



CHIEFS' 3-PEAT OR EAGLES' REVENGE?

Super Bowl LIX teams playing at the top of their games

For the second time in three years, the Philadelphia Eagles and Kansas City Chiefs will meet in the Super Bowl. The Chiefs are playing in hopes of capturing their consecutive NFL title. The Eagles are looking for a bit of revenge from two years ago. What will it take for either team to lift the Lombardi Trophy after the game? **Chiefs' offense vs. Eagles' defense** The Eagles' defense helped lead them to the Super Bowl during the 2022 season. Their pass rush was vicious, as they set the team record for sacks that year. The current team is not as good as they were two years ago, but Philadelphia's pass rush is still a weapon for them with Vic Fangio at the controls. Josh Sweat is their leading man with eight sacks on the year. Nolan Smith has had a sack in each of the first three

playoff games, including two against Green Bay in the Wild Card round. The interior of Philadelphia's pass rush is where the money is made. Milton Williams has had a breakout season, and Jalen Carter might be the best defensive tackle in all of football. In the secondary, general manager Howie Roseman was active in addressing a weakness and turning it into a legitimate strength. Quinyon Mitchell was a first-round pick and has emerged as the team's best cornerback. Across from him is Darius Slay, who has been excellent in a complementary role this season. Cooper DeJean has been excellent as a nickelback and had a big pass breakup early in the team's NFC championship win over the Commanders. Perhaps the biggest change the Eagles made on defense was at defensive coordinator.

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When will the Pack be back?
Can LaFleur and the front office get Green Bay into the Super Bowl?

If you've been following the Green Bay Packers since the 1990s, all you've known is great quarterback play. Brett Favre took the reins in 1992. Aaron Rodgers took over for him in 2008. Jordan Love looks to be continuing the lineage with two good seasons after taking over for Rodgers. The three quarterbacks have combined for seven MVP awards, three Super Bowl appearances and two championships. Matt LaFleur was tasked with adding a second

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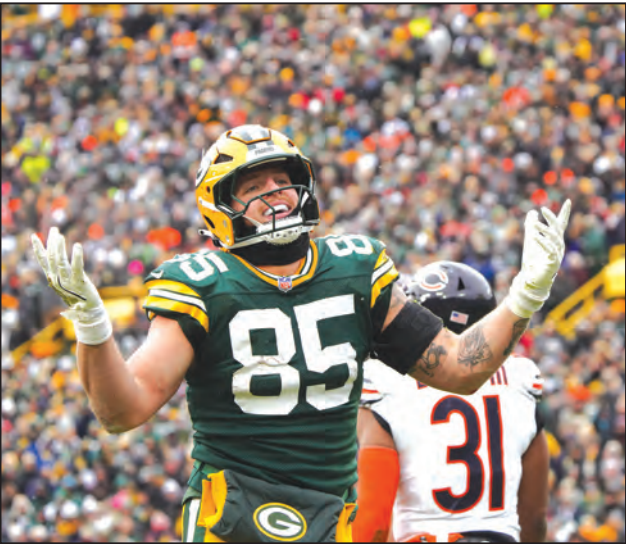
championship to Rodgers' resume, while also getting Love ready to play when his time came. LaFleur succeeded at one of those missions. Love has exceeded expectations, including a big second half of his debut

season as a starter. Despite the overall excellence of LaFleur in the regular season, it has not translated to postseason success. LaFleur has coached in two conference championship games and earned

the number one seed in the NFC playoffs twice but flamed out at home on both occasions. Overall, LaFleur's playoff record is 3-5, including this year's 22-10 loss to the Philadelphia Eagles in the Wild Card round. The disappointment from being one-and-done in the playoffs came on the heels of a year where expectations were high. The year 2023 was a bit of a free roll in a city called Titletown. The Packers had no expectations, so they exceeded them. Making the playoffs was simply good enough in 2023. Anything from there

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Rushing, passing games can't find rhythm

Injuries play major factor in regression

After quarterback Jordan Love got hot to end the 2023-24 season, many within the NFL sphere predicted Green Bay to be one of the highest-powered offenses this past year. With Christian Watson, Romeo Doubs and Jayden Reed at his disposal, Love finished the 2023 season with 32 touchdown passes in his first season as a starter; it seemed like he and the Packers' passing offense as whole were just scratching the surface of what fans could see in 2024. Add into the equation that head coach Matt LaFleur continues to be thought of as one of the best offensive play-callers in the NFL and that Green Bay replaced Aaron Jones with Josh Jacobs. It looked like the Packers were the team to beat in the NFC this season.

