Anderson foes take to streets

Petitioners feel superintendent's removal only way to restore schools

Community members seeking to have Randi Anderson removed as Shawano School District superintendent took their efforts from online to offline April 13.

Several more outspoken residents set up a table outside Angie's Main Cafe to solicit signatures on a petition asking the board to remove Anderson as the district's leader and find someone they feel would be more transparent with people about the financial and educational difficulties that the public schools are facing. The residents were able to get 35 signatures from people strolling through downtown, but an online version of the petition has garnered over 1,100 signatures since it was created on April 10.

The signature collection efforts were happening one block away from the Farm Inn, where Anderson and other district officials were holding a listening session at the same time to get at the heart of community concerns. Several community members solicited downtown in order to reach community members who don't access the internet but might have issues with what's happening in the schools.

For Joyce Phalen, a former school board member who stayed in front of Angie's for several hours, the damage has been done, and nothing short of new leadership will resolve the school situation.

"The petition to remove her is necessary because she doesn't realize that there is a community that doesn't like how she's running things," Phalen said. "She seems to think there are 10 or 20 little people out here that are bucking her system. That is not the case."

Phalen cited major changes like the switch to Apple computer products for education and student use, along with the exodus of many longtime educators, as reasons that Anderson has been a poor leader.

"She needs to be figuring out how we're going to keep our teachers, how we get out of our debt and how we keep the schools open," Phalen said. "Other school districts around us are doing that and doing

it just fine. What is wrong with her that she can't understand that from us?"

Phalen said community members could be persuaded to back off if Anderson could show that she could work with the community and try to make things better in the schools, but she wasn't convinced that could be a reality.

"I can't see that happening, because she continues to disrespect us in every way she can," Phalen said.

The petitions cannot compel the Shawano School Board to remove Anderson, but if the board opts not to do so once the petitions are presented, Phalen suggested it might be necessary to look at recalling board members.

Even if the board decides to cut ties with Anderson, the district will need to find leadership right away, Phalen noted.

"You have to find an interim one right away, and then we go from there to find out how we can financially get forwarded to getting a referendum to get our schools up-to-date and give our teachers some raises," she said. "It's time to

clean house."

The housecleaning sentiment was shared by Leslie Lemerond, a Shawano Community High School junior who has been among those speaking out at recent school board meetings about a perceived lack of empathy from administration to teachers, students and parents.

"Randi says she cares about us, and I'm not denying that," Lemerond said. "I do think, however, that she's exaggerating how much she cares a little bit."

Lemerond said she has asked Anderson for specifics on the students she oversees and claimed that the superintendent told her that she "hasn't been in there for a while."

"I want to believe that she's going to change for the better, but also I understand that if she doesn't, we need to get a change in there," Lemerond said. "I do attend the schools. This is my home, and I will have opinions, whether she likes it or not."

Anderson told NEW Media she had no comment on the petition efforts.

Communication problems, solutions discussed

School district meeting shows where trust is low and how it can improve

A better freeflow of information from the schools to the community was a common thread during a meeting that Shawano School District Superintendent Randi Anderson held with the public April 13 at the Farm Inn in Shawano.

It was the second of four meetings that the district had set up for the community to address concerns and get word about what it is doing. The meetings come in the wake of parents publicly expressing surprise and anger about the methods being offered to close a \$2 million deficit in its 2022-23 budget.

"This is another opportunity for you to engage in conversation and dialogue and find out what we can do to better support our system and students so that we can offer the programs that we currently have," Anderson said.

Jen Green, a former choir teacher for the district, suggested that having a website where information is easier to find and access would be a good way for administrators to increase transparency. She noted that finding information on Shawano's website was more challenging than it is for school districts in Gillett and Pulaski, adding that she was able to find out information about how the Gillett School District was utilizing its Elementary and Secondary School Relief Funds received from the federal government, a question some have had for Shawano officials.

Green said that the website should also be used as a recruiting tool and showing all of the good programs that Shawano has, noting that the Pulaski School District has a "brag page" that is used to encourage families outside the district to either move into the area or enroll their children through Wisconsin's open enrollment program.

"The thing is, we have a lot of the same things that Pulaski does," Green said. "We have a button that says 'open enrollment' but it is a PDF of the (Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction) brochure of how you enroll, but it doesn't say why choose Shawano, when we really have so much to offer. If I

were going to open enroll in another district, I would first go to their website."

Green added that the district is showing some good things on its Facebook page, but unless parents who are looking for good schools for their children have liked the page, they're likely unaware about the "really neat stuff" in the Shawano public schools.

Anderson acknowledged that the website does not provide a user-friendly experience but indicated that there are plans to revamp it this summer and hopefully resolve some of the issues Green brought up. The district page and the schools' pages should mirror each other so that people are not spending a lot of time clicking on tabs in the hopes of finding the information they seek.

"We want it to be a website where you can go, and you can click and find information," Anderson said. "Unfortunately, it's been a piece of work that we've had to push off the plate because of some of the other things we've had to deal with."

While online information would help increase transparency to a degree, some in attendance think

that allowing parents to freely come to the school and see for themselves how things are going would help build trust and faith in the schools again. Sheila Aumann, one parent who has been pushing for answers to the questions the community has had in recent months, took exception to a statement at the meeting made by school board member James Davel that teachers spend more time parenting in their classrooms than they do educating.

"The teachers have become the parents," Davel said. "It's the most disappointing thing since I've had my kids in school to see. That's our biggest problem. People don't like to hear that."

Aumann responded by saying that she has had to jump through hoops just to be involved with her child's school activities.

"You've shut the doors. We haven't been allowed to be in the schools for two years," Aumann said. "I'm a parent who has always been involved. That could be a problem with our parent involvement. We've been told we can't be in the schools."

Aumann added that she had to get permission and school approval this

year just to go into the school for a Valentine's Day party.

"I have not been able to enter the building to even pick them up," said Aumann, who added at the end of the meeting that she has emailed board members with direct questions and not received replies.

Efforts at better communication extended after the meeting, as well. Anderson sat down one-on-one with parent Bobbi Lemerond for 20 minutes after the official meeting ended and addressed concerns that teachers are not being appreciated and that students are being treated like data instead of human beings.

"My daughter is not a test score," Lemerond said with her voice breaking. "None of my children are."

Anderson told Lemerond that her heart is in the Shawano community and with the kids that make up the public schools. She noted that administrators have done what they can, even in little ways, to show teachers they're valued.

"As an administrative team, we've handed out roses. We've handed out cookies," Anderson said.

Vote on school pay raises postponed

Board members differ on how to compensate various staff groups

Plans to give a pay raise to all Shawano School District employees were put on hold after Shawano School Board members tried to alter administrative recommendations on April 18.

The recommended route was to give teachers, support staff and administrators a 4.7% boost, which was expected to cost the district about \$725,000. Business manager Josh Swanson recommended the board consider two different ways to distribute that raise — one was a straight salary increase, while the other was a 2.7% increase in the base wage and the rest coming from an increased stipend.

The 4.7% pay increase was recommended based on the rate of inflation established in January, although inflation has jumped to 8.54% since then. The pay raise recommendation comes on the heels of the public announcement that the neighboring Clintonville School District was giving salaried staff a 5.2% raise and hourly staff a 4% raise.

“Obviously, a lot of surrounding school districts are using that 4.7% as a benchmark,” Swanson said.

Swanson warned that the pay increase, while not impacting next year’s budget, is expected to cause a shortfall in the district’s 2023-24 budget. He noted that the district is using Emergency and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief funding to help plug up the remainder of a \$2 million budget gap in the 2022-23 budget, but the funding should not be expected to clear up the red ink the following year.

“We could be looking at an additional \$1.3 million to \$2 million in a deficit in two years,” Swanson said, noting the estimates were conservative. “The further out we go, the more unpredictable things become.”

Board president Michael Sleeper pointed out that the district is operating under the state’s current biennial budget, which provided a zero increase in per-pupil funding, but 2023 will be the next time the Wisconsin Legislature works on the budget, so

the financial outlook could be very different.

“It’s still in discussions whether we do or don’t go out for an operations referendum,” Sleeper said. “A year from now, we would know if that passed or not.”

Board member James Davel, who sits on the finance committee that recommended the raise, agreed that there were some unknown variables for the future that could impact how the district gives pay increases, but he said the proposal before the board was “warranted.”

