a wetter than normal fall season, which should, in most cases, provide these trees with sufficient moisture to get them through the coming winter.

If you live in an area that was drier, or have

sandier soil, it is important to give them a good soaking before the ground freezes. In many cases, that has not happened yet, or the ground froze temporarily and then thawed back out with our warm spell over the past few weeks.

Conifers are an excellent choice for the landscape, garden and yard. They are certainly much more than

“evergreens.” There are now conifer variet-

ies available in shades of blue, yellow, even those with reddish and purplish tips. There are conifers available in many different shapes, sizes and forms. Of course, the beautiful texture they provide is extravagant.

There are native conifers such as arborvitae, tamarack, juniper, some spruce varieties, some pines, fir and hemlock. There are garden hybrids created of many of these varieties, as well. In addition, there are non-native Asian and European conifers that are popular on the market.

Surprising to many, blue spruce is not native here in Wisconsin. Colorado blue spruce is native to states west of us. However, it grows

quite well here in our climate and is one of the favorites of many landscapers, gardeners and designers. Many fantastic hybrids have been created from this tree. Dwarf versions, weeping versions, columnar forms and many others are now available.

The northern white-cedar, or arborvitae, is another favorite of many gardeners. Another native tree that has been hybridized into a variety of shapes, sizes and forms, the texture, fullness, color and importance to wildlife make this an attractive tree.

Often, white cedar is used as a privacy hedge or living screen, as the fast-growing trees fill in quickly to form a dense growth of foliage.

Hemlock, yews, as well as junipers are also popular landscaping plants. The junipers, including our native red cedar, are extremely useful in the landscape as they adapt to a variety of conditions, from wet to dry. There are junipers that grow columnar, junipers that creep, or spread,

junipers in beautiful, powdery blue, yellow, gold, as well as many shades of green. In addition, the fruits and berries are attractive to birds and

other wildlife.

Of course, when people think of the holiday season, evergreen boughs for decor, as well as Christmas trees, are extremely popular. The fragrant boughs of fir, spruce, cedar and pine make them wonderful for use in containers, garland, tabletop displays and more.

Never harvest evergreen boughs or trees from the wild, unless it is on your own property. It is not legal to harvest greens from state, county or federal land.

Enjoy the beauty and grace of the winter conifers this season and prepare to plant more in coming years to provide food and shelter for wildlife, as well as beauty in the garden and yard during all four seasons.
