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Tauchen to face 1 of 2 possible Democratic challengers in November

Two vying for Democratic nomination for 6th District Assembly seat

Republican State Rep. Gary Tauchen, of Bonduel, will face a Democratic challenger in the fall election for his Sixth District Assembly seat, but it remains to be seen which of two contenders that will be.

Richard Sarnick, a Shawano doctor who ran unsuccessfully against Tauchen two years ago, and Simon Moesch, of Shawano, have both announced plans to run for the Democratic nomination.

They will face off in the Aug. 11 partisan primary to determine who will go up against Tauchen.

Sarnick said the top issues for him include: providing adequate internet access throughout the district, particularly in rural areas; addressing the opioid epidemic; and pushing for expanded health care at the state and federal levels.

"The United States is the only industrialized country that doesn't have universal health care," Sarnick said. "I think it really holds back our economy."

Sarnick also said that as a doctor, he would like to be able to help his fellow Assembly members understand the science behind the COVID-19 pandemic and "help drive policies by data, not by the dollar."

As for the drug problem, Sarnick said he would encourage the decriminalization of people who have drug problems and mandate treatment instead of jail time.

"Drug dealers should still go to

jail," he said, "but I think the people who are hooked by the drug dealers should be treated, not criminalized."

Sarnick said he chose to run again because voters in the district should have a choice on the ballot.

"I don't think the people of our district would be very well served by having only one candidate choice on the slate," he said.

"I would hope to offer people a chance to vote for somebody who will look out for their best interests — not necessarily for big business, but the best interests of the voter."

Tauchen, who was first elected to his Assembly seat in 2006, said this would be his last term in office. He said he welcomes the challenge in November.

"Competition is always good," Tauchen said. "People have a choice of people to consider that are closest to their own philosophies, so that's a good thing."

Tauchen said the big issue that lawmakers will face going forward is balancing the budget.

"Funding is going to be very

tight," he said. "We're going to have to figure out how to shore up the three biggest economic drivers in our state — agriculture, manufacturing and tourism — because we want to make sure that we do what we can to bring in as much revenue as possible."

Tauchen said funding education is also a top priority.

"We need to fund education, and this last year, we did," he said. "We had a pretty conservative budget where we cut taxes by \$500 million, invested \$500 million in transportation and more than that in education. We've done a lot, but we need to continue to figure out how we can best balance the budget and at the same time provide the services we need to in the state of Wisconsin."

Campaigning for the November election could be a bit challenging this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Tauchen said.

"A lot of the parades are canceled. A lot of the events are canceled. You like to go and speak to people and have give-and-take and have listening sessions and such. We're kind of limited on how we can address things," he said. "This is going to be a very unusual campaign I think."

Moesch could not be reached for a comment.

As of press time, Moesch had filed the necessary signatures to get on the November ballot, but approval of those signatures was still pending.

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Engel Drive apartments to begin construction by fall

200-unit complex expected for final approval by city on June 10

SHAWANO — A 200-unit apartment complex on Engel Drive in Shawano is on the fast-track to begin construction by this fall, pending expected approval by the plan commission and Common Council on June 10.

SC Swiderski LLC, of Mosinee, began working with the city last year on the project, which initially wasn't expected to get underway until 2021 at the soonest.

"We were able to move it up in our construction schedule," Swiderski's Business Development Manager Jacqui Miller said.

"We thought we were going to be booked out for a couple years, but we were able to fit it in for a fall start," she said.

Miller attributed that in part to the city's cooperation on the project, but also to a strong demand for housing in the area.

"It's been very easy to work with the city on the project, so we do appreciate their cooperation," she said.

"Also, all the signs were pointing to very strong demand in that area. There's a lot of businesses that were expanding and those are all things that we're looking for when we come to a community. It kind of made it more attractive for us to get going sooner rather than later."

The Shawano Common Council in January approved a developer's agreement with Swiderski calling for the company to purchase the 18.6-acre property from the city for \$450,000.

When Swiderski has completed and received occupancy permits for 160 of the 200 units planned, the city will reimburse the developer for the purchase price of the land.

The Engel Drive property, on Shawano's southwest side near Hillcrest school and the industrial park, was once expected to be the site of a medical residency training center before that project fell through.

According to City Administrator Eddie Sheppard, 160 apartment units — which was the minimum originally envisioned before Swiderski increased that to 200 — would add

an estimated \$16 million of taxable value to the city. There was no figure immediately available for the tax base expected to be added by the additional 40 units.

The apartments will be spread out over the 18.6 acres in three building styles, including two-bedroom, two-bathroom apartments with attached garages; one- and two-bedroom apartments with detached garages; and two- and three-bedroom apartments with attached two-car garages.

"That way we're able to offer a range of prices and floorplans," Miller said.

