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Shawano schools looking at \$2M deficit

Reducing staff, closing school items on the table to tackle budget crisis

The Shawano School District is staring down the barrel of a \$2 million budget deficit for next year and may have to take drastic action to balance its books, including potentially cutting staff positions and possibly closing one of its schools.

Administrators presented the possibilities to the district's executive committee on March 2 and pointed out that action will need to be taken soon to avoid any last-minute surprises to families and the community. If the Shawano School Board plans to cut staff positions, it will likely need to take action at its March 21 meeting to allow time for non-renewal notices to go out, which are required to be sent to staff by April 30. If a school closure is seen as an option, the decision would likely need to be made by the end of May.

"The team has been incredible in coming up with what those scenarios are," Superintendent Randi Anderson said, crediting officials with researching what needs to be done to close the budget gap.

Kurt Krizan, director of personalized learning, said that the district is having a number of staff members retiring in June, so one possibility would be to not fill some of those vacant positions for the new school year. He said the district office is also looking at the number of limited-term contracts with certified staff and determining whether those should be altered "as part of that right-sizing."

"We'd also be looking at the building and district supply budgets," Krizan said.

There was some concern about maintaining current class sizes if

teaching positions were cut, but Krizan noted that enrollment forecasts predict that the downward trend the district has experienced for the past five years is expected to continue, so class sizes could be managed.

School board president Michael Sleeper said it was likely that more resignations and retirements could be possible between now and the end of the school year, making it easier to keep existing staff who want to remain with the district.

Finance director Josh Swanson said that some school districts charge higher grades fees for technology education, family and consumer sciences, and arts programs, but he said that doing so would not be recommended, as that would limit who could take those courses.

"That is one aspect we're looking at," Swanson said.

School board member Mike Musolff expressed concern about reducing support staff, as many of those positions handle "the 5% of the school population that needs the most work."

"If you're going to reduce those numbers, how would we be handling that?" Musolff said.

Krizan said that would be factored in if the district decides to close one of the schools, and some support staff would be moved around. There are about 100 employees that are classified as support staff.

"That would help some efficiencies, duplication of services," he said.

Board members urged administrators to be transparent about their plans, whichever way they decide to go.

"The building closure is always the biggest action," Musolff said. "I understand the need for it, but it's such a big step. It's such an overwhelming thought to shut down a school. It seems logical, but at the same time, we need to explain things."

Musolff added that he also wants to make sure staff keep their jobs as much as it's financially possible to do so.

"I think most of the community would want more teachers and staff," Musolff said.

Board member Chuck Dallas recommended that actions recommended by administrators should be taken seriously and carefully considered before any final plan is voted on.

"I think we have to listen to senior management on what you've done and what you've looked at," Dallas said. "The numbers are not going to change. You look at what we're going to have to stick into these schools over the next few years, and that's a big ticket item."

Dallas also expressed concern that the school that could be shuttered might not be sellable to the point where it helps the district.

"There are a ton of people who are impacted, especially those who have worked at some of these schools, and they don't want to see it go," Dallas said. "Some people are really tied to it, and it's very emotional."

Board member Alysia Pillsbury said she was not in favor of closing a school to resolve the budget deficit, especially if there's only a short period of time for the board to make the decision.

"It's a big decision to make," Pillsbury said.

Dallas said that the decisions the board makes from now until the end of the school year in June will likely be the first stage in a difficult process as enrollment numbers are expected to continue to fall in the next 10 years. He noted that the district is already looking at a referendum for renovating and expanding facilities in the near future, and asking voters to approve an operational referendum that would allow the district to spend above its revenue cap for a limited period at the same time would not bode well, so cuts seemed like the best option.

"I look at it and say, this is your stage one," Dallas said. "This just didn't happen overnight."

Peters gets 5 1/2 years for assault

Victim suffered brain hemorrhage, requires constant care

A former Keshena man was sentenced March 4 in federal court to 5½ years in prison for a 2021 assault that left the victim with a traumatic brain injury and the need for a lifetime of assisted care.

On March 2, 2021, Michael A. Peters Jr., 40, was walking with the victim on Askenette Corners Road near Keshena. As the two men approached the intersection of state Highway 55, they got into a brief fight, which ended when Peters shoved the victim, causing him to fall and hit his head on the pavement.

The 25-year-old victim suffered a brain hemorrhage and was in a coma for several weeks while hospitalized.

Peters was indicted for assault causing serious bodily injury and pleaded guilty to the charge in November.

The victim's sister told U.S. District Judge William Griesbach on March 4 that her brother remains in a brain injury center in Dodge County.

"When Mr. Peters started to assault my brother, to within an inch of his life, it changed us both for the rest of our lives...(H)e requires 24-hour care for the rest of his life," she said in asking for the maximum punishment.

"This is not the first time he's been in trouble, but it should be the last," she added.

Peters faced a 10-year maximum statutory penalty, but the offense falls under the advisory sentencing guidelines, which were calculated at 30-37 months.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Andrew Maier asked for a guideline sentence, saying that Peters' crime will likely result in the victim needing a wheelchair for the rest of his life.

However, Maier said Peters only

gave a shove to the victim, who hit the ground without attempting to break his fall.

Peters' attorney, Lee Schuchart, asked for a two-year sentence. He argued that his client simply shoved the victim and didn't intend to seriously harm him.

"(The victim) wasn't pounded into the ground and wasn't repeatedly bashed," Schuchart said.

The attorney acknowledged that Peters has a history of drinking to excess, suffering a perceived slight from someone, shoving them and, in some cases, stomping or kicking them when they're down. Then he claims self-defense.

His past crimes include attacks against former girlfriends, one of which resulted in Griesbach sentencing Peters to four years in prison.

Peters was barely audible while making an emotional apology.

"I'm truly sorry for what hap-

pened, and I'd like to take it back, but I can't," he said before being overcome by sobs and tears.

Griesbach said the assault may have been a "one-blow event," but it

forever deprived the victim of functioning as an adult human being.

"It's hard to think of an injury more severe than this short of death," he said.

He rejected the sentences recommended by Maier and Schuchart, saying Peters needs stronger punishment and the public needs to be protected from him.

"This is criminal assault by a person with a history of such assaults," and whose criminal history dates back 20 years, said Griesbach.

