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Most child abuse charges dismissed for lack of specifics

Prosecutors have the right to refile the charges against Victor Alberts

An Oconto County judge dismissed all but two of the child abuse charges against a Lena man on Feb. 15 after his defense attorney argued the criminal complaint is not specific enough.

Victor Alberts, 55, Lena, was charged with five counts of child abuse-intentionally causing harm, five counts of causing mental harm to a child, five counts of child abuse-high probability of great harm and one misdemeanor count of battery, in connection with incidents alleged to have occurred between 2004 and 2018.

Attorney Alf Langan argued that 14 of the 16 counts allege Alberts committed some crime “on or between January 1 [year] and Dec. 31 [year].” In

his motion to dismiss those charges, Langan said the state needs “to make an offer of proof for each count and demonstrate how that particular evidence is relevant to that particular count.”

Langan added that not one of the five counts of causing mental harm to a child identifies an alleged victim as required by law. The allegations involve several children, according to the narrative in the criminal complaint.

“If Victor does not know who he is supposed to have harmed, he cannot prepare a defense to the charge,” Langan wrote.

Judge Jay N. Conley granted the motion, dismissing the 14 charges “without prejudice,” which means prosecutors may redraft the complaint and refile the charges at a future date.

If he had dismissed the counts “with prejudice,” the state would be prohibited from refileing.

The remaining charges accuse Alberts of child abuse intentionally causing harm, in connection with a specific incident that allegedly occurred April 30, 2012, and the misdemeanor battery count, in connection with an incident alleged to have occurred July 29, 2018.

Alberts remains in custody in lieu of \$100,000 cash bond but, more importantly, he was sentenced last month to three years in state prison, followed by three years of extended supervision, for child abuse in connection with an incident that occurred in 2020.

Conley scheduled a status conference in the case for April 12.

Suring School Board meets to discuss strip searches of students

The Suring School Board scheduled a special, closed meeting for 5 p.m. Feb. 23 to discuss the recent searches of students and resulting legal actions.

The agenda calls for discussion of a “specific personnel matter involving district employee,” “Consideration of specific pupil behaviors that involve confidential pupil record

information,” and conferring with an attorney regarding a Notice of Circumstances of Claim against the district.

The official notice carries a disclaimer that the agenda does not include a public comment period: “As a result, there will be no opportunity for the community to speak at this meeting. In addition, the board will not make any public comments at this time and will not be granting interviews.”

At least six girls were ordered to strip to their underwear to be searched after they were caught vaping in January. Oconto County District Attorney Ed Burke declined to press charges, saying the incident did not meet the legal definition of a strip search, but parents have hired an attorney to seek civil recourse.

At-home, COVID-19 testing kits will be made available to Oconto County residents for free, while supplies last, at the HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital Prevea Mountain Health Center on Feb. 28.

The kits will be distributed from

10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Feb. 28 through the drive-through service at the center, 14353 State Highway 32-64 in Mountain.

The testing kits are available to Oconto County residents only; a driver's license/ID is required to

confirm residence. There is a limit of four test kits per family.

The U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration COVID-19 Testing Supply Program is providing these at-home tests to rural health clinics in underserved areas.

Gillett using trial run vape detectors

The Gillett School District is currently going through the process of using trial run vape detectors in the secondary school.

Gillett Secondary School Principal Shawn Limberg explained the equipment to the school board during its Feb. 17 meeting.

"I got information from a neighboring school district that had success using trial units to identify some areas

of concern at certain times of the day," said Limberg.

Limberg said that he was intrigued by this because he has not heard of these vape-detecting devices before. He added that he has spoken to officials in other school districts asking about the effectiveness of the devices.

"There are a number of districts in the area that do use them," said Limberg.

After receiving two of the vape detectors, Limberg activated them right before the school board meeting.

"I don't know if we are going to make a recommendation to purchase these," said Limberg. "We are just trying to get an idea if this is something that will help building management."

Limberg added that he is trying to use other variations of vape detectors, including ones that are wireless.

"With these, we could get a couple of units that we can move around the building," said Limberg. "It is kind of

just a trial to see where we can go from there."

He said that the devices will be able to monitor the air quality index, temperature, vape index and a noise level.

"Say a fight or something breaks out, I can set a threshold, where it can sense a certain decibel level and notify me," said Limberg.

The school district will trial these vape detectors for 90 days.

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OCONTO COUNTY CIRCUIT COURT

Proceedings of Feb. 18

Alisha M. Kocken, 29, Oconto Falls, pleaded not guilty by reason of mental disease or defect to charges of attempted first-degree intentional homicide, first-degree recklessly endangering safety, resisting an officer causing substantial bodily harm, battery to a law officer, aggravated battery, disarming a police officer and misdemeanor counts of intentionally pointing a firearm at a person, discharging a firearm within 100 yards of a building and disorderly conduct, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Aug. 6. Kocken is accused of shooting and wounding Oconto Falls Police Officer Nicole Blaskowski during an incident at Kocken's apartment complex. A hearing was scheduled for May 6.

William A. Riskus, 37, Oconto, was sentenced to one year in prison, followed by one year of extended supervision consecutive to any other sentences, for felony bail jumping and misdemeanor resisting or obstructing an officer, in connection with an incident that occurred July 12. Additionally, Judge Michael T. Judge imposed and stayed a further jail term and placed Riskus on four years of proba-

tion for possession of methamphetamine, in connection with an incident that occurred Feb. 7, 2021. Judge ruled that Riskus is eligible for the Substance Abuse Program, which can lead to early release upon successful completion. During his extended supervision and probation, Riskus must maintain absolute sobriety and enroll into and successfully complete all treatment deemed appropriate by the Department of Corrections.

Lily Ali Miller, 24, Oconto, was placed on two years' probation after a prison sentence was imposed and stayed for possession of methamphetamine, in connection with an incident that occurred July 23, 2019. Judge ruled that among other conditions, Miller must maintain absolute sobriety and complete all assessments, counseling and treatment deemed necessary by her probation agent.

