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New Bowler superintendent begins job

Butterfield-Boldig returns to where she started teaching

A familiar face has taken the helm as superintendent of the Bowler School District.

Glenda Butterfield-Boldig, whose first teaching job was in Bowler, took the position July 1. She is originally from the area, growing up in Aniwa and graduating from Antigo High School,

"I was an Aniwa kid," said Butterfield-Boldig. "I grew in up in small, rural Wisconsin."

Butterfield-Boldig graduated from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse with a general education degree and was hired in the Bowler School District shortly thereafter.

"I knew since my junior year in high school that I wanted to be an educator," said Butterfield-Boldig. "What motivated me to go into education was both positive and negative experiences that I had when I was in school."

She has an abundance of knowledge about education, moving from Bowler to Wittenberg-Birnamwood to White Lake, where she served as principal and then superintendent.

"I met my husband at Bowler, and he followed me on my travels," said Butterfield-Boldig. "We had talked about coming back to Bowler, and it feels like I am at home."

She said that her past experiences working with rural schools in Wisconsin have prepared her for the position at Bowler.

"I am able to understand the struggles that rural schools face," said Butterfield-Boldig, "not with just budgets, but also with finding quality staff and keeping them. We also want to offer great opportunities for kids."

Butterfield-Boldig said that growing up in Aniwa is a reason why she came back to the area.

"I found that having grown up and having been an Aniwa kid back in the day, that there is a sense of fam-

ily," said Butterfield-Boldig. "I have always felt that sense of connection in these small schools."

She elaborated on the idea of working in a small school setting by saying that she would not fit in at a big city school.

"I have a hand in everything," said Butterfield-Boldig. "I am about being collaborative and a team player. I want everyone to buy in and work together towards a team goal. I like walking out in the hall and knowing kids' names. I do this for them."

Even though Butterfield-Boldig is familiar to the area, she still wants to build relationships with people outside of the school district.

"I worked at the Bowler Bash," said Butterfield-Boldig. "I have been attending town meetings to introduce myself. I plan to be at community events. I want people to feel like I am approachable and that their ideas and opinions are valued."

She said that an overall goal is to be able to walk into classrooms and not cause disruptions.

"I may have a different role than teachers or the support team, but I want us all to know that we are on the same team," said Butterfield-Boldig.

She has plans to stay with Bowler for the rest of her career.

"I would very much like to retire

from the Bowler School District," said Butterfield-Boldig. "I hope to lead this district to achieve things that maybe we have not even thought about doing."

Butterfield-Boldig doesn't plan on implementing major changes within the school district as her first couple years go by.

"In my experience, its always best to get to know and understand the community for the first couple years," said Butterfield-Boldig. "I hope that in my time here, I can set Bowler up to be here years after me."

If needs and wants come up, she plans to work with the staff and the school board to creatively fill them.

Butterfield-Boldig began her administration career in White Lake last year and was faced with handling the COVID-19 pandemic.

"What I learned from that is to spend more time listening and understanding before offering solutions," said Butterfield-Boldig.

In her first two months as superintendent in Bowler, Butterfield-Boldig has noticed something special about the school district and the community.

"The thing that I have experienced is this huge level of support," said Butterfield-Boldig. "I think that this community as a whole is very welcoming."

Tigerton hosts Lumberjack Days again

55th annual event held after postponement from 2020

Visitors were given the opportunity to return to Tigerton Lumberjack Days as the village hosted its 55th event Aug. 27-29.

"This event seems to keep the community together," said Tigerton resident Dorian Hirt. "It is a big interest for everyone."

The event was canceled last year, as the COVID-19 pandemic raged on across the country.

"It is absolutely awesome that people are able to get back together," said Theresa Stenson, who is originally from Tigerton. "People are meant to be together."

The event kicked off Friday with a beanbag tournament. On Saturday, individual competitors were pitted against each other in a strongman/woman contest. Visitors were then treated to a corn roast. The major draw came on Sunday, as visitors gathered along Cedar Street to watch the annual parade. The parade was followed up by the lumberjack competition, bucket raffles and music from The Drovers.

"We have had great support and a great turnout for the entire weekend," said Tigerton Lumberjack Days President Wally Breitenfeldt. "There has mainly been a positive reaction from visitors this weekend."

Children also had the opportunity to be involved with event, as bounce houses were a big draw for families.

"I think that our favorite part has been the bounce houses," said Stenson.

Face-painting and balloon animals were also offered for children, as many walked away with a balloon giraffe or a face painted like a tiger.

Breitenfeldt said that this year's event is similar to the events in the past in terms of attendance. Although it rained for some of the weekend, he said that did not play a factor in keeping the event going.