In Green Bay's first game in 2024, it looked like the offense had not skipped a beat. Against one of the best defenses in the NFL in Philadelphia, Love completed 17-of-34 passes for 260 yards and two touchdowns. That was before Love went down with

a leg injury. After Love went down, it became obvious that the Packers' philosophy changed, as it became more run-heavy than many would have thought. With Malik Willis under center, Green Bay immediately found a two-headed rushing attack, partnered with Jacobs. Together, the duo led a two-game stretch of 449 combined rushing yards against the Indianapolis Colts and the Tennessee Titans in back-to-back games.

While Love did eventually come back, these two games foreshadowed what the offense came to be this season. On the season, Green Bay ranked fifth in the league with 2,496 rushing yards. On top of that, the team finished with 23 rushing touchdowns, which again ranked fifth in the entire league.

So while the rushing game was certainly the strength of the offense, one has to wonder why the passing game was not able to make that next step. While injuries to Love probably delayed the continued progression of the offense, it seemed that

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Josh Jacobs was a big splash free agent signing in 2024, and he delivered for the Packers. He carried the ball 301 times in the regular season for 1,329 yards and a 4.4 average. Jacobs' longest rush was for 38 yards, which he did Oct. 27 at Jacksonville. He also caught 36 balls for 342 yards, a 9.5 yard average. He had one touchdown, and his longest catch was for 49 yards Nov. 28 against Miami

Defense impresses in first year with Hafley

While Jordan Love and the development of the young offense was the major story surrounding the Green Bay Packers coming into the season, one underrated addition to the team was new defensive coordinator Jeff Hafley. With Hafley manning the defense, fans and sportswriters alike instantly saw a shift in the overall philosophy and scheme, as Green Bay sent a lot more pressure than anyone was accustomed to seeing.

The first stat that really pops out when reviewing Green Bay's defensive season is that it blitzed at the third-highest percentage in the NFL this year. That, in turn, ranked the team as eighth in sacks across the league with 45. On top of that, it was not just one player who was racking up all of the sacks; it was a team effort.

Rashan Gary led the team in sacks with 57.5, but 13 players came away with at least one sack.

That constant pressure and threat of sacks also played a major role in Green Bay's ability to force turnovers this past season. The Packers finished 2024 with 31 turnovers, which ranked third in the NFL. With 14 fumble recoveries and 17 interceptions, the philosophy of sending pressure early and often more than paid off.

One major benefactor and, in turn, catalyst of the defense was the addition

of defensive back Xavier McKinney. McKinney anchored a strong pass defense, leading the team in interceptions with eight and finishing second in the NFL, only behind Detroit's Kerby Joseph.

"I thought there was an incredible amount of growth, to be honest with you, in terms of maybe a vision of what we wanted to do and where we went to," said LaFleur, on Hafley's first season coaching the defense. "You make the necessary adjustments and you put your guys in position, and then ultimately, those guys have to go out there and execute."

On top of McKinney, Green Bay saw a breakout season from rookie Edgerrin Cooper when Quay Walker went down with an injury late in the season. Over the final three games of the season,

Cooper totaled 17 tackles. More than just his performance when Walker went down, Cooper proved that he can lead the defense in play calling.

There is still room for improvement though, as Gary and Lukas Van Ness did not exactly take the next step in becoming the great pass rushing duo in the NFL. Along with that, Kenny Clark also was not as effective as he was probably needed to be, especially against the run-heavy teams that Green Bay lost to — including the Philadelphia Eagles, Minnesota Vikings and Detroit Lions.

In what seemed to be a developmental year for the defense coming into the season, it is fair to say that it more than impressed, even with injuries to star players like Jaire Alexander. On the season, Green Bay ranked sixth in the NFL in points given up this season, allowing 20 points per game to opposing teams.

