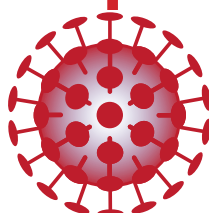

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Consultant hired for school Oconto Falls buildings study

Main focus future of Washington Middle School

OCOnton FALLS — Madison-based Nexus Solutions has been hired to conduct a study of Oconto Falls School District facilities, with an eye toward a potential referendum on the future of aging Washington Middle School.

Superintendent Dean Hess told the school board May 11 that Nexus “comes highly rated from school districts throughout the state of Wisconsin.”

Oconto Falls has been working for several years toward a decision on whether to replace or repair Washington, which is more than a century old at its core with a sizable addition

built in the late 1950s. The district purchased land last year across County Road I from the existing high school and elementary school as a potential new school site.

Administrators reviewed requests for proposals and conducted interviews with three qualified companies or agencies, Hess said. The others were CESA 10 — each cooperative education service agency in the state has a specialty, and the one based in Chippewa Falls specializes in audits of physical plants, Hess said — and Hoffman Planning Design and Construction Inc., an Appleton company the district has worked with in the past.

The agreement with Nexus applies only to the facilities review and does not represent a commitment to continue with the company through the planning and/or construction process, he said.

“It doesn’t in any way require us to continue forward with Nexus if we get through the audit process and for

whatever reason decide to go with a different company,” Hess said.

The facilities audit is expected to help the board make a decision not just on Washington Middle School but all upcoming capital needs.

“The district will receive feedback on the condition of not only the middle school but other facilities, which not only help us to gain a better understanding of the capital needs but it also provides us with an end product that’ll help us for our capital work over the next 10 years,” Hess said.

After the board voted unanimously to approve Nexus, Hess said administrators were impressed by the other two candidates.

“We just want to mention that all three did a nice job and this doesn’t preclude the district from potential of working with either one of these other options in the future should the need arise,” he said.

County releases reopening guidelines No further local extensions at this time

The Oconto County Public Health Department released a four-page set of guidelines May 15 to assist business, individuals and event organizers in reopening while remaining vigilant of the coronavirus threat.

“We appreciate the great sacrifice from Oconto County businesses and residents as we move through the COVID-19 pandemic,” said Debra Konitzer, Oconto County health officer. “We have full confidence in our businesses and residents that they will implement these guidelines in order to keep their customers and staff safe.”

Through Monday Oconto County had recorded 30 positive tests for

COVID-19, with 940 negative tests and no deaths. Only two new cases had cropped up in a week. The cases were primarily concentrated in the southern corner of the county adjacent to Brown County, where a significant outbreak occurred last month.

Oconto County did not issue an order to extend Safer at Home or any other mandated restrictions after the Wisconsin Supreme Court ruled that the state secretary-designee of health and human services had exceeded her authority by attempting to extend Gov. Tony Evers’ executive order. However, Konitzer said her office continues to reserve the right and duty to take such action in the event COVID-19 overwhelms the health care system

or jeopardizes public health.

“While the order has changed, the virus has not,” she said. “Personal responsibility and accountability are essential to keep the spread of COVID-19 low.”

The guidelines can be found at www.co.oconto.wi.us and include information for bars, restaurants, churches and salons, to name a few. There is also individual guidance for residents which includes frequent hand washing, staying home when sick and wearing a mask in public.

“We are aware that best practices may change over time, and we continue to monitor the situation,” Konitzer said. “We can all do our part to keep Oconto County safe. It’s in our hands, Oconto County.”

One dead after officer-involved shooting near Suring

SURING — One person died in an incident that occurred Sunday evening after Oconto County Sheriff's Office deputies tried to make an arrest in the Suring area.

The Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) is investigating the incident, which occurred shortly after 7 p.m. Sunday at a home along County Road Z in the town of Bagley.

According to a news release from the DCI, the deputies responded to the residence after a person with outstanding felony warrants was reported at that location.

"After receiving consent to search the residence, law enforcement found the subject in possession of a

firearm," the release said. "During the incident deputies deployed deadly force with their firearms, striking the subject."

The person died at the scene, and no one else was injured, the DCI said. Further details, including the person's identity, had not been released as of Tuesday morning.