A jury trial was scheduled for April 26 for Joey E. Kingsley, 41, Oconto, who is charged with escape from criminal arrest, two misdemeanor counts of resisting or obstructing an officer and misdemeanor disorderly conduct, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred May 12, 2021. A final pre-trial conference is set for April 12.

Proceedings of Feb. 17

A bench warrant was issued for Cody A. Dufrane, 31, Milwaukee, after he failed to appear to face charges of operating a motor vehicle without the owner's consent and misdemeanor hit-and-run, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred April 29. Court records indicate Dufrane refused to leave the Brown County Jail, where he is being held on sexual assault and human trafficking charges.

A jury trial was scheduled for May 17 for Shane J. Schreiber, 41, Shawano, after he invoked his right to a speedy trial on charges of possession of methamphetamine, felony bail jumping and misdemeanor possession of drug paraphernalia, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Jan. 3. A final pre-trial conference was scheduled for May 2.

A bench warrant was issued for James Roger Jordan, 68, Suamico, after he failed to appear for a court hearing on charges of possession of methamphetamine and misdemeanor possession of drug paraphernalia, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Feb. 2.

Yannis Vasilis Fotopoulos, 21, Sobieski, pleaded not guilty to receiving stolen property, driving a motor vehicle without the owner's consent and two counts of misdemeanor bail jumping, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred June 3, 2020. A pre-trial conference was scheduled for March 17.

Phleecce K. Young, 20, Oconto, pleaded not guilty to charges of possession of amphetamine with intent to deliver and misdemeanor counts of battery, disorderly conduct and possession of drug paraphernalia, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred June 16. A pre-trial conference was scheduled for March 17.

James W. Badem, 55, Oconto, pleaded not guilty to possession with intent to deliver amphetamine, manufacture and delivery of amphetamine, second-degree recklessly endangering safety and maintaining a drug trafficking place, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Oct. 24. A pre-trial conference was scheduled for April 14.

Veronica M. Floring, 28, Suring, pleaded not guilty to manufacture with intent to deliver THC, possession with intent to deliver THC, maintaining a drug trafficking place and misdemeanor possession of drug paraphernalia, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Oct. 27. A pre-trial conference was scheduled for April 14.

Austin J. Fidler, 24, Suring, pleaded not guilty to first-degree sexual assault (sexual contact with a person under age 13) and second-degree sexual assault of a child, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Dec. 6. A pre-trial conference was scheduled for March 17.

Proceedings of Feb. 15

Marie Faye Malotte, 44, Neenah, was sentenced to three years, six months in prison, followed by four years of extended supervision, for possession with intent to deliver amphetamine, in connection with an incident that occurred March 24, 2020. Judge gave Malotte credit for 693 days already served and ruled she is eligible for the Substance Abuse Program, which can lead to early release upon successful completion. During extended supervision, Judge ordered her to maintain absolute sobriety and enter into, participate in and successfully complete any assessments, evaluations and/or treatment programs as directed by the Department of Corrections.

A March 1 jury trial was canceled and a plea hearing scheduled for April 12 for Martin Cooper, 52, Mountain, on charges of operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated (10th or more offense) and misdemeanor operating while his license was revoked, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Dec. 7, 2020. Several misdemeanor and criminal traffic counts from Forest County will be consolidated with the Oconto County charges.

Proceedings of Feb. 14

John A. Schneider, 36, Lakewood, was placed on two years' probation after a prison sentence was imposed and stayed for intentionally contributing to delinquency, in connection with an incident that occurred June 3, 2020. The probation is to be served after any other sentences. Judge gave him credit for 50 days served in the Oconto County Jail. Among other conditions, Schneider may have no contact with anyone under the age of 18 without the approval of his probation agent. He must also complete all assessments, counseling and treatment deemed necessary by his agent, and he may have no access to or possession of electronic devices with internet access.

Sierra Lynn Wied, 27, Oconto Falls, waived her right to a preliminary hearing and pleaded not guilty to two counts of felony child neglect and two counts of misdemeanor child neglect, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Nov. 23. A pre-trial conference was set for March 18.

Aldona S. Hansel

Aldona Serena Hansel, 90, a longtime Lena resident, passed away peacefully on Friday, Feb. 18, 2022, with her family by her side, while her favorite song, "The Blue Skirt Waltz" was playing in the background. Aldona was so special that she had two birthdays – Aug. 16, 1931 (or Aug. 15, 1931). It's a long story — in the Chicago home of her parents, Albert and Marie (Posanka) Klivickis. She was the oldest of four children and was extremely proud of being 100% Lithuanian.

At a young age, her family moved to Coleman. She excelled academically in school and was a 1949 graduate of Coleman High School. She always looked forward to attending the annual Coleman High School class reunions. Aldona was employed briefly after high school as a telephone operator in Green Bay. Thereafter, she worked as an upstairs maid for a prominent Green Bay family.

They loved to travel and were so proud to have visited all 50 states and several foreign countries, with their final trip together being a cruise through the Panama Canal in 2015. Aldona enjoyed attending the school and sporting events of her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She was extremely proud of each and every one of them. Once she was married, Aldona focused on her role as a homemaker and devoted herself to raising her children and doing farm chores. She was a dedicated volunteer and took her positions as a school chaperone, bloodmobile assistant,

librarian, and election volunteer very seriously.

Her family was extremely blessed to be raised by such a wonderful and feisty woman with a unique sense of humor. She shared in all of our joys, challenges and sorrows. She loved family gatherings and enjoyed being the life of the party. Most of all, she truly loved all her children and always wanted the best for her family. She left us with incredible, priceless memories and a few choice sayings: "It's in my back pocket." "I have eyes in the back of my head." "Go home with the one you went with." "Oh, Fudgsicles."

Aldona finally hit the big jackpot as she is now in heaven with her savior Jesus, the rest of her family and friends who have gone before her, and she is once again dancing the Blue Skirt Waltz with her husband Leonard.

