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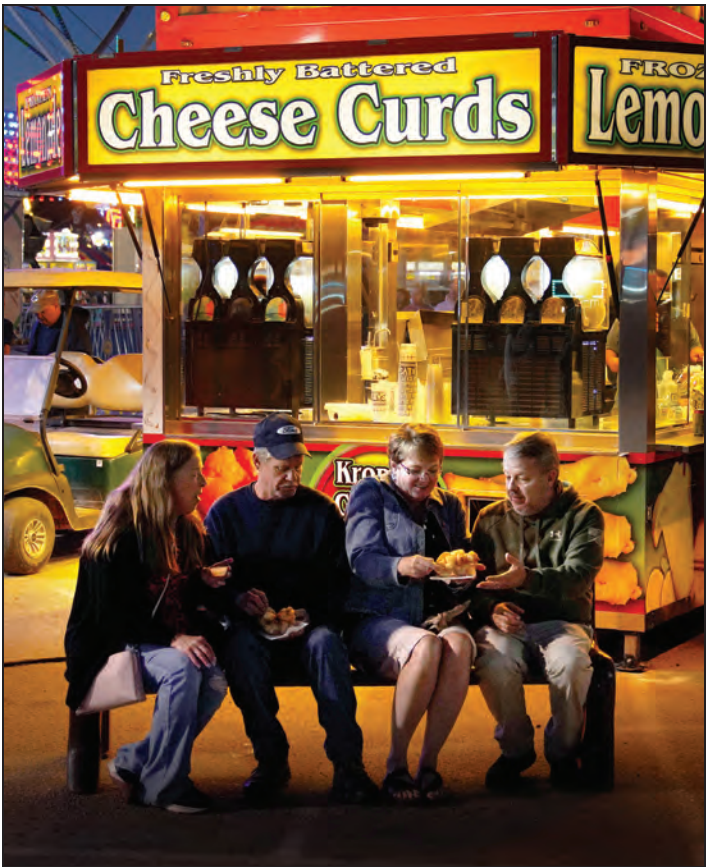


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Watch these avian species at waypoints, refuges and wild places

It's been nearly 25 years since the state Department of Natural Resources established the Great Wisconsin Birding and Nature Trail along with a series of bird-viewing guides for five regions.

The Central Sands Prairie Region includes Shawano, Menominee, Waupaca, Outagamie, Marathon and 12 other counties; the Lake Michigan Region includes Oconto, Brown, Marinette and eight other counties; and the Lake Superior Northwoods Region includes Forest, Langlade and 16 other counties.

Each of the five regions include several waypoints, refuges and wild places that offer the best birding and wildlife-watch-

ing opportunities. Complete viewing guides for all five regions can be found at dnr.wisconsin.gov/topic/EndangeredResources/birdtrail.

Waypoints in the Central Sands Prairie Region include:

Shawano County

- Jung Hemlock-Beech Forest State Natural Area. Signature species: Woodthrush, red-eyed vireo, Eastern wood pewee. Rare species: Red crossbill, white crossbill, blue-headed vireo.

- Mountain-Bay State Trail. Signature species: Catbird, chimney swift, Eastern bluebird. Rare species: Scarlet tanager, wood thrush, great egret.

- Navarino State Wildlife Area and Nature Center. Signa-

ture species: Northern harrier, Eastern bluebird, tundra swan, American bittern. Rare species: Loggerhead shrike, little blue heron.

- Shawano Lake County Park. Signature species: Yellow-headed blackbird, common loon. Rare species: Red-headed woodpecker.

Menominee County

- Menominee County. Signature species: Raven, great blue heron, bald eagle. Rare species: Black tern, golden-winged warbler, Northern parula, winter wren.

Waupaca County

- Hartman Creek State Park and Emmons Creek Fishery Area. Signature species: Scarlet

tanager, least flycatcher, red-tailed hawk, American kestrel. Rare species: Acadian flycatcher, grasshopper sparrow, Henslow's sparrow.

- Keller Whitcomb Creek Woods State Natural Area. Signature species: Winter wren, common raven, hermit thrush, veery thrush. Rare species: Red-shouldered hawk, yellow-bellied flycatcher, merlin.

