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Survey shows teachers demoralized, frustrated

Faith in school administration higher than district office, school board

Results from a survey sent out to public school teachers by the Shawano Education Association show that many are not happy with the way the Shawano School District is being run, and many of them are threatening to leave.

The survey received a response from 68% of the 169 teachers reported by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction in the district, or 115, and most of the questions showed most are not confident things will get better as they stand right now. SEA President Matt Brunette sent out the survey early in 2022, before the news of a \$2 million budget gap became public, which indicates that teacher morale has been low for some time.

Among some of the responses from teachers offering concerns or comments were the following:

“Lack of honest communication and micromanagement is killing this district.”

“Our District used to be cutting edge. We used to be the place everyone wanted to work. Now we are a laughing stock due to current district leadership. I can’t take it anymore.”

“Staff members need to feel supported and valued by administration. The staff morale has been so low. When staff members feel this way, we are not able to be our best selves and give our best to our students. We also need our support staff and Dean of Students to help with behaviors. If those positions are being cut or eliminated, teachers won’t be able to give their best to all students because they will be dealing with behaviors instead of spending that time teaching.”

“The administration does not seem to care what is happening in each of our buildings. Decisions are being made without talking to the actual people who are on the ‘front lines’ working with the children. Total lack of respect is given to the very people who are here every day doing our best.

Loyalty is a thing of the past. We are treated like numbers, not people. A \$ sign. I decided to retire early even though I had intended to stay another year or two. It’s just not worth the stress anymore. After our 1.23% raise this year, I know exactly how little I am valued.”

When asked if they felt they could communicate openly with district administration without fear of retribution, with 1 being a negative response and 5 being the highest positive response, the average in the survey was 1.23. Teachers also had a 1.33 average response when asked if administration communicates information thoroughly, and the average was 1.39 when asked if they did it in a timely fashion.

Principals and other administrators in the individual schools received a more positive response, with teachers indicating an average score of 3.29 when asked if they feel they can communicate with them. School board members did not fare as well, as the average score was 1.88.

On a follow-up question asking which board members teachers felt they could communicate with, Mart Grams received support from 23 teachers, the only one getting double-digit support. Diane Hoffman, who was defeated in the April 5 election, and Alysia Pillsbury received no votes, while Michael Sleeper and Chuck Dallas received one.

One of the comments on the survey regarding the question stated: “I’m sure they are willing to listen, but they are either new, and just learning, have been on the board too long to be effective, or they are out of touch with the teachers/students and fail to understand what is really going on in the schools.”

Teachers replied with a 1.48 average score when asked if their contribu-

tions are valued with district committees, and the technology roll-out, which has had its share of glitches and setbacks, received a score of 1.8.

Of the respondents, more than half indicated they planned to leave the teaching profession entirely, while 20 teachers said they plan to move to a different district, and 10 plan to pursue early retirement. One respondent commented: “This is the first year in my entire career where not only have I considered leaving the district, but the profession as well. I am undecided about my future currently. I went into this profession thinking I would live out my career as a teacher in Shawano. It’s sad to see how bad things have gotten here in such a short time.”

Brunette said in an interview with NEW Media that the survey should be setting off alarms with district administration and the board. He noted that it’s going to affect students the most as teachers with decades of experience depart the district, although he has no numbers on how many of the teachers will be actually submitting resignations this year.

“I thought it was a pretty clear indicator that people didn’t care for the way that things are being done,” Brunette said. “It’s an emotional thing, and people are concerned and, I guess, dissatisfied, and they’re showing it by walking with their feet. I wanted to make sure I could provide a tangible link so people could say what they wanted to say without personal attack down the road.”

Brunette has sent the survey results to school administrators and officials in the district office, but he has not received any acknowledgement that the survey was received and would be looked at.

“Maybe there are issues behind the scenes that I don’t know about, and they’re having discussions about it,” Brunette said. “They’re just not telling me.”

New charges leveled against Retzlaff

Disorderly conduct, bail jumping added following her arrest in Wittenberg

New charges were filed against Ann Retzlaff, the owner of Annie's Campground and a self-proclaimed "sovereign being of light," April 22 in Shawano-Menominee County Circuit Court.

Retzlaff is facing felony and misdemeanor counts of bail jumping for not appearing in court in November 2021. She's also facing two misdemeanor counts of disorderly conduct during her arrest April 20 in Wittenberg on body-only warrants and her subsequent processing in the Shawano County Jail.

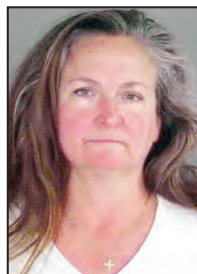
This is on top of the original charges stemming from a police chase through two counties back in May 2021, which include fleeing and eluding officers and two counts of second-degree recklessly endangering safety, as well as a misdemeanor count of resisting or obstructing an officer. She also faces misdemeanor charges through Menominee County for resisting and failing to stop.

Marathon County Circuit Court Judge Mark Moran, who took over the case after Shawano-Menominee County Circuit Court Judge William Kussel Jr. recused himself, agreed to the defense motion of a \$1,000 signature bond, noting that Retzlaff is facing a high bond from her original charges — \$25,000 for the Shawano County charges and \$1,000 for the Menominee County charge. District Attorney Greg Parker had asked for a \$750 cash bond for the new charges.

Parker said the disorderly charges are a result from her alleged lack of cooperation with deputies who arrived at the Harvest restaurant in Wittenberg to arrest her on the body-only warrants.

"While they were taking the defendant into custody in the restaurant proper, she became loud, boisterous and used profanity," Parker said. "She continued to do that until they got her out to the squad and was uncooperative getting into the squad."

Once deputies got her to the jail, Retzlaff continued to be "terse" and uncooperative, according to Parker. He noted it took four or five officers at the

Although the bond Parker requested was not granted, Moran agreed to the terms of Retzlaff not being allowed on the premises of the Harvest restaurant and not being allowed to leave the state, since one of the bail jumping charges is a felony.

"The court knows her history of non-appearance," Parker said.

