Highlights of a busy FFA school year

Trip to national convention, food drives, visit from state officer among activities

Among highlights of the Oconto Falls FFA Chapter's 2022-23 school year:

Each year, the chapter raises funds through its holiday fundraiser. This sale features MinnTex Citrus, Springside Cheese, Meat-ski's Meats, Pete's Mustard, and Big D's Honey. Our members are thankful for everyone's continued support and we hope you enjoyed these tasty foods during the holiday season.

FFA is honored to assist in the Veterans Day ceremony at Oconto Falls High School. We serve as ushers for the ceremony, welcoming and holding doors open veterans and their families as they arrive before the ceremony.

Each year, the Wisconsin FFA State Officer Team members visit each chapter to present to our students about an array of topics. We scheduled our visit on a day that featured our monthly FFA meeting. Brooke Casey, a state FFA vice president, from the New London chapter provided team building activities, interpersonal skills activities, team work scenarios, and taught us all how to line dance.

The 92nd Annual National FFA Convention and Expo was held in Indianapolis at the convention center and Lucas Oil Stadium. This year, Brent Wolf, a senior at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls majoring in dairy science, earned his American FFA Degree, the highest degree of membership in the FFA organization.

To receive the degree, he had to have earned the Wisconsin State FFA Degree, earned a minimum of \$10,000 and invested at least \$7,500 in his supervised agricultural experience program, and volunteered at least 50 hours in a minimum of three community service projects.

Oconto Falls FFA members from Washington Middle School and Oconto Falls High School attended Wisconsin FFA's Foundations in Reaching Excellence (FIRE) Conference at Fox Valley Technical College in Appleton. They learned

about the basic information that every FFA member should know about the organization and explore opportunities that await them.

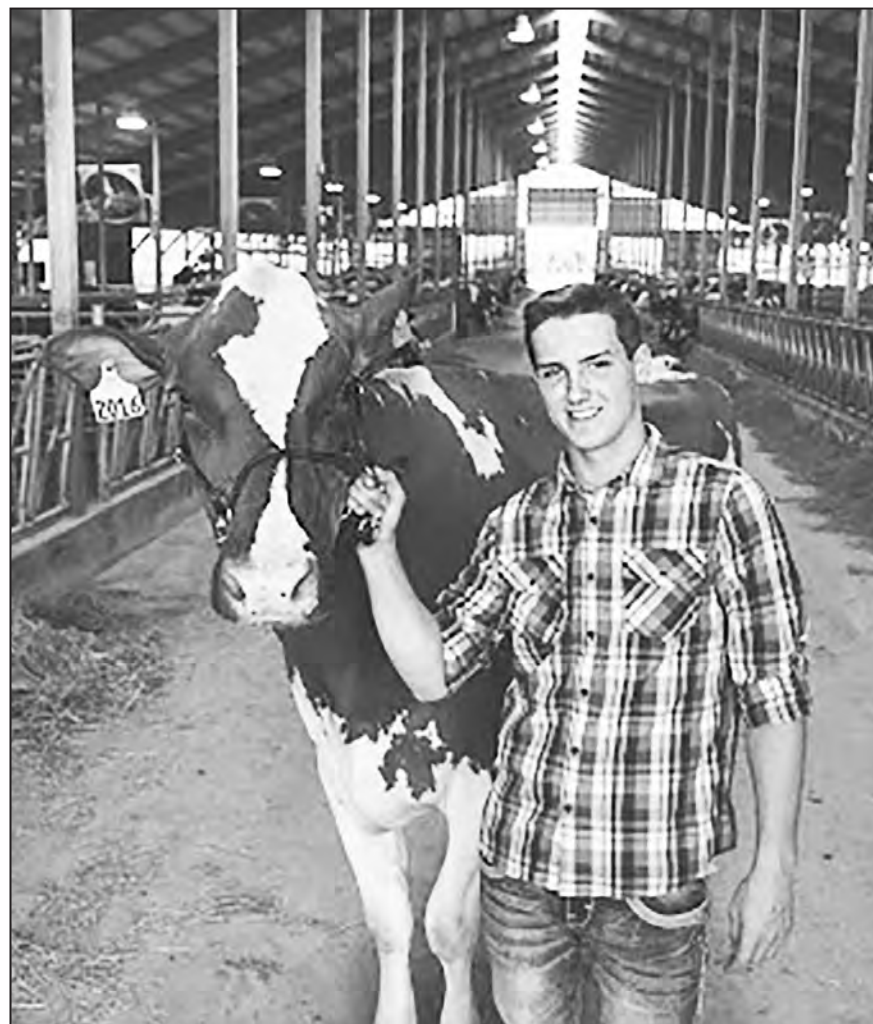
In the end, a Spirit Award is given to the FFA chapter that participates and engages proactively and respectfully; Oconto Falls FFA won that award, and it is proudly displayed at Washington Middle School in Mariah Markhardt's classroom.