She will be dearly missed by her six children: Michael and Jeanne Hansel, Catherine and Rick Dugan, Teresa and the late John Holowich, Steve and Sandy Hansel, Barbara McClain and Tom Marcusen, and Debra and Steve Westenberg. She is also survived by her grandchildren, Amanda and Cliff, Michele, Marcella and Dan, Melanie and Darin, John L., Joseph and Erin, Sarah and Travis, Elizabeth and Jacob, T.R., Shauna and Matt, Kelsey and Scott, Zachary and Janki, and Alayna.

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Facebook panel discussion looks at health care fraud

Wisconsin Medicare beneficiaries, their families and caregivers are invited to a Facebook Live event focused on learning how to prevent, detect and report Medicare fraud, abuse and errors.

The virtual one-hour event, hosted by Wisconsin Senior Medicare Patrol, will be held on Thursday, March 3 at 11 a.m. A recording will be available for anyone to view after the event. Anyone can view the webinar on the agency's Facebook page, www.facebook.com/WisconsinSeniorMedicarePatrol.

"When Medicare recipients, their families and caregivers are more informed, they are not powerless against fraud, abuse and errors," said Ingrid Kundering, project manager. "The Wisconsin Senior Medicare Patrol provides education, outreach and counseling services to reach as many Wisconsin Medicare beneficiaries as possible," she said, adding, "If you are touched by Medicare in any way, our virtual event on March 3 will be an excellent introduction to preventing, detecting and reporting Medicare issues."

Medicare is the federal health insurance program for people who are 65 or older and certain younger people with disabilities or permanent kidney failure. Over \$60 billion a year is the estimated cost of Medicare fraud, abuse and errors. This cost is borne by Medicare recipients who are paying for services they may not need, or by having their medical identities stolen, and ultimately by all taxpayers. It can also put beneficiaries' health and welfare at risk. Kundering said the Facebook Live event will provide potential solutions

to help mitigate these losses.

Kundering noted that updated information will be made available leading up to the virtual event on March 3. More information will be coming on the Wisconsin Senior Medicare Patrol Facebook page. Information is also available by calling the Wisconsin Senior Medicare Patrol's confidential, toll-free helpline, 888-818-2611.

Super cheap smartphone plans for scrimping seniors

Dear Savvy Senior,

Can you direct me to some really cheap wireless smartphone plans for seniors who don't use much data? I use my smartphone primarily for texting and talking but need some data for checking my email and a few other things when I'm away from Wi-Fi. Right now, I pay \$30 per month but am looking for a better deal.

offered through Boost Mobile (BoostMobile.com). For only \$100 per year (or \$8.33 per month) this plan provides unlimited talk, text and 1 gigabyte of 5G or 4G data each month. If you need more data, their \$150 annual plan (or \$12.50/month) gets you 5 GB.

Boost Mobile uses the T-Mobile and AT&T networks and lets you use your existing phone (if compatible) or buy a new one.

A third option to look into is Mint Mobile (MintMobile.com), which is recommended by Consumer Reports and has one of the best values for a cheap plan. Mint offers a \$15 per month plan (plus taxes and fees) that provides unlimited talk and text, and 4 GB of 5G/4G data each month. They also use the T-Mobile network and will let you use your existing phone (if compatible) or buy a new one.

If your income is low enough, another option you should check into is the Lifeline Assistance Program. This is a federal program that provides a \$9.25 monthly subsidy that could go toward your phone or internet service.

To qualify, you'll need to show that you're receiving certain types of government benefits such as Medicaid, SNAP (food stamps), SSI, public housing assistance, veterans' pension and survivors' benefit, or live on federally recognized Tribal lands. If your annual household

income is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines — \$17,388 for one person, or \$23,517 for two — you're also eligible.

To check your eligibility or apply, visit LifelineSupport.org. If you do qualify, contact a wireless provider in your area that participates in the Lifeline program and sign up for

service with them. You can also ask your current company to apply your Lifeline benefit to a service you are already getting, if it offers the benefit.

Dear Scrimper,

There are several super cheap wireless providers I can recommend for older smartphone users who are looking to save money by paring down their cell phone plan. Here are three of the cheapest options available that you can switch to without sacrificing the quality of your service.

For extremely light smartphone data users, the very cheapest wireless plan available today is through Tello (Tello.com), which lets you build your own plan based on your needs or budget. For as little as \$6 per month, you can get unlimited texting, 100 minutes of talk time and 500 megabytes of high-speed data. Increases in talk time or data can be added in \$1 increments.

Tello uses the T-Mobile network and gives you the option to bring your existing phone or purchase a new device, while keeping your same phone number if you wish. If you want to keep your phone, it must be unlocked. Just enter your phone's ID (press *#06# on your keypad to get it) on Tello's website to make sure that it's compatible with the network.

Another super cheap plan to consider is the annual prepaid plan

Spending a lot of her child and teenage years around the speedway and fairgrounds, Curtin said that the feeling of working here is a little odd.

"I always tell everyone that I never in a million years expected to be in this position," said Curtin. "I feel like it is perfect for me though, because one of my strengths is planning events and I will get a lot of opportunities to do

that here. To be around people is what is most exciting to me."

She also added that this experience for her has been very humbling.

"It is rare that someone my age

is ever put into this position," said Curtin, who is 26. "It is humbling to be in a position, much less a sport, that has been historically male dominated. I have always said that I hope younger girls can look at me and know that they can achieve whatever they set their mind to and be just as successful as males."

Curtin has been in this position since the start of the new year, where she has learned more about the position, as well as met many people. She said that in this position, there are a couple of goals that she wants to meet.

"My biggest thing at the speedway is the kids zone," said Curtin. "The reason I want to focus on it more is because of the memories that I made when I was growing up there. It is really important to get kids involved."

She added that she wants to build a stronger and more cohesive relationship with sponsors.