Public defender Elizabeth Stockbridge represented Retzlaff at the April 22 hearing, noting it was only for that hearing, as Retzlaff does not qualify for a public defender. Stockbridge, who arrived late to the hearing, said that Retzlaff is "contesting in full" the new and original charges.

Stockbridge requested the signature bond, noting that the charges don't involve significant violence. The attorney also pointed out her family ties in the community and the fact that her business is about to open for a new season.

"Ms. Retzlaff has lived in the area for the last 12 years," Stockbridge said. "She has family in the area. Her three children reside only three miles away from her."

Stockbridge also noted Retzlaff's service in the U.S. Army from 1993 to 2004.

"She was deployed. She has an honorable discharge," she said. "She has significant reasons to remain in the community."

Stockbridge claimed Retzlaff is the only one able to get the campground up and running, and that she hasn't been able to do "basic stuff" to get additional staff to run the business.

Stockbridge alleged that Retzlaff has not been allowed by jail staff to contact her actual attorney regarding the case.

"She said the underlying charges relate to concerns she has in the community regarding child and other human sex trafficking," Stockbridge said.

Stockbridge said that Retzlaff wanted to address the bond amounts from her 2021 case, but Moran noted that he could not address them that day because, according to Marsy's Law, notice has to be given to victims about

"One of them can be heard (on the body camera) saying, 'Stop resisting,'" Parker said. "She was making a lot of remarks."

a hearing. The April 22 hearing was only regarding the disorderly conduct and bail jumping charges.

The April 20 arrest was a little less complicated than Retzlaff's initial arrest May 15, 2021, when she led law enforcement on a chase through the Shawano area. However, Shawano County Chief Deputy George Lenzner said she was uncooperative and "not a happy camper" when deputies took her into custody this time.

"She was kind of surrounded," Lenzner said. "We sent a few officers out there, and she was out of her car. We've been watching for her and trying to find her over the weekend, and then we had the tip she was over at the restaurant into Wittenberg."

Lenzner said Retzlaff did not answer any questions after being taken into custody. However, the sheriff's department learned that she had been spotted in Virginia earlier this year, but because the body-only warrants were approved for Wisconsin and the surrounding states, Virginia's law enforcement could not act on them, according to Lenzner. He noted there was evidence that Retzlaff was alleg-

edly in Florida, as well.

Lenzner noted that it was good she was out of her vehicle at the time, as it made the arrest less hazardous to deputies.

"We didn't want to create a hazard for the public," he said. "It worked out good."

Retzlaff called the \$25,000 cash bond a "hardship" in another hearing on April 21. She said she has typically "gone south" in the winter months and come back to her business near Gresham in April when camping season begins, but the terms of her initial bond included not leaving the state because she is facing felony charges.

"It is normal for me to leave Wisconsin when it is wintertime," Retzlaff said.

She went on to claim that she runs "a multi-million-dollar business" and that she can't delegate everything.

"I have to be here," Retzlaff said, later claiming she's the only full-time worker in her business. "There is no flight risk."

The new and original charges are scheduled for a preliminary hearing at 1:45 p.m. May 2.

Shawano breaks ground on downtown plaza

Community project years in the making should be finished by Labor Day

Almost 100 people, most of them with their own shovels in hand, broke ground on the \$2.5 million downtown plaza in Shawano on April 22, eager to see a dream finally taking form.

"The day is finally here," City Administrator Eddie Sheppard said during the ceremony, noting the plaza would serve as an anchor for downtown activities. "I know we lured a lot of you out here with the promise of free beer and steaks. That part fell through."

Once the laughter died down, Sheppard noted that a lot of people had a hand in making the plaza a reality, and that signs are already underway as the raised walkway is being constructed on South Washington Street between the west end of the future plaza and Franklin Park. The first hints of developing a plaza somewhere in the downtown area started in 2016, when Jeanne Cronic was mayor.

"When people ask me what's going in Shawano, I take it that they don't know. The question is, why is so much going on in Shawano?" said current Mayor Bruce Milavitz. He noted that he's just the recipient mayor after the idea has gone through with support from Cronic, former Mayor Ed Whealon and Rhonda Strebel, who was acting mayor before he was first elected. "You should all be proud, because this is what you folks have done."

Milavitz brought Cronic in front of the crowd, and she noted that Franklin Park was such a wonderful thing that people started thinking there should be a plaza that connected the park known for its community events to the downtown area, which is seeing a revival in business.

"We took a bus tour on a cold and rainy day to several cities that had plazas," Cronic said. "We took ideas from those places and tried to incorporate their best ideas into what we are going to see develop here in Shawano."

Once the Shawano plaza is completed, there will be stage areas for community performances and other events, along with an area that pays

tribute to the Menominee people — which used to have the land where Shawano is today — as well as other area tribes. There will also be a water feature and tables for seating and dining.

Much of that support had to come after the pandemic caused construction costs to skyrocket, and the original \$1.5 million bid swelled to \$2.5

million, meaning the Community Development Block Grant dollars and the \$1 million grant from the Wisconsin Department of Administration was not going to cover everything.

Sheppard noted that contributions from community leaders have been helping to fill the void. Shawano Municipal Utilities is donating almost \$100,000 worth of infrastruc-

ture work to the plaza, he said, and Charlie Harvey, owner of Charlie's County Market, also gave \$100,000. The Forget Me Not Foundation donated \$10,000 to help build the water feature going on the eastern segment of the plaza.

"It's a community space," Sheppard said. "It's going to be used as a community space for 100 years, and I can't wait for you to be able to enjoy it."

Donations are still being accepted, as the plaza is about \$300,000 shy of having the money needed to be completed. Sheppard said that, if more money doesn't materialize, the city could opt to use funding from the new Tax Increment Finance District set up for the downtown, but he has been pushing to avoid using any local taxpayer dollars to fund the plaza.

The plaza is expected to be completed around mid-August, but Sheppard believes it will be closer to Labor Day when the work is done, taking into account bad weather over the next few months. Main Street is only expected to be closed through May 9 at the latest before the work proceeds onto the plaza zones themselves.

Racial disparities must be confronted

Wisconsin's racial disparities in assessment data are egregious, not to mention unconscionable. In disparities by race, we are the worst state in the nation. Let me confront a common assumption upfront — these disparities cannot be explained away by poverty. After controlling for economic disadvantage, the gap persists. In fact, on average, Black students who are not economically disadvantaged score lower than white students who are.