However, it quickly became evident that board members didn’t want to provide an across-the-board raise for all categories of employees.

Board member Mike Musolff noted that, working on the last budget, it was revealed that support staff pay was “deficient,” so he recommended that those employees receive an additional 2% increase, bringing their raise to 6.7% and garnering applause from the standing-room-only crowd. When asked what the financial impact would be, Swanson said he didn’t have the figures, which ultimately led the board to vote to postpone the decision to its May 2 meeting.

It was also unclear what the finan-

cial impact would be if the board opted not to give administrators a raise at all. Board member Mart Grams made that recommendation, suggesting that the financial quagmire the district is in that has resulted in the district having to cut staff positions is not something the board should be rewarding.

“Knowing that we’ve cut staff, and that we’re debating to cut more, I don’t think the administration should get a raise,” Grams said. “They have less people to administer. If there’s less kids, we have less teachers. If we have less teachers, we need less administrators.”

Grams added that the salary freeze for administrators was the minimum that should be done and went on to suggest that a 5% pay cut would be warranted.

“They’re not in the classroom,” Grams said.

Board member Chris Gull noted that, even though he couldn’t vote on the pay increase because of a conflict of interest due to being related to a staff member, he didn’t think the 4.7% raise was enough.

“I think teachers are vastly underpaid, and I wish we could do more,” Gull said.

Gull also expressed pessimism that

an operational referendum would pass due to “large, well-funded members of the community” possibly coming out against it. He said that if a referendum failed, instead of surgical cuts the board has had to make to downsize its staff structure, it could be looking at harsher cuts.

Megan Pyaskowit, a community member and parent in the district as well as a substitute teacher, said she was pleased to see the raise being considered, which was much higher than the 1.23% salary increase approved by the board the previous year. However, she did not feel administrators should be included since they received an additional 4% raise in the last two years that teachers and support staff did not receive.

“I would like to recommend administrators receive only a 0.7% pay raise so that it is equal with the raise all the other employees received,” Pyaskowit said. “I was not given the 1.23% pay raise at the start of the school year, and the reason I was given was that the district has to be very careful with its money. I have a salary of \$31,500. Apparently, \$387 was too much for the district.”

Rose Mary Prokash passed away on Good Friday, April 15, 2022, in Shawano, on her 95th birthday. Our mother died peacefully in her own bed, surrounded by and being held by her loving family. She was able to hug, kiss and be kissed by each of her 10 children the day before she passed.

Rose was born April 15, 1927, in Kewaunee County, daughter of Wenzel and Elizabeth Schlies, the eighth of her parents' nine children. She graduated from Kewaunee High School in 1944 and continued to Door-Kewaunee County College.

Floyd Prokash was a childhood friend of the family. Rose accepted his proposal of marriage after he returned from serving in the U.S. Marines as a fighter pilot in World War II. Marie; a grandson, Daniel Johnson; and brothers and sisters, Audrey, Dorothy, Myrna, Dick, Jerry and Bill.

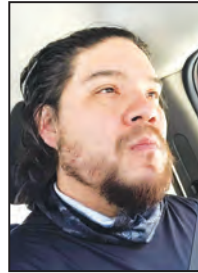

ORDINANCE NO.: 2006

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHAWANO, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN that Chapter 11. HEALTH AND SANITATION, Section 11.10 Control of Weeds, grass, and plants (1) Mowing required, (2) Mowing/trimming/cutting by City, and (4) Specific exemptions are hereby amended as follows:

(1) Mowing required. No person owning property within the City shall permit any weeds, grass or plants to grow to a height exceeding eight inches. Any such weeds, grass or plants exceeding said height are hereby declared to be a nuisance. In order to prevent such growth, it shall be the duty of every property owner to mow or cause to be mowed upon his or her premises all such weeds, grass and plants exceeding eight inches in height. It is the property owner's responsibility to maintain all grass, weeds and plants in any abutting street right-of-way.

(2) Mowing/trimming/cutting by City. It shall be the duty of the designated Code Enforcement Officer to enforce this section, and if any person shall fail to comply herewith, the Code Enforcement Officer shall, after 48 hours' written notice to the owner, cause the premises to be mowed/trimmed/cut and shall report the cost thereof, in writing, to the City Clerk and to the property owner. The costs/fees shall be as set by Council resolution. In the event of nonpayment within 30 days from said report of cost, such cost shall be assessed against the real estate as a special charge. Repeat offenses at a premises, occurring within a six-month period following a mowing/trimming/cutting by the City, will not be noticed to the property owner and the Code Enforcement Officer shall cause the premises to be mowed/trimmed/cut and the costs reported and collected as provided above.

(4) Specific exemptions. To prevent unnecessary hardship and to avoid practical difficulty in complying with the foregoing mowing requirements, any aggrieved party may request a specific exemption from the Code Enforcement Officer. Such request shall be submitted in writing and shall detail the unnecessary hardship or practical difficulty claimed. Any exemptions so granted by the Code Enforcement Officer shall be in writing, shall clearly show what particular and specific unnecessary hardship or practical difficulty is exempted, and a copy of same shall be filed with the City Clerk so as to be available for public inspection. Denials of specific exemptions by the Code Enforcement Officer may be appealed in writing, within 30 days, to the Field Committee. The decision of the Field Committee shall be given in writing, within seven days, subject to approval of the Council.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

Over 20 catalytic converters stolen from Chimney Mechanix

Catalytic converters have been an easy target for thieves, looking to make some quick money in Shawano.

Chimney Mechanix found this out the hard way, as it was recently a victim of people stealing the catalytic converters off of cars.

Owner Jasper Drengler said that over 20 catalytic converters were stolen from Chimney Mechanix on the night between April 11 and April 12. Drangler noted that the business did have cameras, but staff was unable to identify the suspect. Even though they were not able to identify the suspect, Drangler said that this person had left behind some belongings, including power tools.

"There was close to \$40,000 taken from our trucks," said Drengler.

He added that the business lost more than just the catalytic converters.

"Our flock of trucks was damaged, as they ripped through metal and wires in order to take these catalytic converters," said Drengler.

Drengler said that no personal

vehicles were harmed and the business has been working to repair their work vehicles.

The issue of catalytic converters has been an issue all around the area, with Police Chief Bradley Rabideau reporting a noticeable uptick to the Shawano Common Council on April 13.

"This is something that is national, and it hit us this last weekend," Rabideau said.

Rabideau suggested keeping outdoor lights on at night, as it seems to be the darkness that emboldens the thieves. Keeping vehicles in a garage when possible would also help deter thieves from their efforts.

"Keep an eye out," Rabideau said as a recommendation for residents to avoid being a victim. "If you hear something or see something, give us a call. We're open 24 hours for a reason. We got calls today where they said, 'I heard this but I didn't think anything of it.' If it's nothing, we're glad that it's nothing, but that could be the one thing that helps us nab these guys."

Sleeper butchers right to free speech

We've all seen a television show or movie where someone has been kidnapped or taken hostage, and that person tries to fight back. In some cases, they're tied up and gagged so the villains don't have to listen to the protestations. In other cases, they're smacked around to elicit submission.

It was disturbing to see that kind of scenario play out during the April 18 Shawano School Board meeting when board president Michael Sleeper engaged in the metaphorical version of those actions by informing the large crowd assembled in the Shawano Community High School library that he would not be allowing all of the 20 people who had signed up to speak. He claimed it was a hindrance to the board proceeding in an efficient fashion with its business.

It was impossible to ignore the irony in that statement, considering most of the people in the library had been waiting for close to 90 minutes for the board to waltz out of a closed session at the start of the meeting. Community members probably didn't want to be postponing their dinner and family time to speak out against some actions — and in some cases, inactions — by the district and board, but they did it because they've felt ignored and disrespected.

Sleeper's action exacerbated that disrespect, but more importantly, it was a direct assault on the First Amendment of the United States Constitution. One man ruled that he wasn't going to allow those who

followed all the rules to speak to have their say, and he cherry-picked who was going to speak, going against the concept of free speech.

"There's also a tremendous amount of redundancy," Sleeper claimed. "What I am going to do is, when I see multiple individuals that want to comment on the same topic, we'll have one comment on that topic. We do have to be efficient."