Griesbach ordered Peters to serve three years of supervised release after serving his sentence.

There has been no immediate replacement for Smith announced, but she said that the position will soon be posted on the chamber's website, <https://www.shawanocountry.com>.

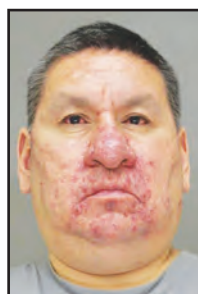
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Keshena man charged for sexual contact with minors

A Keshena man has been indicted in federal court for allegedly making sexual contact with three girls under the age of 12 and photographing at least of one of them.

According to an affidavit by FBI Agent Sarah Deamron filed in court, Menominee Tribal Police began investigating Darwin J. Pamanet, 46, for possible child sex abuse on Jan. 22. On that date, an 11- or 12-year-old girl told them that, in December, Pamanet allowed her to look at his cellphone. The girl saw a photo of Pamanet's hand lifting up her younger sister's nightgown exposing

her buttocks.

According to the affidavit, the older sister also said that Pamanet "touches" her and her younger sister. Pamanet had allegedly told the older sister to go to her room where

Pamanet has the girl sit on his lap and had sexual contact with her, according to the affidavit.

Pamanet gave tribal officers his cellphone and, after obtaining a search warrant on Jan. 24, 18 photos of prepubescent minors engaged

in sexually explicit conduct were recovered.

The older sister told a forensic interviewer on Jan. 31 that Pamanet had touched her under her clothing but over her underwear.

Pamanet told a tribal officer on Feb. 2 that he had penetrative sexual contact with the older sister and photographed the contact while she slept.

Pamanet was charged by complaint and detained in early February. He made an initial court appearance on Feb. 7.

He was indicted on March 1 on three counts of aggravated sexual abuse, one sex of sexual exploitation of a child and one count of possess-

ing child pornography.

The indictment alleged that, between July 1 and Dec. 31, 2021, Pamanet made sexual contact with three minor females under the age of 12, and had recorded himself engaged in sexual contact with at least one of the girls.

Conviction of the sexual abuse charges carries a penalty of 30 years to life in prison, the exploitation charge has a penalty of 15-30 years, and the possession charge has a 20-year maximum penalty.

A May 9 trial date has been set before U.S. District Judge William Griesbach.

Pamanet remains in custody in the Brown County Jail.

Giving help where needed has its rewards

Gauthier named one of UW-Madison's Outstanding Women of Color

A lesson taught by her grandparents, to give help whenever needed, has been a driving force in the professional life of Jennifer Gauthier, of Shawano, one of six women chosen to receive the University of Wisconsin-Madison 2021-2022 Outstanding Women of Color Award.

The awards were presented at a reception held at the Pyle Center in Madison on March 3.

"It was very emotional for me," Gauthier said. "I was able to see lots of family and friends after two years (pandemic-related social distancing). Receiving the award was overwhelming in a really good way."

She learned she was nominated for the award from a colleague, who shared nomination letters with her, which commended her work with UW-Extension.

The honor is presented to women of color among UW-Madison's faculty, staff, students and greater-Madison community members who have made outstanding contributions in social justice, community service, scholarly research and community building. The areas are all focused on advocacy on behalf of disadvantaged and marginalized populations, teaching on race, ethnicity and indigeneity in U.S. society and/or creating an inclusive and respectful environment for all.

Gauthier, UW-Extension community development educator in Menominee County and the Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin, meets most of those criteria through her job performance. Her office is based

at the College of Menominee Nation, and her work focuses on the health needs of the county and tribal residents, adapting Extension programming guidelines to fit the needs of the community.

She noted that her job title is the same in other Wisconsin counties, but the job duties may be different based on each community's special needs. Backed by UW research, community development educators work with local governments, civic organizations, businesses and community leaders to help people identify critical local concerns, set goals and work on solutions.

Gauthier worked for the tribe for almost 15 years before her Extension position. Her experience with the tribe gave her an in-depth understanding of community and cultural teachings, as well as tribal, state and federal political systems that help her to do the work she currently does through the Extension.

She was brought up on the Menominee Reservation and considers it home. Gauthier has been an integral member of the CMN/University of Michigan/University of New Mexico's Indigenous Summer Planning Institute, where long-term strategies address sustainable environments.

Gauthier assists the community in seeking wellness through fostering healthy relationships, connection to

the land, language preservation and respect for their ancestors.

"When people ask for help, if I can help, I will get involved," following her grandparents' examples, Gauthier said.

In her case, this important work ethic has led to her involvement in many areas, topics and efforts on behalf of tribal and county health initiatives.

Her deep connection to the tribal lands is one of the reasons that she has a vision for improving the community's health. Getting people walking, helping people to eat healthier, building a community of safety by biking in established bike lanes and increasing healthy snack options for after-school events, and improving community gardens, are some of the issues Gauthier is working on.

The involvement of some community partners has helped to increase participation at events, where participants can count on getting healthy foods. She also noted that it is important to include cultural/Indigenous foods at special events.

To help answer the volumes of community questions and improve communications during COVID-19, Gauthier was instrumental in creating and distributing a weekly digital newsletter to county and tribe members. She highlighted information about gardening and cooking and access to resources in the newsletters.

She also included culturally-appropriate information about maintaining social distancing to the members, whose culture places great value on community and large family gatherings. She partnered with the

Wisconsin Farm Bureau to provide supplemental meals and dairy products to families, adapting no-contact distribution to community members.

In addition, she has shared the knowledge she's gained by working through the Extension with Indigenous organizations in Montana, Hawaii, and took two trips to visit the Maori in New Zealand. She links what has been done on the reservation, for example how to create community food gardens, with what the needs are in those remote locations. She said that she also learns from those visits and incorporates their practices into what she does in her Extension work.

Gauthier chuckled about a dream that she has of being able to walk into an area restaurant and "order a hummus and veggie plate." Working toward this dream to improve the health of the community, she encourages community partners to put healthy food options, and cultural foods, into vending machines. Gauthier's involvement with the Wisconsin Obesity Prevention Initiative focused on local food policy research, food sovereignty and Indigenous approaches to health and wellness.

"We're going to get healthy again by power and strength in knowledge and sharing with others listening and learning," Gauthier stated.