This is the reality of the achievement gap in Wisconsin. It cannot continue this way. We are failing our students of color, and one factor in that failure is in the language we use to describe it. The word achievement places both the possibility of success and blame for failure on the child, and that is not where it belongs.

Instead, let's talk about the opportunity gap between students with ample opportunities for enrichment classes and co-curricular activities and those without. Let's talk about the gaps in literacy among and between the students who have access to high quality childcare and early childhood programming, versus those who do not,

or the access gap between students in classes with well-supported teachers and specialists with mentors and robust professional development available to them compared to those teachers in underfunded districts who must go without.

Speaking of support, how about the gap between students with strong mental health care in their schools or communities, compared to those who struggle with challenges and do so without support?

These are gaps our education system must address, and we cannot do it alone. We will need consistent and increased funding from the legislature, meaningful and intentional family engagement with our schools, and a greater understanding of and commitment to the need to meet the challenges of supporting youth mental health in Wisconsin.

There are more gaps to tackle beyond these. There is the representation gap where our students of color do not see themselves reflected in

the curriculum they study, or they only see that reflection in studies of trauma and struggle.

There are hundreds of thousands of Wisconsin children who go through elementary, middle, and high school who learn in schools who never see a teacher who doesn't look like them, and there are hundreds of thousands of Wisconsin children who learn in schools where they never see a teacher who had their childhood experience.

We must embrace that Black history, Indigenous history, the history of immigrants in our country are all part of American history. We need to honor that people of color continue to make immeasurable contributions to American society — and have since the foundation of our nation.

Related to the representation gap is an engagement gap, with too many of our classrooms structured to cater to learning styles that do not reflect the diversity of learners in those classrooms. This is where culturally relevant teaching, the original CRT, is essential to our instruction. Culturally relevant teaching reaches every student in the classroom not despite their identity,

but through nurturing and supporting that cultural identity.

That brings us to another gap, the belonging gap, the distance between students who feel welcome, celebrated, and authentically included in the classroom community, and those who do not. This goes beyond race, ethnicity, color, or language, but includes ability, gender, gender identity, and sexuality as well.

When there is a gap in outcomes, a potentially less offensive way of saying achievement gap, it means we need to investigate the inputs that are creating those disparate results. We need to question what we are doing as an education system that results in these disparities, and what can we do to change those educator actions and, in turn, those student outcomes?

I believe Dr. Clint Smith's writing applies here, too — the question is again whether we have the collective will to reckon with these disparities and the need for belonging in our classrooms. I believe we do, and we must.

the budget. This would only make a bad situation worse. Why is there no talk about a referendum exceeding our revenue limits to get us out of debt?

Sometimes, as a board member, you have to make tough decisions for the benefit of the students. It might not always be in agreement with public opinion. If the top administration is responsible for the toxic environment in our schools, maybe it is time for a change.

Island purchase pays off for Belle Plaine

Town's efforts keep Gibson Island pristine for visitors

Permanent homes and seasonal cottages take up most of the shoreline of Shawano County's Cloverleaf Lakes.

That's not the case with Gibson Island, however.

The Town of Belle Plaine owns the 25-acre undeveloped island, which sits between Grass and Pine lakes off County Road Y, about halfway between Shawano and Clintonville.

The island is open year-round to foot traffic and can be accessed from a parking area off Cloverleaf Lake Road.

Alvin Bartz, the town's chairman since 1974, played a big role in keeping the island undeveloped.

"It's the only area around the lakes that doesn't have a home on it," he said. "It was to preserve the quality of the lake. It's a chance for people to view nature close-up. There are deer out there, and there are bald eagles nesting by the boardwalk where you go out on the island."

The island's ownership changed hands over the years, according to Bartz.

"It was owned by some bankers in Clintonville, and then they gave it to the Boy Scouts," he said. "The Boy Scouts had buildings out there and camped out there. When the Boy Scouts came on hard times, they wanted to sell it. I offered \$125,000 for it, and some guy that was associated with the Boy Scouts got it for \$80,000, if you can imagine that."

A small strip of land provided access to the island.

"When we bought it, there was a road going to the island," Bartz said. "Somehow, the people that owned the house next to it got a hold of somebody, and they got possession of the road. Since that time, we've gotten access to the road again, so we can get out there with whatever we need to. We put a boardwalk in, which makes it really nice."

In 2006, the town purchased the island from Lynne Lenius for \$1.025 million. That sounds like a lot of money for a rural township to spend on land it had no intention of developing.

"We really didn't spend a million,"

The Belle Plaine Town Board approved the following rules for access and use of Gibson Island, which the Gibson Island Stewardship Committee had recommended:

- Access may be limited during eagles' nesting as designated by the state Department of Natural Resources.
- The island is open to pedestrian use only. Fires, picnics and camping are not permitted.
- Alcohol use and hunting are not permitted on the island.
- Dogs or horses are not allowed on the island.
- Access is permitted during daylight hours.
- Fencing is planned to keep snowmobiles and other motorized vehicles off the property during winter months. Winter hiking is permitted.

Bartz said. "Way before we even bought it, we were doing some work at our boat launch there. One of the people from the DNR that appropriates money was there, and we were talking about how we didn't get it when the Boy Scouts sold it. He said, 'If you ever get a chance to buy it, go ahead and buy it and we'll get you the money.'"

"Of the \$1 million, Lynne Lenius donated \$200,000," he continued. "The DNR grant was about 50%. We had a lot on the lake that we sold, and the rest was from private donations."

The island would probably be developed today if the town hadn't stepped in to purchase the land, Bartz said.

"We had different proposals," he said. "They were going to buy it and turn it into 26 lots, but people didn't want more development on the lake."

In 1998, 12 years before the town purchased the island, the Belle Plaine Town Board identified the island in its Land Use and Development Plan.

"It did take some time," Bartz said. "They thought they were going to get more money for it or whatever, but we just kept at it. The fundraising took some time, but once we got rolling, it went pretty good."

Walkers can follow a trail that goes around the entire island.