Efficiency is a poorly veiled attempt at censorship. Even those folks who don't read the newspaper, listen to the radio or watch Green Bay's news shows are aware that the school district's relationship with the community is strained — check that, unhealthy. Censoring the outrage is not going to make it go away.

Outside of the meeting, community members have been gathering signatures on a petition to have Randi Anderson removed as superintendent, getting close to 1,200 signatures in just over a week. That petition was not allowed to be presented, which adds a second violation to Sleeper's attack of the First Amendment — petitioning the government for a redress of grievances.

The Shawano Education Association distributed a survey that garnered more than two-thirds

response from teachers about their thoughts on the condition of the school district and their faith in the administration. Speakers who planned to address the survey and its damning portrait of the Shawano School District were also denied the opportunity to speak.

Sleeper couldn't even stick to his own rules saying that people who'd spoken at previous board meetings would not be allowed to take the podium. He made a point of saying that Christine McKinnies would be passed over, having already barked at McKinnies at a listening session the week before and claiming she needed to get her facts straight, but then he allowed Sheila Aumann to speak, even though Aumann had also taken multiple opportunities to express her views.

That action came back to bite Sleeper when Aumann didn't filter her comments and got both raucous applause from the audience and angry gaveling from Sleeper. Instead of trying to keep negative commentary out of the meeting, board members should be hearing from all sides to make an informed decision.

Sleeper pointed out during a condescending lecture that it is a "privilege" that community members are allowed to speak during the public comments portion of the meeting, which begs the question of whether he plans to yank the agenda item entirely in future meetings if he tires of people continuing to drive the

point home that the school district is proceeding in the wrong direction. It would be a bad idea, given how furious the community is, but the board's courtship of bad ideas is not unprecedented.

There were other steps Sleeper could have taken. He could have asked the multiple people speaking on a single topic to consider letting one or two people make their point. He didn't. He could have asked the board when it approved the agenda to consider moving the community comments after the board took care of its business or possibly break it up into two sessions — one before and one after. He didn't.

By cutting back on community comments, it only increases the bitterness and anger. The problem with bitterness and anger is, if it's allowed to fester, sometimes people lash out. My earlier comparison to a hostage situation didn't include the fact that, on occasion, the person being stifled goes into a rage and beats the stuffing out of the oppressor. Is that where Sleeper and the school district want things to progress?

Michael Sleeper, do better. Shawano School District, do better. The pulse of the community right now is akin to a whistling tea kettle, but if you continue to assault the right to free speech, it could look like an erupting volcano instead.

Scooters coming to Shawano in May

Council approves agreement with Bird Rides, ordinance to regulate devices

Visitors to Shawano and those who call the city home can expect to see electric scooters moving around the community after the Shawano Common Council approved a memorandum of understanding April 13 with Bird Rides Inc.

The council also adopted an ordinance regulating the use of scooters.

The agreement with Bird Rides allows the scooters to be operated on most streets, with the exception of Green Bay Street and other streets with a speed limit above 25 miles per hour, along with bike lanes and bike paths. While the scooters will be

available to rent 24 hours a day, the city can opt to limit operational hours from 4 a.m. to midnight.

The ordinance opens up the option for other scooter licensees to operate within the city, but requires that requests for more than 300 scooters get approval from the council first. Licensees will be required to relocate improperly parked scooters within three hours notice if the notice occurs between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., and by 10 a.m. if the violation occurs after hours.

Scooters will be required, under the ordinance, to have wheel-lock technology to prevent unauthorized use, and geofencing has to be used to prevent scooter usage in prohibited areas. Sidewalk scooter usage is prohibited,

and the speed limit for scooters is 20 miles per hour. Operators must be at least 18 and have a driver's license.

City Administrator Eddie Sheppard said the concept of electric scooters in the community was well received when Bird presented the idea last month.

"It'll be a nice, little thing for us to have, especially with tourists in summer," Sheppard said.

City officials felt it was important to establish an ordinance before entering into any agreements with any scooter companies, according to Sheppard, noting that other cities were establishing their own laws to regulate not only scooter companies but anyone who owned a scooter privately.

The ordinance is for electric scooters only and won't impact gas-powered scooters.

"We're not regulating them," Mayor Bruce Milavitz said. "They're being regulated through state regulations."

Milavitz added he's been in another community recently that had Bird scooters, and it looked like they were well received and well regulated.

"I think we're going to be in a good position by doing this right away," Milavitz said.

Scooters could be hitting the streets in May, provided that Bird Rides can find a local partner to manage the scooters.

Plaza work to close Main Street for two weeks

Shawano residents will need to adjust their plans for navigating around the downtown area as work begins on the new plaza.

City Administrator Eddie Sheppard said that work has begun on Washington Street, including the crossing from the plaza to Franklin Park. He told the Shawano Common Council on April 13 that it had originally been discussed to start road work on Main Street first, but with asphalt plants not getting up and

running until mid-May, there was a concern that having one of the city's main thoroughfares for a lengthy period would not be acceptable.

Main Street will be closed down April 25 at the spot where the plaza is going to be connected, just south of Division Street, so anyone going to the post office will need to take an alternate route. The closure is expected to last two weeks, according to Sheppard, and access to the post office and businesses will still be available during the closure.

Once the road work is done, crews will begin work on the east side of

the plaza, next to Stubborn Brothers Brewery, and then proceed to the west side of the plaza, adjacent to the Shawano Civic Center. Sheppard said the work could be completed around mid-August if weather doesn't cause delays but said it would be more likely finished at the end of the month.

"We've been having weekly meetings with the contractors, who are right on the ball with stuff," Sheppard said. "From my perspective, things are moving along well from the beginning."

That doesn't mean there couldn't be some shifts in the plan, depending

on weather and unforeseen situations, so Sheppard is asking residents and businesses to be flexible.

"Until we get everything out of the streets, there are going to be hiccups, so I'm asking for everyone's patience until we get it done," Sheppard said. "At the end of the day, it's going to be awesome."

The city will hold a groundbreaking ceremony at 10 a.m. April 22 on the east side of the proposed plaza. Attendees are welcome to bring their own shovel.

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHAWANO, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN that Chapter 5, Streets and Sidewalks, Section 5.043 Regulation of Electric Scooters is hereby created as follows:

- (1) Intent. The intent of this ordinance is to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by preventing or mitigating against any adverse impact that electric scooter rental and operation may have, by restricting the locations in which electric scooters may be operated and parked, and by licensing the short-term commercial rental of electric scooters in the city.
- (2) Definitions. The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this division, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
 - a. Electric scooter. A device weighing less than 100 pounds that has handlebars and an electric motor, is powered solely by the electric motor and human power and has a maximum speed of not more than 20 miles per hour on a paved, level surface when powered solely by the electric motor. "Electric scooter" does not include an electric personal assistive mobility device, motorcycle, motor bicycle, electric bicycle, or moped.
 - b. Licensee. The holder of a commercial electric scooter rental license issued under ordinance
 - c. Operate an electric scooter. To ride on an electric scooter powered at least in part by the electric motor.
 - d. Rebalancing. The redistribution of electric scooters throughout the city.
 - e. User. An individual who uses an electric scooter for the purpose of transportation or recreation.
- (3) Usage of electric scooters.
 - a. No person shall operate an electric scooter on any roadway under the city's jurisdiction having a speed limit of more than 25 miles per hour.
 - b. No person shall operate an electric scooter on any sidewalk under the city's jurisdiction.
 - c. No person shall operate an electric scooter on Green Bay Street other than to lawfully cross such street.
 - d. Electric scooters may be operated on any roadway under the city's jurisdiction having a speed limit of 25 miles per hour or less, and on recreational trails under the city's jurisdiction, subject to State, Federal and County regulations.
 - e. No person who has not attained the age of 12 may operate an electric scooter unless he or she is accompanied by and under the direct supervision of an adult over the age of 18 years of age.
- (4) Parking of electric scooters.
 - a. Electric scooters shall be parked in an upright position, with two wheels making a point of contact with the ground.
 - b. Electric scooters shall not be parked in a way that provides less than a five-foot wide path on the sidewalk for pedestrian access.
 - c. Electric scooters shall not be parked between the sidewalk and the curb where such area is less than three feet wide.
 - d. Where possible without impeding the flow of pedestrian traffic, an electric scooter may be parked on a sidewalk, or in a bicycle rack or other similar area designated for bicycle parking.
 - e. On blocks without sidewalks, electric scooters may be parked in the roadway if the right-of-way and the pedestrian way are not obstructed by so parking the electric scooter.
 - f. Except at existing permitted bicycle facilities, electric scooters shall not be parked between the sidewalk and the curb where adjacent to or within the following locations:
 - 1) Parklets;
 - 2) Loading zones;
 - 3) Accessible parking spaces;
 - 4) Curb ramps;
 - 5) Entryways;
 - 6) Driveways;
 - 7) Street furniture requiring pedestrian access; and
 - 8) Transit stops (including bus stops, shelters, and passenger waiting areas).
- (5) Rental of electric scooters.
 - a. License required. No person or business shall offer short-term commercial rental of electric scooters to the public unless the person or business has obtained a license in accordance with this section.
 - b. License application requirements.
 - 1) Application for a commercial electric scooter rental license shall be made in writing to the city clerk, upon applications furnished by the clerk's office.
 - i. In the case of a sole proprietorship, the owner shall sign the application.
 - ii. In the case of a partnership, the name of the business and the names and addresses of all partners shall be provided on the application. One of the partners shall sign the application.
 - iii. In the case of an LLC or a corporation, the name of the business and the names and addresses of the principal officers shall be provided on the application. In the case of an LLC, one of the members shall sign the application. In the case of a corporation, the president and secretary shall sign the application.
 - 2) The application shall identify contact information (including a phone number and email address) for an operations manager based within 50 miles of the city.
 - 3) The applicant shall include a copy of their user agreement and privacy policy with the application.
 - 4) Insurance.
 - i. The applicant shall include a certificate of insurance with the application that meets the requirements of this provision.
 - ii. The applicant's insurance shall provide that the City of Shawano will receive a 30-day written notice of cancellation, non-renewal, or material change by any insurer providing coverage required by this provision.
 - iii. Insurance companies must have a current A.M. Best rating of A-VII or better.
 - iv. Applicant's insurance policy limits shall meet at least the following requirements:
 - a. Workers' compensation (only required if the applicant employs persons within the State of Wisconsin): Statutory limits.
 - b. Commercial general liability insurance: \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$3,000,000.00 in the aggregate.
 - c. Auto liability: \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 in the aggregate.
 - v. The City of Shawano shall be listed as an additional insured on the applicant's commercial general liability insurance policy.
 - vi. If applicant uses subcontractors for maintenance, rebalancing, or any other aspects of the applicant's commercial electric scooter rental business, the subcontractor must be covered by applicant's insurance or applicant must demonstrate the subcontractor independently meets the insurance provisions of this requirement.
 - 5) Indemnification. The applicant shall agree to indemnify, defend, and hold the City of Shawano (and the city's officers, employees, and agents) harmless from and against all actions, damages, or claims brought against the City of Shawano arising out of the applicant's operations. The city attorney shall have the authority to negotiate the terms of the indemnification provision with the applicant.
 - 6) Application fee. The fee for a commercial electric scooter rental license required by this article shall be as set by Council resolution.
 - 7) Granting licenses. The city clerk shall issue a license under this section if all requirements have been met and if issuance is in the best interest of the city. The city clerk may deny any license under this section in his or her full discretion in the interest of public safety or if the application is not in the interest of the city. In reviewing the application, the city clerk shall consider any input from the city administrator, the city attorney, the police chief, the director of planning and development, or their designees. If the clerk denies a license, the applicant may appeal said denial to the licensing, hearing, and public safety committee of the common council.
 - 8) Term of license. Any license issued pursuant to this section shall be effective upon issuance. It shall expire on the 31st day of December following its issuance.
 - c. Rental operation requirements. In conducting their electric scooter rental business, each holder of a commercial electric scooter rental license shall comply with the following:

- 1) Maximum number of scooters. No licensee shall have more than 300 scooters available for rent within the city at any one time without the approval of the common council.
 - 2) Hours of operation. No licensee shall make electric scooters available for rent before 4:00 a.m. or after midnight.
 - 3) User fees. Any user fee for the rental of an electric scooter shall be clearly and understandably communicated to the user prior to the usage of the electric scooter.
 - 4) Parking. The licensee shall:
 - i. Provide instructions for properly parking electric scooters to users.
 - ii. Keep the sidewalk free from obstructions to pedestrians by requiring users to park electric scooters such that a walk space not less than five feet wide shall at all times be kept open for pedestrians.
 - iii. Use geofencing to prohibit parking in areas in which parking is prohibited by this division.
 - iv. Upon notification by the city administrator or a designee to the operations manager that an electric scooter of license is improperly parked, the licensee shall relocate the electric scooter in accordance with the following requirements:
 - a. Within three hours of notice received between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
 - b. By 10:00 a.m. for notice received between 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
 The City of Shawano may relocate improperly parked electric scooters which are not relocated in accordance with this requirement and shall bill the licensee \$50.00 for each electric scooter it relocates, which is reasonably calculated to recapture the city's costs in relocating an improperly parked electric scooter.
 - v. Licensees may appeal fees imposed by subdivision iv (b), above, to the Finance Committee by providing written notice to the city clerk within ten business days of receiving notice of a fee.
 - vi. Licensees that owe \$500.00 or more to the City of Shawano related to the relocation of licensee's electric scooters shall, upon five business days written notice, have their license suspended until the total amount owed has been paid. Prior to the expiration of the five business days' notice, licensee shall remove their electric scooters from the city or shall make payment to the city. If licensee does not remove their electric scooters from the city or make payment to the city during this time period, the city may remove the electric scooters pursuant to subsection (e).
 - 5) Safety education. Licensee shall provide materials to its users to promote safe riding and educate users on rider responsibilities and encourage safe and courteous riding and parking.
 - 6) Snow events.
 - i. The licensee shall ensure that their electric scooters do not impede City of Shawano or resident snow removal and ice control operations.
 - ii. In the event that the City of Shawano declares a snow emergency, the licensee shall ensure that its electric scooters are removed from the right-of-way for the duration of the snow emergency.
 - 7) Notice of changes. In the event that licensee changes its operations manager identified in its application (including contact information for the operations manager), user agreement, privacy policy, or insurance, licensee shall provide notice to the city clerk within three business days of the change.
 - 8) Website or mobile application. If the licensee operates a website or smartphone application, the website and smartphone application shall:
 - i. Notify users that:
 - a. Helmet use is encouraged while riding an electric scooter;
 - b. Sidewalk riding is prohibited;
 - c. Users are required to follow all rules of the road; and
 - d. Scooters must be parked responsibly.
 - ii. Provide a means for users to notify the licensee if there is a safety or maintenance issue with the electric scooter. Licensee shall immediately take the scooter out of service upon receipt of notice that there is a safety or maintenance issue and shall not return the scooter to service until licensee has resolved the safety or maintenance issue.
 - 9) Electric scooter standards. Any electric scooter made available for rent by licensee must meet the following requirements:
 - i. Each electric scooter shall meet the requirements described in Wis. Stats. §§ 340.01(15ps), 347.489(1), 347.489(2), and 347.489(3).
 - ii. Each electric scooter shall include easily visible contact information, including a toll-free phone number and email address for members of the public to make relocation requests or to report other issues with the electric scooters.
 - iii. Each electric scooter shall be inspected by licensee at least once per month. The inspection shall include, at a minimum, a check of the brake function and brake-level wear. Any electric scooter deemed unsafe or inoperable shall be placed out of service immediately. Licensee shall maintain records of its inspections, which shall be open to the city for inspection upon reasonable request.
 - iv. Each scooter shall be equipped with wheel-lock technology to prevent unauthorized use.
 - v. Geofencing shall be used to prohibit usage in areas prohibited by this division.
 - vi. Each scooter shall be assigned a unique identifying number (which is clearly labeled on the electric scooter), which shall be provided to the city clerk prior to making the electric scooter available for rental in the city.
 - 10) Data and reporting. Licensee shall provide data reasonably requested by the City of Shawano to assist with monitoring program usage.
 - 11) Assist with user compliance. In addition to the requirements set forth above, licensee shall take any additional steps reasonably requested by the city to ensure appropriate usage of electric scooters by its users.
 - d. Suspension or revocation of license.
 - 1) A license may be suspended or revoked by the city clerk or their designee for any of the following reasons:
 - i. Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this article;
 - ii. Violating any state statutes or City Code provisions;
 - iii. By request of the city administrator, city attorney, police chief, or their designees, when said request provides evidence of the reasons in subdivisions i. or ii. above.
 - 2) Any licensee whose license has been suspended or revoked under the provisions of this subsection may appeal said suspension or revocation to the licensing, hearings, and public safety committee of the common council by providing written notice to the city clerk. The licensing, hearings, and public safety committee shall conduct a hearing within 30 days of receipt of a written appeal.
 - e. Unlicensed electric scooter rentals. In the event that a person or business commences short-term commercial rental of electric scooters to the public in the city without having first obtained a license in accordance with this section, the city may, without advance notice, take possession of any unauthorized electric scooters in the right-of-way. The city shall provide notice to the unauthorized person or business that it has taken possession of the electric scooters and invoice the unlicensed person or business the rate for relocating an electric scooter set in subdivision (c)(4)iv., above. The unlicensed person or may appeal fees imposed by this subsection to the Finance Committee by providing written notice to the city clerk within 20 business days of receiving notice of a fee. If the unlicensed person or business does not appeal the fees imposed or make payment within 45 days of receipt of invoice, the city may dispose of any electric scooters belonging to the unlicensed person or business in its possession. Any proceeds from the disposition shall be used to offset the unlicensed person or business's unpaid fees. Any costs from the disposition shall be billed to the unlicensed person or business.
- (6) Penalties. In addition to the penalties specifically provided in this subchapter, any person who shall violate any provision of this subchapter shall be subject to a penalty as provided in section 20.04 of this code.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