"We had rain, but not during the day," said Breitenfeldt. "We are limited with our space, but it didn't rain until the nights. So we were able to hold all of the scheduled events."

Breitenfeldt agreed with Stenson in that seeing visitors come to the park for the weekend event has been encouraging.

"People had to make that choice

if they wanted to come to the park or not," said Breitenfeldt. "For the most part, it has been good; we have had a lot of good support and a lot of people have come out."

He said that the support for the

event was so good that people were staying at the event past midnight on Friday and Saturday nights.

Breitenfeldt said that Tigerton Lumberjack Days has a major impact upon the village as a whole.

"Every dollar goes back into the community," said Breitenfeldt. "We put the money back into youth baseball, summer recreation and improvements to village parks. We also do scholarships for the kids and a lot of different things like that. That's the idea; that's what we want to do."

The original Tigerton Lumberjack Days started out 55 years ago as a small corn roast. The event has grown to include all the contests, raffles and a parade.

"It has evolved since I have been involved with the event," said Breitenfeldt. "We are always looking for new ideas."

He said in order for the event to continue to evolve and expand, volunteers are needed.

Another impact on Tigerton that Breitenfeldt mentioned was that it helps get people to experience what Tigerton has to offer.

"I hope that this event helps people understand Tigerton," said Breitenfeldt. "Our community has evolved. I saw a lot of people that I don't know. A lot of people come from all over."

Breitenfeldt said that, for some, this event acts as a family reunion.

"People are going to compete in these contests," said Breitenfeldt. "But, they are here to have fun and socialize with everyone. That is the joy of it."

Mask debate heats up in Gresham board meeting

Community, board members exchange words about mandate

Angry words were exchanged by parents and members of the Gresham School Board on Aug. 31 as the board debated whether to reinstate a masking policy that was rescinded in June one day before the new school year was to begin.

No action was taken to change the district's current stance on recommending masks but not mandating them. However, parents in the audience were baffled as to why requiring masks was even being considered, especially when Superintendent Newell Haffner said there were zero cases reported of COVID-19 within the district, although there were cases in surrounding school districts.

"It doesn't mean it's not there," Haffner said. "It just means we haven't had a reported case, so I'm saying, based on you guys giving me the power, we're mask-optional. To me, nothing has changed."

Board member Doug Huck said that the power to change the mask requirements in the district should fall to the board, claiming it was unfair to put the burden on Haffner's shoulders. He noted that when the data in June showed COVID-19 numbers statewide were dropping, the board made the decision to drop its mask mandate in the hopes of attracting people for summer school.

Now, the state numbers are trending upward, so Huck feels requiring masks for a short time would be a safe option.

"Last year, when we were in school, everybody was masked, and I think that's a reasonable course," Huck said. "I think the most effective way we can control the COVID disease is to mask up for a while. If the numbers continue to stay low in the district, then we can take a look at it."

Board member Joe Ejnik disagreed with the idea, noting that the board gave Haffner the power to decide on masks for a reason, and it shouldn't be going back on its word. He said the statistics and science can be interpreted different ways, with different studies saying differ-

ent things about the same issue.

Ejnik noted that 91% of the deaths from COVID-19 in Wisconsin have been people over the age of 60. He said the school is the most controlled environment in the community, and maybe there should be more concern about letting kids pig out on candy bars instead of the chance of getting the coronavirus.

"We need to worry more about our elderly folks than pushing it onto our kids," Ejnik said. "Our kids have been shown to handle it very well. I don't know why we have to keep going after the kids. I don't see why we have to hit the panic button right now."

The masking issue has polarized the community, according to Haffner, to the point where people he once liked and respected called him vulgarities because the district was requiring masks last year.

"The only thing that's driving me nuts right now is that people can't have a decent discussion about it," Haffner said. "We get mad. We start hating people all because of a piece of cloth. That's bull. We're better people than this. Our community is better than this."

Haffner noted that available substitute teachers are few and far

between, which prompted concern from board president Alpha Creapeau about what would happen if a teacher contracted the virus, and a classroom had to be shut down.

"We better pray that a teacher doesn't get it," Haffner said.

Parent Amber Fischer feels the decision about whether children should have to wear masks should be determined by parents, not the school district.

"This is enough with this controlling our kids and our families," Fischer said. "Enough. Let's get back to normal."

Some of the community statements did not sit well with some board members. Board member Jim Hoffman lashed out at one of the speakers, noting he'd known the person for over 30 years, but he wasn't too accommodating to threats.

"I'm going to do what I think is best on one issue," Hoffman said. "If anything starts to slide, I'm going to be one of the first ones to say we've got to put masks on so we can keep the school open."