Speaking of the partnerships she's developed within the tribe and county, Gauthier added: "So many of us are committed to preserving what was passed on, to make sure it's there for future generations. Our language and our culture all connects to what we do in various ways."

SCHS jazz band gets 11th Rolling Meadows honor

Program comes back from pandemic hiatus, scheduling issues to win

Rolling Meadows is one of the high points in the Shawano Community High School jazz band's competitive season, as the band finds itself facing off against some of the most talented bands in the country. This year, SCHS came back from its Feb. 26 competition with its 11th consecutive win from the annual jazz festival in Illinois.

It's not the 11th consecutive year that SCHS has won, though, according to band director Christopher Kent. The pandemic has kept the band from performing the last couple of years, he said, and there have also been years where SCHS skipped Rolling Meadows to play at a jazz festival in Louisville, Kentucky, which takes place the same weekend.

"This is a streak we don't want to drop," Kent said. "I told the kids after they won that this was a special one, after everything they'd gone through the last three years leading up to this. For them to get to hear other bands again, every director I saw ... was just so fired up. From my standpoint, I'm just so happy to be back doing this."

Kent noted he was in another room when the results were posted, but he could hear his students cheer when they saw that SCHS was the champion band again.

Besides the band's overall win, Ashlee Raddant, who plays alto saxophone, won as the outstanding soloist for performing what Kent described as an extremely difficult piece. Ananya Wilson, who plays the tenor sax, received an honorable mention for her performance.

Raddant, who is also the leader of the saxophone section, said of all the things she's done with the jazz band, the latest Rolling Meadows victory qualifies as one of her proudest accomplishments.

"I am so happy with the way our band played, and I am honored to have helped take the band there," Raddant said. "I have been listening to my feature song for much of my music career, and to have not only played it competitively, but to have

won an award for it has made my experience come full circle. I am so proud of the hard work and perseverance that everyone has put in to take our band from good to great."

Being able to come back with a win even after the band's been on hiatus due to the pandemic was especially pleasing for Isabel Roloff, who leads the band's trombone section.

"Playing at Rolling Meadows was very exciting, and our success certainly showed our band's hard work over the past few months," Roloff said. "We worked as a team to reestablish the skills we had lost over the COVID pandemic. I am very proud of the trombone section for the good sound we are creating and the fun we have while doing it."

The latest victory is especially sweet for Kent, who noted that the band did not start playing until November due to a different scheduling system at the high school. Normally, the band starts up on the first day of school in September.

Kent noted that the band had to

make some last-minute adjustments as well, which might have affected the outcome. He said Jackson Smits, his senior drummer, had to bow out because he's also on the SCHS wrestling team, and the state meet coincided with Rolling Meadows.

"I had a sophomore girl, Savannah Elgin, who stepped in and had to learn his two tunes plus play hers, and the two tunes he had were really difficult," Kent said. "She stepped up and she did it. We were able to do this, even with that (change), and it's because the band as a whole, the kids bonded as a group — as a band family."

The director believes having that cohesion is what makes the difference between a decent band and one like SCHS, which won the contest.

"They played for each other," Kent said. "They worked, and they overcame the situation."

Kent also believes there was some motivation to up the game after the band finished fourth at the Purdue Jazz Festival in January.

"They went into an even bigger venue and did that," Kent said.

Among the pieces SCHS performed for the festival were two Duke Ellington pieces, "Johnny Come Lately" and "Banquet Scene," along with the song "Alianza," which Kent noted is hard for a drummer to perform because the beat switches

between Latin and swing.

"The whole style switches back and forth and back and forth," Kent said. "For the rhythm sections, that makes for some great difficulty."

The SCHS second jazz band also performed well at Rolling Meadows, according to Kent. Clarice Neumann, who plays alto sax for that band, received an individual honorable mention for that performance.

The Rolling Meadows victory has put the bands on a wonderful high going into the school's own jazz festival, which takes place this weekend. Kent noted that Lauren Sevia, a Grammy-award winning baritone sax player, will be among the special guests at the event.

For those unable to make it to the jazz festival coming up, there will be two other opportunities for the community to see the jazz bands perform. "The Last Dance," an annual end of the school year event before COVID-19 hit, will return May 13-14, and then the bands will play at Franklin Park the following weekend.

"It's going to be nice to be back live (in the community) next weekend and do this," Kent said. "We have a lot of alumni coming back, and we have a lot of alumni bringing their own high school bands now."

Shawano School Board sells old town hall

Highest bid less than the minimum established but expected to cover district's costs

The old Wescott Town Hall is finally off the Shawano School District's hands after being sold to Richard Muth for \$67,100.

The Shawano School Board voted 8-1 on March 7 to accept Muth's bid, even though it was below the minimum bid of \$70,000 that the board established earlier this year. The district received four bids, according to finance director Josh Swanson, with Muth's being the highest.

Swanson noted that the fair market value for the property was \$65,000, but the minimum had been set at \$70,000 to allow the district to recoup the costs to appraise and sell the property.

"This is above fair market value and allows us to recoup the appraisal costs," Swanson said.

Board president Michael Sleeper expressed disappointment that the bids were not as high as what the board wanted, but he said did not see a benefit to rejecting the bids and trying again.

"It's not quite what we wanted, but the recommendation is that we should take that bid and move on," Sleeper said.

Board member Mart Grams, who was the lone vote against the sale, disagreed and felt the district could get more for the former town hall.

"I know the market's booming, so that bothers me a little," Grams said, adding that he would prefer that the owner was local. "I think we should establish a monetary value and a use value for this place. Fair market value is garbage."

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Swanson did not provide the board with many details other than the top bidder's name.

Board member James Davel, who is also the administrative coordinator for Shawano County, disputed Grams' claim that the buyer should be local, noting that the board did not stipulate that when it established the bidding requirements.

"Having watched what the county went through, holding onto a building because we thought we'd get more money, but it never panned out," Davel said. "In this case, I think it's just time to get rid of this, pull an

asset off the books."

In 2019, the Town of Wescott deeded the old town hall, located at N6251 Lake Drive, back to the school district. This fulfilled the obligations of an agreement reached 50 years earlier when the district gave the building, then used as a schoolhouse, to the town. The town had voted in 2006 to keep the building for community use, like the occasional rummage sale, even though the town's main office and meetings took place at the current town hall on Old Keshena Road. It was later decided to return the building to

the school district.