While again, it was the offense that was supposed to make the jump this season, it turned into the defense really becoming the strong part of the season. Given the likely additions to the pass rushing and defensive backs units, there should be high expectations for the defense going into next season. Based off this past season, that should be very exciting for Packers fans.

"I thought Hafley did an outstanding job," LaFleur said. "And it is not just Hafley; it is our entire defensive staff."

injuries to Doubs and son did not help the cause. With the injury concerns after the last two seasons and the overall lack of star play, could adding a playmaker be in the cards for the offseason? Maybe, but as it stands, LaFleur still likes the group of pass catchers around Love.

“I think that our collection of receivers is pretty darn good,” said LaFleur. “I think that we have six guys that we can definitely lean on. I love the group; I think that they work their tails off. I do think that there is a lot more out there for them. We have to be a lot more consistent. We have to make sure that when given those opportunities, we come down with that football.”

Whether it is bringing in a veteran or supplementing the receiver room in the upcoming draft, one thing is certain – the passing game as a whole needs to be better for Green Bay’s offense to really be thought of as one of the better units in the league.

While the stats may be a little misguided due to the injuries surrounding the team, Green Bay finished 16th in the NFL in passing yards with 3,939. When looking at 2023, the team finished with 4,210 passing yards, good for 14th in the NFL.

While those numbers do look good, one thing stands out: As a whole, the passing offense did not get better this past season. Did a strong rushing attack have an impact on that? Of course. But again, with such high expectations on where Love and the group of pass catchers should have been this season, the passing attack and probably the offense as a whole can be seen as tad disappointing.

0-3 could have been much to overcome for Green Bay

A backup quarterback is like a good lawyer. You never know that you need one until you really need one.

The Green Bay Packers have neglected the backup quarterback position over the years.

If it was not a first round pick like Aaron Rodgers or Jordan Love, chances are that the backup was a journeyman or a late round draft pick the Packers were hoping to develop.

Occasionally that worked with someone like Matt Flynn, but more often than not the backup situation has been a point

of contention.

Brian Gutekunst neglected the position a season ago with Jordan Love taking over as the team's starting quarterback.

Sean Clifford was the team's backup. A fifth-round pick that was a rookie.

Clifford never had to play as Love was able to start all 17 games in his "rookie" season.

Michael Pratt was added in the draft last offseason to compete with Clifford for the backup role.

Both Clifford and Pratt were lackluster in the preseason, which led to Gutekunst making a trade as training camp ended.

He traded a seventh-round pick to the Ten-

nessee Titans for Malik Willis.

Willis did not have much time to get acclimated. He was on the team for less than a month when Love went down with a knee injury that would impact the next two games.

Willis was asked to help save the season of a team that had already fallen to 0-1 on the year.

Backup quarterbacks are hoping to keep teams afloat when they are asked to play.

Losing is not unexpected. Backups are, in fact, backups for a reason.

Willis could not afford to lose the games he was asked to play.

An 0-2 start would put the Packers in a large amount of trouble, and

0-3 could end the season before it even began.

Instead, Willis was efficient, confident and calm.

Those are not words used to describe him during his time in Tennessee.

Sometimes a situation is what makes all the difference for a young quarterback.

Willis' first start as a Packer was a 16-10 victory over the Indianapolis Colts.

Willis was asked to make two big plays in the passing game, and he made them.

The following week in his revenge game against his former team, he did more against the Titans, as the Packers won in a rout.

"I just cannot articulate the job that he's done

in this short period of time," LaFleur said after the game. "People can't fathom it. I promise you, you guys don't get it. I know you think you got it, but you don't get it. What he's been able to do, I've never seen something like this."

"Hats off to him, hats off to everybody around him, guys rallying, having his back. I think Tom Clements does a great job. And I'd be remiss to say Connor Lewis and Sean Mannion, just the help they've given him, the support. Jordan Love has been instrumental, as well, giving him the tips and hanging right by his side and helping him out all along the way."

Willis would win a

third game against the Jacksonville Jaguars with a big throw late to Jayden Reed to set up a game-winning field goal.

Willis would play most of the season finale against the Chicago Bears, and helped lead a go-ahead drive for a field goal before the Bears orchestrated a game-winning drive of their own.