"It takes about an hour and a half, depending on how fast you walk," Bartz said. "We'd like to see more

people use it. There's a bicycling group here in Shawano, and we've advertised it in some of the trail magazines. We're always talking about what can we do to get more people to use it. We don't get outside people as much as I thought we might."

Most of Gibson Island doesn't get much foot traffic, as walkers stay on the main trail.

"Eventually, I think we'll put something across the top," Bartz said. "It's not that you can't walk there; it's just easier walking on the trail."

Oak wilt and invasive species are an ongoing problem on the island, but volunteers have been working on an ongoing restoration project.

"We have an oak wilt problem in that whole area, all around the lakes," Bartz said. "We clean up the oaks when they die and take them out of there."

The island will serve as the location for a wedding this year, Bartz said.

"She said her grandfather took her out there all the time," he said. "Now, she wants to get married there."

Concerns arise about operational referendum

Timing, expected opposition prompt school board members to sound alarms

Some Shawano School Board members are concerned that an operational referendum could be dead on arrival in November, even though the board has not approved a survey gauging community support for it and a possible capital referendum.

During a work session April 25, board members Chris Gull and Mart Grams brought up their concerns about the operational referendum failure, even though it could be used to keep the existing schools open, keep staffing levels from dropping any further and even get some future maintenance projects accomplished.

The Shawano School District is looking at a five-year operational

referendum that could provide anywhere from \$1.75 million to \$2.25 million each of those years just to maintain the schools and staffing levels, according to Josh Swanson, finance director. He said the numbers are based on plans to provide staff with a 4.7% raise this year and 3% in subsequent years, along with anticipating a 10% increase in health insurance costs.

The estimates are also based on the worst-case scenario on next year's state biennial budget approval, according to Swanson, which would be a zero increase in state aid, the same as was approved in the current state budget.

Erik Kass, the district's financial advisor with PMA Educational Resources, said that the district could ask for an operational referendum of up to \$5.7 million annually, and the remainder of the funding could be used for the maintenance projects expected to become a priority within the next five years.

Gull noted that a "large, well-funded, well-organized group" was responsible for killing the district's plans for a referendum in 2019

when it was looking at building a joint recreation center with the city of Shawano. The group had sent out claims in the mail that the \$28 million proposal was going to be a taxpayer-funded playground.

"I think it's just going to be suicide for us," Gull said. "There is talk that the capital (referendum) is supported by them, but if we ask for both of them, they will do everything they can to squash both of them because they don't want confusion."

The capital referendum, which would also be addressed in the planned community survey, is expected to be around \$40 million. In addition to planning for future maintenance needs, the referendum could provide upgrades to all of the schools' libraries, along with fine arts and athletic facilities at Shawano Community High School.

Grams suggested 2022 was a bad year to be asking for anything, considering the battle between Republicans and Democrats not only to determine control of Congress at the federal level, but the governor's office in Wisconsin, as well. Conserva-

tives are indicating that they're not happy with how the school district is run.

"If you wanted this referendum, you should have done it in the spring," Grams said. "This fall is going to be a bloodbath."

If the operational referendum fails, the district would potentially have to revisit staff cuts and closing a school. Sue Peterson, a consultant with ISG in La Crosse, said that if the district tried to ask for the referendum again in a future election, unless drastic changes are made to the question, it would be likely that voters would vote it down again, indicating "What part of 'no' don't you understand?"

The board is expected to give its final recommendation on the survey questions at its May 2 meeting, and then it would go to the district's committee working on the operating and capital referenda on May 9. The survey is expected to go out in mid-May, and then the board will have to decide after that whether to proceed to a referendum in November.

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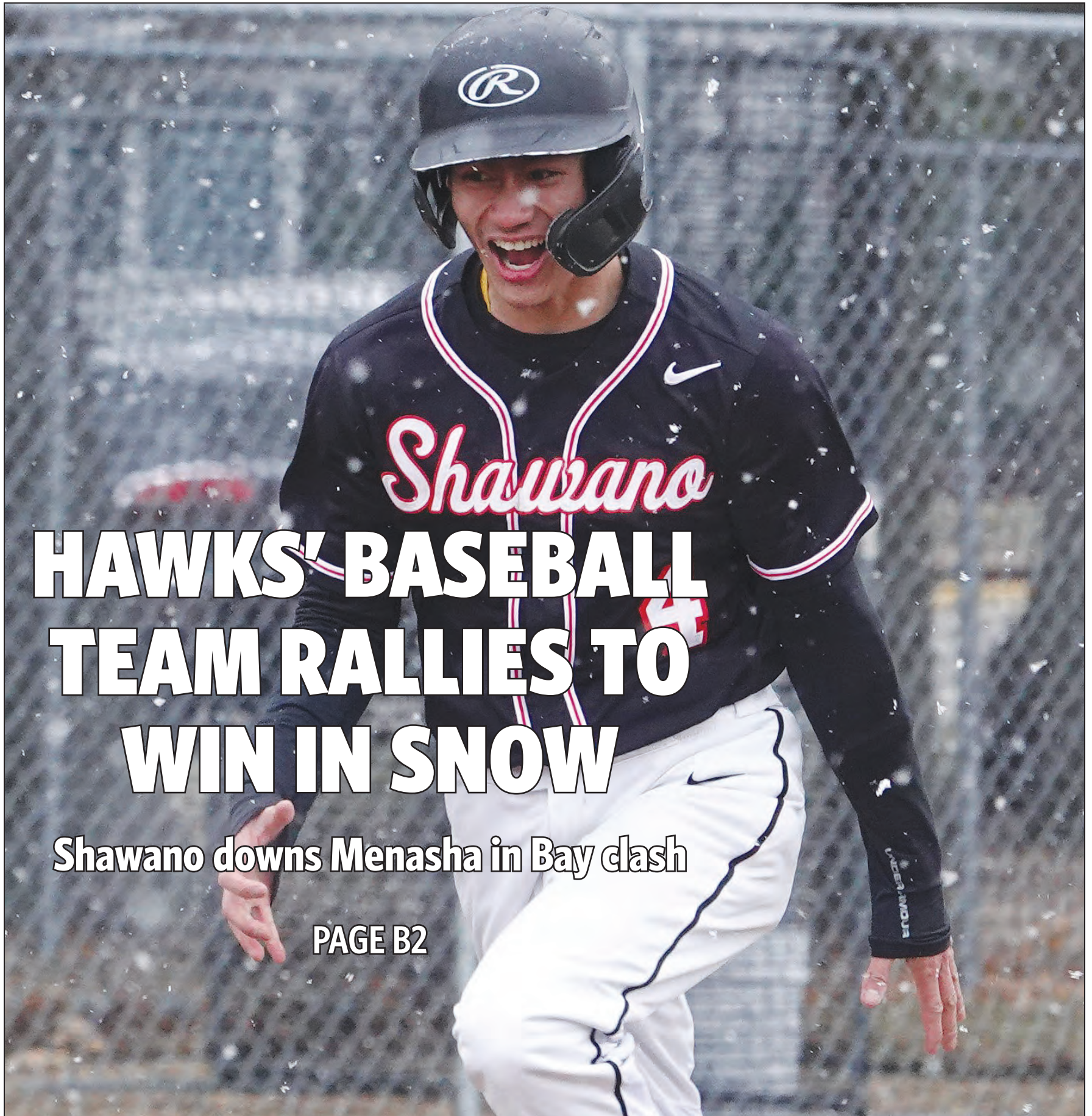