Initially, the district had pondered using the facility as an alternative academy for the exceptionally gifted for grades 6-12 with plans to research the idea in earnest in summer 2020. However, the coronavirus pandemic derailed efforts to research the issue further, and district officials announced in 2021 that they planned to sell the building instead. District residents agreed to those plans at the annual meeting held in September of that year.

"It is a neat experience, that maybe otherwise, they would not have," said Jaime.

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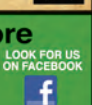
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Gillett school's marimba has history

It is one of 75
made for the 1933
Chicago World's Fair

The Gillett School District recently stumbled upon an instrument with significance but an unknown value.

Gillett Secondary School Principal Shawn Limberg explained that the school district recently found some exciting information regarding their marimba.

"How this started was posts were missing or broken on the instrument," said Limberg. "Our band director, Nathaniel Miller, had contact Century Mallets out of Chicago. He wanted to ask if they had any parts available that would fit the instrument. They emailed him back asking for a picture and serial number."

Limberg explained that the company had emailed Miller back saying that the pieces can be sent, but also asked him if he knew what the significance of that particular marimba was.

"They sent back some pictures of what a restored marimba looks like," said Limberg. "There were 75 of these marimbas made, and they were for the 1933 World's Fair in Chicago."

He added that the marimbas were constructed for an orchestra to celebrate the centennial of Chicago's incorporation as a city.

"This is a one of 75 pieces," said Limberg.

Limberg said that when he was

looking for more information on the instrument, he went to Dave Pelow, who was once the band director at Gillett.

"He remembers buying it around 1966," said Limberg. "He reached out to Hyde Music and bought it for about \$350. That is how it got here."

The marimba originally had a pearl-colored inlay, but at some point someone painted over the pearl coloring. Limberg also said

that during the time the marimba was constructed, art-deco style furnishing was popular.

"All of them have these resonator tubes, some of these are fake. They are capped at the top, so they really don't do anything to resonate the sound like a normal marimba would have," said Limberg. "The front row of tubes is purely for show."

Limberg said that Pelow remem-

bers asking Hyde Music to put a red inlay on the instrument to color-coordinate it with school colors. The original marimba also would have a bronze plaque on the front detailing who the player is. This was removed on the marimba at the school district.

"He told me that he had no idea at the time of when he bought this of what the history of it was," said Limberg. "I don't think Hyde knew either."

Limberg said that the school district is still looking into where the marimba was between 1933 and 1966.

"There is still more of a story to it," said Limberg.

The school district is unaware of what the valuation of the marimba is.

"We could be sitting on a gold mine," said Limberg. "Or it could be worth nothing. The value is probably determined on who the interested party is. To a collector or a professional marimba player, this is probably worth quite a bit; overall we don't know yet."

Limberg added that if the piece does have value, the school district would like to put it in a place where people can value it.

"It would go to a museum, or even Century Mallets in Chicago has their own percussion museum — it would go to something like that," said Limberg. "We do appreciate it here, but it is something that is unique."

He also said that the instrument is used in school's concerts and other areas with the band.

"This is just one of those neat finds," said Limberg.

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Common redpolls not common sight but stand out

We were amazed to see a flock of common redpolls at our feeders today. They flutter down to the ground from

our shrubby border like falling leaves, decorating the snowy ground with their small, energetic forms. We counted 45 redpolls and plan to enter this sighting in eBird as part of the February Great Backyard Bird Count.

The eBird database is one of the world's largest nature databases, housing millions of bird observations worldwide and is used for scientific and conservation purposes. Adding our observations to the database is fun, helps us learn more about birds and is a way we can contribute to their conservation. For information about eBird and how to participate in using and contributing to this database, go to <https://ebird.org/home>.

Although not a frequent visitor, common redpolls, when seen, do grab your attention. For a small finch, they pack a lot of energy. They are in constant motion even when on the ground searching for seeds — a peck here, a hop, a turning of the head, a short jump, a repositioning amongst the flock, a flick of a seed and then off again as they all scatter into the shrubs.

Study them, and their beauty emerges. As a seeming hedge against the cold they sport a red cap or "poll" atop their head. Both sexes have a black chin spot, short yellow beak and brown-and-white streaked back. Their wing feathers are black, edged in white. And the males are quite striking right now, their breasts and sides stained a pale crimson, ready for the breeding season.

We listen for the redpoll's calls as

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we watch them flit about. Upon consulting "National Geographic's Field Guide to the Birds of North America (Fifth Edition)," we learn that when perched they give a swee-ee-eet call and when in flight a dry rattle. From Alan Haney's book, "Jewels of Nature, Delightful Birds I Have Known," we find that their range is quite extensive. They breed around the world in the far north's subarctic, inhabiting regions of

tundra scrub and forests.

A common redpoll banded in Michigan was found in Siberia, a testament to their worldly travels. Their winter range includes the northern United States and Canada.

The cold demands adaptations for survival. To make up for heat loss during frigid weather, they must eat up to 42% of their body weight in food daily. That's a lot of seeds. The birds grow a third more plumage to help them survive winter temperatures that can plummet to minus-65 degrees Fahrenheit in the far north. Another survival strategy mirrors that of the Ruffed Grouse; they can dive into loose snow and burrow a foot or more into a roosting cavity to keep warm, according to Haney.

Also, like other finches, redpolls are mostly seed eaters when spiders and insects are not available, Haney adds. These they find in brushy weedy habitats and in stands of alder and birch that bear seed-laden catkins. They can store food in throat pouches, which gives them the chance to move to a safe place to digest the food or carry it to their nests. In winter, they especially like millet and thistle seeds.

Look for the common redpoll at your feeders. They have come to us on winds from the far north, from the land of the polar bear and possibly as far as from Siberia, making this energetic traveler all the more spectacular.

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The Irish farmhand and forgiveness

Belle Plaine man remembers life of Harry 'Shorty' Davis

"You must be sober two years before you step back on my land," Dad told Shorty after a drunken binge that scared Mom.