Getting the Packers to 3-1 in the four games he was asked to play had to be more than what the Packers ever could have hoped for.

The Packers will have Willis under contract for the 2025 season and would be wise to keep him, because you never know when you'll need a good backup quarterback.

Special teams provides mixed results in 2024

While there certainly have been other reasons why Green Bay has seemingly underperformed in the playoffs throughout the Aaron Rodgers era, one thing certainly stood out - special teams.

Those problems continued to persist in Jordan Love's first season as a starter, as rookie kicker Anders Carlson made 27 of 33 field goals on the season, including 34 of 39 extra points. On top of that, Carlson struggled in the kickoff game. He kicked off 86 times but was only able to record 37 touchbacks, coming out to a 43 touchback percentage.

Green Bay's kicking unit drastically improved in 2024 though as after an off-season of questioning and a few weeks of Brayden Narveson, Green Bay landed on Brandon McManus. McManus instantly provided production for the Packers, winning them two games on last-second field goals.

More than just the game-winning kicks for Green Bay's special teams was the kick defense. In a tight game with Chicago

on Nov. 17, the Bears lined up for a game-winning field goal. Packers defensive lineman Karl Brooks got an early push on the Bears offensive line and got his hand up to block the Bears' game-winning attempt and win the game. This was the first game in a long time that Green Bay recorded a win because of its special teams, not in spite of it.

In Rich Bisaccia's third season as Green Bay's

special teams coordinator, some aspects of the unit improved, while others continued to decline. The aspects that declined reared its head on the kick-off coverage team. In 2024, the Packers gave up the third most kickoff yards at 1,323. While those kickoffs yards were somewhat masked by the Packers' defense this season, giving teams starting field position beyond the 30-yard line is a slippery slope

moving forward. To add to the list of problems with the special teams unit, it seemed like that part of Green Bay's game suffered a bit of a collapse in the team's Wild Card matchup against the Philadelphia Eagles. The game immediately started with a fumble on a kick return from Keisean Nixon that gave the Eagles prime scoring position early in the game. Later on in the game, finding itself down

10-0, Green Bay had the opportunity to cut the lead to one score, but McManus missed a 38-yard field goal. "I think that the fundamental part of alignment, assignment, key, technique, your eyes being in the right place, to some degree being fundamentally sound in the things that you are doing - it is certainly not the time a lot or trick-em type," said Bisaccia, on what the most important thing about

special teams during the playoffs is, when talking to media before Green Bay's playoff game. "(It is) to be fundamentally sound and put yourself in the right position at the right time. You know, this time of year you would really like to stay away from the penalties."

Special teams in the playoffs once again proved to be the Achilles' heel for Green Bay as it looked to advance to the Super Bowl. Not that the team lost because of the special teams unit, but it just goes to show how important that unit is when making a playoff push, especially when those points that Bisaccia made aren't coming to fruition.

Even though those problems presented themselves throughout the season, Bisaccia was re-signed on an extension to keep him in Green Bay through the 2026 season.

With the continued disappointment from the special teams, many teams probably would have moved on from its special teams coordinator, re-signing Bisaccia was probably the right decision for Green Bay, just based on his leadership capabilities. Overall, it is hard to give the Packers special teams anything better than a B- grade on the season, because while there were some good aspects, there are a lot that need to continue to improve if the Packers want to get back to the Super Bowl.

Packers finally find kicker

After a season with inconsistent play from the kicking position, Green Bay went the route of bringing in competition in the offseason to secure the kicker position. That came in the form of signing Greg Joseph to compete with Anders Carlson throughout training camp.

That seemed to be the biggest story of the offseason, as the Packers were supposed to be on the precipice of winning the Super Bowl. Bringing in competition seemed like the right move at the time. It turned out that Green Bay did not go either way and signed out of house, bringing in Brayden Narveson, who was with the Tennessee Titans through the offseason.

When the Packers brought in Narveson, it seemed like the right move, given that Carlson probably needed to go, just given the circumstances around his inconsistent play from the season before. In his time in Green Bay, Narveson wasn't necessarily relied on, as Green Bay's early season schedule was pretty easy. Good thing that Narveson did not need to be relied upon, as his time

in Green Bay was just as tumultuous as Carlson's. Narveson converted 12 of 18 field goals. On top of that, out of his 38 kickoffs, he was able to kick just 18 for touchbacks. Seeing the inconsistency in the kicking game, Packers general manager Brian Gutekunst elected to sign Brandon McManus.