"I really want to make sure that we have a good relationship with them, because without them and the fans supporting the track, there wouldn't be a track," said Curtin. "Listening to what they want and being adaptable will help to strengthen those bonds."

Curtin said that her relationship with the community and speedway has

"The fair has been here for 140 years, so I want to continue building that relationship between the speedway, fairgrounds and community,

because of my experiences with them," said Curtin.

As for Luepke, he has enjoyed his time showcasing the fair and speedway.

"I was there for seven great years," said Luepke. "I met so many great racers and so many great fans."

Luepke said that this was a job that he was fully committed to for the last seven years.

"You are working seven days a week," said Luepke. "I loved my time there, though."

In this position, Luepke said that he handled sponsorships, promotions and managing awards, along with other duties.

"The list is about four pages long with everything I had to do," said Luepke. "You are definitely the jack-of-all-trades in that position."

He said that during his time there, he formed a lot of friendships and created a lot of memories that will last the rest of his life.

"Building Racing for a Reason was a big one for me," said Luepke. "That became an event where everybody marked on their calendar to be there. I will also have memories of meeting all of the fans, drivers and crews who became a second family to me."

Luepke pointed to finding another job and wanting to spend more time with his family as a reason why he left this position.

"I had another opportunity come, and my daughter graduated high school. That's where it hit me that I missed all of her proms, golf outings and graduations," said Luepke. "I did not want to miss my son's stuff, with him being a sophomore in high school. The biggest reason was to spend more time with my family."

According to Luepke, there were a couple of things that he learned during his time in this position.

"I learned about dedication and hard work, from those people who have been running the speedway and the fairgrounds," said Luepke. "They taught me what it means to be dedicated to one thing and the drive it takes to make something successful. That seven years was big in my life."

He said that he will use what he has learned from his seven years in this position to help him in his next.

"You learn to deal with a lot of different personalities," said Luepke. "I deal with a wide variety of people every day from all over the area. Learning how to deal with diverse people will help me at this new position."

Luepke extended his congratulations to Curtin and said that her background will be a huge success for the speedway and the fairgrounds.

"I think that having her with her background in marketing and racing will be a huge success for the speedway and the fairgrounds," said Luepke. "I think that the Shawano Speedway and the fairgrounds are in good hands."

Menominee collection in New York reviewed

Grignon looks over more than 300 items housed inside American Museum of Natural History

David Grignon, the tribal historic preservation officer for the Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin, is tasked with preserving the cultural heritage of the Menominee people, who have a deep connection to their ancestral lands.

"The Menominees are the oldest continuous residents of Wisconsin," said Grignon.

His department is responsible for any areas of cultural preservation within the ancestral tribal lands that have been the tribe's home for thousands of years.

"We remain on our ancestral lands and owe that to the Menominee chiefs, Chief Oshkosh in particular, who negotiated treaties with the government," Grignon said.

In November 2021, Grignon visited the American Museum of Natural History in New York as the tribe's Native American Graves Preservation and Repatriation Act (NAGRPA) representative. He met with members of the museum's anthropology department to review the more than 300 Menominee items in the museum's collection. NAGRPA allows Indigenous tribes to determine the ownership of cultural items found on federal or tribal land, and in this case, items held in the collections of the American Museum of Natural History.

Meeting with the museum's NAGRPA staff, Grignon reviewed Menominee objects in the Hall of Eastern Woodlands Indians.

"It was kinda sad to see these

items," Grignon said. "I wished they were back (on tribal lands)."

He also went behind-the-scenes to assess sacred and ceremonial pieces. He ceremonially cleansed sacred items in the museum's "smudge room," speaking to them in the Menominee language. The room is an area designated by the museum specifically for use by tribal representatives.

Grignon would like to see some of the ethnographic objects and ceremonial objects returned to the tribe. Menominee tribal elders will consider his recommendations.

NAGRPA requires federal agencies and institutions that receive federal funding to return Indigenous cultural items to Native American tribes. Grignon works with various museums to review collections identified as Menominee and request repatriation of the items to the tribe, as authorized by Menominee tribal elders.

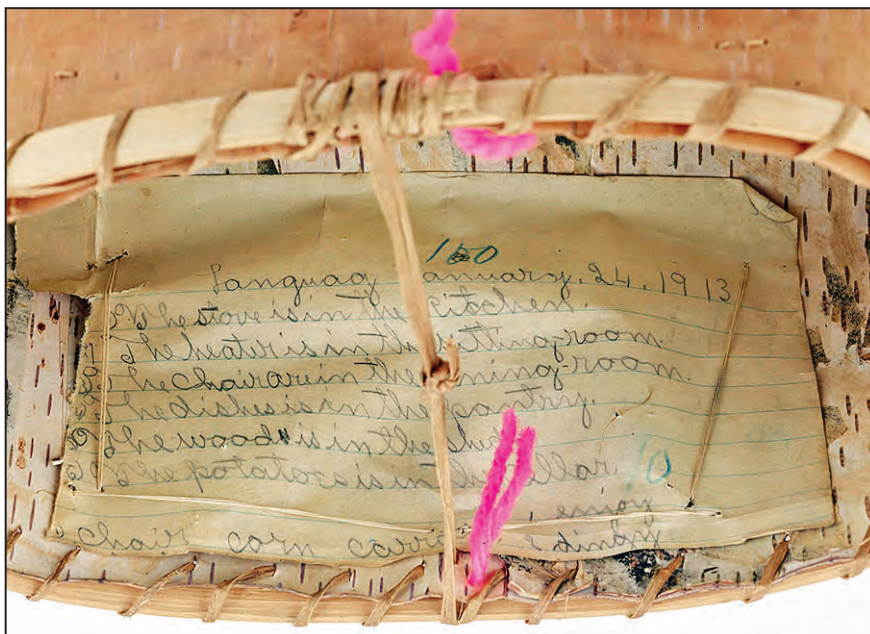
Through his endeavors, Grignon has repatriated more than 200 items, including human remains, from various museums. Human remains returned to the tribe are buried in a special burial ground on the reservation. Ethnographic objects are on display

in the Menominee Cultural Museum in Keshena. Sacred items, such as ceremonial artifacts, charms, medicine bags, etc., are not placed on display.