It is the son, Leo Dillenburg, who remembers it, and he tapped the table at War Bonnet Gifts when recalling his father's ultimatum to the short Irishman who was living at the Belle Plaine farmhouse. Shorty "just got so damn mean," Dillenburg said.

There were young kids in the house, and a line had to be drawn. Shorty never crossed it again, according to Dillenburg.

Harry 'Shorty' Davis

There are elements to the life of Harry "Shorty" Davis that will remain buried, but some details appear more certain than others to Dillenburg, whose recollections fill in gaps.

"I tried to think today about who I could ask about Shorty, but everybody is dead, except my sister and my brother," Dillenburg said.

So the following is what Dillenburg recalls during interviews about old Shawano County.

Shorty allegedly came from Ireland, born in 1900. His jig validated it. So did his height — 5 feet, 2 inches "at the most," according to Dillenburg, "and he was just a guy my dad picked up walking on the road one day."

The find was before Dillenburg was born in 1946, when Shorty was already middle-aged. He clearly was a traveling worker. Perhaps some called him a vagrant. Others probably called him a bum. He spent time in the Fox Valley, and he was a butler. He survived the Great Depression, and it wasn't a cliché.

There are aspects of Shorty more obvious than others, according to Dillenburg.

"Well, here's the thing with Shorty," Dillenburg said. "I only knew the good part of Shorty, but I always heard the bad parts of Shorty."

For example, there were details missing in Shorty's biography.

"He'd talk about these real

wealthy people in Appleton he worked for, but we never could get the information out of him (of) who it was," Dillenburg said. "My aunt came over one day ... and she said, 'Here, Shorty, would you look at this?'"

The news clipping read: "Wanted: Anybody know the whereabouts of Harry Davis?"

Dillenburg recalled his dad checked out the big mansion he supposedly worked at.

"We even drove down and saw it, and it was by the university, if I remember right," Dillenburg said. "It was in Appleton, and it was a great big mansion up there."

Whatever the case, there was a big advertisement out to find him. Somebody in the Fox Valley wanted Harry Davis.

"And he got really mad at my aunt, and he grabbed that, and he said 'If you ever bring that up again, I'll never talk to you again,'" Dillenburg said. "And that was it. So nobody ever found out what the situation was."

These were the elusive bullets on Shorty's resume prior to the end of World War II.

When younger, Dillenburg never saw Shorty drink, but Dillenburg's uncle, Wallace, filled him in. The Irish wanderer apparently showed

up in the Shawano area, wound up in the bars and probably worked a little bit here and there. Dillenburg's uncle and dad went duck hunting on an October morning with a complete frost on the ground.

Dillenburg told the story as if it was Uncle Wallace speaking: "Here, we're driving down the road, and we thought, 'Somebody musta threw their jacket in the ditch,' because we drove by and it looked like a jacket there covered in frost, and here it was Shorty. Laying under all that frost, drunker than hell yet. Frozen, half frozen."

Shorty, who raised "all kinds of hell," according to Dillenburg, had

been fighting down at Club 22 and got thrown out.

“But I never remember that part of him,” Dillenburg said.

Through his dad and his uncle, there were stories of Harry’s wilder days. Layers peeled off over the years, but never exactly to the core.

However, there is no question Dillenburg’s dad had enough of Shorty’s alcohol in the mid-1940s. The last straw was when Shorty tried kicking him down the steps. Dillenburg recalled that his dad grabbed Shorty by the leg, dragged him outside and gave the ultimatum of two years and sobriety.

Time passed and there Shorty stood at the end of the driveway with a little suitcase, saying: “I’m ready to come home.”

It was two years to the date of the eviction.

The Irish character

Shorty demonstrated his loyalty to the family upon his permanent return.

“He lived in the same house with us: me, my mom, and kids and everything,” Dillenburg said. “He had his own room.”

Dillenburg and his siblings became childlike figures to a man who lacked ties to his own family. A vagrant was now something between a second dad and a cool uncle at the Dillenburg Farm in the 1950s.

“Us kids could do nothing wrong,” Dillenburg said. “He just loved us kids. He was always looking out for us.”

Dillenburg also recalled Shorty didn’t get along well with older men. Mind you, Shorty himself was already between 50 and 60.

One time, Dillenburg’s dad hired another guy named Lenny. By then, there were multiple farms the Dillenburgs owned. Shorty and Lenny stayed on the other farmhouse, because they worked there. Shorty didn’t have a driver’s license, but Lenny had a car.

“And Lenny comes flying in the yard and said Shorty was gonna kill him,” Dillenburg said, adding, “he was gonna beat him up with a hammer.”

Shorty was “very jealous of anybody that wanted to look good around us kids,” according to Dillenburg. He became a figurehead to the family.

“He liked being the one who took care of us kids and everything,” Dillenburg said.

Through it all was a good work ethic. Shorty made the expansion of the Dillenburg Farm possible. Dillenburg motioned the “chu, chu,

chu, chu, chu,” suggesting the efficiency in which Shorty could hand milk a cow in the 1940s before milk machines came to the farm.

“And he was a big part of the neighborhood,” Dillenburg said. “Everybody knew Shorty, because he jigged. He would start his Irish jig. And it was funnier than hell — especially when you were a kid. He was always trying to teach us how to do that Irish jig.” His work was sprinkled elsewhere, for he helped put the floor in at Giese’s Three Elms. Shorty told Dillenburg: “We put that flooring in, and then we had a dance, and I had to show ‘em how to jig.”

A decline from the prime

Dillenburg’s dad had bet on mink and faded out of dairy. Then the mink market collapsed.

Dillenburg’s mom died in 1965, dad moved off the farm and the Dillenburg kids grew up. Alcohol crept back in, and depression lingered. The purpose Shorty found in mid-century had faded, as his laborer body turned 70. Meaning was harder to find. Dillenburg’s brother moved in at the farmhouse, and a trailer was put outside for the old farmhand.

“Just a little dinky trailer, and that little Irishman always lived in there,” Dillenburg said.

Shorty seemingly avoided alcohol until the 1960s. But as Dillenburg’s dad moved away, and the kids grew up, there was less social ties to keep Shorty positive. Dillenburg’s dad went over to the trailer one day, and

it was clear Shorty was in a bad spot mentally. Shorty hadn’t cleaned up much, so Dillenburg’s dad went over to talk to Dillenburg’s brother.