The signing came as a little bit of a surprise given McManus' history of alleged sexual assault. After the NFL declared that there was insignificant evidence to support the sexual assault claims, McManus was listed as free agent. After signing with the Packers, the case was marked as resolved with no other information provided.

McManus instantly made an impact as he converted two game-winning field goals to push Green Bay close to the top of the NFC. On the season, McManus converted 20-of-21 field goals, with a long of 55 yards. He also went perfect on extra points hitting 30 of 30 attempts.

Even though the kicking game looked a lot stronger this past season, there were still some issues when it came to when snaps, as well as McManus' distances. While 55 yards being a season long

is great, there seemed to be some hesitation from Matt LaFleur on kicking long field goals.

The major question surrounding McManus now is if he comes back next season. It seems likely that he is a priority for Gutekunst given the stability he provided this season.

"I had a good conversation with him before he left and obviously you guys saw how he solidified that journey that we were going on," said Gutekunst, on the possibility of re-signing McManus. "I think the thing that was so neat about being around him is not only his confidence, but his ability to adjust, no matter where we were or what weather we had. If we were able to get Brandon back, I think certainly that would make me feel very good about that group."

If it does not work out where the Packers have to look a different way for kicker next season, it seems likely that Gutekunst goes the route of signing another veteran given the success from what happened last season. With what Gutekunst said though, it is probably inevitable that McManus kicks for the Packers again next season.

had the Packers playing with house money. Beating the Dallas Cowboys and taking the top-seeded San Francisco 49ers to the brink of elimination changed the calculus.

The Packers were thinking Super Bowl just one year into a rebuild.

At times, the team looked like they were hitting their stride, but the story of the season can be told by three opponents – the Detroit Lions, Minnesota Vikings and Philadelphia Eagles.

They fell behind 28-10 to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers with a series of uncharacteristic mistakes and questionable coaching decisions.

The 2021 team did the same against the 49ers

before a blocked punt ultimately sunk their season.

The Packers were not better than this year's Eagles team that eliminated them in the postseason, but they were expected to be.

Instead, the final month of the season sealed the team's fate.

Green Bay was trending downward as the season came to a close. That culminated with a loss to the Chicago Bears where LaF-



leur insisted the team was attempting to gain some momentum going into the postseason, only to make decisions that flew in the face of that mission.

Josh Jacobs hardly played. Kenny Clark was in and out of the lineup. Jordan Love started and injured his elbow.

It was a bizarre series of events. Ultimately, Chicago won on a walk-off field goal by Cairo Santos.

Once the season ended, Tucker Kraft essentially said that the team got what was coming to them, that they could feel their struggles brewing.

The question is why? Why did a young team plateau and ultimately decline as the season went on? Why was LaFleur as conservative as he was throughout the season?

Aggression has been rewarded in this postseason. Andy Reid and Nick Sirianni are two of the

more aggressive coaches in football, especially on fourth down. They'll face off on Super Bowl on Sunday.

LaFleur was one of the most conservative in football this season.

Perhaps that controversial decision to kick a field goal trailing by eight against Tampa Bay in the 2020 NFC Championship Game will be his lasting legacy.

A good coach but not aggressive enough to find his way over the hump.

The 2025 season is a big year for LaFleur and the Packers.

In a city named Titletown, there are no more years without expectations. The Packers are expected to win.

Brian Gutekunst said himself it was time they started competing for championships.

That starts with the man in charge, LaFleur.

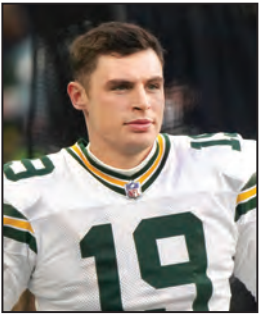

Who will stay, and who will go?

Packers GM expected to go shopping in free agent market

The Super Bowl is upon us, and the Green Bay Packers are not playing in it.