The act, passed in 1990, requires institutions and museums, such as the American Museum of Natural History, to inventory remains and cultural objects for Native American Tribes and to allow the review and assessment by tribal representatives. A recent inventory prompted Grignon's November visit to the museum.

The Menominee Historic Preservation Department has a staff of three, and relies on numerous volunteers to assist with the preservation work.

Many of the Menominee artifacts at the museum were obtained by Alanson B. Skinner, when he was employed as an anthropologist there in the early 1900s. Some of his writings and pamphlets are held in the Smithsonian libraries. He is viewed as having great success in field work with Indigenous tribes, specifically the Menominee, and brought many artifacts from Wisconsin to the museum. Having the artifacts returned to tribal grounds will continue the cultural preservation efforts of Grignon.

Holsey: Resilience key to tribes thriving

Stockbridge-Munsee president delivers State of the Tribes to Wisconsin Assembly

Resilience is a virtue of Native American tribes in the past and continues to ring true in the present and into the future, according to Shannon Holsey, president of the Stockbridge-Munsee Band of Mohican Indians.

Holsey addressed resilience constantly in her 50-minute address to the Wisconsin Assembly on Feb. 22 as she gave the 18th annual State of the Tribes address. She talked of the tribes' resilience as they faced assimilation and extinction in centuries past, and she told of the continued resilience today as they lead the way in combatting the coronavirus pandemic.

"In spite of the many determined efforts to extinguish our people, we are still here," Holsey said.

Holsey noted that addressing the treatment of Native Americans throughout history is not an easy thing for anyone to hear, let alone acknowledge. She said the country has a history of "genocide, ethnic cleansing, forced removals and brutal assimilationist policies" that make it hard, even today, to give Indigenous peoples the respect and honor they deserve.

"Our discomfort in sharing this painful, collective history pales in comparison to the lived experience that so many Native people endured in the past 530 years," Holsey said.

That history is being threatened, she added, because of a bill going through the Wisconsin Legislature that prohibits critical race theory. Holsey pointed out that accurately teaching history is essential to showing what happened to tribes and should not be removed "for fear of hurting students' feelings."

"It is our view and response as tribal nations that perhaps what is needed is not critical theory but more critical thinking," Holsey said. "To have critical thinking, you have to face the full, natural history head on. As you can see from the many tribal members here today, American Indians are not a people of the past."

Holsey took a shot at sports, cartooning and mascots for being detrimental and degrading to Native Americans. Having native mascots like the Atlanta Braves continues to showcase tribal people as caricatures instead of decent human beings, she said, and it's affecting the

health of tribal youth.

"Low self-esteem factors prominently in suicides, and our teen suicide has been at or near the highest level in the United States for more than a century," Holsey said. "This is a matter of life and death for most Native peoples. It is also the main reason so many of us devote time and energy to ridding sports of these dehumanizing, belittling, objectifying behaviors."

She noted that tribes did not get a religious freedom act from the U.S. government until the 1970s, and action was not taken to allow tribes to recover ancestral remains and cultural artifacts from museums until the 1990s.

"We are still the only segment of society that cannot use the First Amendment to protect our sacred places," Holsey said. "Far too long, Indigenous people have faced discrimination, disrespect, violence and oppressive use of words and imagery. As long as we can be treated badly in this very public way, Native people will continue to be persistently mistreated,

and our collective and individual rights will be at risk."

Holsey also related the hard road tribes have in retaining their traditional languages, noting that those languages link their people to all of their relatives and to the creatures of the world.

"When a language becomes extinct, just like the gray wolf, it can take with it much of our history and the culture of our people who spoke it and continue to revere it," Holsey said. "I cannot stress enough the importance of retaining our tribal languages."

Holsey told the Assembly of some of the positive things going on with tribes. She praised the 11 federally recognized tribes in Wisconsin for "leading the way" in mitigation efforts to curb the coronavirus pandemic and getting their people vaccinated.

"As we struggle with the COVID-19 pandemic and the economic revitalization, Indigenous communities are no longer content to wait for others to make decisions for us. These days are

gone," Holsey said. "Given the tribes' leadership and forward movement during the pandemic to protect not only our communities but the communities around us, I believe there were lessons to be learned from the tribes' responses to the pandemic."

From the beginning, tribal leaders were clear in what needed to be done to protect their communities from the coronavirus, Holsey said, because tribes have had a history with epidemics and pathogens. Tribes organized task forces, developed plans for keeping people safe during societal shutdowns and worked with Gov. Tony Evers to get help from the National Guard to administer virus testing and vaccinations.

"In our small tribal communities, the loss of any citizen is too high of a price," Holsey said. "Losing a single elder ... is like a library burning down, and with it, the loss of our culture, our traditions and our teachings."

Board hears about possible referendum

Consultant says one could be coming in November

A consultant leading a discussion of Shawano School District stakeholders told the Shawano School Board on Feb. 21 that the debate is looking at many ways to fund future renovations, expansions and maintenance, but indicated voters could be asked to approve a referendum in November.

Sue Peterson, a consultant with ISG in Minnesota, noted that it will ultimately be up to the board if it decides to proceed with a referendum, but she constantly referred to it at a work session where she updated the board on meeting with school and community officials that are part of a facilities task force.

"The work that our team is do-

ing, in partnership with the district, is really walking you through a roadmap to referendum," Peterson said during the presentation. "We're going through the community engagement process and doing a facility assessment, finding out what it is that your community will support should you decide to go out for bond."

The presentation did not outline what specifically would be included in a referendum and what amount voters could be asked to approve. Peterson said a final report could be put in front of the board around the end of May.

"The path we have you on is leaving open the option of November of '22 should you choose to go out for it," she said. "The reason for that is you always begin with the end in mind. The soonest it made logical sense for the district to consider a referendum was November of '22."