Shannon Holsey, president of the Stockbridge-Munsee Tribal Council, said her tribe was ready to help out with whatever the district needed,

whether it was providing masks and hand sanitizer or helping to provide COVID-19 testing and vaccines. She noted that there are currently 85 active COVID-19 cases in the county, and community transmission risk is high, adding that the tribe is requiring face masks within its boundaries.

"We know it offers a level of safety for everybody," Holsey said. "We're here for you. We are good stewards, and we want to have a meaningful and robust relationship because we do care."

Community member Deanna Bisley argued that masks should be mandatory, noting that Shawano County's vaccination rate is very low at 40%.

"Right now, the state of Mississippi has a similar vaccination rate, and I think we all know what's going on in the southeast," Bisley said. "Thirty-four counties are experiencing very high COVID-19 cases, with nine of them around us."

The district will look at a COVID-19 plan first at its policy committee, which meets Sept. 7, and then the full board is expected to vote on the issue Sept. 13.

Landscapes enjoy a hibiscus extravaganza

One of the most flamboyant and extravagant landscape plants for our area is the incredible hardy hibiscus. With massive blooms that may reach 10 inches across, colorful and decorative foliage, and over-the-top size, hardy hibiscus shrubs are becoming more and more popular in local gardens.

Unlike tropical hibiscus, which will not tolerate winters here in Wisconsin,

hardy hibiscus, also known as rose mallow, do quite well in our area in zone 4 and 5 gardens.

Hardy hibiscus feature massive, tissue paper-like blooms in shades of pink, red and white. In many of the hybrid varieties that are available, these colors are swirled together like peppermint candy, creating a spectacular effect in the late summer and fall garden.

It is their massive, dinner-plate-sized blooms that draw gardeners to these easy to grow and easy to care for perennial shrubs. Nothing else compares to the massive blooms of hardy hibiscus throughout late summer and fall.

Even before and after their bloom season, hardy hibiscus are attractive specimens in the garden and feature incredible foliage. Some varieties boast bright green foliage and heart-shaped leaves, while others feature foliage that is deep maroon or purple in color and heavily laced, almost like a Japanese maple. There are even a few varieties that are variegated in color with leaves that are green, pink and white.

Hardy hibiscus are very easy to grow in our area and normally do not require any winter protection. Be sure to select varieties that are hardy in zone 4 or 5, depending where you are located.

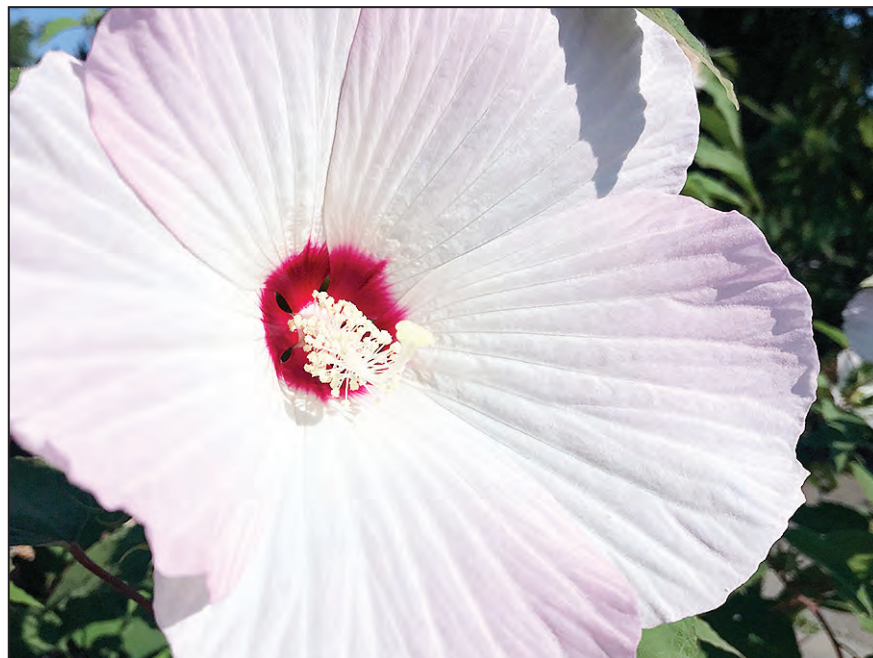
One caution about these giant specimen plants is that they come up quite late in the spring season, often not sending up shoots until June 1. It is important to be patient in the spring. Many gardeners, inspecting their garden plants in April and May and don't see shoots coming up yet, assume that the plant has died. However, hardy hibiscus are simply extremely late in emerging.

Once they do emerge, these are fast-growing shrubs that bloom on new wood, or new branches, each

year. They quickly shoot up 3 to 5 feet in height and begin to form massive flower buds that begin to bloom in late July and August. Established shrubs may contain hundreds of flower buds

that will continue to bloom even into October.