Miller said there will also be one building style that Swiderski will be using for the first time, which will be "all one-level living," with attached garage and patio.

Swiderski will also have a leasing office on-site here in Shawano, not only to begin leasing the first apartments as they go up, but also for the company's other eastern region developments.

"We are developing our eastern region, so this will be the headquarters

for the property management staff for that eastern region," Miller said.

There will also be full-time maintenance personnel on site.

Groundbreaking on the project is not yet scheduled, but, Miller said, it's anticipated that would occur in the late summer or early fall.

"We're very excited to be coming to Shawano," Miller said. "That location is ideal. It has great access for people right in Shawano and also for people that maybe live outside of Shawano that are looking to have that nice convenient location."

Sheppard said that with all the recent attention understandably being focused on the COVID-19 pandemic and the city's response to it, good news like the Engel Drive apartments has fallen through the cracks.

"Sometimes we lose track of some of the really positive things that have been going on," he said. "I think this is going to be a huge building block in developing that area out there."

Robert Edwin Anderson & Rosamond Ruth (Redmann) Anderson

Love and Accomplishment in a Tumultuous Age...

Robert Edwin and Rosamond Ruth died peacefully, days apart, in Williamsburg, Virginia; Robert, age 100, on Sunday, May 17, the consequence of a fateful fall, and Rosamond, age 94, on Thursday, May 21 following a lengthy struggle with Alzheimer's dementia; both in the company of loved ones. They would have been married 74 years this coming June and had resided in Skokie, Illinois for over 70 years.

Robert Edwin, in adolescence known as "Ed" and later as "Bob," was, among many things, a distinguished World War II Navy veteran, who also served during the Korean conflict, and who then later rose through the ranks to head a leading Chicago construction company. Rosamond, most always called "Rose," was a dedicated homemaker and mother who lovingly raised four children in their Dobson Street home. Their lives epitomized the quintessential American story; two spirited, fiercely independent, souls that joined and forged a legacy of enterprise, service, and devotion both to family and to one another.

Robert, the eldest of four boys, grew to manhood in Athens, Georgia, where his father worked as a traveling salesman. Rose, hailing from rural northern Wisconsin and the eldest daughter of seven siblings, was raised on the family farm at Belle Plaine near Shawano. Their births and deaths literally 'book-end' the modern American



era. Born in the waning days of horse-and-buggy America, when electrification was still a novelty in much of the country, they arrived in the wake of the "Great War." Their lives began in the raucous prosperity of the "Roaring 20's," as America flexed its newfound might, and then witnessed the immense suffering and privation of the terrible economic calamity that was the "Great Depression." They survived the tribulations of World War II and witnessed the "Pax Americana" that issued thereafter. From the early days of biplanes to spacecraft landing on the moon, Robert and Rose saw together the wonder, majesty, and misery that was mid-century America.

Robert, following his distinguished Naval service, during which he sur-

vived the sinking of both USS Hornet (CV-8) and USS Princeton (CLV-22), began his civilian career as a time-keeper for the Chicago commercial construction company Campbell-Lowrie-Lautermilch, of which he was to eventually acquire ownership. Despite the demands of running a large and successful enterprise, he carved out time for all the important things in his life: his beloved wife, his children, and his omnipresent dogs and exotic plants. Yet, given all the demands that intruded on his life, Robert never stopped giving, finding time to serve his Skokie community as a Boy Scout Troop leader for nearly 20 years.

If Robert was the engine that moved life forward, Rose was the lubricant that kept the family machine running smoothly. A 'spunky' and 'spirited' woman, she resolved early on to let go the farm for the lure of life in the big city. It was while working in Chicago that she met the love of her life. She married Robert on June 22, 1946, and never looked back. An avid card player and gardener, she skillfully balanced her duties as wife, mother, and, in the later years, grandmother; armored with a constant, firm and abiding faith in God. Rosamond was fiercely proud of the home she managed, and eternally dedicated to the burgeoning family she and Robert created; unflaggingly committed to a successful partnership that spanned seven decades.

Robert was preceded in death by his parents, Jessie Addison Anderson and Gena Mae McBrayer and his brothers John Harold, Jesse Addison, and William Joe; Rosamond, by her

parents Edward Louis Redmann and Anna Martha Kersten, her brothers Wallace Royce, Oliver Henry, Edward Carl, and Arlin Harold Paul and sisters Lila June (Leis), and Norma Ann (Blank). Robert and Rose are survived by their children Carolyn Rose (Tripp), Glenn Edward, John Howard, Donald Forrest and their spouses, and lastly by their beloved 11 grandchildren, and 5 great-grandchildren.

Robert and Rosamond formed a lasting partnership that spanned the entire modern, American century. Their contributions to our country, their community, and family will be their enduring legacy; two remarkable lives which certainly represent the very best of a "Great Generation" and, now resting together, represent one of its greatest love stories.