During the first full week of December, the WMS Student Council and WMS FFA worked together to plan and conduct our second annual food drive. Items donated were donated to the Kingdom Come Food Pantry. Over the week, members of the two clubs worked together to collect, sort, and count the items that were donated. In total, students of WMS donated 733 total items to the drive. Thank you to all of those who participated.

On Jan. 27, the Oconto Falls FFA Chapter held a food drive for the Kingdom Come Food Pantry. FFA vice president of building communities Amber Haines coordinated the project. The food drive had a successful and positive turnout. The Oconto Falls FFA Chapter is excited to plan more opportunities like this to benefit our community.

The alumni chapter accepted the donation of a John Deere Model A tractor last spring. Alumni member Miguel Kesler suggested the tractor could be restored by FFA members to gain practical experience and offered use of his home shop for the project.

Other alumni members joining Kesler in assisting FFA members on the project include Bryan Maring, Phil and Aaron Konitzer, Al Stranz, Mike Burdosh, Dave Baeten, and Amber Larson. Oconto Falls High School ag educator and FFA advisor Walter Taylor is coordinating the project. Between nine and 15 FFA members have been involved. Students, assisted by Alumni members, completely disassembled and are reassembling the tractor, after which it will be painted.

At the end of October, we also had the opportunity again to attend the national convention in Indianapolis. We toured many facilities on the way down, with stops this year at Kuhn North America in Broadhead, the University of Illinois, Hunter Honey Farm and Not Just Popcorn. Students were able to interact with students from all across the United States and see the impact they are making on a larger level.

We also ran our fruit sale this year, and it went really well. This is our biggest fundraiser and allows us to do all the fun events throughout the year. We will be continuing this event next year, so keep your eyes open for members out and about. Along with our fruit sale, we also buy fruit as a chapter to donate to the food pantry in Wittenberg. This year, we were able to donate roughly 300 pounds of fresh produce back to our wonderful community.

In December, we also run a giving tree for our community. Our members go out and gather household items to donate to the giving tree project, including toothpaste, toothbrushes, soaps, Band-Aids, deodorant, laundry soap, etc. As a chapter, this year we were able to give roughly 200 items back to the community.

To go along with everything we have going on we also attend leadership development events all year long. The entire officer team was in Bowler early this year for the District Leadership Development event, where students learn how to excel at their officer position and also how to be better leaders for their chapter.

Four amazing members — John Hoffman, Matthew Nousen, Ava Medo, and Madisyn Sippl — have moved on to the sectional leadership event, which will take place in New London. We also had the opportunity to send two students to the Halftime conference in Stevens Point. The training at this event is more intense and has a focus on building better leaders for better chapters.

Lastly our Ag Building is running at full capacity this year as we are

currently housing seven pigs and 11 piglets. The pigs consist of four gilts, two barrows and one sow.

The gilts are females that have not had piglets yet, and will be bred here at school by the students. They will then go back to Jake's Pig Palace, where we got them from, and farrow out in the spring. The two barrows, or castrated males, will be finished out here at school, and processed at Pond Hill in April.

We will be hosting a meat raffle in May. The sow, which is owned by advisor Matthew Christian and his wife, has called the building home the year. The first week of February, she farrowed and had 11 healthy piglets right here in the ag building. It is a once in a lifetime experience for a lot of our students to see her go from being in heat all the way to giving birth right here at school.