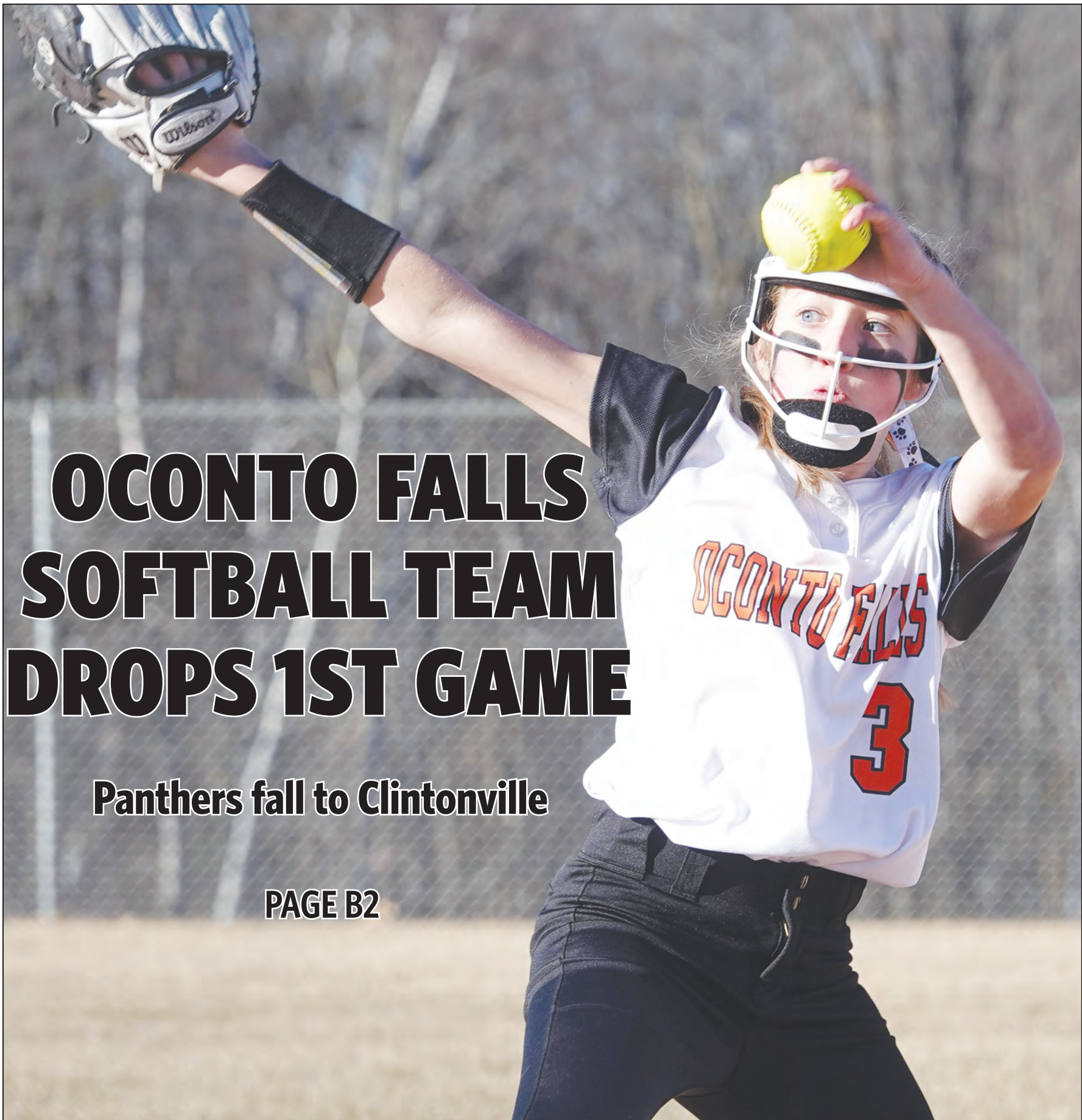

Engel added that first-game jitters played a role in the outcome, and she was confident the team would produce more in the coming games.

Trailing 8-3 heading into the bottom of the seventh, Oconto Falls was able to put a rally together to tighten up the game but came up a bit short

in the end.

Sophomore Kyndra Staidl walked with one out before Euclide reached on a bunt attempt. With two outs, Kurek came through with a hit to score Staidl and Euclide, but a groundout followed to end the contest.

Clements wants to help Rodgers reach Super Bowl

QB coach returns to Green Bay

The biggest offseason clue forecasting Aaron Rodgers' eventual decision to stay in Green Bay came when Tom Clements ended his retirement to begin a second stint as the Packers quarterback coach.

Clements also held that position when Rodgers led the Packers to a Super Bowl title during the 2010 season.

Clements continued getting praise from the four-time MVP long after leaving Green Bay.

The 68-year-old Clements now wants to help the 38-year-old Rodgers make at least one more Super Bowl appearance.

"I know that's what he wants," Clements said this week. "He wants another Super Bowl, and that was one of the things that intrigued me."

Clements' return to Green Bay is one of many changes to the Packers offensive staff this season as they adapt to life without Nathaniel Hackett, who spent the past three seasons as Green Bay's offensive coordinator before becoming the Denver Broncos head coach.

Hackett hired former Packers tight ends coach Justin Outten as his offensive coordinator. Clements takes over a position formerly held by Luke Getsy, who left to become Chicago's offensive coordinator under new Bears coach Matt Eberflus.

Even though Packers coach Matt LaFleur lost much of his offensive

staff, the new guys have plenty of familiarity with Green Bay's organization.

LaFleur promoted from within by making former offensive line coach Adam Stenavich the new coordinator and having former assistant offensive line coach Luke Butkus — the nephew of Hall of Fame line-backer Dick Butkus — fill Stenavich's old spot.

New tight ends coach John Dunn was a senior analyst for the Packers last season.

They face a major task in trying to make sure Green Bay's offense maintains its efficiency without All-Pro receiver Davante Adams, who was traded to the Las Vegas Raiders for a first-round and second-round draft pick.

"That's going to be a big challenge," Stenavich said. "I know our personnel staff and our coaching staff are really working hard at trying to find the best fits, whether it's through the draft or free agency, and I'm really excited about it."

The loss of his top playmaker could make it tough for Rodgers to maintain the form he showed while earning MVP honors the past two seasons.

Rodgers at least should benefit from having Clements back on board.

Clements previously worked for the Packers from 2006-16, first as a quarterbacks coach and later as offensive coordinator on Mike McCarthy's staff.

Rodgers has said he owes Clements plenty of credit for his development.

After working as the Arizona Cardinals passing game coordinator

and quarterbacks coach from 2019-20, Clements spent last season away from the game.

"I didn't have the itch to come back," Clements said.

A conversation with Rodgers helped change his mind.