“And my dad told my brother, ‘You get the bathtub ready, and I’m bringing him over there, and he’s gonna take a bath,’” Dillenburg said. “So, he took Shorty over to the house and washed him up. He literally threw him in the tub.”

Then Dillenburg’s dad made sure protections were in place to protect his aged farmhand, saying: “Every week you check on Shorty, and you make sure he gets over there and gets a bath, ‘cause he’s depressed about something.”

Memories at the trailer

There were more important memories at the trailer that vindicate the Irishman. Dillenburg was drafted for Vietnam, and Shorty worried about something happening to the child he watched grow up over 20 years. Of course, when Dillenburg came home on leave, he went and stayed by Shorty.

“And then when I went away, I can remember him standing there bawling,” Dillenburg said. “And then when I came back from Vietnam, that’s where I went and stayed. The first person I went and seen was Shorty.”

Another aspect of Shorty was his love for his second country.

“He was really, really patriotic,” Dillenburg said.

During Dillenburg’s childhood, he could remember Shorty saying, “I don’t like that president that we

got,” but Shorty concluded, “I gotta love him because he’s our president.”

“It didn’t matter what president it was — if he didn’t like him, he didn’t like him,” Dillenburg said, “but he would never say anything bad about ‘em, other than he’d just say, ‘I don’t like him, but I respect him because he’s our president.’”

Shorty lived four or five years at the trailer at least.

“When I came home from leave to go to Vietnam, he was there, and when I got back from Vietnam, he was there,” Dillenburg said. “Whenever I would get in any trouble at all — like I’d stay out too late, I couldn’t drive home, or I’d be drinking too much — I’d always stay by Shorty. And he would feed me. I always remember he’d make me mash potatoes with peas, but the mashed potatoes were full of pepper, and I kept telling him: ‘I don’t like pepper.’”

Shorty’s response, which Dillenburg laughed while repeating: “You’re gonna eat pepper.”

Somewhere between alcohol and his 80s, Shorty wound up in the nursing home. He still had some fire.

“I remember all of them women in the nursing home said how much fun he was, because he was flirting with every girl in there, even though he couldn’t get any girls,” Dillenburg said.

In 1984, the chapter closed on Shorty in Shawano. He blew in like a leaf in the wind in early adulthood, but there was a general consensus that he had the best times of his life when he rooted on the Dillenburg Farm. His strong work ethic, overt loyalty and humorous jigging were central to his character.

Shorty had no known blood relatives in Wisconsin, but friends who knew him made sure he was honored.

“And when he died, my brother buried him next to my dad, up there, with my mother on the hill,” Dillenburg said.

Dillenburg was gone at the time working out of state, and his brother, Dan, went out of his way to insure the farmhand was respected. With two clovers and a Celtic cross, a monument stands at Sacred Heart Cemetery in Shawano signifying an Irishman’s redemption: “Our Irish friend touched the lives of many.”

It was quite the comeback from an eviction, and a permanent reminder on the value of forgiveness.

War in Ukraine is a teachable moment

I discuss the topic of leadership a lot in our home. It is not much of a surprise, as my wife and I have multiple combat tours between us.

Together, we have over 40 years of collective military leadership experience and the honor of leading troops into combat. Over the course of our careers, we have seen the full spectrum of leadership; some of the most rewarding experiences are when we observe those unlikely leaders emerge in the face of adversity. In the past few days, like so many other Americans, we have watched new heroes emerge in Ukraine as an unjust war unfolds.

We have been most impressed by “Captain Ukraine,” President Volodymyr Zelensky, a former TV comedian, who in the past few days has become a global symbol for the democracy we hold so dear. He has become not just the face of Ukrainian resilience, but also a leader who has truly united people across the globe. His words and actions have inspired and motivated world leaders to recommit to the values of peace, unity and democracy.

To our family, his courageous response to an offer of evacuation showed the spirit in which this country (America) was founded. He said, “The fight is here; I need ammunition, not a ride.” It is this kind of “lead from the front” attitude that we feel has captivated so many of us over the past few days.

Zelensky’s willingness to roll up his sleeves (when he is not wearing a T-shirt) and put himself in harm’s way is a stark reminder that freedom is not free, and that the price of freedom is commitment, perseverance and determination. He teaches a lesson in democracy that is not lost on the members of my family.

It is not just Zelensky who is worthy of praise as the media reports nearly 70,000 rifles were distributed to civilians in a single day last week. The same media also quotes a Ukrainian woman as she stands resolute to defend her coun-



try by defiantly stating, “I am an adult woman, I am healthy and it’s my responsibility.”

President Zelensky has been the first to acknowledge that the Ukrainian people have stepped up and have been doing so since Russia’s invasion of Crimea in 2014 with the creation of the Territorial Defense Force made solely of Ukrainian volunteers.

Just as live television allowed the Vietnam War to be brought into our living rooms, social media has put the Ukraine War into our hands. We are bombarded with traditional media and social media accounts of the war. This new age of reporting has brought an unprecedented awareness to how fragile democracy can be and as my wife and I point to the TV, cell phone or computer monitor, we try to show our children that “this is what patriotism looks like and that everyday people can be heroes if they so choose.”

The news is reporting that some Ukrainian parents are sewing their child’s blood type to their shirt

before sending them off to school. Other parents are packing bags for their young children so they can be loaded onto a train and taken to a foreign country for safety, reassuring them that everything will be OK while silently wondering if they will ever be a family again. Other parents are pleading with doctors, trying desperately to keep the youngest victims of this war alive.

This is how Ukrainian children are learning about war and freedom. With everything that has transpired over the past few days, my wife and I are suddenly realizing how valuable something as simple as a family dinner can be to a nation’s democracy.

As Americans, we are grateful that we are largely free of external threats to our family and our freedoms. We should remember that the principles that the people of Ukraine are defending with their lives today are the very same principles that generations of Americans have fought for as well. Our country, despite all our self-imposed differenc-

es, needs to look at the images coming from Ukraine and bear witness to their unity, and to notice that the only division is between those who stand in defense of democracy and those who stand against it.