The Shawano Community High School softball team used aggressive baserunning to overwhelm Clintonville and ease to a 13-7 nonconference win on a cold and snowy day April 18 in Shawano.

The Hawks were credited with 13 stolen bases in the contest. The aggressive approach also led to a few defensive mistakes from Clintonville, which helped Shawano pull away for the victory.

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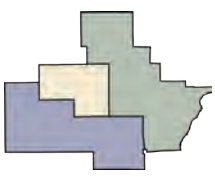


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'TIL DEATH DO US PART?

'Blithe Spirit' comes to Mielke, shows marriage really is eternal

Spirited play hits the stage at Mielke

'Blithe Spirit' debuts this weekend, putting 'Til death do us part' phrase into question

Spirits have been high at the Mielke Arts Center since live theater resumed late last year, but the spirits will be taking over in the Box in the Wood Theatre Guild's latest production.

The guild is presenting "Blithe Spirit" from April 29 through May 8, a comedic tale by Noël Coward of writer's block gone awry when a husband's first wife returns from the dead to torment him. It's not the first time that "Blithe Spirit" has been performed at the Mielke, as co-director Cheryl Folkerts performed in the role of Madame Arcati in April 2004.

"It's one of my favorites. That's why I wanted to do it," Folkerts said.

Folkerts noted that she and Mary Madsen, her partner in the director's chair, disagree a little bit on English humor, but said that, whether done in the British style or in American style, it'll be funny for audiences either way.

The show starts with novelist Charles Condomine experiencing writer's block and asking Madame Arcati to his home to conduct a seance in the hopes of generating ideas for a new book. Instead of inspiration, Charles winds up having his first wife, Elvira, who had passed away years earlier, summoned. Elvira is eager to make things unpleasant for Charles and his new wife, Ruth.

"Just the situation where he's got a new wife for seven years, and the other one is dead and comes back, it's just crazy," Folkerts said. "The way they talk to each other, Charles thinks it's kind of nice to have two wives at the same time. He thinks it's going to be fun.

However, the fun reaches a point where Elvira sabotages Charles' car in the hopes that he will join her in the spirit world. However, that backfires when it is Ruth who takes the car out for a drive and reaches her expiration date. Then Ruth's spirit returns to get revenge on Elvira, and Charles has to contend with two ghostly and spiteful wives.

The directors for the local show made an interesting choice when casting Madame Arcati. While they

auditioned several women for the part, the role went to Brandon Byng,

who has performed in and directed other Box in the Wood shows and is the founder for the Phoenix Players in Clintonville.

"When Brandon came in, I had him reading Charles and all the different roles," Folkerts said. "Then he just kind of sat there and looked at me, and I said, 'You want to do Madame Arcati, don't you?' He goes, 'Yes, please.'"

Folkerts noted the decision prompted her to urge the cast to bring their A game, or Byng was likely to overpower them when the show started.

"I loved the part," Folkerts said of Madame Arcati, "and I knew we needed a traditional, old-time play, because we'd been doing a lot of

newer things. I like to do things that people remember."

Adding to the interesting production was the fact that the Mielke was as cold as a grave with the heat going out. It took a few weeks to get the heating system fixed due to supply issues, but audiences should find the theater comfortably warm when they come out.

"It was 40-some degrees in this building when we had auditions," Madsen said. "Then we had to rehearse out of the building, because you couldn't stand it in here."

"Blithe Spirit" first debuted in Broadway in 1941 and has enjoyed many revivals since then, with Dame Angela Lansbury playing Madame Arcati in two of the revivals in 2009 and 2014 and Jennifer Saunders taking on the medium role in 2019. The play has also seen film adaptations, with the latest coming out in 2020, when Dame Judi Dench tackled the hilarious Madame Arcati role.

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One 'good turn' deserves another

Historical society exhibits 100 years of Girl Scouts in Shawano County

"Do a good turn daily" is the Girl Scouts of America motto, and Shawano native Dorothy Grosskopf Owen epitomized the motto when she donated a treasure trove of Shawano Girl Scouts memorabilia to the Shawano County Historical Society.

The "good turn daily" that Owen accomplished with her donation came in time to mark the 100th anniversary of Girl Scouts in Shawano.

Jesse Borlan, the historical society's curator, along with volunteers, used Owen's gift to create a pop-up exhibit, "Cookies and Campfires," celebrating the 100th year of Girl Scouts in Shawano County. It is on display in the Sikora Family Archive and Reception Center, 517 N. Franklin St., Shawano, displaying artifacts donated by Owen and will run through the summer.

"Mrs. Owen gave us seven boxes of Shawano Girl Scout history. Three of the seven are scrapbooks," Borlan said.

Girl Scouts alumni will recognize many of the items on display, from the Girl Scout Handbooks to the signature green tent displayed in the archives. Current scouts will recognize many items that haven't changed too much.