- Mukwa State Wildlife Area. Signature species: Osprey, bald eagle, Northern harrier, American kestrel. Rare species: Northern shrike, least bittern, great egret.

- Myklebust Lake State Natural Area. Signature species: Mourning warbler, pileated

- Outagamie State Wildlife Area. Signature species: Ruffed grouse, blue-gray gnatcatcher, Cerulean warbler. Rare species: Osprey, black tern.

- Wolf River Bottoms State Wildlife Area. Signature species: Sandhill crane, ruffed grouse, American woodcock. Rare species: Loggerhead shrike, prothonotary warbler.

Marathon County

- Big Eau Pleine County Park and Dells of the Eau Claire River State Natural Area. Signature species: Broad-winged hawk, Blackburnian warbler. Rare species: Long-eared owl, scarlet tanager, cedar waxwing.

- Big Eau Pleine Woods State Natural Area. Signature species: Cerulean warbler, Acadian flycatcher. Rare species: American white pelican, winter wren, solitary sandpiper.

- Bluegill Bay County Park. Signature species: Wilson's snipe, yellow warbler. Rare species: Red-necked grebe, yellow-crowned night heron, Northern groshawk, Northern saw-whet owl, pine grosbeak, Connecticut warbler.

- George W. Mead State Wildlife Area. Signature species: Bald eagle, sandhill crane, ruffed grouse, white pelican. Rare species: Greater prairie chicken, sharp-tailed grouse, loggerhead shrike.

- Nine Mile County Forest. Signature species: Black-billed cuckoo, hermit thrush, Acadian flycatcher. Rare species: Red-shouldered hawk, yellow-billed cuckoo, olive-sided flycatcher, pine grosbeak, evening grosbeak, common redpoll, red

Waypoints in the Lake Michigan Region include:

Oconto County

- Oconto County Forest (Machickanee Unit). Signature species: Red-shouldered hawk, Blackburnian warbler, ruby crown kinglet. Rare species: Yellow-throated warbler, Swainson's thrush, hooded warbler.

- Green Bay West Shores State Wildlife Area (Oconto Harbor, Oconto Marsh, Rush Point). Signature species: White pelican, common tern, Caspian tern. Rare species: Snowy owl, long-tailed duck, red-throated loon, scoters.

- Green Bay West Shores State Wildlife Area (Pensaukee Unit). Signature species: Common merganser, common goldeneye, American bittern. Rare species: Snowy egret, yellow rail, peregrine falcon.

- Peshtigo Brook State Wildlife Area. Signature species: Ruffed grouse, barred owl, common nighthawk. Rare species: Merlin falcon, loggerhead shrike, warbling vireo.

- Snow Falls Creek State Natural Area. Signature species: Blackburnian warbler, least flycatcher, red-shouldered hawk. Rare species: Merlin falcon, ruby-crowned kinglet, yellow-throated warbler.

Brown County

- Barkhausen Wildlife Preserve and Fort Howard Paper Foundation Wildlife Area. Signature species: Sandhill crane, waterfowl, shorebirds, Wilson's snipe. Rare species: Cerulean warbler, snowy egret, saw-whet

owl.

- Bay Beach Wildlife Sanctuary. Signature species: Black duck, white-eyed vireo. Rare species: Summer tanager, Ross's goose.

- Bay Shore County Park. Signature species: Ducks, flycatchers, shorebirds, woodpeckers. Rare species: Caspian tern, red knot, scarlet tanager.

- Cofrin Arboretum (University of Wisconsin-Green Bay). Signature species: American woodcock, waterfowl, songbirds. Rare species: Red knot, red-headed woodpecker.

- Lily Lake County Park. Signature species: Common loon, sandhill crane, water pipit, willow flycatcher. Rare species: Willet, marbled godwit, ruff, gyrfalcon.

- Brown County Reforestation Camp. Signature species: Pileated woodpecker, common raven, red-shouldered hawk. Rare species: Blue-winged warbler, black-backed woodpecker.

