Founder of Heins Appliance remembered by family, friends

Al Heins passes away at 83 after lifetime of community service

SHAWANO — Al Heins is probably best known in the community for the local business that he started 43 years ago and still bears his name.

There were many other facets to the man the community might not know.

Alan A. Heins passed away Wednesday at the age of 83.

"There were many different pieces of his life," said his son, Craig, who runs Heins Appliance today with his brother, Brian.

Al Heins drove an ambulance for the Shawano Ambulance Service and was deputized by the Shawano County Sheriff's Department.

"He rode shotgun on the week-ends and went to many accident scenes and that sort of stuff over the years," Craig said. "He rode along a lot with the game wardens, back in the day when it wasn't as structured as it is today."

He also served as an assistant county coroner and was a volunteer firefighter with the Shawano Area Fire Department.

"He was a value to the fire department," Fire Chief Shawn Borlace said. "He served very well. He served for a long time."

In later years, Heins continued to serve on the department's retirement board.

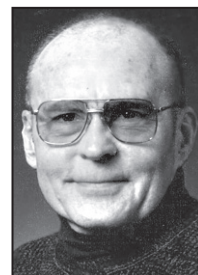
"As a son, I'm kind of proud of that stuff because a lot of times the community at large doesn't know some of those things about him," Craig said.

In later years, after passing the business onto his sons in 1999, Heins was a school bus driver and served on the Shawano School Board, while continuing to work at the business.

"He would drive the bus route in the morning, come to work midday and then he'd drive the afternoon route," Craig said.

Heins developed a bond with many of the students who rode his bus.

"Kids would come in later that had

so proud of that."

Diane Hoffman served with Heins on the Shawano School Board for several years.

"I always appreciated his outlook on what we would be doing for the kids," she said. "He would still come to meetings and give input even after his time off the board. He's going to be missed."

Heins enjoyed the rapport he had with families and with kids, Hoffman said.

"He had a caring nature," she said. "He was always willing to help people out."

As a board member, Heins continued to educate himself on issues coming before the board.

"He and I had gone to different workshops together so we could better understand what new things were coming down for education," Hoffman said. "He always wanted to stay abreast of what was new and may help students in the long run."

Heins was working for Knope Heating and Cooling in 1977 when he decided it was time to strike out on his own.

"He felt like he could handle it," Craig said. "He was restless where he was."

Heins Appliance had modest beginnings and was a traditional mom-

graduated, and they would look him up and give him a hug," Craig said.

"A number of those kids asked for Al to give them their diploma," he said. "He was always

and-pop business, Craig said.

"Dad fixed things, and Mom did the books and took care of the office," he said.

It wasn't surprising that family would be a part of the business.

"Family was a real big thing to him," Craig said.

Heins' wife, Barbara, said he was a good family man who was always there for everyone, to the point of texting his children and grandchildren to see how everyone was doing.

"Our whole family is a close-knit family," Barbara said. "We love each other and enjoy being together. He will be greatly missed."

He managed to balance his devotion to the family with a commitment to the community.

"He felt that you had to give time to your community, to give back," Barbara said. "He felt, if nobody did it, who would do it?"

Heins' community involvements included the Shawano Fish and Game Club, Shawano Gun Club, life member of the National Rifle Association, life member of Shawano VFW Post 2723 and a member of the Shawano Masonic Lodge 170 F & A.M.

He was also a lifetime member of Navarino Nature Center.

"He was on the board of directors when I got here," Director Tim Ewing said.

That was in 2000, and Heins continued to serve on the board until about 2015.

"He still remained active on a couple of different committees," Ewing said. "He was on the investment committee, involved with the endowment fund and raising funds to keep us going."

Heins and his family always attended the center's annual banquets, Ewing recalled.

"He always had a positive attitude on getting stuff done," he said. "Al was a great guy. Anybody that knows him knows he was great guy. He will be truly missed."

Delabreau elected to lead Menominee legislature

New chairwoman vows to face challenges in 2020

KESHENA — Joan Delabreau is the new leader of the Menominee Tribal Legislature after it voted 6-3 Sunday to elect her chairwoman over Legislator Ron Corn Sr. during the tribe's annual reorganizational meeting.