Peterson added that a referendum could be pushed back to 2023 or beyond.

A review of the schools has been

done to determine what work needs to be done, Peterson noted. The district held a town hall meeting in January that outlined some of the fixes and additions it is looking at over the next 10 years, including renewed plans to improve and expand athletic and fine arts facilities at Shawano Community High School.

The task force of close to 40 people then held its first meeting at the end of January and plans to meet again Feb. 28, according to Peterson.

"This is a group of community leaders that will provide feedback and input as we move through this roadmap, and looking at what are the things that people are thinking or feeling about the needs for the district's facilities," she said.

The Feb. 28 task force meeting is expected to delve into the financial situation of the district and see what condition it's in. The district has previously boasted about having a higher than average fund balance but has also reported that the continuous drop in its student enrollment is expected to result in

less state education aid.

Peterson said the task force will look at each of the schools and determine strengths, weaknesses, threats and opportunities. ISG is also planning to survey school staff to get their assessment on the condition of classrooms and other facilities.

"The idea is to expand that circle of trust and knowledge to deal with the needs of the district, start with the small group and expand on to greater people in the community, telling your story and gathering feedback," Peterson said.

If the board decides in June to proceed with a November referendum, Peterson vowed that ISG would provide the district with a "pre-referendum communication plan" to "educate the community" and "get out that messaging."

The last referendum the district got approved was in November 2015, when it asked voters to approve \$9.25 million to update Shawano Community Middle School.

JR Machine expanding in Shawano

Expansion will open
10-12 new jobs

One local manufacturing business is preparing to open an expansion in Shawano.

JR Machine, which had been a staple in the city since 1992, recently announced that it is working toward an expansion. The expansion will add another 8,000 square feet of production capacity, more extensive quality assurance capabilities and 10-12 more jobs.

“We are a contract manufacturing service company,” said JR Machine CEO Tim Tumanic. “We are currently adding more manufacturing space.”

JR Machine streamlines the process of procuring and producing complex machined parts. The manufacturing services include capabilities like prototyping, engineering, CNC machining, multi-spindle machining, thread rolling, fabrication and assembly, among other services.

Tumanic said that the company is planning to have the expansion ready for use in April. According to Tumanic, JR Machine recently received its aerospace certification, which gives it what’s needed to move forward with the expansion.

“With that, we made a marketing effort with the aerospace and space exploration markets,” said Tumanic. “It would be to service those markets.”

As a part of the expansion, JR Machine will also add four new DMG MORI 2500 turning centers. A turning center is a machine process that is used to make cylindrical parts. These turning centers will help JR

Machine to service customers by doubling its max length of machine parts from 2 feet to 4 feet. The expansion area will also feature a cleaning system to help prevent rusting on the stainless steel parts of machinery.

As the expansion moves forward, Tumanic wants to continue to stay connected with the community.

“Shawano has been where we have operated for years,” said Tumanic. “We have made contributions to the community, and this is where our employees live.”

The contributions to the Shawano community include aiding the technology education programs at Shawano

Community High School and Bonduel High School.

“We will continue to support those,” said Tumanic. “With the expansion, everything is scaled up, including our contributions to the community.”

Tumanic said that out of the 10-12 jobs available, six of them have been filled. The available positions are entry-level machine technicians, he said.

He added that the decision to expand in Shawano as opposed to a larger city was due to the competition in the job market.

“The competition in the job market is much tougher in Green Bay, Wausau

or Appleton than it is here,” said Tumanic. “Over the years, we have leveraged on the strengths of the Shawano community. There are a lot of people out there with good work ethic, so we try to develop people within our own community.”

He said that the relationship between Shawano and JR Machine has worked well.

“We would not think about being anywhere else,” said Tumanic.

He added that JR Machine had no plans of looking anywhere else to expand.

Shock, outrage reasonable response in Suring

When attorneys invade a situation, it's harder to say I'm sorry, so I guess I understand why the Suring Area School District has been so silent on the subject of strip-searching students.

On the other hand, whoever is advising the Suring Area School District surely has advised them that, at the very minimum, an apology is in order. For now, the district's attorneys seem to be suggesting that officials exercise their right to remain silent.

At issue is an incident that occurred Jan. 18 at the school after several students were caught vaping in the girls' room. Oconto County District Attorney Ed Burke says six girls were told to strip to their underwear, apparently to ensure that they didn't have more vaping devices or cartridges secreted on their persons. Burke concluded that the incident

did not amount to a "strip search" under the letter of the law, so no one at the school will be criminally charged. Angry parents have, however, hired an attorney to explore the option of a civil lawsuit.

I am not the first to say this: Maybe it was not a strip search as defined by the statute, but what else would you call it? The officials' behavior has been declared legal, but was it moral? Was it even reasonable, as in the constitutional prohibition on unreasonable search and seizures?

Strip down to your underwear because you vaped? As a product of the generation where the answer to excessive smoking in the boys' room

was to create a student smoking area, I am baffled that the issue of tobacco use has risen to the level of such an extreme response. Is using tobacco on school grounds really that serious an offense?

Let's take the emotion out of this discussion, shall we? Oh, never mind; it's impossible to listen to what happened to those girls without getting emotional.

Like many people — I dare say most people — my first reaction when I heard about these searches was shock and outrage, and it only gets worse the more I hear and think about it.

Heads must roll. Whoever suggested, conducted or dares to condone these searches needs to be gone. I've seen more than one parent say those people should never be allowed to darken the door of a school building again. I can't say I disagree,

although no one from the school district has offered an explanation or justification — see the reference to legal advice, above.

Young women have a right to feel safe on school property, especially in the presence of the school's administrators. What happened to these young women is a violation of that trust, plain and simple.

The school board president told local media that the board plans to meet at 5:30 p.m. March 2 to address the matter, although as of the beginning of this week no notice of such a meeting had been posted. I suspect that half the town — probably more — will be at the school to see what they have to say for themselves. It promises to be an interesting evening.