"It was because of coming back to Green Bay, with Aaron, chance to win a Super Bowl," Clements said. "Those were the primary considerations."

That conversation when Rodgers was still deciding whether to return to the Packers, request a trade or retire. LaFleur said at the NFL scouting combine that Rodgers had a "significant" role in Clements' return.

"I think we interviewed each other to some level," LaFleur said at the time regarding his discussions with Clements.

"But the conversations we had, it was pretty easy for me to see why he is such a great quarterback coach and developer and such a great communicator. He has such a great

even-keeled demeanor."

Although Clements spent the past five seasons away from Green Bay, he still watched enough games to monitor Rodgers' progress. He's eager to join forces with the Packers superstar once again.

"Looking at it from afar, I thought he was playing a style more like when he was younger because he's playing more under center, play-action passes," Clements said. "In the later years that we were here, it was more of a not-too-much under center, exclusively shotgun, more of a spread offense. And in the early years, we relied on the running game and the play-action pass and got in the shotgun more on third-down situations like that, and that's more the style that I saw."

"When you can run the ball, it opens up a lot of things, and there's been a lot of explosive passes over the years off the play-action pass game, and hopefully we can continue to do that."

The Red Raiders had another runner reach with two outs, but she was eventually left stranded.

For the contest, Pulaski left nine runners on base.

"I would honestly say just overall a little bit of intensity and just self-confidence," said Benberg on what kept the team from cashing in more often throughout the conference game. Shawano man becomes master cheese maker

Henn points to knowledge, experience as the reasons why he was selected

Shawano resident Charles Henn was recently recognized for his work in cheese making.

Henn received an award for completing his training on becoming a master cheddar cheese maker on April 14 in Milwaukee.

Henn grew up in Shawano and said that he became interested in cheese making in college.

"I grew up on a dairy farm," said Henn. "I went to college at UW-River Falls. I had work study money and got a job working on the dairy plant on campus."

Henn said that he has worked in the cheese making industry for 21 years and walked through the process of how to become a master cheese maker, which includes applying to be in the master cheese making program.

"You have to obtain a cheese maker license — I did that in 2003," said Henn. "You then have to have your cheese maker license for 10 years before you can apply to get into the program."

He added that he also needed to take classes through the Center for Dairy Research (CDR) through the University of Wisconsin.

"You need to take two classes there before you can apply," said Henn. "Once you apply, they only accept a maximum of five people from the program a year."

According to Henn, once someone is accepted into the program, there are many more steps to complete.

"Once you get into the program, you have to do an oral exam, a plant visit and you have to spend roughly 3½ years working, where you submit cheese samples, take more classes and then take a written exam," said Henn.

Henn has been working on becoming a master cheese maker since he entered the profession.

"It is a lot of work, it took me 20 years to do it," said Henn.

He said that when he entered this profession, one of the goals that he wanted to accomplish was becoming a master cheese maker.

"I initially heard about the program when I took my cheese making

class in college," said Henn. "They explained the program and I always thought that it would be nice to have that honor and get into that elite group. I always felt like I had the knowledge to do it."

Using his knowledge and meeting the requirements is what Henn points to as why he was one of five people in Wisconsin selected this year to receive the award.

"This program is pretty intense," said Henn. "You are still working while in the program and trying to support your family. I think I stood out though because of my knowledge and experience, as well as the work that I put into the program, including the oral and written exams."

He added that, with only five people being selected a year from this program, there were times where he was denied from being accepted into the program.

"The first time that I tried to get in, I did not meet all of the require-

ments," said Henn. "I was missing a class with the CDR."

With this being one of his professional goals, Henn said that it is a great feeling to complete this program.

"I feel great about it," said Henn. "I am very happy that I got into the program and passed it."

Henn completed the program and was given the award as a master cheese maker with cheddar cheese. He is now looking at becoming a master cheese maker with other cheeses.

"My current plans is in Weyauwega for Agropur — we make cheddar and feta — now I am going to put in my time towards feta cheese and try to become a master cheese maker of feta," said Henn.

He called this award recognition for the hard work that he has put in for the last two decades.

"Everyone in my organization have been giving me so many congratulations," said Henn. "All the way

up to really high vice presidents have reached out. It has been so positive. Agropur has been such a great company for me. I have only been at the company for six years and three and half were spent with this program."

Throughout the last 20 years, Henn said that he has learned a couple of things about himself.

"Cheese has really changed my life," said Henn. "I was a part of a group in college who went to China, where we made cheese out of yak's milk. Just that whole experience changed my life. Before that I wasn't really open to trying new foods. Now I will try anything."

Henn ended giving advice to those who are trying to become a master cheese maker.

"My biggest thing is put in the hard work," said Henn. "If you want to move up, you need to put in that hard work."

Bessette plants education seeds in youngsters

Kohl grant recipient finds her calling with special education

An elementary school teacher in Clintonville is one of the latest to receive a Herb Kohl Teaching Fellowship Award.

Suzzann Bessette teaches early childhood special education students at Rexford-Longfellow Elementary School and recently received a \$6,000 grant from the Herb Kohl Educational Foundation. The Clintonville Public School District also received a matching grant.

Bessette is originally from Bowler; graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point; and lives in Shawano with her husband, Ryan, and their children, Luella and Stetson.

Bessette is one of 100 teachers from throughout Wisconsin to receive the award.

According to the foundation, the award is given to “educators who have been chosen for their superior ability to inspire a love of learning in their students, their ability to motivate others and their leadership and service within and outside the classroom.”

Bessette is in her fifth year in the district after six years as a 4K and early childhood special education teacher in Gillett. She received the award April 6.

“I can’t even begin to describe the rush of emotions that I experienced upon receiving the award,” she said. “The support that has been given from my family and friends, coworkers and the Gillett and Clintonville community is unbelievable.”

“I feel like this award is a huge step for special education,” she said. “All too often, special education teachers work behind the scenes and although our talents are celebrated in our district, they aren’t typically recognized at a state level. To feel validated, supported and acknowledged by the Herb Kohl Educational Foundation is truly an honor.”

Bessette’s passion for education stemmed from working with Special Olympics athletes.

“My mom was the agency manager for a local Special Olympics team,” Bessette said. “I found that I loved coaching the athletes in various sports, so I pursued a degree in education. When I accepted my position in Gillett, I got teaching experience in both a general and special education setting.”

“While there, I worked closely with this amazing little girl and her family,” she said. “Together, we had the opportunity to laugh, cry, celebrate success and navigate obstacles and it was in that moment that I knew I wanted to focus solely on special education.”

Bessette focuses her teaching energy on special needs students.

“I work with children in all types of environments such as Rexford-Longfellow elementary and 4K classrooms, Head Start, local childcare settings and families’ homes,” she said. “I find so much joy

getting to know students, their families and other teachers who are involved in their education.”

The job is rewarding in several ways, according to Bessette.

“Without hesitation, watching my students succeed and grow is at the top of the list,” she said. “The relationships I have developed with families and organizations in the community is also vital and the companionship and friendships that have been created since I started teaching will last a lifetime.”

Bessette said she has been able to make a difference in her students’ lives.

“I not only want to make an impact with the students I work with, but so much of my teaching philosophy is based on family involvement,” she said. “I can only hope that I leave a positive lasting impression with the families I encounter.”

“I am often the first person from the district that families meet as their child is referred for special education, so navigating those situations with understanding, acceptance and support is incredibly important. I always inform parents that when necessary, I will advocate for their child and their education. I hope that the students and families I work with feel valued, encouraged and safe. I feel like making a positive connection between home and school is vital for the success of all.”

Bessette said several teachers inspired her as a student.

“My first-grade teacher, Gloria Steinberg, showed me unconditional love as my mom battled cancer,” she said. “My ag teacher/FFA adviser, Jerry Ashenbrenner, helped me find my voice and confidence through public speaking, and my college adviser, Yomi Ogunnaike-Lafe, is deeply passionate about education and her lessons on social-emotional learning and family involvement helped create the foundation upon which I have built my teaching career.”

Bessette said opportunities have made her the teacher she is today.

“I honestly feel that I am the educator I am today because of the opportunities I have been given and the team I work with,” she said. “Without my coworkers’ support and trust from administration, I would not be nearly as confident in my skills as a special education teacher.”