As President Reagan, a World War II veteran, once said: “No arsenal, or no weapon in the arsenals of the world, is so formidable as the will and moral courage of free men and women.” There is no place in the world today where this is more evident than in Ukraine. My sincere hope is that the sacrifices being made by the people of Ukraine inspire all of us to have the moral courage to recommit ourselves to the ideals we share as Americans and to put aside our petty arguments to find a way to show our families we love them and our country.

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Sunflowers featured in county's 386th barn quilt

Shawano County's 386th barn quilt is called "Sunflower Field" and is on display on a farm owned by Grant and Amy Riesenberg at W8139 County Road A, Shawano.

The quilt pattern the Riesenbergs chose is very appropriate because Amy loves sunflowers. In fact, their farm is called Riesenberg's Sunflower Dairy and, in the summer, several rows of sunflowers are planted along County Road A on the north border of their farm. They plan to plant additional sunflowers on their land — including by their house, which is nearby at N6309 Hazel Drive.

Neither Grant nor Amy Riesenberg grew up on a farm. Grant is from Green Bay, and his wife is from Valders; however, Grant used to work at his uncle Gary Riesenberg's farm not far from where they now live.

"I just fell in love with working on a farm," he said. "After Amy and I met, we decided we would become first-generation dairy farmers."

They started farming with 62 cows in October 2012 near Clintonville. In June 2013, they moved to their present location, which was owned by Warren Gueths. In July 2015, they purchased 20 acres plus

the buildings from Gueths. They currently have 230 dairy animals, including calves, heifers and about 100 milking cows. The majority of the herd consists of purebred Holsteins, but it also includes some purebred Jerseys and Holstein/Jersey crossbreeds.

This past fall, the Riesenbergs built a new free-stall barn and eventually hope to add a robotic milking system and increase their herd size to about 125 milk cows.

The couple has three children: Zoey, 7, and twins Jonathan and Morgan, 6. They also have a dog, Maestro, 11.

Lawrence Gueths purchased the farm in 1962, which at the time totaled 65 acres of crop land and 35 acres of woods. In 1968, his son, Warren Gueths, took over the farm with a milking herd of 26 Holstein cows. Over the years, Gueths increased the herd to 90 cows and 400 acres. He still farms the land and rents the cropland to the Riesenbergs for feed for their dairy herd.

The sunflower quilt was painted by the Shawano County barn quilt committee and was put on display by LeRoy and Keenan Raddant, both of whom work for Raddant Electric in Shawano.

DNR to end online hunter education for students under 18

Online option still available for those age 18 and older

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources announced March 1 the temporary all-online hunter education course option will end at midnight on March 20 for those under age 18.

Hunter education students aged 18 and older will continue to have the online course as a hunter education option.

The DNR temporarily offered the all-online hunter education option to all to help protect the public and staff from the spread of COVID-19. Following the updated guidance from state and federal health agencies, the DNR is returning to the in-person course for the under 18 group.

Students under the age of 18 enrolled in the all-online course will have through March 20 to complete the course. Those over age 18 may continue to utilize the online course.

Students of all ages will have the following two course options

available:

- Internet field day — This training allows you to complete some of your training online and then attend one day of training with a certified instructor. This class is a good fit for a person that has handled firearms or is going to be hunting with someone that has more experience to help them build upon their hunting skills. During this class, there are 4-6 hours of firearm handling opportunities. All age groups are welcome.

- Traditional class — This training offers a more hands-on approach to working with a certified instructor over a few days. Most students and families enjoy this option because they can do it in their community. This option provides students with opportunities to handle hunting equipment, learn about safe hunting practices, shooting and many other topics. In-person feedback from instructors also

enhances student-learning. All age groups are welcome.

This training allows any person age 18 years and older to complete all hunter education online. The student spends multiple hours online studying, completing modules and passing a final exam to become certified.

This option is a great fit for adults who have a connection/mentorship within the shooting sports to help establish and strengthen their skills and lessons learned virtually.

The DNR remains firmly committed to the health and safety of recreational safety course instructors and students. The department receives the most up-to-date information and will continue to adjust course operations if conditions change.

The DNR encourages the following safety protocols for all in-person classes: Social distancing of six feet between participants; class sizes may be capped to accommodate social distancing; face coverings are encouraged to use indoors and/or follow

local guidelines that may be in place; availability and use of hand sanitizer to include sanitizing class equipment; and outdoor class instruction where possible.

Enroll in a hunter safety course now as classes will start to fill up with spring hunting seasons coming up soon.

More than 20,000 people take hunter education courses in Wisconsin each year. Anyone born on or after Jan. 1, 1973, is required to have a hunter education certification to purchase a hunting license, unless hunting under the Mentored Hunting Law.

Before enrolling in any course, interested students must first obtain a Wisconsin customer ID number through Go Wild, the DNR's online license portal (gowild.wi.gov/customers/profile/new).

All course options, links to enroll and cost information are outlined on the DNR's safety education webpage (dnr.wisconsin.gov/Education/OutdoorSkills/safetyEducation).

Pursuant to Section 174.052 Wisconsin Statutes, notice is hereby given to all owners of dogs in Shawano County that rabies vaccinations and dog licenses are required under the statutes.

Vaccination by a veterinarian against rabies of all dogs is required (Section 95.21 (2)) within 30 days after the dog reaches 5 months of age and revaccinated within one year after the initial vaccination. Older vaccinated dogs must be revaccinated when the certificates expires or within 3 years of the previous vaccination. Presentation of evidence that the dog is currently immunized against rabies must be presented when obtaining dog licenses.

All dogs 5 months of age or older require a license. The minimum license fee for neutered males or spayed females is \$3.00 upon presentation or evidence attesting to the same and \$8.00 for the unneutered male or unspayed female dog, or one-half of these amounts if the dog became 5 months of age after July 1 of the license year. These minimums may be supplemented by local municipal action. The fee for a multiple dog license is \$35.00 for the first 12 dogs. There is an additional fee of \$3.00 for each dog over 12 dogs.

PENALTIES

A late fee of \$5.00 shall be assessed the owner of each dog 5 months of age or over who fails to obtain a dog license by April 1, 2022.

An owner who fails to have a dog vaccinated against rabies as required by statute may be required to forfeit not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00. 2021 dog licenses must be obtained from your local treasurer.