The involved deputies have been placed on administrative leave, per department policy.

DCI is leading the investigation assisted by the Wisconsin State Patrol Investigative reports to the Oconto County District Attorney when the investigation concludes, a process that usually involves a number of weeks.

No additional details are currently available.

Summer school canceled in Oconto Falls, Gillett

Registration significantly down this spring

OCONTO FALLS — The Wisconsin Supreme Court's decision on extending shelter-in-place orders last week let stand Gov. Tony Evers' executive orders that closed school buildings through the end of June.

The decisions disrupted not only the high school graduation ceremonies, originally scheduled this week and next, but plans to hold summer school starting in mid-June.

After reviewing its options — including an effort to conduct a “virtual” summer school online — the Oconto Falls School Board decided May 11 to cancel this year's sessions planned for the months of June and July.

Superintendent Dean Hess said sign-up for summer school has been significantly lower this year.

Registration for summer school opened April 24, and through early May about 363 slots were taken, said Joanne Michalski,

“At this point last year we would have had over 1,000 to 1,100 spots filled already,” she said.

District policy has traditionally been that a class that draws fewer than eight students will not be offered.

“Most of the classes would not be running in a normal year,” Hess said, adding that the courses that have enough registrants are not ones that would be closing achievement gaps in core areas, like math, science, social studies or language arts.

“If they were, I think that our conversation would have a different flavor,” he said.

The amount of professional development training is expected to be higher than normal this summer as teachers are provided with additional education about teaching in a virtual environment, Hess said.

“We were absolutely building the plane while we were flying it since March 15,” he said. “We'd like to, if possible, be able to land that plane for a few weeks, i.e., a couple months, and be able to do some work on it before we're taking it back off in late August.”

The Gillett School Board voted to cancel summer school for the 2019-20 school year during a special meeting May 7.

Lena is also not running summer school this year, Michalski said, although some school districts closer to Green Bay are going with a virtual option.

a March 20 opening when concerns about the coronavirus pandemic led Gov. Tony Evers to close schools and issue a shelter-in-place executive order.

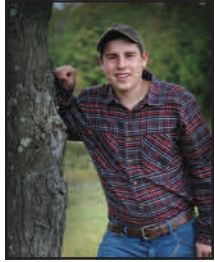

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State: Upgrade RR crossing, this time for sure

Railroad commissioner chides E&LS Railroad for 'obstinate behavior'

MADISON — A sternly worded order from the state Commissioner of Railroads grants a fourth extension for upgrading a crossing in the town of Stiles but suggests enough is enough.

The commissioner's office in 2013 ordered the Escanaba & Lake Superior Co. to install signal lights and gates at the railroad crossing on County Road I, about 80 feet from the intersection with U.S. Highway 141, by the end of 2015.

The 2013 order said the railroad operates about two trains a day through the crossing at a speed of about 25 mph. Two accidents are on record at that location, in 1989 with one injury and in 1993 with no injuries.

Since then the E&LS obtained permission to postpone installation of the crossing gates until the

end of 2017, 2018 and 2019. Matthew Hopkins, signal maintainer for the railroad company, asked in February

that the order be extended a fourth time, to the end of this year.

"The E&LS is finalizing the transition to a new signal contractor, and completion of these projects by the end of 2019 was not possible," Hopkins wrote.

Commissioner of Railroads Yash P. Wadhwa granted the extension but said the company's request lacks credibility.

"The Commissioner has grave concerns that the railroad's attitude about crossing safety is increasing the potential risk of a catastrophic incident at more than the crossing at issue," Wadhwa said in the order. "This is not an isolated incident but a pattern and practice by the railroad that appears to elevate a disdain for maintaining active signals above the public's safety."

The order concludes that the extension to Dec. 31, 2020, is granted to "give the railroad some room to move from its obstinate behavior." After that, "the Commissioner will evaluate all options."

Heavy rains cause minor flooding

Street flooding in Oconto, county highway closed north of city

OCONTO — A heavy rainstorm and strong northeasterly winds Sunday and Monday caused more minor flooding in Oconto County, especially along the bay shore and rivers flowing into the bay of Green Bay.