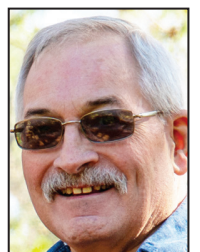


David A. Brath

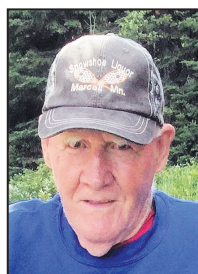

The pair was concerned that if their big day had to be pushed back further, she wouldn’t be there.

Local plant making millions of gowns

Novolex steps up, steps in to make COVID-19 protection

SHAWANO — A Shawano manufacturer is stopping the COVID-19 virus millions of times every month.

Novolex, 3100 E. Richmond St., Shawano, has employees working around the clock to make protective gowns for health care workers. On April 21, the packaging company started making gowns on one of its production lines. By mid-June, they will be making 870,000 gowns a week, said Galen Killam, senior product and technical manager in Shields Organization, which includes Novolex in Shawano.

There is a lot of demand from health care workers, especially first responders, said Leann Gueths, Shawano's plant manager.

The 105 employees in the production side in Shawano are making gowns for health care workers to use as they care for COVID-19 patients. The gowns are made from polyethylene terephthalate, a polymer from the polyester family.

Locally, these products have been used at the Menominee Tribal Clinic and at nursing homes in the Fox Valley, she said.

The ability to make a million of anything, and a history of successful work with disposable products, led Novolex leaders to ask, "What can we do to help?" Killam said. The answer was personal protection equipment — specifically, face masks and gowns. The plant in Shawano was tapped to make gowns.

"We're a pretty good company at making a lot," Killam said. "A lot of different things."

The "different things" that Novolex produces are probably familiar to most people.

"You have used our products," Kil-

lam said. "We make insulation-facing materials. We make ice and food bags...fertilizer, see, anything like that. We make butter packaging. We make coated papers like you would find on a Tootsie Roll."

While the individual items are familiar, the kind of quantities that Novolex deals with routinely are hard to fathom for someone who grabs one bag at a time.

Novolex has plants throughout North America. So when someone says they need a million of something, the company doesn't flinch.

"A million of something is totally within normal bounds," Killam said.

The Shawano facility right now is making vest-style and sleeved gowns. These are single-use PPEs for the medical industry, distributed by the Department of Defense, for use in hospitals with maximum need, he said.

Novolex gowns are made in two styles, one with sleeves and one without. Sleeves aren't attached as they are with a shirt, he said. The plastic is cut in a T shape, and the seams are sealed and trimmed. The sleeved gowns are made in two sizes, which he said should cover any body type. They are designed so sleeves and

gowns can be cut to the appropriate length for the wearer.

"In general, it's going to fit," he said.

In addition to fitting correctly, Killam said the gowns had to actually stop the virus from passing through. That meant testing the materials before making the first gown.

"When we decided to enter the market, as you can imagine, we have a lot of companies that we do testing with. We send to outside testing labs to do tests. So we ended up pulling in the University of Iowa testing labs to help us out," Killam said. He said the testing proved that they were capable of meeting the needs of the demands placed upon it.

Longstanding relationships with medical supply companies helped guide that process, he said. In addition to engineering the production, they had to make sure they complied with the many regulations that direct supplies for health care workers.

By converting from bags for good to PPE, he added, he feels the company is helping other families while helping its own families stay employed.

Now that they've established themselves in the PPE market, Killam sees this is an ongoing product line.

"This will be a long-term market for us," he said. For now, he said, they anticipate orders for PPEs through the end of 2020.

"There are a lot of orders coming through through the end of the year," Gueths added.

And while the PPEs are being produced, he added, the demand for packaging food products and the other Novolex products remains strong.

The plant now offers protective gear for employees in addition to the normal steel-toed shoes, eye protection and hearing protection, he said. They are taking employee temperatures and providing masks or shields for workers.

Existing customers aren't going away, he said, so the plant will be scaling up its operations over the next few weeks.

Novolex in Shawano is hiring. Machine operators work 12-hour shifts, either nights or days. There is no "swing shift" where workers rotate their start times, Gueths said. Information on opportunities is posted on the company's website, <https://careers.novolex.com/?utm=careersite>.

MADISON — The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is proud to host the eighth annual Wisconsin Free Fun Weekend. Park admission fees, fishing license and trail pass requirements will be waived June 6-7 to encourage Wisconsinites to take advantage of and enjoy Wisconsin's outdoors.

During Free Fun Weekend June 6-7:

- No state park admission stickers or trail passes are required.
- People may fish without a fishing license or trout/salmon stamps. All other fishing regulations apply.
- ATV, UTVs and OHMs are exempt from registration requirements. Resident and non-resident all-terrain vehicle operators do not need a trail

pass to ride state ATV trails.