The Packers were eliminated shortly after the playoffs began with a 22-10 loss at the hands of the NFC champion Philadelphia Eagles.

Once the season was over, all eyes turned to the offseason.

The Packers did some of their best work last off-season. General Manager Brian Gutekunst's three best moves came before the regular season began.

Xavier McKinney and Josh Jacobs were brought in to solidify the back-fields on both sides of the ball.

Both players fit seamlessly into their roles and

were stars on offense and defense.

The other big move was a small trade for a backup quarterback. Malik Willis was one of the best moves of the season in general, winning three of the four games he had to play extended minutes in.

That doesn't include a draft class that included Edgerrin Cooper and Evan Williams.

With the offseason upon us, the question now is who is staying and who is going?

The Packers had some tough draft classes in 2020 and 2021. The only player who is a slam dunk to be on the roster in 2025 from the 2020 draft class is Jordan Love.

The 2021 class is the group slated to be free agents now.

The biggest free agent, however, is someone who

was not in this draft class.

Kicker Brandon McManus was another small move made by Gutekunst during the season, and he paid off in a big way.

Replacing Mason Crosby proved to be no easy task. Anders Carlson was given the leash of an entire 2023 season before being let go at the end of training camp.

Greg Joseph was the presumptive winner of the offseason kicking competition, but that lasted all of one day.

Brayden Narveson was brought in and released before Halloween.

McManus was Gutekunst's fourth crack at attempting to replace the franchise's all-time leading scorer.

As it turns out, the fourth time was, in fact, the charm.

McManus missed one

kick during the regular season for Green Bay and solidified the position.

He ended with a whimper, missing a 38-yard field goal in Philadelphia, but with the issues Green Bay has had at that position, they should be more than eager to give McManus a deal to stay in Green Bay.

"We would," Gutekunst said in his end-of-year availability when asked if the Packers want McManus back next year. "Had a good conversation with him before he left. Obviously, how he solidified that journey (at kicker) we were going on. He's a veteran guy."

The thing that was so neat about being around him was not only his confidence but his ability to adjust, no matter where we were, what weather we had."

Apart from McManus,

there are not a lot of free agents that represent priorities to be brought back to Green Bay.

Eric Stokes was the team's first-round pick in 2021, but his career in Green Bay appears to be over. He played six snaps in the final two games of the year, despite being healthy.

Stokes never found his footing after a gruesome leg injury suffered in his sophomore campaign.

He was passed on the depth chart by Keisean Nixon and Carrington Valentine.

A.J. Dillon is a popular figure in Wisconsin but unlikely to be brought back to Green Bay after a neck injury ended his season.

The only free agents other than McManus that could be a priority is defensive tackle T.J. Slaton

and center Josh Myers.

Myers was referred to as a heart and soul player by coach Matt LaFleur during the season. Gutekunst said he felt Myers had his best year.

He's had more downs than ups during his career, but perhaps the Packers will opt for stability at their pivot position.

Slaton had his best year as a Packer and was the anchor of the team's run defense. How much is that worth in free agency? That remains to be seen, but the Packers could certainly look to keep him in the fold. They don't really have a two-down run defender on their defensive line, which is where Slaton excels.

Overall, the lack of options in house make it likely that Gutekunst will once again go shopping in free agency this offseason.

For the second time in three years, the Philadelphia Eagles and Kansas City Chiefs will meet in the Super Bowl.

The Chiefs are playing in hopes of capturing their consecutive NFL title. The Eagles are looking for a bit of revenge from two years ago.

What will it take for either team to lift the Lombardi Trophy after the game?

Chiefs' offense vs. Eagles' defense

The Eagles' defense helped lead them to the Super Bowl during the 2022 season. Their pass rush was vicious, as they set the team record for sacks that year.

The current team is not as good as they were two years ago, but Philadelphia's pass rush is still a weapon for them with Vic Fangio at the controls.

Josh Sweat is their leading man with eight sacks on the year. Nolan Smith has had a sack in each of the first three playoff games, including two against Green Bay in the Wild Card round.

The interior of Philadelphia's pass rush is where the money is made. Milton Williams has had a breakout season, and Jalen Carter might be the best defensive tackle in all of football.