Delabreau, who was the legislature's vice chairwoman for the last two years, will become its leader for the fourth time.

Douglas Cox, who served as the legislature's chairman for the last two years, will serve as vice chairman after a unanimous vote. Legislator Pershing Frechette will serve another term as secretary, also by unanimous vote.

Legislators must be nominated to leadership positions.

Frechette, who nominated Delabreau, said that he doesn't always see eye to eye with her on some issues, but he believed her years of experience made her the best on the legislature to lead.

"In my eyes, this individual is the most prepared when we have complicated issues to debate," Frechette said. "We don't always agree, and we have had some heated debates in the horseshoe (the tribal legislature dais). But in the end, we've always respected each other's positions."

Frechette said the coming year was going to present some challenges for the legislature, and Delabreau would provide "proven leadership" to help guide the governing body in the coming months.

Delabreau will receive a \$90,000 salary but will not receive any per diems for attending meetings like

the other legislators.

Delabreau echoed the concerns about coming challenges in her acceptance speech.

"It's going to be a very challenging year as we work with our different entities and with the outside greater society as we try to accomplish all the things that we need for our tribe," Delabreau said.

One of the big challenges Delabreau sees is working with the tribe's charter entities and making sure they function. While the legislature is working to keep existing Menominee businesses functioning, it is also trying to bring in additional businesses to allow tribal members to do more business on the reservation so they don't have to go off-reservation for basic essentials, as well as allow them to work closer to home.

"There's no downturn in the greater society, but up in our society, there's something of a change," Delabreau said. "As legislators, we created the charters with the exception of MTE (Menominee Tribal Enterprises). We still need to work together to ensure a strong foundation for them because they do provide a lot of employment."

Delabreau said she expects the legislature to put in a lot of work on combating opioids on the reservation.

"We struggle, just like any other community," Delabreau said. "We focused on prevention, and we're getting some efforts to show that's paying off. On the flip side, though, we're concerned about drug-endan-

gered children because that's going to affect those children for the rest of their lives."

Despite serving as chairwoman on three other occasions, Delabreau said she was surprised to be asked to serve again.

"Whether they voted for me or not, it's always a difficult choice," she said.

Delabreau noted that the downside of being chairwoman is that her family members will not see as much of her as they'd like.

"They're going to have to understand that, as usual after 15 years, they will continue to come in last

as far as my dedication and commitment to serve the Menominee people and to serve the needs and the desires and the demands of the Menominee Tribal Legislature," Delabreau said.

The reorganizational meeting also included the oath of office for the legislature's two newest members, Gena Kakkak and Ron Waukau Sr., who were elected in January to replace Craig Corn and Eugene Caldwell, as well as Ron Corn Sr., who was elected to a second term in office.

Stuck stumps for Congress with Stockbridge-Munsee

Candidate holds listening session to learn issues

BOWLER — Amanda Stuck first got interested in politics at age 10 when she was taken to a speech being given by then-presidential candidate Bill Clinton.

Since then, she's wanted to "be Bill Clinton," she said.

Currently serving in the Wisconsin Assembly representing Appleton and Menasha, Stuck is now seeking to unseat two-term U.S. Rep. Mike Gallagher in November and become the District 8 representative in Congress for Wisconsin.

Stuck journeyed Saturday to the Stockbridge-Munsee Reservation and met with about a dozen tribal members for a listening session as she tried to gather some information about what constituents want done in Washington. She said she decided to run for Congress after receiving a letter from a man concerned about what would happen if the pre-existing conditions requirement of the Affordable Care Act went away.

Stuck noted that the letter was also sent to Gallagher and to state Rep. Tom Nelson. She said that she learned from the man that the only one who didn't reply to the letter was Gallagher.

"That was the day that I decided I was going to run for the seat," Stuck said.

Molly Miller told Stuck how sick she is of all the partisan politics in Washington. She asked if Stuck believes there's any hope of taking the federal government away from that mindset.

Stuck, in her time with the Assembly, helped to create the Future Caucus, a bipartisan group seeking to find solutions to compromise and avoid the party politics that seem to shape state and federal governing

bodies. She vowed to bring the same attitude to Congress, if elected.