Marinette County

- Bloch Oxbow State Natural Area. Signature species: Bald eagle, great blue heron, bank swallow, red-shouldered hawk. Rare species: Caspian tern, Forster's tern.

- Dunbar Barrens State Natural Area. Signature species: Eastern bluebird, Eastern towhee. Rare species: Upland sandpiper, merlin falcon.

- Governor Thompson State Park. Signature species: Bald eagle, scarlet tanager, common nighthawk. Rare species: Osprey.
- Green Bay West Shores

State Wildlife Area (Peshtigo Harbor Unit). Signature species: Waterfowl, terns, rails, bitterns, harriers, sparrows. Rare species: Red-shouldered hawk, osprey, yellow rail, Forster's tern, common tern.

- Seagull Bar State Natural Area. Signature species: Shorebirds. Rare species: Piping plover, white pelican, Caspian turn, common tern, Forster's tern.

Waypoints in the Lake Superior or Northwoods Region include:

Forest County

- Ed's Lake National Recreation Trail. Signature species: Blackburnian warbler, blue-headed vireo, ovenbird, hermit thrush, black-throated green warbler, pileated woodpecker, brown creeper, winter wren, scarlet tanager. Rare species: Common loon.

- Franklin and Butternut Lakes Area. Signature species: Bald eagle, woodpeckers, wood pewee, winter wren, Blackburnian warbler, cape may warbler, ovenbird, common loon, great blue heron, mallard duck, spotted sandpiper, willow flycatcher. Rare species: Red-shouldered hawk.

- Giant White Pine Grove State Natural Area. Signature species: Blackburnian warbler, black-throated blue warbler, pileated woodpecker. Rare species: Winter wren, evening grosbeak.

- Knowles Creek Impoundment and Interpretive Trail. Signature species: Owls, hawks, eagles, waterfowl, common loon.

- Wabikon and Riley Lakes. Signature species: Yellow-bellied flycatcher, osprey. Rare species: Nashville warbler.

Langlade County

- Ackley State Wildlife Area. Signature species: Sharp-tailed grouse, clay-colored sparrow, Henslow's sparrow, yellow-headed blackbirds, ducks.

- Bogus Swamp State Natural Area. Signature species: Palm warbler, Lincoln's sparrow, Northern harrier, American bittern.

- Peters Marsh State Wildlife Area. Signature species: American woodcock, sandhill crane, Northern saw-whet owl, hawks.

- Veterans County Park and Jack Lake. Signature species: Golden-crowned kinglet, Northern waterthrush, winter wren.

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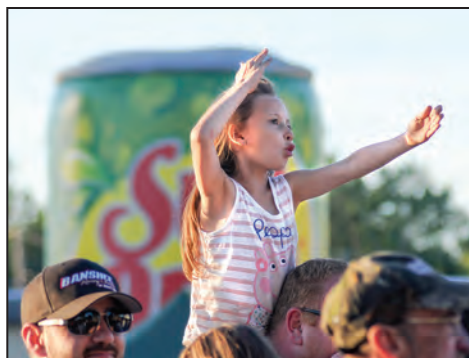

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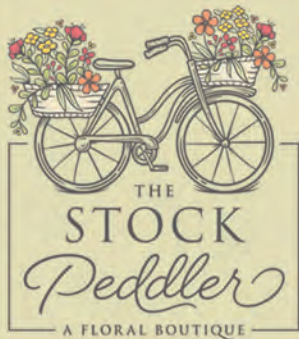