Hardy hibiscus also transform into incredible fall colors, making them even more valuable in the garden.

Leaves may turn rich purple, red, orange and gold throughout September and October.

I usually recommend to gardeners that they leave the branches standing throughout the winter season so that they are able to locate the plant in the spring. As previously noted, these are incredibly late in emerging in the spring season and the branches or stubs help gardeners remember where the plant is located even when its new growth has not yet emerged.

Hardy hibiscus are generally pretty easy to find at area garden centers. They are often available in large, blooming size 2- or 3-gallon pots. They may also be sold as one-gallon perennials. Be aware that these are smaller and may just send up a few blooms the first year, taking three to five years to reach their full size of 4 to 6 feet high and wide.

Most of the hardy hibiscus hybrids should be planted in full sun to maximize bloom count. However, a few varieties do well in shade or part shade. Be sure to read the individual tags that indicate if your variety needs sun or can handle some shade.

GRACE trail opens at Alpine Shores Park

Project brings together city, Pathways, ThedaCare, other community partners

One of two unique trails opened to the public Aug. 26, with the particular trail adding some depth to an otherwise undeveloped park.

With Shawano Pathways, ThedaCare and other community partners, the city of Shawano opened its GRACE (Grateful, Release, Acceptance, Challenge, Embrace) trail at Alpine Shores Park on the north end of town. Another one is opening in the Navarino area.

"It's just been a great project of collaboration and absolute excitement," said Matty Mathison, who spearheaded the project on behalf of Pathways.

The ¾-mile trail not only provides another recreational opportunity for community members, but it also provides a source of healing as it helps people who have lost a loved one or are at risk of losing someone. Mathison could sympathize, noting how the COVID-19 pandemic gave her a scare when her 96-year-old mother was diagnosed with the virus in November 2020.

"I did two daily window checks on her every single day and reported how she was to my eight siblings and to all of the people who were concerned about her health and safety," Mathison said. "On Thanksgiving Day, two weeks later, she felt well enough to have something to eat, despite the fact that, before that, she was very, very sick."

Mathison noted that visiting her mother in person wasn't an option at the time, so she ordered Thanksgiving dinner for two and sat outside her mother's home in 40-degree temperatures eating cold turkey. Mathison's mother, whom the daughter described as a "stubborn Norwegian," survived COVID-19, and the word that came to her from the experience was "grateful," and she came home to read her mail and learned about GRACE trails.

"This was what I needed in my life," Mathison said. "I have no doubt this is what other people need in their lives. When I realized how significant this trail could be for our community, I decided I wanted to create two of them."

Once Mathison was able to secure

funding, she went to Matt Hendricks, park and recreation director for the city. Hendricks said he didn't know what a GRACE trail was, but once he learned about it, he tried to figure out a way to get it to fit in Shawano.

"This park was established when this residential plat was dedicated decades ago," Hendricks said. "For decades, this park has sat here and been a wooded area. All by itself, that's fine, as environmental protection comes

through parks and natural areas."

Hendricks noted there were plans to have a wooded walking area at Alpine Shores long before Mathison walked into his office, but once she came in, he felt like the GRACE trail was meant to be. He also expressed his appreciation to ThedaCare, which contributed \$10,000, or \$5,000 per trail, to the project.

"After that, things just fell into place," Hendricks said.

Paula Morgan, ThedaCare director of community health, noted that the project's existence was due more to the people committed to making it happen than it did from her organization's monetary donation.

"This community has such an incredible wealth of talent, of passion, of people who want to continually improve," Morgan said. "This is the kind of work we're trying to do across all of the communities that we serve across nine counties. If we had people like you in every one of the communities we're serving, thinking about how to make this community better — mostly to keep people healthy in the first place — this GRACE trail is a perfect example of where we want our community to go."

Mayor Bruce Milavitz agreed that having organizations and people willing to help on projects like the trail is a good thing.

"When we talk about gratefulness, we're grateful for these community partnerships going on," Milavitz said. "I look back in 1996 and 1997 with my young family at the time, and we were looking for a community to move to, and I am so fortunate that this is the one community that stood out. Now, to look at what it's growing into in 2021, it's fantastic."

County to charge to sign death certificates

Officials say it's needed to balance coroner's budget; opponents argue it's hidden tax

It's going to cost families an extra \$100 to get a signature when a loved one dies in Shawano County.

The Shawano County Board of Supervisors voted 16-9 on Aug. 25 to implement a \$100 fee to have the coroner sign a death certificate, a service that previously was free. The resolution, which takes effect Jan. 1, generated some terse comments from the supervisors who voted against the measure.