Our year is not finished yet, as we have plenty of events yet this year. We have many contests that we will be participating in, a sledging trip, bonfire, Adventures in Dairyland, farmer appreciation day, another drive your tractor to school day, and many more. It has been a busy year, but we wouldn't have it any other way.

On Sept. 12, we held a pizza kick-off meeting to recruit new FFA members, with six new members joining that night. To raise money toward their National FFA Convention trip, six FFA members sold about 100 fall garden mums in late September.

In October, Jessica Burayi, Bella and Gabe Dahlstrom, Michaela Gleason, Rae Strehlow, Samantha Suehring, and Ms. Rowe attended the 95th National FFA Convention and Career Expo in Indianapolis. They attended leadership workshops, convention sessions, going to the World's Toughest Rodeo, agricultural tours including Kuhn USA, Uof I-ACES Plant Science, Hunter's Honey Farm and Not Just Popcorn, as well as checking out the many exhibitors at the FFA Career Expo. After Convention, we started our FFA Fruit and Nut fundraiser with delivery before Christmas.

On Halloween night, we sponsored a "Dare to Care" food drive for the Tigerton Food Pantry and collected three boxes of nonperishable food items and personal hygiene products.

In mid-November, most of the agriculture classes assembled and packed 150 Nueske's meat boxes for the Tigerton FFA alumni and supporters fundraiser.

In December, the food science class baked a variety of cookies and homemade fudge for their baking lab, selling a few additional cookie plates. The horticulture class made evergreen wreaths as a class project. Some of the extras were sold and all

On May 7 we will celebrate the accomplishments of our chapter and hope to host a petting zoo at our elementary school with an Agriculture Awareness Day before the school year ends.

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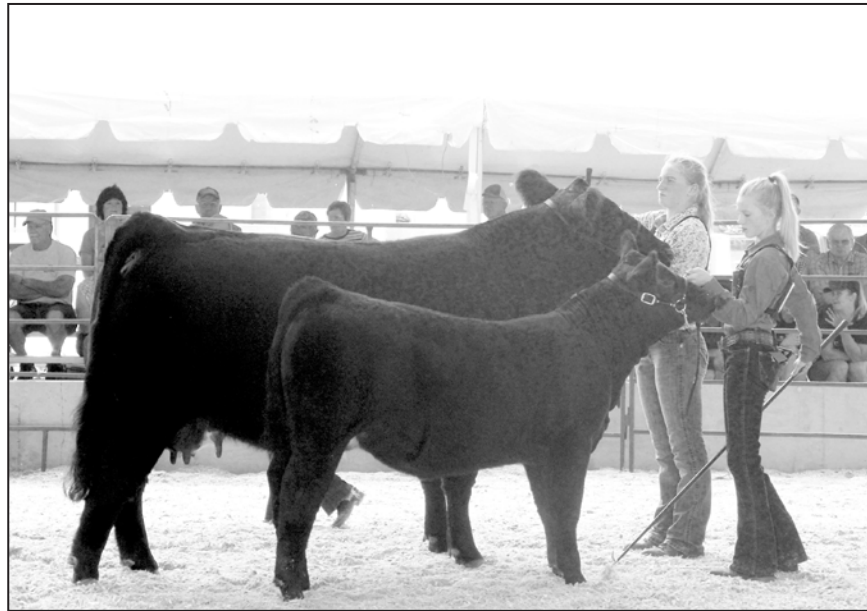

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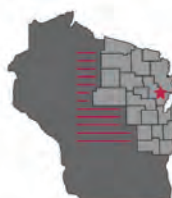
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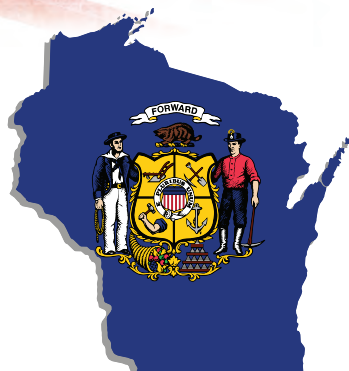
