Rustic Road 74

Florence County between state Highway 139 and state Highway 101 in the town of Fence

This rustic road is a 32.5-mile stretch in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. R-74 passes the former Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) Camp Newald, which operated from 1933-42. The route crosses the Popple River, a Wisconsin undeveloped "Wild River." Sighting a secretive bear, fisher, eagle or many other wildlife species is very possible.

Spread Eagle Barrens

The Spread Eagle Barrens State Natural Area is 7,155

acres rich in plant and animal life. It is open to visitors for hiking, fishing, hunting and berry picking, but there are no official hiking trails. The most noticeable topographic features of the Spread Eagle Barrens are the kettles, or "frost pockets." Every night, cool dense air flows down into the frost pockets. Frost can form in the lower parts of these giant potholes even when it is warm outside the pockets. Sometimes fog forms in their depths and looks like clouds from the rim of the frost pocket. Frost has been recorded in these pockets in all 12 months of the year.

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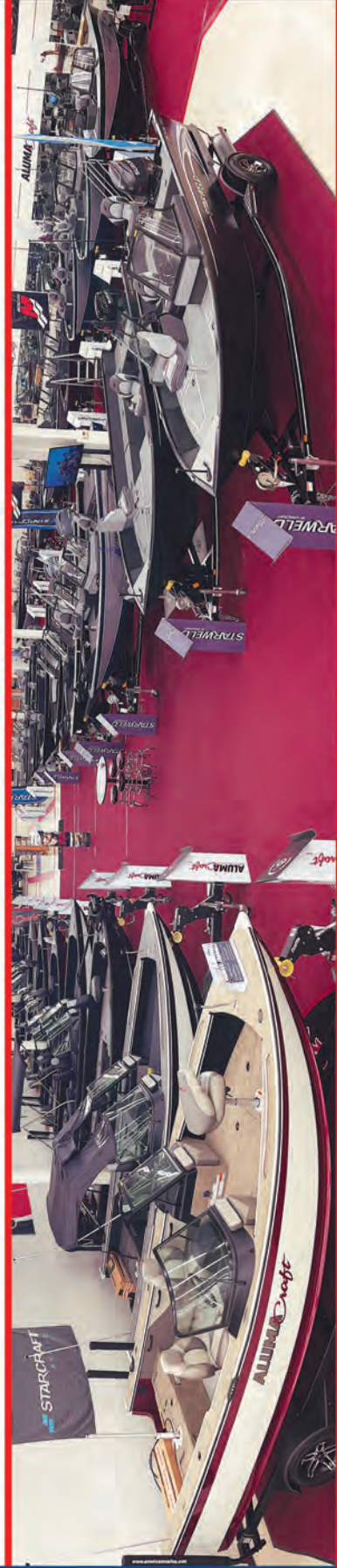

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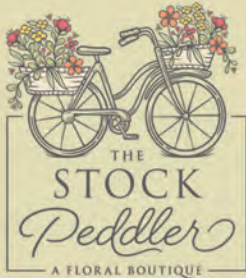