Supervisor John Ainsworth argued that the fee would be just one more thing a family is charged for at a time when everything costs. He recounted his own experience five years ago when his wife died.

"I got two county sheriff's officers. I got two ambulance attendants. I got two people from the funeral home and, eventually, the coroner," Ainsworth said. "I think there are other places we can cut expenses. I don't need two police officers to verify that my wife died before my eyes. I didn't call either one of them. I called the coroner only."

Supervisor Deb Noffke said signing the death certificate was the coroner's job, and she didn't believe that grieving families should be charged for signing a piece of paper confirming their loved one was dead, as money from the tax levy already goes into the coroner's budget.

"When my grandmother died,

there was an actual M.D. — a doctor — there that knew she was dead, and we still had to have a coroner called, and that wasn't free," Noffke said. "There's a charge for a coroner call. There's a charge if you want to be cremated. The death certificates that everyone wants, those aren't free. When a family loses someone, this is probably the worst time to tack on extra fees, and now we want to charge just to sign a death certificate."

County Board Chairman Tom Kautza argued that the fee would reduce the amount of levy dollars going to the coroner, which Noffke dismissed in disbelief, calling it an extra hidden tax.

The fee is one of three the coroner is allowed to assess under state law. Besides the fee for signing death certificates, there are also fees for disinterment and cremation release. Cur-

rently, Shawano County only charges for cremation release, a \$125 fee.

Administrative Coordinator James Davel told the board the fee was necessary, in light of the fact that the coroner's office is constantly over budget for the last six years. There are about 120 deaths per year in the county, he said, but this month alone had 20 as of the time of the board meeting.

"Our issue goes around autopsies and the number of autopsies we do around the county," Davel said. "Each autopsy costs us \$1,500. We go down to Milwaukee for our autopsies. There's only two places where they do autopsies — one's in Milwaukee, the other's in Madison."

Davel noted the deaths have gone up slightly due to COVID-19, but increased costs are also a factor.

"We looked at a way to generate some revenue that was outside, but certainly authorized, rather than come to the (public safety) committee and asking for money," Davel said. "If we charge this fee, it would generally cover what we're over."

The \$100 charge was recommended because it can only increase due to the price index, according to Davel. Milwaukee County charges the most for the death certificate signing at \$153, while four counties — Clark, Crawford, Jefferson and Manitowoc — charge \$25.

However, some Wisconsin counties do not charge the fee at all. Supervisor Aaron Damrau noted that

Langlade, Marathon and Waupaca were among them, although Menominee County also does not charge the fee.

"It's a tax," Damrau said. "It's inappropriate to generate revenue off of people dying."

Davel noted that the county checked with the funeral homes to see if there were any concerns and found no one objecting, adding that funeral homes outside the county were surprised that it hadn't assessed a fee previously. He said the only request was that, once the fee was established, the county not change it.

"We don't want to mess with it for a while," Davel said. "We want to set a price that's reasonable."

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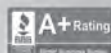
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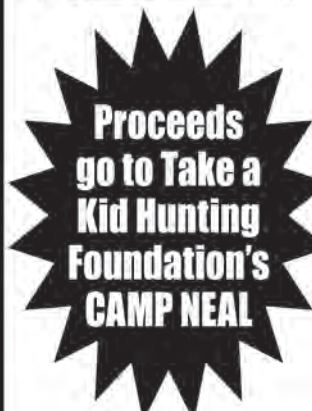


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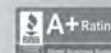
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School board approves \$20K for SCMS fix

Broken pipe found in wall after major upgrades completed

The Shawano School Board signed off Aug. 27 on what board president Michael Sleeper called a “critically important issue on our infrastructure” at Shawano Community Middle School.

The school had been undergoing some updates with its drainage systems, some of which were damaging the foundation of the school and leaving some parking areas flooded after rain fell. However, an issue was discovered during the updates that needed to be fixed right away, and the board approved spending up to \$20,000 for Elexco to fix it.

Shawn Mathwich, the district’s maintenance director, said that water was still coming through the tunnel and into the school’s boiler room, even after all the proposed fixes were in place. Elexco officials said they would investigate the issue gratis and discovered after putting some holes into a tunnel wall that there was a broken pipe underneath one of the school entrances, according to Mathwich.

“We immediately put a hole in the wall and fixed the pipe,” Mathwich said.

The measure the board approved would repair the wall that had to be opened to fix the broken pipe with a

slurry mix to solidify it. The special meeting was called because district officials wanted to get the work done before school opened on Sept. 1. Mathwich noted that plans were in place in case the work could not be done early in the week.