Local news outlets deserve a break today with bill

In recent years, the news business in Wisconsin has seen a lot of bad news. Dozens of newspapers have closed. Revenues are way down. Staffs are being trimmed. "Vulture" hedge funds are circling, threatening to pick clean the bones of this once robust industry.

There is at least one piece of good news: A bipartisan bill working its way through the Wisconsin Legislature would help local news outlets by offering a tax break to small businesses that advertise in newspapers, TV or radio stations or online media in the state.

The Wisconsin Local Media Advertising Tax Credit would offer credits to advertisers with fewer than 100 employees and less than \$10 million in revenue. The credit would be based on 50% of the cost of advertising in local media, for a maximum of \$5,000.

Sen. Roger Roth, R-Appleton, and Rep. Todd Novak, R-Dodgeville, former editor of the Dodgeville Chronicle, are co-sponsors of As-

sembly Bill 762. "Having worked in the newspaper industry for 25 years, I think this proposed credit will make a real difference," Novak told fellow lawmakers during a Jan. 19 Assembly Ways and Means Committee hearing. "I believe this advertising incentive creates a win-win scenario for small businesses that want to advertise, customers and workers, and for local media."

Steve Waldman leads the national Rebuild Local News Coalition, which backs the measure. He said the Wisconsin bill could be a model for other states — and Congress.

"I think its significance is in the leadership and the nature of the coalition. It's led by Republicans and backed by an amazing collection of groups — both news orgs and business groups (restaurants, banks,

chiropractors, small businesses etc.)," wrote Waldman, who also is president and co-founder of Report for America.

Beth Bennett, executive director of the Wisconsin Newspaper Association, said the measure's impact is twofold: helping businesses reach their customers, and supporting local journalism by increasing local advertising dollars. The state estimates the tax credit would save businesses at least \$65.7 million a year in taxes — meaning twice that amount would be spent on ads.

In 2018, about 163,000 small Wisconsin businesses claimed deductions for advertising expenses, according to the bill's fiscal note. The cost of the tax break could be "significantly higher" than \$65.7 million if many of them claim the tax credit, it said.

Richard Lee, president of the Inter-County Cooperative Association, told lawmakers the bill would provide needed revenue to a newspaper group that saw ad sales drop

20% in two years.

The cooperative owns a weekly newspaper, the Inter-County Leader in Frederic, and five shoppers covering a 5,000 square-mile region. It was founded in 1933 by area farmers hungry for local information. Nearly 90 years later, keeping people informed in northwestern Wisconsin is still a struggle, Lee said.

Many of Lee's readers get their TV news from Minnesota, and internet access is spotty. Without the ads he runs for available jobs, restaurant specials and grocery sales, Lee said, "Many of the small businesses don't have a way to let the local residents know what is happening."

AB 762 deserves to pass, because preserving the public's right to know hinges on keeping local news outlets — and the local businesses that advertise with them — alive and well.

There are risks with popular steroid injections

Spinal injection with a steroid medication has become a popular treatment for patients with back pain and leg pain. It is estimated that 9 million Americans receive these procedures each year. Spinal steroid injections were first used in 1952 for the management of low back and leg pain. The early research was extremely poor quality (no control group comparison, small samples of patients tested, etc.). Although the FDA has not approved injectable steroids for spinal use, these products continue to be used “off-label.”

Recently, an international medical research team conducted a randomized controlled trial to determine the effectiveness of steroid injections on pain and disability as an addition to usual care for acute low back and leg pain in general medical practice. They found no clinically relevant

the natural history of the condition. There are simply no quality research studies supporting long-term benefits.

In the past two decades, multiple randomized trials have found that spinal steroid injections do not outperform placebo injections long-term. A scientific review of several studies found that injections offer no clinically important short-term

benefit in favor of steroid injections at any point in time, short-term (two weeks) or long-term (one year). Although some patients experience short-term benefit, this is likely due to placebo and

or long-term relief of leg pain or disability for patients with sciatica; and there is no evidence to support the current common practice of administering a series of injections. Additionally, there is no evidence of long-term benefit for patients with neck pain or neck pain with radiation or spinal stenosis.

Numerous potential adverse reactions have been associated with epidural steroid injections. The FDA now requires that injectable corticosteroids must carry a new label with a warning about the risks of severe adverse effects from epidural injections, including death, stroke, permanent blindness, nerve damage and paralysis. Additional steroid side effects may include weight gain, water retention, flushing (hot flashes), mood swings, insomnia, and elevated blood sugar levels in diabetics.

Just a few years ago, an outbreak of fungal meningitis from spinal injections killed 64 people and sickened 751. Recently, medical researchers discovered that each steroid injection increased the risk of fracture due to diminished bone density (osteoporosis) by 21% in men and women.

Until new evidence emerges supporting the effectiveness of spinal steroid injections, we recommend that patients with neck pain, low back pain, sciatica, or spinal stenosis receive conservative care and avoid this invasive treatment. At a minimum, the results of all available research should be presented to patients prior to steroid administration.