“I also have had endless encouragement from my family, especially on the days where I feel defeated and overwhelmed. They remind me of my true calling as an educator.”

Bessette isn’t sure what she’ll do with her grant money.

“My daughter is convinced we need to take a trip to Disney World, but I haven’t made any plans on how I will spend the funds,” she said. “I’d like to give back to organizations that support children with special needs and maybe splurge a little on myself and my family.”

FARM LIFE FROM A FARM WIFE

Tapping maple trees turns into adventure

Serene and miraculously changing every season, our woodland holds year-round wonders. We've harvested not only deer and turkeys, but also wood, making our farmhouse cozy as toast. It's a multi-dimensional hunk of land we've been blessed to be the caretaker of. Turns out we get one more dimension out of it.

"Let's tap some trees," says he. My stomach dropped, eyes widened.

"Huh? What exactly are you pondering?" Thinking I'll let him down slowly.

"I'm sick of making wood, and we have maples on the ridge. I don't wanna stick pails on the trees halfway up the hill, just those we can get at without too much trouble."

Four-wheeling around one day, we strolled along the soggy ridge, still decorated with winter's blah, the moss-covered rounded stones, slick. Our ridge is at the edge of the field adjacent to the woods. He pointed out maples.

"There's one, there's one, here's two, three, four; there's another three, four." There were enough for me to get a pretty good picture of exactly what he had in mind.

We (yes, I agreed) decided to tap 60 trees and instead of cooking it down, sell the sap. With zero supplies, we started shopping. Our adventure had begun. Perusing Marketplace, discovered pails in Cecil. Driving to Birnamwood, bought taps at Sippl's. In Iola, purchased two 275-gallon white totes enclosed inside strong metal cases. We bought a strainer plus a calf pail at Fleet. The pail was for my benefit, as when he'd haul those full five-gallon pails to our trailer which held our totes, I'd pour it into the calf pail to easily hoist that through the strainer on the top of the totes.

Our overhead added up. We didn't wanna add it up. Ignorance is bliss. We had a trailer hauled by our tractor, plus our ATV with a bed on the back for transporting supplies.

One sunny day, promising good sap running in the future, saw us drill 60 holes in maples on the ridge. We wore short sleeves and no coat. Spring is here. (We were duped.) We brought a cordless drill, hammer, pails and an opti-

mistic attitude, which duplicating the upcoming weather trend, would fluctuate greatly. Coming home that late afternoon, our countenance pumped up; we were in our beloved woods, we are gonna help feed people. This is great. We rubbed our hands together with glee, patting ourselves on the back, eager to harvest sap.

First harvest brought a whopping 44 gallons. Our buyer was sympathetic; this was a lousy year so far. While it tested out very well, the quantity, not so much. We weren't in this to make money, that was quite obvious, nor had it been our intent. We just wanted to get out in the woods. One day after the sap had frozen, chunking off a clear icicle, it tasted sweet as sugar cane. The sap was good, just solid.

That day, we had thought we could gather but the sap was trapped under a frozen layer of ice. The weathermen forecasted all-day rain coming, so to save what was good we stopped at every tap, covering each pail with a sheet of heavy-duty aluminum foil.

One day in March after a particularly hard freeze and after some warmth that day, we decided to see what was going on out there. My husband started out in the tractor, hauling our trailered totes, me following in our ATV. Heading just down the lane going up to the woods, I noticed the tractor start to slide, then watched in horror as he kept sliding.

There's a spring under the middle of the lane and because it had frozen, a 4-foot-wide ice pond formed, sloping downhill. The trailer followed the tractor, sliding sideways, and jackknifed down an incline. I hollered my husband's name so loud my throat hurt. Helplessly watching him slide slow motion sideways in a big cab tractor was dreadful.

Hightailing it back to the farm to get another tractor and chain, we drove in from a different angle. Backing up to the site, we hooked the chain on. I had to drive the tractor pulling the tractor/trailer out.

Shaking, I prayed, "Father, You'll have to do this because I cannot." Immediately, a sense of peace came over me, and I settled into a resolve.

It came out after two attempts. Relief and thankfulness flooded us both; he later admitted he was shaking, too. No machinery was broken, the trailer was in one piece and so were we. Thank you, God.

After an extremely disappointing early season, the sap started running, and it took off. A turnaround! First of April brought warm temps in the day, freezing at night, which is ideal, despite the mud. Pulling taps third week in April, all-in-all a

great experience, one we'll repeat next year, Lord willing.

Then says he one day, "You know ... there are a bunch of wild blackberries out there." Oh-oh.

Thank you, Father, for the harvest gifts from your woods.

("While the earth remains, seed-time and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease." Genesis 8:22)

Verses, values echoed in Menominee poetry

A nation's stories convey what it values. April is National Poetry Month in the United States, and for many people, the thought of versed lines evokes images of a raven or roads not taken. Yet, in each of those images the narrator is clearly a singular voice. Edgar Allan Poe's raven tapping "at my chamber door," and Robert Frost's lone traveler conveys that "long I stood" before the fork in the road. America's stories are often about the individual and not the collective.

One of the privileges of teaching at the College of Menominee Nation is sharing the poetry the tribe has produced. Beyond the beauty of the natural imagery and the precision of the meter, there are messages that echo across the generations — the poetry speaks for the Menominee nation or Native people as a whole and not from the perspective of one person. The verses affirm the knowledge connected to land and the beliefs of the Omaeqnomenaewak — the Menominee people.

In 1929, tribal member William J. Kershaw published "Joseph Fights No More," discussing the end of combat for the "Nez Perce Chief Joseph (1840-1904). Kershaw em-

changes the chief's often cited line of "I will fight no more forever" to one that speaks on behalf of the collective.

Kershaw wrote, "We have fought our last fight, my brave hearted warriors / The land we defended is ours no more / To a stranger we yield the home of our sires / And our vanished hopes like a dream that is o'er."

While Kershaw's fictionalized words are equal in melancholia to Joseph's actual speech, it resonates as a singular voice for a group of people who speak of the land as their "mother" whom they hope is not assaulted but instead continues to sustain them. He prays, "We ask Thee, Great Spirit, to keep her and bless her / And make her forever the home of the free."

The same year, another Menomi-

bodied the man who won fame for his skilled resistance to the U.S. Army before surrendering in 1877. Although the poem depicts the scene of the famed laying down of arms, it

nee poet published the tribe's connection to the natural land that has always sustained their people. Gust-ah-yah-she's "The Indian's Plea" is a request to protect the tribe's homeland and waters. The poem's conclusion speaks to the Menominee hope that the dams are not built and the tribal connections to the unaltered land can remain. "Why can't we have something that we can enjoy, / Oh! Leave it as God made it—do not destroy, / The light from our wigwams has passed as the day, / Now please do not take our waters away."

In the 1940s, a poem attributed to an "Anonymous" Menominee read much like its predecessors in recognizing the beauty and inspiration of the Menominee homeland since time immemorial. "Thus they dwelt for generations, in their own dear native land, / From sea to sea an earthly eden, with fish and game at every hand. / Countless birds sang in the forest, anthems rang from all the trees, / And wild flowers in profusion, scented every wind and breeze. / Paradise-or much the same-long before the white man came."

The most famous Menominee poet has been publishing since the

1980s and is often featured in anthologies. Known simply as Chrystos, one of this famed poet's quoted verses continues to exude the resilience of her people as knowledge—"They have our bundles split open in museums / our dresses and shirts at auctions / our languages on tape / our stories in locked rare book libraries / our dances on film / The only part of us they can't steal / is what we know."

Earlier this month the Menominee Indian School District's \$35 million referendum was approved by the voters. The upshot is that the Menominee Nation will be building a new high school on their beautiful homeland that will continue to amplify tribal voices while affirming the values of their people.

While it is far too early to read the verses inspired in these future classrooms, I am certain the poems the next generation of Menominee poets' produces will echo the beliefs of their tribal ancestors — speaking not to the value of thinking solely as an individual but rather as part of a collective.

Steroids, surgery not best for spinal stenosis

Unfortunately, as we age it becomes more likely that we will experience certain health conditions. Low back spinal stenosis is one of those conditions that affects about 10% of the population, mostly people over 50 years of age. This condition causes pain; weakness in the lower back, buttocks and thighs; inability to walk properly; and loss of bladder and bowel control.