- Capacity limits remain in effect at some properties to limit overcrowding.

Federal Energy Regulatory Commission allows Shawano Lake level to rise

SHAWANO — Senator Robert Cowles (R-Green Bay) released the following statement after the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) approved a temporary order this morning raising Shawano Lake to historic water levels effective immediately:

"I continue to be proud of the partnership that's been formed in Shawano which has led to the latest temporary approval by FERC to raise the water levels. Shawano Lake is a pristine recreation hub to visit

and a fun and relaxing place to call home. This order comes just in time to allow residents and visitors to continue enjoying their weeknights and weekends like they always have: safely on Shawano Lake," the statement read.

Following an early 2015 order by FERC to draw down lake levels by approximately five inches, Senator Cowles has been involved with successfully seeking temporary approvals to raise lake levels for three years. The break from the 30-year historic

water levels, as required initially, resulted in concerns from lake-goers for their safety and ability to recreate as even lower lake levels on the already shallow Shawano Lake exposed more structure on the lake bottom resulting in potential hazards that could lead to injury or property damage. Lower water levels also limited access to the lake at public boat launches and on the shorelines and docks of waterfront property owners.

"For a third year, a temporary approval to raise the lake back to a level

necessary for safe navigation and recreation for the summer is welcome and appreciated, but continuing to seek temporary approvals year after year is not a long-term solution. It's my hope that we'll be able to work cooperatively between stakeholders this summer to seek a permanent order that keeps Shawano Lake open for recreation all summer, every summer."

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Shawano school mulls re-opening

Anderson eyes 4 alternatives including virtual learning

SHAWANO — The Shawano School Board wrestled Monday night with how to reopen local schools this fall.

Randi Anderson, district administrator, said the schools are weighing four approaches to reentry, ranging from a continuation of 100% virtual instruction to having all 2,300 students and 300-plus staff back for face-to-face instruction.

Anderson said several times during the meeting, “Absolutely. I want our students, our staff back in our buildings.” She said she was not advocating 100% virtual instruction, “but we have to be ready for it.”

The administrator said she was continuing to plan with staff and hoped to have a reentry recommendation for a board meeting in July.

She cautioned that may be premature as the district continues to learn from other countries as they reopen, as well as abide by the evolving local and state health guidelines.

Nick Curran, district business manager and human resources director, said the district is still looking to the state for guidance.

He added the district has to be aware of its liability if a staff member, student or visitor became sick and negligence can be proven.

Madelynn Easter, who just completed her junior year at Shawano High School, presented results from a survey she conducted to assess virtual instruction. She received responses from 55 students — 29 juniors, 25 sophomores and 11 freshmen.

Her conclusions indicated 83.6% of students found it “overwhelming” to complete assignments since the lockdown in March.

Her respondents also noted higher levels of depression, higher levels of hopelessness and a loss of motivation.

Michael Sleeper, board member, asked if the pass-fail grading scheme contributed to the lack of motivation. Easter responded she thought it did.

Sleeper then asked about what the

district could do better.

Easter advocated that each student meet with teachers at least every two weeks via Zoom or a similar technology platform. She said that some teachers regularly reached out to students, but that some students felt abandoned.

Chuck Dallas, board member, observed the virtual learning approach didn’t work very well and said, “We could do better.” He suggested finding some champions among teachers and use their efforts as a model.

Sleeper said that the district made a lot of decisions on the fly. He likened the situation to a football team not given a playbook or practice time but still expected to win a game.

Easter added, “It was new to everyone, students and teachers.” But, she said, a lot was learned “for the next time we have to do this.”

Diane Hoffman, board member, said she thought comprehension of a subject was lost with the total focus on completion. She thought the experience with virtual instruction pointed out the flaws in the schools. “This is not how every student learns,” she said.

Bruce Milavitz, board member, said he was concerned the student base lost

communication with teachers. “All I’m hoping, if we’re forced into this virtual world, I’m hoping we can stay connected with students,” Milavitz added.

While she agreed with Dallas that improvements can be made, she reminded the board that no one could have foreseen the schools would still be closed June 1.

The board voted to renew its Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association membership for next year, which comes at no cost to the district.

Anderson said the same uncertainty on restarting instruction also applies to sports. She said Shawano benefits from partnering with the state association and learning what other districts are doing in answering the question, “What do sports look like this fall?”

Curran gave the board an overview of employee insurance programs and asked for approval. Curran noted a decision was needed by July 1, the start of the next fiscal year.

On the recommendation of Jeff Easter, district facilities director, the board presented a Hawk Pride commendation to Dan and Donna Everson for their years of tending gardens and a prairie area at district schools.

2 juveniles facing charges after drug deal goes bad

SHAWANO — Two juveniles are