Stretches of several area streets and roads were closed due to high water, including County Road Y in the town of Little River just north of the city of Oconto. City officials asked residents to restrict water usage for a time Monday night as the wastewater treatment plant struggled to keep up with demand.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Detroit District, announced that Lakes Michigan, Huron, St.

Clair and Erie set new monthly mean water level records for April 2020, which were previously set in 1985 or 1986. All of the lakes are either in their period of seasonal rise or are reaching their peak, as

we continue into the late spring and summer.

During the spring, water levels typically rise on the Great Lakes due to increased rainfall and runoff. In the coming months, the Corps is

predicting water levels will continue to be near or above record high water levels on all of the lakes, except Lake Ontario. Significant erosion and flooding continues in many locations as water levels remain extremely high.

Lakes Michigan and Huron are still projected to peak above last year's levels after a marginal seasonal decline this fall and winter. The Corps is urging people impacted by the high water levels of last year to continue preparing for similar impacts over the next few months.

"During this high water level period, it is rewarding to get out and work with our partners and communities to help alleviate flooding where possible," said Pat Kuhne, emergency manager for the Detroit District. "We are here to provide services within our authorities, to additional communities. Any community or individual homeowner needing assistance should reach out to their county or local emergency manager to so that coordination for assistance with us can begin."

Drive-by parade to replace traditional memorial

OCONTO FALLS — American Legion Post 302 plans a drive-by parade down Main Street in Oconto Falls on Monday as a coronavirus-safe alternative to the traditional Memorial Day ceremony at the city cemetery.

Spokesman Bob Maloney said cars are asked to assemble at East Side Beach starting around 10 a.m. At about 10:45, the group will proceed down North and South Main Street, turning at North Farm Road past the new veterans monument next to the Oconto Falls School

District Office.

A group of about 10 veterans will be stationed at the monument, spaced in accordance with health guidelines, for the parade participants to wave and honk, Maloney said. Arrangements were worked out with city administration and health officials.

Most Memorial Day observances, which usually attract a crowd, have been suspended this year in recognition of federal and state guidelines that caution against large gathering. Oconto County Veterans Services Officer Ron Christensen said.

Oconto Falls senior has state dreams dashed

OCONTO FALLS — In some high school sports, senior seasons are sometimes the best chance for an athlete or team to make deep post-season runs. For weight throwers in track and field, that's the case for a lot of athletes, and Oconto Falls High School's Colton Rohr was hoping that was the case for him.

The senior, who specialized in discus, was preparing to make a run to state this spring, but the COVID-19 pandemic eliminated that thought.

Rohr, who tore the ACL and menisci in both his knees during his time in high school, made it to sectionals in discus as a junior, placing seventh. He qualified for sectionals after taking fourth at the Oconto Falls regional.

Q: When did your interest in track and field begin?

A: My interest started in probably the seventh grade. I started off with football coming in to sixth and seventh grade, and then I did basketball. Then I learned about track and field and fell in love after that.

Q: What is your favorite part about the season?

A: Definitely competing in discus toward the end of the year, whenever the big meets came up.

Q: What did track and field teach you over the years?

A: It definitely taught me patience, of being able to learn and master the art of competing in the thing you do. Like discus, you got to learn patience of the spin. It took a lot of patience and learning not to rush things and get each step done correctly.

Q: Talk about your emotions when the season was officially canceled.

A: I pretty much felt shocked. I didn't really believe it. I was told, "Oh, you'll be back in a couple

weeks, no problem." And then finally the WIAA came out and said, "Yup, no. Cancel everything."

I didn't believe it at first. But after a couple weeks, it's kind of sunk in, and I realized everything I worked for is kind of gone. But in the end, I realized you just got to get over it and find something else to do with my time, like work or hang out with friends — anything to get my mind off of it.

Q: Is it maybe more disappointing to not get a season because you were a senior?

A: Yeah, it's extremely disappointing because I believe this would have been my state run (in discus). Last year, I ended up taking seventh at our sectional meet — which to me, I thought was amazing after the past two years before that of how hard of a time I had with having two knee surgeries and finally working my way back up. This year all the seniors (from the sectional meet) graduated, and I had a straight run for state. So it hurts a lot missing out on that.