Spinal stenosis is narrowing of the spinal canal which results in compression of the spinal cord and nerves. Common causes are spinal arthritis, spinal disc herniation, spinal injuries, osteoporosis and, rarely, a tumor. Common treatments include steroid injections and spinal surgery, but recent research suggests that neither is effective.

A randomized clinical trial con-

ducted by a team of doctors from many prestigious institutes, including Mayo Clinic and Stanford University Medical Center, tested 400 patients with steroid injections or placebo and found no difference for pain or function between the groups at any point in time. In fact, researchers in this study published in the New England Journal of Medicine concluded that steroid injections are not helpful even for temporary relief of pain.

Not only are steroid injections ineffective, they also are associated with numerous potential adverse

reactions. Although the vast majority of these are minor and transient in nature, serious complications, including nerve damage, paralysis, strokes and death, may also result. In 2012, an outbreak of fungal meningitis from spinal injections killed 64 people and sickened 751. Recently, medical researchers have identified a new serious adverse event: epidural steroids increase the risk of fracture and osteoporosis 20% with each injection.

In another study published in the Annals of Internal Medicine, researchers compared the results of spinal decompression surgery and exercise therapy. The study found that surgery was not better than exercise therapy at any point time during the 2-year follow-up period. Moreover, adverse events for

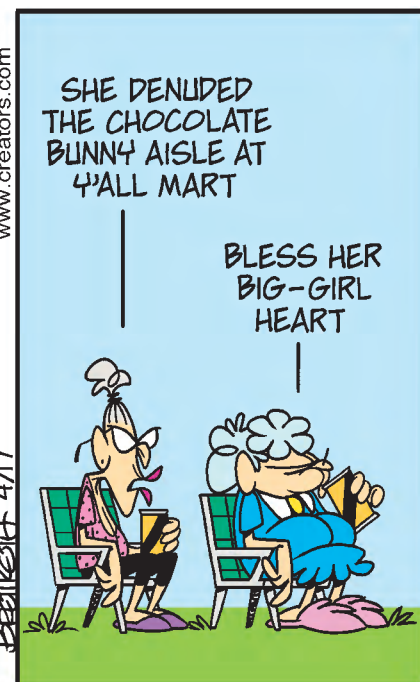
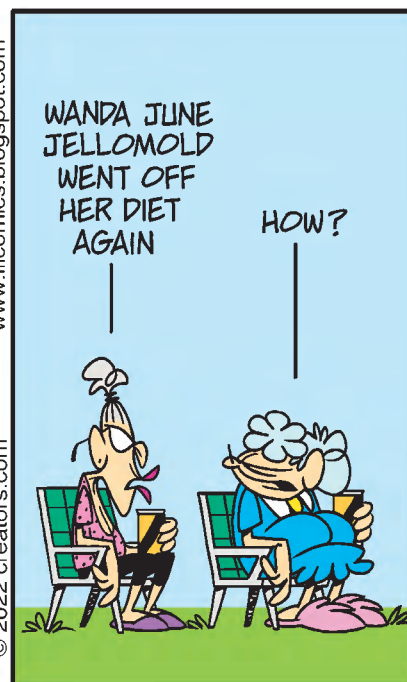
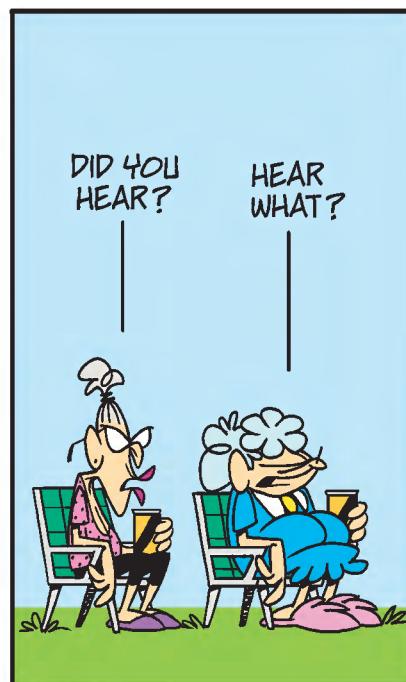
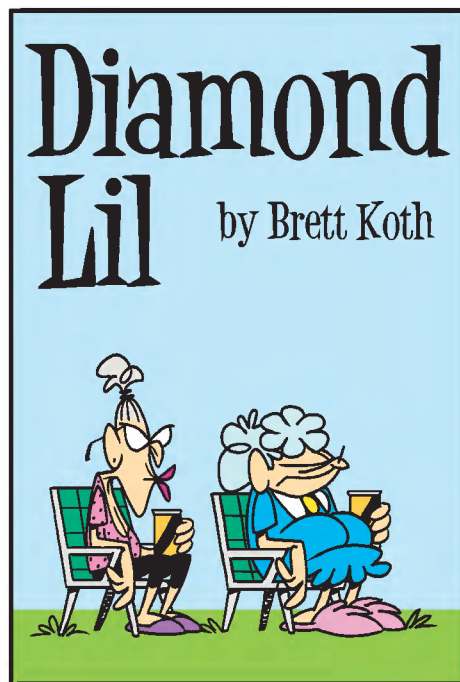
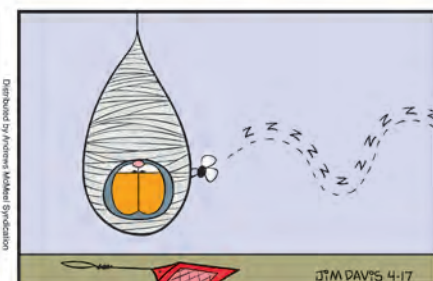
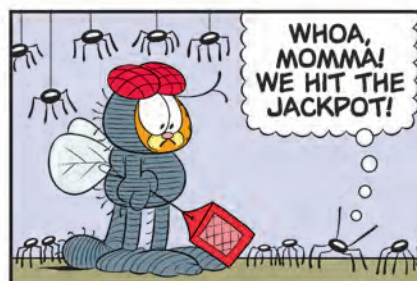
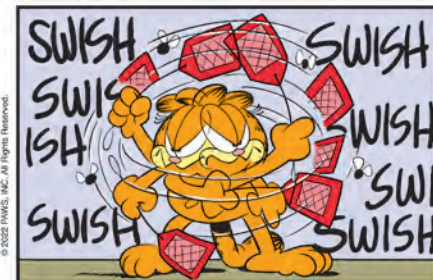
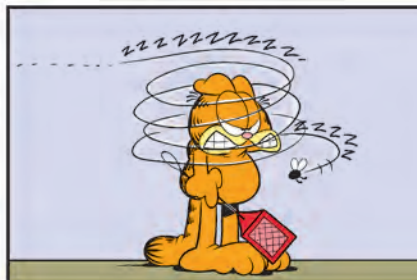
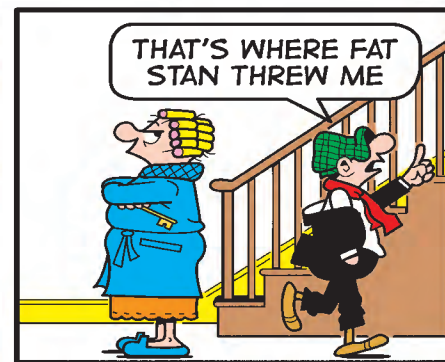
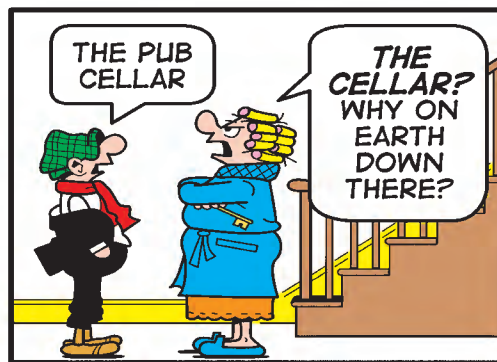
stenosis surgery can be serious and not infrequent (30-day mortality greater than 0.3%, cardiopulmonary complications or stroke greater than 2.1%, rehospitalization greater than 7.8%, reoperation rate 22.9%). The take-home message is that six weeks of prescribed exercise therapy is just as effective as surgery, with no serious adverse events.

Patients and health care providers should engage in shared decision-making conversations that include full disclosure of the evidence on steroid injections, surgery and nonsurgical treatments for spinal stenosis.