"It's the Future Caucus that has given me more hope than anything," Stuck said. "When I go these national gatherings with millennial legislators from across the country, I honestly don't know sometimes if I'm talking to a Democrat or a Republican. I just know I'm having a really good conversation about energy policy or any other topic you can think of."

Denise Palmer, an enrolled Stockbridge-Munsee tribal member, said a lot of the struggles that Wisconsin Native American tribes face are similar and sought answers from Stuck on how the federal government can address them.

"For the most part, people in our communities really struggle," Palmer said. "We have the highest unemployment rates, the highest poverty rates and, I'm very sad to say, we're dying at very young ages."

She noted that there are plenty of people interested in protecting Social Security and Medicare, but she's concerned that little is being done to protect Medicaid, which she said is vital to helping Indian Health Services programs.

Stuck said she's heard similar concerns from the Menominee,

Oneida and other tribes.

"It's not that we don't know what to do," Stuck said. "We have a system. We just need to fund it better."

Roy Martin, a disabled veteran, told Stuck about how he's dealing with terminal cancer, and because he was no longer able to work, he had to go onto the federal health care system. Martin said, as a result, he was taken off the medication he'd been taking because the system would not pay for them.

"That just made me even more sick, and I had seven different specialists watching me laying in my bed, waiting to die," Martin said, noting he couldn't get help from the veterans administration because his cancer was not service-related. "The government program, the tribe and the VA won't work together to spend money on one person. They won't work together. It's quite ridiculous, actually."

Martin told Stuck that he took his health care into his own hands and got involved with cannabis therapy in Michigan. He said he's raising a young son on his own at age 42, and he wasn't ready to die.

"I'm back to work full-time and 100% off of their pharmaceutical poison," Martin said. "Those seven specialists who were watching me

die and saying there was nothing they could do because I lived in Wisconsin is ridiculous."

Stuck said she would support legalizing marijuana if elected to Congress.

"Your story is an example of how we say we honor veterans, but we don't," Stuck said. "Our government should be ashamed of itself."

Lori Miller, a fourth-grade teacher, told Stuck about how Native American history is pushed to the side at both the federal and state level, despite state Act 31 requiring that schools teach the subject to their students. She noted that teaching the history has been proven to close the achievement gap between Native American students and non-native students.

Miller agreed that more needed to be done to strengthen the education system, and teaching tribal history and culture was important for all students in order to promote better cultural understanding. She decried the education she received from the public schools in Appleton.

"I learned the history that I learned was not the truth," Stuck said. "We need to do a lot better to make sure we're teaching the right things."

Krueger gets year in jail on misdemeanor count

2017 crash killed Appleton woman, injured two children

SHAWANO — A Shawano man acquitted last month of reckless homicide in the death of a 41-year-old Appleton woman but convicted of recklessly causing injury to one of her children was sentenced Friday to a year in jail.

Brian J. Krueger, 33, was accused of recklessly causing the death of Naomi Gregurich in a two-vehicle crash on state Highway 29 near the intersection of Rangeline Road in the town of Herman on June 29, 2017.

He was also charged with a felony count of reckless injury for injuries sustained by one of Gregurich's two sons, both of whom were passengers in her vehicle.

A third felony count was amended to a misdemeanor charge of reckless driving-causing bodily harm for injuries to the other child.

After a four-day jury trial and nearly eight hours of deliberations,

the jury acquitted Krueger of the two felonies but found him guilty of the misdemeanor.

Judge James Habeck sentenced Krueger on Friday to 360 days in jail. The maximum sentence for that class of misdemeanor is one year.

Krueger will get work release privileges and be eligible for time off his sentence for good behavior.

He is due to report to jail March 6. Krueger will also have to pay \$631 in fines and court costs and pay \$200 for a DNA sample.

Krueger was the driver of a 2013 Ford Focus that was traveling east on Highway 29, when he lost control of the vehicle, crossed the median and struck a westbound 2008 Saturn being driven by Gregurich.

Krueger has epilepsy and suffered a seizure while driving.

The state argued at the trial that after several recent seizures — including one just the night before the accident — Krueger would have been aware he should not be driving.

Krueger had also been involved in two previous minor accidents also caused by epileptic seizures while driving. He'd had his driver's license

temporarily suspended after these incidents.