The first Shawano troop was organized in spring 1922, but it wasn't until 1944 that the Shawano Girl Scouts were formally acknowledged by the Girl Scouts of America, Borlan said.

Owen was involved in scouting in Shawano from the time she first joined Troop 2 in 1934 as a grade school student.

"She apparently fell in love with scouting right away, and found her passion," said Borlan. "She became a leader and remained one through the early 2000s."

According to Borlan, Owen was the leader of Troop 12 at Sacred Heart Catholic School. A flag for Troop 12 is part of the 100th anniversary exhibit, along with books, vintage pictures, uniforms and other Girl Scout-specific artifacts from Girl Scout cookie campaigns.

Owen showed a lot of initiative with her troop and started a day camp program on Monkey Island, now known as Sunset Island Park, located next to Heritage Park. She was

subsequently asked to organize a day camp at the Girl Scout cabin just east of Shawano.

Rose Kroner Salzman of Shawano belonged to a Girl Scout troop through Sacred Heart School in the 1960s.

"Mrs. Owen was very good with us," Salzman noted. "She was an encourager."

"I remember having our meetings in the church basement. We were able to go to the summer camp, which was an old log cabin east on Highway 22 in the woods near The Fawn Café, which was close to where the Shawano Cinema is. One neat thing

we did that I thought was pretty cool, was to take canning jars and make terrariums."

Salzman recalled going back into the forest and getting everything, including moss and twigs, for the terrariums.

"I remember the pudgy pies (sweet or savory concoctions made with special cast iron, long-handled irons) that we cooked over open campfires," Salzman said. "We also made campfire dinners in coffee cans. That was one special thing we were able to do as Girl Scouts, go to the summer camp."

She remembered that it was prob-

ably during fifth and sixth grades that she was involved in scouting.

"I was surprised that my folks even allowed it, because we were seven girls and one boy, and just for mom and dad to run us around, but it was one thing they let us do," Salzman said.

Salzman's friend, Stephanie Stewart, reminisced about being a Girl Scout and chuckled.

"You know what I remember? Getting all those badges on my uniform," Stewart said.

Both Salzman and Stewart voiced fond memories of going to a ceramic studio across from Franklin Park and earning a badge there.

"There's a lot of history at Heritage Park," said Salzman. "I saw a Girl Scout handbook in the collection. In the front of it, someone had written down all of the scout numbers and group names, and I saw my sister Mary Pat's name on that list."

The exhibit may not be complete, though. Shawano Girl Scouts, former and current, are being encouraged by the historical society to share photos, items and memories from their scouting experiences with this exhibit.

Trail, piers help anglers find South Branch's trout

Renovation project helps reopen fishing area in 2021

Looking for an out-of-the-way place to drop a line for trout during the upcoming inland fishing opener May 7?

A stretch of the South Branch of the Oconto River, one of north-eastern Wisconsin's premier trout streams, offers plenty of opportunities.

The Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest maintains the South Branch Barrier Free Fishing Trail, a quarter-mile-long stretch along the river in northern Oconto County.

The trail includes four wooden piers that extend over the river.

Brook and brown trout are found in the river's deep holes and can also be seen facing the current.

After a major renovation project that had kept the trail closed for several months, forest officials reopened the trail just in time for last year's opener on May 1.

Jeremy Delforge, of Green Bay, showed up at the trail for last year's opener with his daughter, Ella, and her friend, Stella McNaughton.

"We're camping at Boulder Lake Lodge," he said. "It's pretty close to home, about an hour and 15 minutes. It's a good trout stream and this area is easy to fish with kids. When I'm by myself, I like to bust brush and get back in the woods a little more, but with kids, this is perfect."

The four handicapped-accessible piers overlook a Class I trout stream. Each pier has a name. The Delforges and McNaughton tried their luck on Otter Slide, while other anglers checked out Big Bend, The Narrows and Lunker's Lair.

"I came here at about 6 in the morning before they woke up and waded out there," Delforge said. "There's a pretty big pool right below this, so I thought it would be a good spot for them. I caught a couple of brook trout in here, 8 or 9 inches. Never a lot and never huge, but usually a couple every time I come up here."

The piers make it easier to fish the river, according to Delforge.

"We fish the Embarrass (River) and up north on the Pine River," he

said. "You make your own trail in a lot of those places."

Meanwhile, Doug Sterk, of Pittsfield, sat at his picnic table during last year's opener going through flies that he planned to use to fish for brown trout on the nearby Wolf River.

He set up his small tent in a designated campsite near the trail.

"It's very affordable," he said.

"They charge me \$5 a night to camp. It's a little more rustic. You have to bring your own water and haul your own garbage in and out. I met a dad and he was watching his son fish. His son was in the water with his waders on. Dad wasn't too interested in fishing, but he still was there watching him."

The trail is located off of County Road T between State Highway 64 and County Road W, about 10 miles northwest of Mountain in the Town of Doty.

"If you're handicapped, it's very accessible for people that need that," Sterk said. "It's definitely a different style of fishing than going out in a boat and putting a bobber

down, but then you start catching fish that are 6, 8, 10 inches long that are native to our state. These are native brook trout."

Sterk had plenty of options for opening day and decided to spend his time fishing for brook trout on the South Branch and larger brown trout on the Wolf River.

He usually fishes the South Branch each spring for brookies before returning in the fall for browns that move upstream from the Oconto River.

"The brook trout are here all year long, this is their home," he said. "The browns basically go down where the river is bigger and spend most of their lives down there. In late August or September, they move up."

"These aren't small fish," he added. "There might be some 12-, 15-, 18-inch fish, but there are a lot of 20-plus-inch fish. It's a heck of an opportunity to catch a real trophy fish."

Sterk likes the South Branch, but said it doesn't get a lot of fishing pressure and doesn't have the repu-

The Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest teamed up with the Wisconsin Conservation Corps, state Department of Natural Resources, local Trout Unlimited chapters and other partners more than 20 years ago to build the South Branch Barrier Free Fishing Trail on the South Branch of the Oconto River in Oconto County.

The idea behind the trail and its four wooden piers is to provide a more accessible way to enjoy the stream. However, degradation and forest heaving resulted in safety hazards.