Mathwich said the school’s pipes had filled with sand over the years on lower levels, due to high amounts of water from rainfall. This, he added, put stress on the pipes and caused the one pipe to break over time.

Board member Mart Grams expressed concern that, given the age of the middle school, other repairs might be discovered, causing the district’s maintenance budget to swell.

“Is this giving us some indication that we need to bulldoze that damn building and think about building another one?” Grams said. “Are issues going to come up? Is this a Band-Aid, or is this a fix?”

The district had previously asked Kraus Anderson to assess the status of all of its facilities, according to Mathwich, and the middle school still has about 20-30 years of life left to it — especially since the district plunked \$9.25 million into renovations and upgrades in 2016.

Sleeper indicated that he was not worried that the district might be making major repairs continuously on the middle school.

“It’s an appropriate and necessary investment to keep the building functional, a building that is overall sound in its structure,” Sleeper said.

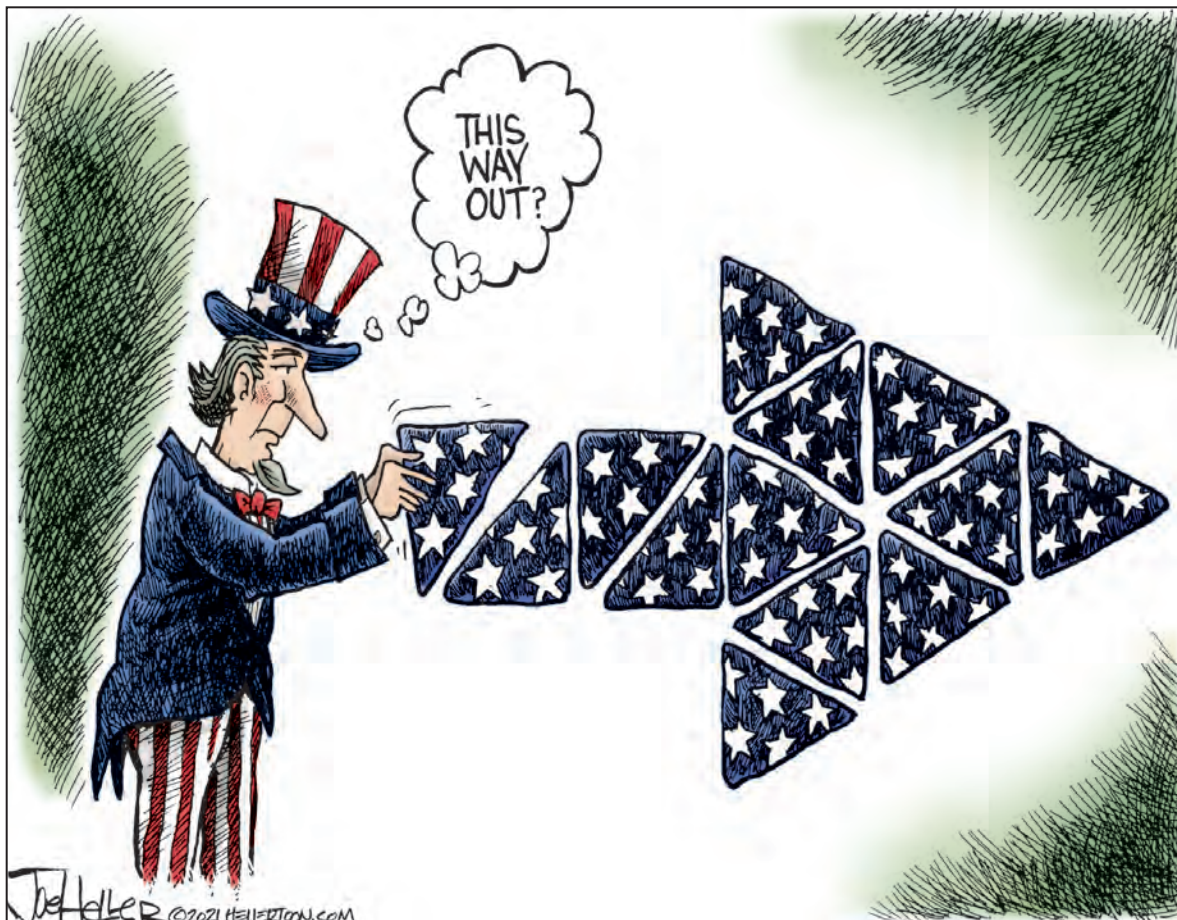

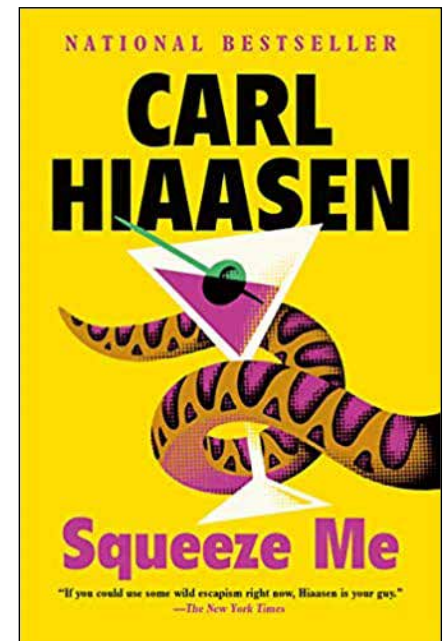

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OHM route established near Tigerton