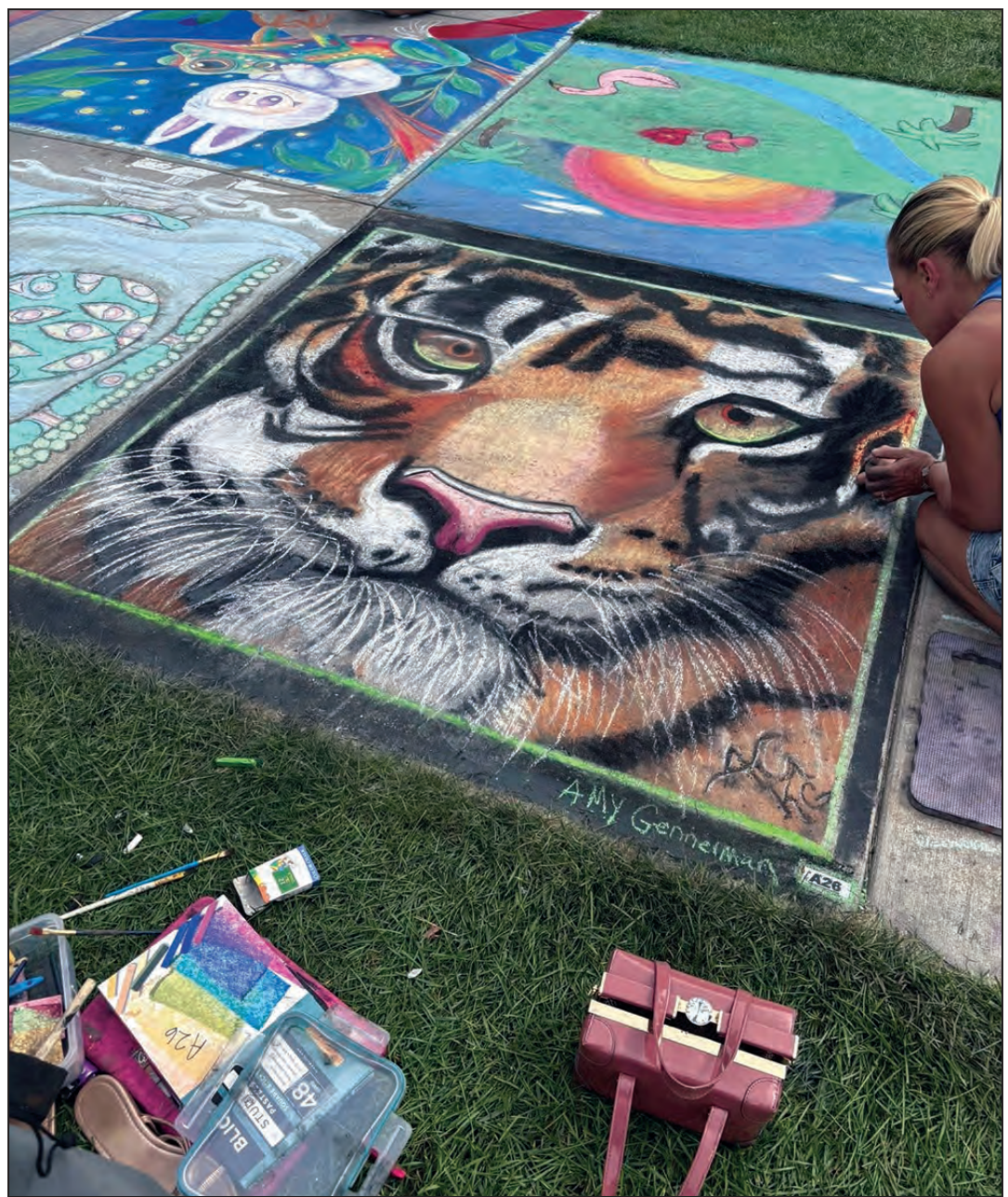

Wagner's Market puts Black Creek on the map

Peppers and cabbage and sweet corn, oh my!

That's what visitors are thinking to themselves as they wander around Wagner's Market, a mainstay for more than 30 years at Black Creek's main intersection of state highways 54 and 47.

Kim Kamp owns the business with her brothers, Chris and Nick Wagner, at the site of a grocery store that their grandparents and great-grandparents owned and operated.

The state Department of Transportation widened state Highway 54 — Main Street in Black Creek — in 1989, which changed everything for the

Wagners.

"They purchased the store and took the store down," Kamp said. "My parents bought the lot from my grandparents in '89, and they brought this building here. It was supposed to move off the lot that year, but they filed with the village to keep it here and the building never left."

The building eventually became Wagner's Market, which Kamp's parents, James and Margaret Wagner, operated.

Most of the market's fresh produce comes from the Wagner farm, with the exception of bulk potatoes, onions and carrots.

The market also sells apples from Door County.