Prevea using Impella heart pump to aid cardiology patients

Advanced heart failure is a chronic, progressive condition in which the heart is too weak to pump enough blood throughout the body.

For some patients with advanced heart failure, it may be determined their condition is too severe to undergo a typical stenting procedure to increase blood flow. So, how can a patient in these circumstances safely get the care, or more specifically, the stent they need?

Prevea Health interventional cardiologists Jennifer Davis, Todd Fergus, Simil Gala and Anas Sarhan are now providing a procedure called,

“protected stenting” with the Impella Heart Pump at HSHS St. Vincent Hospital in Green Bay. The Impella is the only FDA-approved, non-surgical heart pump proven safe and effective to assist the pumping function of the heart during stent placement and ensure blood flow is maintained to critical organs.

During the protected stenting procedure, an interventional cardiologist uses a catheter to insert the pencil-sized pump into a small incision on the patient’s femoral artery, then advances it through the arteries and into the heart. The pump,

Bonduel girls fall win short of state

Bears bounced after game-winning 3 by Westfield

The Bonduel High School girls basketball team's season ended just one win short of state.

After toppling St. Mary Catholic 57-46 in a Division 4 sectional semifinal playoff game March 3 at Crivitz High School, Bonduel lost a 41-38 heartbreaker against Westfield in the sectional final game March 5 at Waupaca High School. Westfield hit a game-winning 3-pointer as time expired to claim the victory and advance to state.

The loss signaled the end for three Bonduel seniors — Allaina Robaidek, Brenna Hertzfeldt and Kylie Hoffman. The trio were all four-year letter winners and finished with a record of 88-12, which included two Central Wisconsin Conference-East Division titles and four regional championships.

Sectional final

With 1.2 seconds left, Westfield's Carly Drew caught an inbounds pass, took a dribble and step back before throwing a one-handed shot toward the rim. The 3-pointer went in, sending the Westfield team and crowd into a frenzy and left Bonduel players and fans stunned.

"I told them all that I love them very much, that I couldn't be prouder of their efforts," said Bonduel coach Jerry Reinke on his message to the team after the game.

It was a tough way to end the season for Bonduel, especially considering the fight the team had to put up just to tie the game up. Westfield came into the game on fire from 3-point land, making four in the opening six minutes to jump out to a 14-4 advantage.

Bonduel slowly began to chip into the deficit, working it down to four before Westfield went into halftime up seven, 20-13.

Westfield hit another 3-pointer on its first possession of the second half and looked to be in complete control up 28-17 with about 14 minutes to play. That's when Bonduel finally

started making up ground on Westfield.

A bucket from sophomore Hailee Thompson followed by a 3-pointer and another basket by Robaidek got the Bears within four points.

Westfield worked its lead back up to eight, but Bonduel went on a 8-1 run to make it a one-point game, 33-

32. Sophomores Hailey Zernicke and Ella Hischke, Robaidek and freshman Audrey Weier scored on the run.

"We've been very resilient all year; that's the way we've played," said Reinke. "I couldn't be prouder of our kids. I guess you could say (Westfield) made one more play."

Westfield looked to regain control

with a 5-2 spurt, but Bonduel wasn't finished yet. Hoffman hit two clutch free throws, and then Robaidek hit a driving layup with just under 25 seconds to play to tie it up.

Westfield called a timeout with 12.5 seconds left. Bonduel blocked a potential game-winning jumpshot but couldn't gain possession of the ball.

After another Westfield timeout with 1.2 seconds left, Drew hit the game-winning shot.

"I thought our kids were good; they did everything the coach asked them," said Reinke of the team's play down the stretch. "We played great defense to get back into it. We were just one play short."

Fittingly, it was the three seniors who led the team in scoring. Robaidek led the Bears with 13 points. Hertzfeldt had seven points, while Hoffman provided six.

Hertzfeldt grabbed a team-leading seven rebounds, while Zernicke had five before fouling out with about six minutes to play.

Sectional semifinal

Bonduel used a 10-2 run to pull away from St. Mary Catholic down the stretch.

After battling back and forth for most of the game, Bonduel went ahead 42-35 after a 9-2 run, only to have SMC score the next four points to tighten the game back up. Hischke then went

on a personal 5-0 run to make it 47-39, but the Zephyrs got right back in it with a five-point spurt.

Kirk Bahr has stepped down as the Menominee Indian High School wrestling coach after two decades.

Bahr was the head varsity coach for 20 seasons, while also coaching a year in the youth program.

"The reason I am stepping down as head coach is to spend more time with my family," said Bahr, who was named the Central Wisconsin Conference Coach of the Year three times, including this winter. "My wife Angela and my 9-year-old son Bennett don't get to see me much during the winter months, and it is time for me to be home more."

During his time as the Eagles' head coach, the school won its first and only regional title in 2014. The team's wrestlers racked up 41 all-conference honors and had five wrestlers win conference titles.

The Eagles had 42 individual wrestlers qualify for sectionals and six state qualifiers under Bahr. Seventeen wrestlers won regional titles.

Menominee Indian earned 145 dual wins during Bahr's tenure. The school hadn't won a dual in 11 years before Bahr arrived.

While the coaches are typically the ones teaching the athletes, Bahr's wrestlers also returned the favor.

"My wrestlers teach me every year. I never knew what an impact the sport of wrestling would have on these student-athletes' lives. We have built a brotherhood at Menominee," said Bahr. "Although winning is fun, coaching has not been about winning and losing. It has been about building relationships that will last for years to come."

"I would like to think that most of the young men and women who wrestled for me can look back and be proud of what they accomplished, on and off the mat. We went through good and bad times together and became a family. But most importantly, we had a ton of fun times together, and that is what I will remember most."

Bahr thanked his assistant coaches Matt Pleshek and Dale Hodkiewicz for their help over the years, adding he couldn't have done it without them.

Kyle Winker, who was an assistant under Bahr this season, is the one taking over the program. Winker wrestled under Bahr and was on the team that won the regional title in 2014.

Winker also was a state qualifier and owns the school's all-time win mark for a career with 116 and most wins in a season with 44.

"I could not have left the team in better hands, and I hope some more of my ex-wrestlers will come to help carry on what we have built the past 20 years," said Bahr. "It has been my honor to have coached so many great student-athletes at

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Menominee Indian High School."