County M to allow for motorcycles to access 1.7-mile segment by village's off-road vehicle park

The Shawano County Board of Supervisors voted Aug. 25 to designate a portion of County Road M around Tigerton as an off-highway motorcycle route, allowing the village's off-road vehicle park participants to have access to nearby amenities.

The OHM route would start on County Road M at the intersection of U.S. Highway 45 and continue for 1.7 miles east, which would include the intersection for the off-road park.

Bryan Much, a representative with the Wisconsin Off-Highway Motorcycle Association, told the board that his group worked with the village to establish some off-road trails that motorcycles can utilize. The problem is there are two segments of a trail separated by a river, and in order for those riders to get to those segments, it requires getting on County M.

"The law allows for a limited-use motorcycle, which is a dirt bike, to operate on a route," Much said. "Since we don't have a connection, the solution is the 1.7-mile motorcycle route, which allows us to get between segments and also get to services at the corner of Highway 45."

Steve Reinert, a member of the Tigerton Village Board, said the OHM route would make it easier for visitors and their motorcycles to obtain provisions once they've set up camp in the park.

"The big thing we have is, being a campground, these vehicles are coming in big-toy haulers," Reinert said. "If they need to get to another segment, right now they have to load up and get them back through the park again."

However, the board vote was far from unanimous, with five supervisors voting against the ordinance. Supervisor John Ainsworth, one of the "no" votes, tried to get an amendment to the ordinance requiring the dirt bike riders to "have in their immediate possession" a motorcycle license, but he only got five other supervisors to side with him.

"We have unlicensed drivers with unlicensed vehicles on a county road, then we're asking for trouble," Ainsworth said.

Supervisor Jerry Erdmann saw

the amendment as unnecessary and prohibitive.

"Being as this is going on in my backyard, I know most of what's going on in this ATV park with the recreation and stuff, and I think this is going too far," Erdmann said. "The majority of people that are there are there just to enjoy themselves and recreate with the family or maybe on a race day they're there to take in the races. I think if you start prohibiting things, sooner or later you're not going to be able to police it at all."

Supervisor Aaron Damrau, an-

other Tigerton representative also found the amendment to be unnecessary. He pointed out that this is the first time an OHM request has come to the board, even though the state has given the county the authority for years, and that there is a clause in the ordinance that the county's highway commissioner has to review the ordinance annually and can close the route if safety's an issue.

"I think there's other options besides requiring a cumbersome permit or driver's license," Damrau said.

Corporation Counsel Larena

Maulson told the board that OHM riders have to take a safety course through the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources before they're permitted to operate the vehicles.

Even after the amendment was defeated, a minority of supervisors pushed for denying the OHM route. Supervisor Arlyn Tober suggested that maybe the park should put a bridge similar to one available for snowmobiles across the river so that motorcycles can access the segments of the trail instead of designating part of County M as an OHM route.

"I'm just worried that the 1.7 miles is going to be a nice racetrack on good blacktop, and I think they're going to use it for more than getting to where they've got to get," Tober said.

Erdmann said that option was not feasible, as it would likely result in a long and drawn-out debate with the DNR.

"It would be more cumbersome than just voting yes here now," he said.

Supervisor Randy Young, another opponent of the ordinance, objected to the idea that motor vehicles have to have insurance and utilize turn signals in order to operate on the roads, but the motorcycles in the ordinance do not.

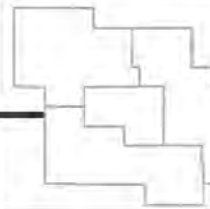
"In order for me to drive my car on that 1.7 miles, I have to have turn signals that work, and if I get pulled over, I have to have insurance," Young said.

Supervisor Gene Hoppe, who also voted no, tried to get the matter postponed until questions could be worked out. However, his postponement failed on a 16-9 vote.

Damrau saw the attempts of some supervisors to deny the OHM route as a slight to Tigerton. He noted the proposal is not that different from the one passed earlier this year on routes for all-terrain vehicles and utility-terrain vehicles.