The jury heard testimony from medical experts, members of law enforcement who responded to the fatal crash and the two previous minor crashes, witnesses to the crashes and witnesses to Krueger's epileptic episodes.

The crux of the case, however, came down to the recent seizures the state cited and whether they could be classified as actual seizures or

less severe epileptic episodes that wouldn't have required Krueger to temporarily give up his driving privileges.

The law requires that anyone with a license who experiences an epileptic episode that results in altered consciousness or loss of bodily control must report the incident and be suspended from driving for 90 days for medical review.

Police chief special election scrapped

Menominee to move election to when legislators run for office

KESHENA — Plans to hold a special election to elect a new police chief were scrapped Thursday by the Menominee Tribal Legislature when it received the news that it would cost more money than its elections department has.

The legislature had voted at its last meeting Jan. 16 to direct the Menominee Election Commission to schedule a special election. The legislature had fired Mark Waukau, the last elected police chief, in September 2018 and was seeking

to make the position an appointed post instead of an elected one, but eventually opted to keep the hiring up to the voters.

Yvette Ducane, election commission chairwoman, told the legislature that having a special election would cost well over \$25,000 — \$10,871 for a primary and \$14,968 for the general election — and that the elections department does not have the money in its 2020 budget.

Ducane noted that it's the legislature's responsibility to set dates and times for special elections.

"In order to have a special election, you have to have a resolution

setting the dates and the times," Ducane said. "We have to have 60 days to hold a special election, so that would put us into April."

Legislator Joan Delabreau felt it would be better to hold off on electing a new police chief until the next legislative election, which would begin with a primary in November and a general election in January 2021.

"I think \$25,000, \$26,000 is a lot of money," Delabreau said. "I think if we wait until ... the legislative election, it won't cost us any additional money, and it will be cleaner when that person's term ends."

The legislature unanimously approved rescinding its call for a special election and a motion that moved the police chief election to the regular election season.

Richard Nacotee is serving as the interim police chief, having served in that position since Waukau's removal.

The tribal police chief would serve a term of seven years, according to current tribal ordinances, and be sworn in February 2021, the same time the legislature is sworn in.

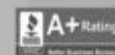

THE GARDENING YEAR

Signs of spring popping up earlier than normal

With both December and January seeing overall temperatures well above normal,

it should be no surprise that, already, the signs of spring are beginning to pop up throughout our woodlands and gardens. It won't be long before spring's official arrival, and Mother

Nature is already gearing up for the big change.

A few weeks ago, the first cardinals and chickadees began to sing their sweet spring love songs. House finches joined the chorus, as well.

The high-pitched, siren song of the cardinal is one of spring's most welcome signs and, right on schedule, cardinals in our area have begun to sing. Usually, each year about Valentine's Day, the cardinals begin to serenade the sunrise with their piercing song of joy.

Black-capped chickadees, our friendly little black and white friends, also fill our yards, gardens and woodlands with their sweetly sung love song. Many people have heard this song but have not connected it to the tiny chickadee. For most, the only sound they are familiar with from these birds is the telltale "chickadee, dee, dee" call.

Their sweet spring song is a two- or three-part whistled phrase. Some say the chickadee is singing "pee wee," while others liken the chickadee's sweet song to the word "cheesburger." Either way, the sweet spring song of the chickadee has begun, and there is no going back.

The house finch, our glorious red finch, sings now with an explosive, continuous warbling that erupts from the treetops with a contagious energy and enthusiasm.

Soon, other songbirds will join the chorus. Mourning doves will begin to sing their forlorn love song from treetops, telephone wires and rooftops. The tufted titmouse will also burst into glorious song, though this bird is not as common here in central Wisconsin as it is in the southern part of the state.

Another sure sign of spring as the drumming of woodpeckers that has

now begun. Drumming is a different display than the sound made by feeding woodpeckers hammering on tree trunks and logs. Drumming is a purposeful, fast-paced, echoing display designed to make sure other woodpeckers in the area know that they are about to infringe upon a male's territory.

Often, woodpeckers seek out hollow logs, metal flashing on telephone poles, even our chimneys, to perform their drumming ritual as the intent is to create as much noise as possible, and the birds have discovered that certain objects create a better sound than others.

