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# School psychologist Kara Muthig wins top award

Muthig recognized as  
state School Psychologist  
of the Year

**WITTENBERG** — Kara Muthig was named the Wisconsin School Psychologist of the Year in a March 5 ceremony in Wisconsin Dells.

Each year, the Wisconsin School Psychologist Association gives the award.

“Kara is the best at what she does,” said Garrett Rogowski, superintendent of the Wittenberg-Birnamwood School District, where Muthig works. “She is a tireless worker, trusted by staff, students and families, and is a servant leader that is fully committed to the personal and academic success of all of our students.”

Muthig graduated from the school psychology program at UW-Whitewater and did her internship at the Gillett School District during the 2000-01 school year before coming to Wittenberg-Birnamwood.

As a school psychologist, Muthig spends most of her time working with teams to problem-solve and put in place best practices to help students succeed academically and behaviorally. Part of her job involves interpreting data to help teams make decisions regarding programs and instruction, assess students to determine specific needs, consult with teachers and families to connect them with resources and provide staff development.

“Working in a small, rural district allows me the opportunity to get to know and to develop relationships with staff, families and students,” said Muthig. “I feel like Wittenberg-Birnamwood is a supportive, positive place to work, and I’m extremely grateful for all of the connections I’ve made over the years.”

Muthig acknowledges that working in a smaller district also means that it’s sometimes harder to connect

families with outside resources. She notes that with teamwork between her and the staff and the families, they make that happen.

She feels it’s important to note that many staff members wear multiple hats to get everything done. For example, in addition to being the school psychologist, she is also the district assessment coordinator.

Regarding district-wide initiatives, Muthig says she is very proud to be working with Rogowski to provide professional development based on Shawn Achor’s work in positive psychology related to his parable, “The Orange Frog.”

“Outcomes of this training include increased happiness and a positive outlook, which leads to increased productivity and success,” said Muthig.

“One of the best things about receiving this award is that I was just being myself,” added Muthig.

“That statement alone speaks volumes to the kind of individual she is,” said Megan Marcks, director of pupil services at WBSD.

Marcks also noted that she is grateful for Muthig’s dedication, compassion and empathy toward every situation she encounters.

“I’m extremely proud to be recognized for this award and hope that it helps bring awareness to all of the positive things happening in Wittenberg-Birnamwood schools. I’ve been very fortunate to work in such a supportive community,” said Muthig.

# Another great reason to visit or live in Wittenberg

Another theatrical production has come and gone, and the WOWSPACE sits empty — waiting for the next event.

It's a lot of work to put a show together — learning the lines, blocking the scenes, finding the right costumes and props. The fact that it's all done by volunteers, who have lives of their own to run, makes it all the more special when it all comes together.

Each show surprises me. You never really know what is going to connect with the audience. I had one person, who has been to all but one of the murder mystery shows, tell me that this last one was the funniest. I'm always surprised when I hear that, especially when I have had difficulty pulling a show together.

As the director, I'm responsible for everything that can go wrong. This last show had the opportunity for four nights with four different specialty acts. I was fortunate the first weekend

when I found a singer who could play four songs each night.

The next weekend, I found four acts for the first night but needed to fill in one of the spots because someone had to work and

couldn't attend the second night. I almost filled in for another who wasn't sure he wanted to do it again, but he saved me and, in the end, the performances all went off without a hitch.

The script called for pulling audience members from their seats and having them read aloud the passages from the fake romance novels. It's important to know your audience and how comfortable they are with any level of participation. I hope I correctly assumed that there would be

very few willing to come up on stage and do a cold reading. I made the decision to create another character and gave myself the task of reading all five selections. I think it went over well, as "ham" is my middle name.

For this show, we actually invested in a spotlight to give us some more lighting options. People forgive a lot when they come to our shows. They know the WOWSPACE is an art gallery, not a theater. Adding the portable staging units and now the spotlight, we can be a little bolder in our choices.

My favorite part of the show is right after the performance when audience members linger behind to chat with the cast. To be able to pull off two shows a year and keep the audiences coming is something the whole troupe is proud of. I love meeting the faces I've not seen before, to find out where they're from and how they heard about the show.

We get a fair amount of people who

have never been to Wittenberg before and know nothing else about the Walls of Wittenberg organization. It's a real treat to play ambassador and give the reasons to keep coming back to our little "berg."

When I first moved back home, I envisioned starting an acting troupe, but the idea didn't catch on for a few years. It took a while to figure out if there were enough actors in the area, and then to take that leap of faith that we could fill the seats.

It takes a while for new traditions to become old ones. It takes a while for people to notice the hidden talents our area has to offer. I don't mind. I have plenty of time to encourage people to see Wittenberg the way I see it. My glasses may be a bit rosy, but I have no trouble finding people to come share that vision.

# New SCEPI chief sees great things for county

Thillman named chief economic development officer

**SHAWANO** — A strong strategic plan for economic development is the first priority of the new director of Shawano County Economic Progress, Inc., who started his new job on Monday.

Peter Thillman, most recently the vice president of economic development for the Fox Cities Regional Partnership, will replace SCEPI's current chief economic development officer Dennis Heling, who has retired.

Thillman has worked in various economic development capacities since the early 1990s, giving him experience on the municipal, state and regional levels, as well as experience in higher education.

"I think it's a good fit for what's going on right now in Shawano County to try and grow the economy and get things moving again," Thillman said.

Thillman said he'd like to start by getting together with the SCEPI board of directors and getting everyone on the same page in terms of what the economic strategy should be, what direction it should take and what expectations need to be met.

"I can see that there's a strong want for more development and probably more tax base, and then how we go about that and what we're looking for, that will be important to look at," Thillman said. "And, of course, keeping the businesses that we have is also critical, to make sure they're successful and can grow and expand, also."

Thillman said there are challenges in the economy, but the county has some advantages in its favor.

"The one bright thing about Shawano County is I believe the people are here to expand the economy," he said.

Currently, 44 percent of those people leave the county every day to go to work elsewhere.

"That means there's an available workforce here to make business recruitment a little bit easier," Thillman said. "That's the biggest hindrance right now to recruiting businesses. Do you have a workforce?

And it's clear we have a workforce. We just have to make sure that we have the right mix of businesses that can keep people in Shawano County."

Thillman said he was attracted to the job because

he felt it was a good opportunity.

"You're in three market areas you can work with," he said. "You can work with the Fox Cities, you can work with Green Bay and you can work with Wausau. So you're in this kind of prime location and on the Highway 29 corridor. So there's ample opportunity for growth and I think it's poised to take that next step."

Thillman had previously been vice president of workforce and economic development with Lakeshore Technical College in Cleveland, Wisconsin; director of economic development for the city of Green Bay from 2000 to 2005; development zone specialist for the Wisconsin Department of Commerce from 1995 to 2000; and coordinator for the Harland Revitalization Association in Harland, Kentucky from 1992 to 1995.

His starting salary as SCEPI chief will be \$95,000.

The SCEPI board went through two rounds of interviews, including a candidate who turned down the job after it was offered in December just 10 days before he was expected to start.

There were six candidates interviewed during the first round and three interviewed during the second round.

Thillman applied during the second round.

"The hiring committee was unanimous to go with Mr. Thillman," said Eddie Sheppard, Shawano city administrator and member of the SCEPI board of directors.

"He's got extensive economic development experience in the public sector," Sheppard said. "We were very impressed with what we think he's going to bring."

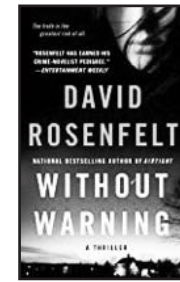