The Nature Conservancy, a global conservation organization, oversaw a recent improvement project to the trail to prevent frost heave and reduce soil erosion. The improvements also provide better support for the trail and meet Americans with Disabilities Act accessibility design standards.

The U.S. Forest Service charges a \$5 daily fee to use the trail, which is located off of County Road T about 10 miles northwest of Mountain.

tation of trout streams in southwestern Wisconsin.

"When you get to the upper branches of the Oconto, there are miles of them that go up to the national forest," he said. "Other than maybe opening weekend, you can go out there in June or July and you're probably the only one on the stream. I fly-fish at this point in my life, but I have used a nightcrawler, hook and sinker and it works very well."

While other anglers were happy to fish for brook trout, Sterk had bigger plans in mind.

"These are designed for bigger browns," he said while going through his extensive collection of flies. "I'll be fishing here tomorrow, but today, I'm going to go over on the Wolf River, which has a lot of brown trout. If the water gets warm on the Wolf, they'll move up into the tributary streams. All the tributaries that come into it, some of them have brook trout, some have rainbow trout."

It's the same Wolf River that flows for more than 100 miles through Forest, Oneida, Langlade, Menominee and Shawano counties before entering the Lake Winnebago System near Oshkosh.

"You talk about the Wolf River, you can compare it to some of those big rivers out in Montana," Sterk said. "I've seen some really big fish caught out of the Wolf River. It's not a self-sustaining river. It needs help from the DNR on that end, but a lot of those rivers out in Montana do, too."

Specialized services that help downsize, relocate

Dear Savvy Senior,

Can you recommend any businesses or services that specialize in helping seniors downsize and relocate? I need to find some help moving my mother from her four-bedroom home — where she's lived for nearly 50 years — to an apartment near me.

Dear Overwhelmed,

The process of downsizing and moving to a new home is a big job for anyone, but it can be especially overwhelming for seniors who are moving from a long-time residence filled with decade's worth of stuff and a lifetime of memories. Fortunately, there's a specialized service available today that can help make your mom's move a lot easier for her, and for you.

To help your mom get packed up and moved into her new home, you should consider hiring a "senior move manager." These are trained organizers (they are not moving companies) who assist older people with the challenges of relocating and can minimize the stress of this major transition by doing most of the work for you.

A senior move manager can help your mom pare down her belongings, decide what to take and what to dispose of, recommend charities for donations and help sell her unwanted items. They can even create a customized floor plan of her new home so your mom can visualize where her belongings will fit.

Senior move managers can also get estimates from moving companies, oversee the movers, arrange the move date, supervise the packing and unpacking and help set up her new home, have the house cleaned and just about anything you need related to her move.

If you want to do some of the work yourself, you can pick and choose only the services you want. For example, you may only want a move manager's help with downsizing and selling excess furniture and unwanted belongings

but plan on doing the actual packing and moving yourself.

The cost of working with a senior move manager will vary depending on where you live, the services

you want and size of the move, but you can expect to pay somewhere between \$60 and \$125 per hour or more, not including the cost of movers.

To locate a senior move manager in your area, visit the National Association of Senior Move Managers website at NASMM.org or call 877-606-2766. The NASMM is a trade association with an accreditation program that requires its members to abide by a strict code of ethics that ensures integrity. They currently have around 1,000 members across the U.S.

You can also search at Caring Transitions (CaringTransitions.com), which is the largest senior relocation and transition services franchised company in the U.S. They currently have nearly 200 franchises throughout the country.

Before you hire one, be sure you ask for references from previous clients and check them, and check with the Better Business Bureau, too. Also, find out how many moves they have actually managed and get a written list of services and fees. And make sure they're insured and bonded.

If you can't find a senior move manager in your area, another option is to hire a certified professional organizer who specializes in downsizing and relocating. To find one, check the National Association of Productivity and Organizing Professionals, which has a searchable database on its website at NAPO.net.

It's not spring until the robins come to town

It is that time of year when the snow begins to melt and the grass becomes more visible each day. Spring is on its way, but for me, and perhaps for you, too, it is not officially here until I see our beloved state bird — the American robin.

When I see that familiar red breast, I smile. Just as I cheered as the ice cream truck came around the corner when I was a little girl, I jump for joy upon my first robin sighting of the year. The American robin is a much anticipated and welcome sign of spring.

What is it about robins that we love so much? Perhaps how they run around the yard and then stop suddenly in their tracks? How they stand straight and tall one minute and then use their powerful legs to tug worms out of the ground the next? Is it their beautiful morning song or their serenade as the sun sets?

Everyone knows their eggs are such a beautiful blue we've named a color after them. It probably helps that they hang out in our gardens and shrubs and build their nests in our windowsills and barns. They feel comfortable living with us, and we enjoy them and make them a part of our lives. But perhaps there are some things about this familiar bird that you don't know.

Upon the first spring sighting, I've heard friends exclaim: "They're back! The robins are back!" While robins are classified as migratory birds, many of them do not actually go south for the winter. Their migration is affected not only by climate but also food supply, according to The Cornell Lab.

While many will fly as far south as Mexico, if your neighbor down the road has a lot of crabapple trees, there is a good chance some will stay at his house for the winter. I've heard concerns from people when they see a robin in winter, thinking something must be wrong with it having not migrated, but now you know, it is probably just fine.

Robins also change behavior in winter. While they are very territorial in spring and summer during their nesting season, in the winter they unite to form flocks of dozens, sometimes hundreds and even thousands of birds. According to the article "61 Tons of Robins" by Bob Sundstrom, an estimated 720,000 robins were seen roosting together near St. Petersburg, Florida, in 2007.

They are also known to join forces with other species giving them more eyes to find food and more bodies to keep warm and ward off predators. Even

the American robin's archenemy, the bluejay, who steals eggs right out of the robin's nest, is known to join flocks in winter, a sure sign of nature doing what it needs to do to survive.

To help robins endure the winter and early spring months, consider providing what The Cornell Lab says are the three essential things birds need to survive: food, shelter and water. Robins like berries, so consider planting berry producing shrubs and trees like chokecherries, red mulberries and dogwoods. You can add a feeder filled with hulled sunflower seeds, suet, mealworms or fruit to supplement their diet.