The emergence of pussy willows is another sign of spring and already, they are beginning to emerge in Waupaca, Shawano and Out-

agamie counties, as well as points south. The tiny, fur-lined catkins are bursting forth from buds set last year, protecting tiny flowers that will begin to bloom in March and April, attracting the season's first flying insect pollinators.

Speaking of pollinators, our warmth last week caused honeybees in some hives to emerge and begin taking flight in the warm sunshine. I observed honeybees drinking from snow melt puddles, even from the snow itself, to quench their thirst. See my Facebook page for the amazing video of honeybees in action.

Dogwoods are beginning to blush in bright red and willows are beginning to transform into spring amber and gold. Skunk cabbage is beginning to bloom in area wetlands. I

discovered several plants blooming at Hartman Creek State Park this past week.

On open water, many species of ducks are beginning to perform their elaborate courtship displays, many of which consist of head and neck pumping, bizarre noises and passionate dancing on the open water.

Even if winter still holds a tight grip, the signs of spring are beginning to show and, as the calendar move closer and closer to March, the changes will continue and the dreams of area gardeners and nature lovers will swell along with the growing tide of the season.

Grief into gratitude

New yoga class aims to help deal with grief and loss

SHAWANO — Grief has a place in life, and yoga can be a way to bring grief to an appreciation of life.

That's the reason Jaime Gajewski is offering Yoga for Grief, a free class to help support and transform emotions of loss and sadness.

The class will be held at the First Presbyterian Church in Shawano on Feb. 23.

The class will include simple stretches, breathing and meditation, Gajewski said. She added that the goal is transform grief into something uplifting.

"I don't want people thinking, 'I don't want to go for an hour just to cry,'" she said. "You will leave uplifted and grateful. That is my intention.

"I can guide you to think a little deeper. This is not based on physical moves as much as joining and reconnecting with all of the feelings. Anger, confusion — it comes to a deeper understanding and appreciation of life.

"Step by step, breath by breath, walk barely into the uncomfortable feeling. Gently, slowly — there is not time pressure. You learn that letting go does not mean forgetting."

The class will start with remembering, she said. After that, she will guide through "protecting our hearts, releasing feelings into strength, to celebration and to surrender."

The inspiration from the class grew out of Gajewski's own grief. The suicide of her cousin, a close confidant, was devastating to her. The pain she experienced brought her to a new understanding of what she wanted to do in life — which includes helping others get through their grieving process.

"I knew I was ready to share other aspects of life, not focus on grief anymore — but to use it as a catalyst," Gajewski said.

While she finds it sad that it took her cousin's death to bring these issues into focus, she said: "I

stumbled upon grief yoga online. It was so helpful. I knew I had found my purpose."

It took 200 hours of training at the Pranashama Yoga Institute in Hawaii for Gajewski to feel that she was ready to share her insights with others.

She shared her story and, for her final test, conducted a session of grief yoga. A video of the program concludes with bright music and dancing.

Gajewski, who founded Crazy Heart Yoga, teaches at the Methodist Church on the Hill in Shawano. She said her style of yoga has a large spiritual component. Although she uses yoga poses and stretches, "I can barely touch toes myself," she said.

Everyone has their own style and needs, and "you have to find one that works for you."

"You being with yourself, breathing, being gentle with whatever comes up," she said.

Yoga is not a religion, she noted.

"It is an ancient process that connects you with your breath ... reconnect with the universal love that is within ourselves," Gajewski said.

Gajewski said the grief class is open to both men and women, and suggested that some men could benefit from the flexibility that yoga provides. She also called the class a safe place where emotions are accepted.

Gajewski said she will use some of her late cousin's music in the class.

"I know he would be proud," Gajewski said. "I know he would have benefited from this."

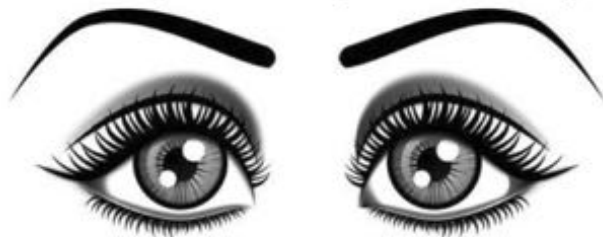