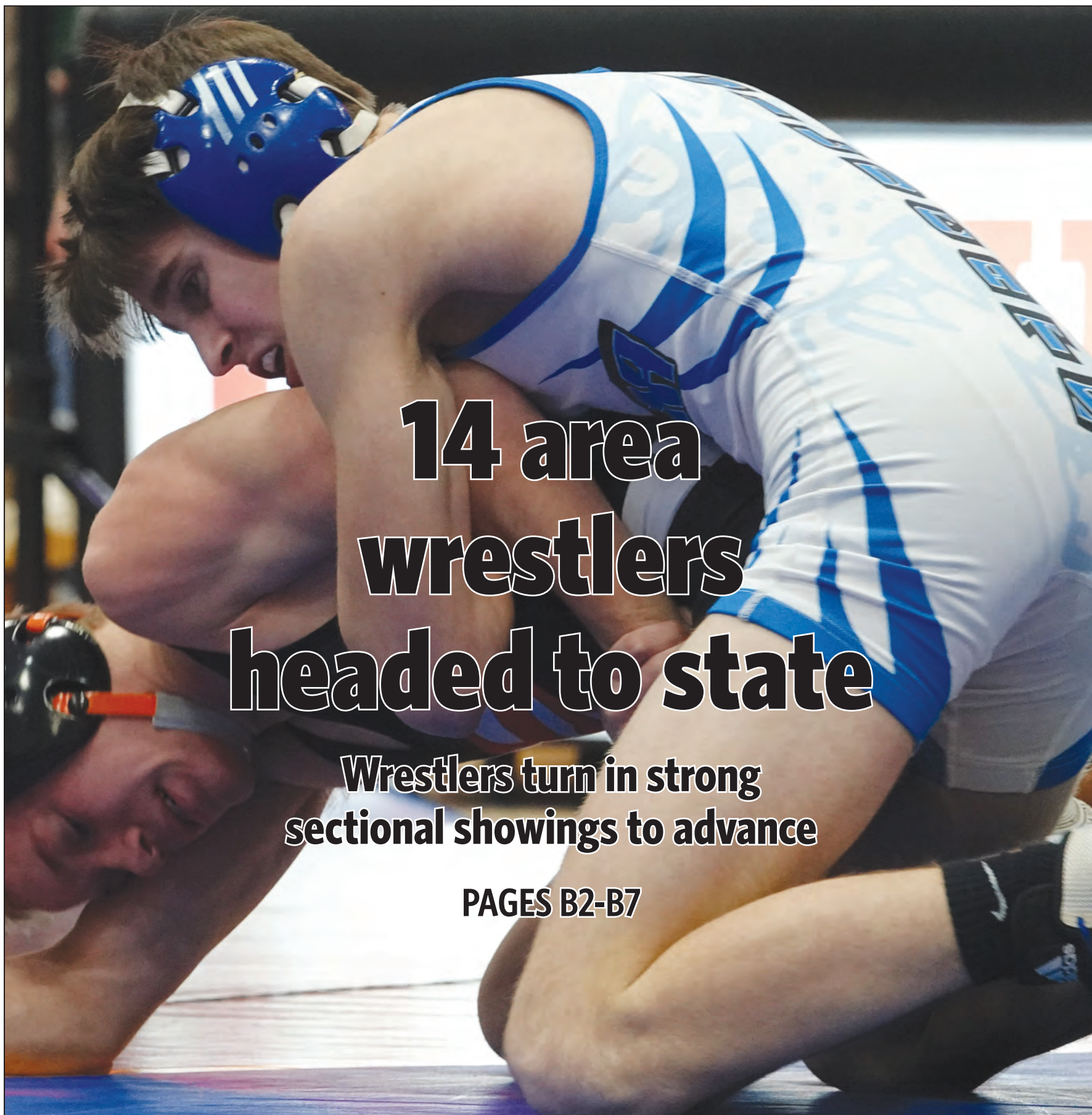

Three Oconto Falls and one Lena wrestler qualified for state after competing in sectionals on Feb. 19.

No Suring/Gillett wrestlers qualified for state, which will be held at the Kohl Center in Madison from Feb. 24-26.

Oconto Falls

Oconto Falls' Clayton Whiting, Graeson Pankratz and Cole Bozile all qualified for state after strong showings at the Division 2 Oconto Falls Sectional in Oconto Falls. To qualify for state in Division 2, wrestlers had to place first, second or third in their respective weight classes.

Whiting won the 182 weight class with a 3-0 mark. Pankratz finished 2-1 at the 120 class, and Bozile also went 2-1 at 126 pounds.

Whiting opened his day with a pin in 1 minute, 42 seconds before a 23-8 technical fall win in the semi-finals. He won the first-place match by pin in 1:58.

The senior will be making his fourth appearance at state and is looking to become a four-time state champ. Only 19 WIAA individuals have ever accomplished that feat.

"Goals I have set for state are pin everyone as fast as possible and score a lot of points," said Whiting. "The only way I can achieve these is by having the right mindset going in to each match, as well as focus on these in my last few practices before I head out to compete."

Whiting owns a 47-1 record on the season and won't need to wrestle on Thursday after his sectional title. He'll open up his state tournament by facing either Amery's Grant Cook (38-11) or Freedom's Josh Lahay (21-9) on Friday morning.

With three titles already, there isn't a lot left to prove for Whiting. Still, he's found a way to keep himself motivated, saying he'd like to show people, "That I am the greatest wrestler in Wisconsin, and I want to make a mark in Wisconsin wrestling out there at state."

Pankratz's day at sectionals began with a 51-second pin before a 9-4 decision victory. He lost by technical fall in the first-place match but didn't have to wrestle again, having already defeated the wrestler he would have faced.

The senior is also no stranger to the state tournament, as this will be his third-straight appearance. He made state in the 106 weight class as a sophomore and then was a part of the 113 class as a junior.

"I'm excited to get back down there one more time," said Pankratz. "Knowing this will be the last time I go out and compete in high school, these last matches will mean a lot to me. I don't want it to end, but I'll go out and leave it all

on the mat."

While also looking forward to competing alongside Whiting and Bozile, Pankratz has individual goals as well.

"Today is one of the biggest days of my life," said Dixon. "I'm finally going on to a bigger stage and under brighter lights. I'm still in shock."

"It's just really a big accomplishment for me and I feel like I worked my butt off for this opportunity and I feel like I deserved it and I'm glad it came to me," said Smith.

Like every athlete that moves on to the collegiate level, the path Dixon and Smith took were unique.

Smith, who came into high school enjoying basketball the most, didn't begin playing football until he was a sophomore. After his junior season, he began drawing interest from colleges.

Hoffmann came up to Dixon after he had an interception during a practice that week and told him to come visit the school. Dixon got an offer after visiting the school.