Shrubs and trees that maintain their leaves during winter provide good shelter. When choosing plants for your yard, remember to go native and consider different canopy levels for diverse shelter needs.

Robins love heated bird baths. They not only drink from them but they put on quite a show taking long dramatic baths dipping in and out and shaking water everywhere.

In his blog, Tony Bedford points out the American robin can "recognize humans as part of remembering patterns such as where and when food is. Robins like humans who fill bird feeders, dig around in the dirt and have relaxed body language." Keep this in mind when they return in spring. They may or may not have traveled far, but if they choose your yard to live in, welcome them home. Enjoy living and working among them for they are a symbol of new beginnings and a sign of good things to come.

Turkey hunter now mentors kids, veterans

Terry Dorschner isn't exactly sure how many turkeys he's shot over the years, but he hasn't shot any since 2015.

It's not that his luck has run out. Quite the contrary. He just gets more fun out of helping others bag a big tom.

He's shot plenty of big gobblers, including one that weighed 30 pounds. The record he's most proud of is taking 113 hunters — mostly first-timers and many young or physically challenged — and helping them bag

103 birds.

"I'm the most excited one there," said Dorschner, a New London resident and avid member of the Little Wolf Gobblers chapter of the National Wild Turkey Federation in Marion. "I have succeeded in all my work when they succeed."

The semi-retired owner of Dorschner Excavating Co. in New London has an arsenal of gear for his hunts: a variety of slate, box and mouth calls, locator calls, binoculars, mosquito spray and of course lots of camouflage clothing. But when young hunters are involved, comfort is king. His secret weapon when hunting with neighbor Autumn? Kit Kat bars.

Autumn, 16, has killed six turkeys in four years while hunting under Dorschner's tutelage. When birds or even bucks won't show, their luck seems to change for the better when the Kit Kats come out, she said.

"I think it was way more fun than deer hunting," Autumn said, explaining that she started hunting with Dorschner at age 12, after completing a four-hour Learn to Hunt course.

She and Dorschner recounted many of their fun and humorous hunts, including the time she shot a tom at 57 yards with her teacher's 12-gauge Remington 870 pump shotgun and 3-inch magnum 5 shot. That's a stiff gun for a 12-year-old, but Dorschner said the kids never feel the recoil when they are focused on the bird. That long shot earned her the nickname "Autumn Oakley."

Turkey decoys also are in his equipment bag. Leading the way in fooling boss toms is Gobblin' George, a real turkey skin with full tail feathers that a friend tanned with borax and stretched over a decoy for him.

Many of Dorschner's young hunters or veterans with injuries participate in the Learn to Hunt program. A special weekend hunt for these first-time hunters is held a week prior to the two-day youth hunt.

There is no minimum age to participate in a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Learn to Hunt program, and no hunter safety

certificate is needed, although a harvest authorization is required. Go here for more information: <https://dnr.wisconsin.gov/Education/OutdoorSkills/lth>

While he's found many of his charges through Little Wolf Gobblers-organized Learn to Hunt events as well as through Challenge the Outdoors, a Green Bay-based service group that helps the physically challenged to hunt, Dorschner now also seeks out new hunters on his own.

"I see someone at Fleet Farm in a wheelchair and ask them if they've ever been turkey hunting," he explained. "If they say no and want to

go, I tell them, 'You get the license and camo clothes and I'll take care of the rest.'" He then hands them a business card. About 20% call him back to book a hunt.

His hunters all go first class, with comfortable blinds equipped with heaters and of course plenty of gear, including Dorschner's wide array of slate, box and mouth calls. Depending on the wind and weather, he may use some or all of them. Box calls are the loudest and work best on windy days. Mouth calls can be used with no hand movement and are usually used for the final few yards of coaxing before the fatal shot. Slates offer finesse and sometimes bring in the birds when the others won't.

"A lot of people call too much," he noted.

Most hunters think they are calling in the toms, and that's true when a gobbler's traveling alone, but when the tom's with hens, "you are really calling in the hens," he explained.

"If you are at a party with 25 girls and a girl calls you on the phone and asks if you want to come over, do you go? It's the same with turkeys," he said.

He believes in using hen and jake turkeys, believing some gobblers don't want to tangle with a boss tom. He does use Gobblin' George, a decoy covered with the stretched skin of a real tom that adds realism to his spread. Gobblin' George looks a little scruffier the past few years, since Autumn accidentally shot him on one of her successful hunts.

Dorschner has had many successes in his hunting career, including bagging a 30-pound gobbler that was certified the 72nd highest-scoring tom in Waupaca County (he thought it would place much higher, but it only had one beard). He's also bagged some exceptional whitetail bucks and even a few bull elk from hunts in Colorado.

It's clear from the smile on his face and the kitchen table full of photos, thank-you notes, certificates of appreciation and other mementos from his years of mentoring that his real passion is introducing rookies to the joys of springtime turkey hunting.

Agencies taking back drugs this weekend

On April 30, law enforcement agencies in Shawano County will participate in the Wisconsin Department of Justice's Prescription Drug Take Back Initiative.

Drugs can be dropped off from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Bonduel Police Department, 207 S. First St., Bonduel, or Stockbridge-Munsee Public Safety, W13455 Camp 14 Road, Bowler.

The goal of the event is to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposal of prescription medications, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of these medications.

Unused prescription drugs thrown in the trash can be retrieved and abused or illegally sold, according to a Shawano-Menominee Counties Health Department press release. Unused drugs that are flushed can contaminate the water supply. Proper disposal of unused drugs helps save lives and protects the environment.

Participants may dispose of solid, non-liquid medications by removing the medication from its container and disposing of it directly into a disposal box or into a clear sealable plastic bag. Plastic pill containers should not be collected. Blister packages are acceptable without the medications being removed.

Liquids will be accepted during this initiative. However, the liquids, creams and sprays must be in their original packaging and evenly distributed within the boxes of collected solid prescription medications.

Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are not a part of this initiative and should not be placed in collection containers.

Law enforcement officers and volunteers at the drug-take back sites will provide education on how to safely dispose of medical needles.