In the secondary, general manager Howie Roseman was active in addressing a weakness and turning it into a legitimate strength.

Quinyon Mitchell was a first-round pick and has emerged as the team's best cornerback.

Across from him is Darius Slay, who has been excellent in a complementary role this season.

Cooper DeJean has been excellent as a nickelback and had a big pass breakup early in the team's NFC championship win over the Commanders.

Perhaps the biggest change the Eagles made on defense was at defensive coordinator.

Jonathan Gannon left the Eagles after their Super Bowl appearance to be the head coach of the Arizona Cardinals.

The Eagles replaced him with Sean Desai, who was eventually replaced by Matt Patricia during the season.

Neither of those options worked well, and the Eagles hired former Packers' nemesis, Vic Fangio.

Fangio facing off against Patrick Mahomes and Andy Reid is one of the better matchups in the Super Bowl.

On the other side of the field, it's familiar territory at this point.

Mahomes and the Kansas City Chiefs are back in the Super Bowl for the fifth time in six years.

This time around, they're playing for history. No team in the Super Bowl era has won three consecutive Super Bowls.

Others have come close, but none have accomplished it.

Mahomes is also playing for legacy purposes. A win in this Super Bowl would be his fourth championship, tying him with Terry Bradshaw and Joe Montana for second among quarterbacks behind only Tom Brady.

This Chiefs' offense is solid, if unspectacular.

It's not like the days where Tyreek Hill ran deep through the secondary or Travis Kelce made one big play after another.

They're methodical, and they execute. In fact, they're similar to the New England Patriots of old in that they are chasing individual and team legacies.

Kelce is still around and is the team's leading receiver.

Xavier Worthy and Marquise "Hollywood" Brown are their two best receivers and give juice to the passing game for plays down the field.

JuJu Smith-Schuster is a potential red zone target, while their ground game is

Ultimately, the Chiefs' offense remains dangerous because of the two men that are at the controls. Reid and Mahomes.

Chiefs' defense vs. Eagles' offense

Philadelphia's offense is led by Jalen Hurts. Hurts had a down year last year after a near MVP season in 2022. He's had a better season in the 2024 regular season and had not played after the first quarter of a late December game against Washington thanks to a concussion.

AJ Brown and Devonta Smith combine for one of the best receiver combinations in all of football. Dallas Goedert has had a big postseason and was the leading receiver in the NFC Championship Game.

The big addition to the Eagles' offense this off-season was running back Saquon Barkley.

Barkley's talent alone was tantalizing in this offense, but he has run all over any opposing defense that has been in his way this year.

asked to play in an emergency situation. That situation arose when Landon Dickerson exited the game with a knee injury.

With the layoff, both players should be able to play.

Special teams

Philadelphia's special teams has enjoyed a big postseason. They forced a fumble in two of their three playoff games and recovered both of them. Both fumble recoveries led to touchdowns in the Wild Card and Conference Championship rounds.

Will Shipley is likely to be the kickoff returner if Kenneth Gainwell is unable to play due to an injury suffered in the NFC Championship Game.

The big question mark for the Eagles is at kicker. Jake Elliott had been rock solid for the duration of his career, until this season.

He struggled during the regular season and missed the first postseason field goal of his career in the conference championship game.

He's 1-for-8 on the year in kicks that are longer than 50 yards.

In a game where points are going to be at a premium, the Eagles cannot afford to give points away

in the kicking game.

Their punt return team will need to be shaken up as well, after getting hit up for a fake punt in their previous game.

Overall, the Eagles' special teams is solid if unspectacular. The goal here will just to be sure that the kicker makes his kicks.

The Chiefs' special teams had a big night against the Buffalo Bills in the conference championship round.

Nikko Remigio had a nice night that included a 41-yard punt return.

Harrison Butker has not been as good this year as he's been in recent years but has been nails in the postseason.

In a game of this magnitude, the kicking game can be a deciding factor.

Something else that plays into special teams is how aggressive both teams are on fourth down.

The Eagles and Chiefs both were in the top four of conversions on fourth downs during the season.

A failed fourth-down conversion is similar to a turnover in these big games. Whatever team is better in situational football could be the one that is raising the Lombardi Trophy at the end of the night.