"We have a record on all of the vehicles going into the park. If there are enforcement issues, the Tigerton police chief, I believe, is working on those race weekends," Damrau said. "This ordinance is vital for tourism in my community. Just saying no to this ordinance really puts a damper on one of the smaller, impoverished communities in our county."

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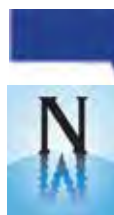

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Shawano County businesses look for employees

Staff shortages attributed to COVID-19 pandemic, housing, lifestyle changes

Labor Day 2021 finds many Shawano County businesses putting “help wanted” signs in their windows to attract more people to work for them.

“I am hearing that every employer is looking for workers,” said Peter Thillman, Shawano County Economic Progress, Inc. chief economic development officer.

One reason for the decline in available employees is retirements, Thillman said.

“We have a limited number of people to fill the large number of openings,” he said. “This is part of the demographic reality as we have a large number of workers who will be exiting the job market over the next few years as they retire. The labor market is not growing fast enough to cover the retirements.”

“Many baby boomers are retiring,” said Nancy Smith, Shawano County Chamber of Commerce executive director. “There just aren’t enough qualified workers available. This is not a new issue, but has been magnified by the pandemic.”

Business and county officials said the COVID-19 pandemic has had its effect on employment in the county.

“Some have chosen to stay out of the workforce out of concern with COVID,” Smith said.

“Pre-pandemic in February 2020, Shawano County had 19,941 people employed and 817 unemployed,” Thillman said. “June 2021, Shawano County had 20,543 people employed and 888 unemployed.”

Shawano County Administrative Coordinator Jim Davel also said he is seeing openings for jobs in Shawano County due to the job market changing.

“People are working from home,” said Davel. “People like the ability to be flexible with their hours and work from home.”

One of the county’s larger employers is Aarrowcast, which has continued to work and hire throughout the pandemic, but have still run into problems finding workers.

“We have continued to hire during the COVID-19 pandemic,” said Colleen McInnis, Aarrowcast director of human resources. “The cus-

tomers demand is very high, though.”

She added that Aarrowcast has been unable to produce for customers due to the high demand and staff shortages.

Davel said that, like other businesses, county government has its share of job openings at positions like correctional officer, in the library system and at the highway shop.

“We are having a difficult time finding people for the open positions,” said Davel. “There is an 18% turnover rate in the county.”

Davel said it seems younger generations “job-hop” more frequently than older workers.

As of Aug. 30, the Jobs Center of Wisconsin website listed 364 Shawano County job openings in all realms of business.

“Unemployment remains in the 4% range,” said Thillman. “This is considered full employment. The labor market will continue to tighten if the labor force does not continue to grow.”

He added that the closing of some child care programs has had an impact.

“There is a belief that since the closure of child care facilities and remote K-12 education that some labor force participants withdrew from the labor market to stay home with their children,” said Thillman.

Lucas Heart, marketing and communications manager at Roehl Transport, said that they have had trouble finding truck drivers since before the pandemic.

“We have truck driving positions that have been open for a while,” said Heart. “There are not enough people to fill these trucking jobs.”

He attributed some of the openings to people not wanting to make a lifestyle change.

“People will be away from home and will have to adapt a new lifestyle with these positions,” said Heart.

Housing has also become an issue for county residents, as well as people who are looking to move to

the county for work.

“It is hard to promote our area as a great place to relocate if they aren’t going to be able to find a place to live when they get here,” Smith said.

Thillman said the county has a housing shortage at all price points.

“Shawano County has a flat-out housing shortage at all levels of the market,” said Thillman. “Wisconsin Realtors put out monthly reports on housing sales, and Shawano County has had a record number of sales and record-high median sale price during the pandemic. That has affected employment in the county.”

He added that sales have started to slow down and prices have started to surge, according to a recent July study.

McInnis said a temp service has assisted Aarrowcast in recruiting for open positions, including hiring workers from Puerto Rico. She added that Aarrowcast has run in trouble finding housing for these employees.

“There seems to be a housing

shortage in Shawano County,” said McInnis. “We have had to pay to house these employees in hotels in Green Bay, as well as transport them back and forth.”

Davel said that Shawano County is different from larger counties in Wisconsin, like Brown or Milwaukee.

“Shawano is rural,” said Davel. “People come here for the tourism and schools. There is a different availability of resources here compared to other counties.”

He said that people take the rural lifestyle into consideration when looking for jobs.

With the abundance of job opportunities available, companies are using different strategies to bring more people in for interviews.

“I think what works well for us is that we have paid CDL (commercial driver’s license) training here,” said Heart. “There are a lot of opportunities within Roehl.”

“We are trying to market through the internet,” said Davel.
